1 Responses to RFQ

Responses to this RFQ [Quotations] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully enjoyees and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transpet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification conficate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B BEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point system is applicable to all bids:

- The 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000.00 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFQ and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1000 000.00 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BB E I reference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status is stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this REQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

2.2 B-BBEE Improvement Plan

Transnet encourates in Suppliers/Service Providers to constantly strive to improve their B-BBEE rating. Whereas Respondents will be allocated points in terms of a preference point system based on its B-BBEE scorecard to be assessed as detailed in paragraph 2.1 above, in addition to such scoring, transmet also requests that Respondents submit a B-BBEE improvement plan. Respondents are therefore requested to indicate the extent to which the extent to which they will praintain or improve their B-BBEE status over the contract period.

A1 SCOPE OF WORK

This contract covers the removing, repairing and erecting of new fence or other fencing as specified by Technical Officer. (North Depot) The necessary equipment and machinery to be supplied by Contractor.

A2 DURATION OF CONTRACT

The work provides for the provision of services commercing to the date of notification of acceptance of tender and ending within a reasonable time posified by the contractor to do the work within 183 calender days or when the money for the Contract is depleted

A3 TO BE PROVIDED BY TRANSNET

Material will be supplied by Transnet at afra Depor, Beaconsfield to contractor for work to be done. The contractor to supply transport and a pour.

A4 TO BE PROVIDED BY CONTRACTOR

In addition to all labour and incidental needed to complete the work, the Contractor shall provide transport, accommodation and food for his employees.

No accommodation on Transnet Property in the section or within station yards.

The Contractor shall provide at his own cost any security measures he may deem necessary for safe and effective execution of the work within the contract area.

All yater to be usage during the Contract, shall be provided by the Contractor.

A5 SCHEDULE OF QUANTITIES AND PRICES

The contractor shall submit with his tender a complete and detailed price schedule (Prepared in ink) for the works No changes will be allowed on Schedule form.

A6 VELD FIRES

Under no circumstances may the Contractor or his employees make open fires within the Transnet reserve that may lead to veld fires. The contractor will be liable for any damages cause by such fires caused by staff on site.

Under no circumstances may the Contractor or his employees collect wood on the Transnet reserve or the adjacent farm land.

A7 REACTION TIME

The Contractor will be available and punctual for callouts throughout the contract period. After being ordered to be on site by the Technical Officer or his/her Deputy, the contractor will start work, as soon as possible, within 24 hours (weekends included).(refer to A4- A6)

PART B: WORKMANSHIP

B1 STANDARDS OF WORKMANSHIP

All work must be done according to the relevant specifications. Where material has been supplied by Transnet and the material has been spoilt or damaged during execution of the work the contractor will be held responsible to make good. All work will be approved by Transnet's representative before payment will be executed.

No payments will be made if work is not according to the specifications of the contract.

PART C: SAFETY

C1 ASSESSMENT

Prior to the start of the contract the contractor is required to do a risk assessment of each task and to provide a safety plan to address these risks.

C2 SAFETY PLAN

This safety plan is to be provided and implemented by the contractor before the work commences.

C3 RISKS

Provision for the following risks must be made in the safety plan.

- 1. Working adjacent to passing trains.
- 2. Loading and off-loading of both new and old material.
- 3. Travelling to and from work sites on public and mechanization rolds.
- 4. Working close to Overhead Traction equipment. Electrical speck.
- 5. Uneven surfaces.
- 6. Transport of staff to and from the work site.
- 7. Blue asbestos.
- 8. Veld fires.
- 9. Transport of injured staff from work site to marest ospital.

C4 PERSONAL PROTECTION EQUIPMENT

The contractor is to provide personal projection equipment (PPE) in relation to the risk and type of work to be executed.

All workers on this contract **chall** be quired to wear reflective orange vests but not **red** vests at all times, safety boots. An all necessary PPE as required for the different needs.

C5 TRAINING

Before the con ractor may start any work, the contractor supervisor and his entire team will be required to attend a compulsory 3 hour long Safety Induction given by a disignated pransnet Safety representative and also the Electric Safety Induction Course, for 3 days. Transnet will supply all the training, but accommodation and transport, to be paid by the Contractor

C7 SAFETY TALK

All workers shall work as a team in one area in the Transnet reserve.

C9 WORK AFTER HOURS












TYPICAL VIEW OF GATE POSTS AT CATTLE GUARDS

This preference form contains general information and serves as a claim for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [**B-BBEE**] Status Level of Contribution.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A total/maximum of 20 preference points shall be awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.
- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contamplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to equire or a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITION

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 "BEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 **"Bid"** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;

- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies for the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be tractical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidde.
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice illsued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 **"rand value"** means the told estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of told in vitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 "subcontrac," makes the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 **Intra-revenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 **"trust"** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.

- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.



4. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

4.1 In terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, preference points shall be awarded to a Bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 4.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as E. E. in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis sonfirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership.
- 4.4 In terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice, Bidders other than EMEs must submit the poriginal and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- In terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, Bidders who qualify as QSEs are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R50 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership. Large enterprises must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.6 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for its B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits its B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 4.7 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.

- 4.8 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the Bid documents 4.9 that such a Bidder intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the same number of points that such a Bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.10 A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.11 Bidders are to note that in terms of paragraph 2.6 of Statement 200 of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, any representation made by an entity about its B-BBEE compliance must be supported by suitable evidence or documentation. As such, Transnet reserves the right to request such evidence or documentation from Bidders in order to verify and B-BBE accognition claimed.
