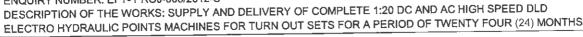

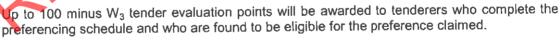

- 1) 90 where the financial value inclusive of VAT of all responsive tenders received have a value in excess of R1 000 000; or
- 2) 80 where the financial value inclusive of VAT of one or more responsive tender offers equals or is less than R1 000 000.

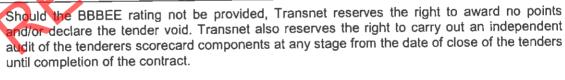

The minimum number of evaluation points for quality is: 60

The persons named in the Schedule of Key Persons of tenderers who satisfy the minimum quality criteria will be invited to an interview. Tenderers who attain a score of less than 50% of the points allocated to the interview will be declared ineligible to tender.

Each evaluation criteria will be assessed in terms of four indicators – poor, satisfactory, good and very good. Scores of 40, 70, 90 or 100 will be allocated to poor, satisfactory, good and very good, respectively. The scores of each of the evaluators will be averaged, weighted and then totalled to obtain the final score for quality. (See CIDB Best Practice Guideline #4)

The scores of each of the evaluators will be averaged, weighted and then lotalled to obtain the final score for quality.



Tenderers with no accreditation will score zero points for preferencing.

### F.3.13.1 Tender offers will only be accepted if:

- a) the tenderer submits an original valid Tax Clearance Certificate issued by the South African Revenue Services or has made arrangements to meet outstanding tax obligations;
- b) the tenderer or any of its directors/shareholders is not listed on the Register of Tender Defaulters in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act of 2004 as a person prohibited from doing business with the public sector;
- c) the tenderer has not:
  - i) abused the Employer's Supply Chain Management System; or
  - ii) failed to perform on any previous contract and has been given a written notice to this effect:
- d) the tenderer has completed the Compulsory Enterprise Questionnaire and there are no conflicts of interest which may impact on the tenderer's ability to perform the contract in the best interests of the Employer or potentially compromise the tender process and persons in the employ of the state are permitted to submit tenders or participate in the contract;
- e) the tenderer is registered and in good standing with the compensation fund or with a licensed compensation insurer;

### SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The upswing in growth in the last decade, followed by the global recession in 2008, as well as persistently high unemployment and social inequality, forced the South African government to re-evaluate its growth strategy. This led to the development of a revised growth framework, the New Growth Path (NGP). The NGP aims to enhance growth, employment creation and equity, through the identification of strategies that will enable South Africa to grow in a more equitable and inclusive manner and promote the development of new industry to attain South Africa's developmental agenda.

In order to achieve this, the NGP focuses on:

- Increasing employment intensity of the economy
- Increasing the responsiveness of infrastructure and addressing competitiveness
- Balancing spatial development of rural areas and poorer provinces
- Reducing the carbon intensity of the economy
- Creating opportunities in changing regional and global environments
- Enabling transformation that benefits a wider range of social actors in society e.g. workers, rural communities, women etc.

Tenderers must submit a Supplier Development Plan (SDP) which clearly indicates the following benefits:

- Acceleration of localisation and transformation of local business by promoting technology transfer, skill development and job creation
- Focused regional development
- Increase in local content security of supply, reduced cycle times, reduced exposure to foreign currency and reduction of supply chain costs (over time)
- Transformation of supplier dominance from large international or traditionally white owned business to locally owned and black owned suppliers

The SDP will be incorporated in the eventual Contract and will be managed as part of the Contractors deliverables in terms of the contract. The final SDP will be submitted and agreed to by Transnet and Tenderers must clearly indicate in their Pricing Schedule the cost of implementation hereof. Financial penalties will be included in the contract and be imposed based on the Pricing Schedule for non-compliance with the SDP.



# **T1.3 CIDB Standard Conditions of Tender**

January 2009 Edition



As published in Annexure F of the CIDB Standard for Uniformity in Construction Procurement in Board Notice 12 of 2009 in Government Gazette No 31823 of 30 January 2009

#### F.1 General

#### **Actions** F.1.1

- The employer and each tenderer submitting a tender offer shall comply with F.1.1.1 these conditions of tender. In their dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in F.2 and F.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, honestly and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not engage in anticompetitive.
- The employer and the tenderer and all their agents and employees involved in F.1.1.2 the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Tenderers shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict, and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.
- A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of roles which might provide an incentive for improper acts in some circumstances. A conflict of interest can create an appearance of impropriety that can undermine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result.
- Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the procurement 2) process include direct, indirect or family interests in the tender or outcome of the procurement process and any personal bias, inclination, obligation, allegiance or loyalty which would in any way affect any decisions taken.
- The employer shall not seek and a tenderer shall not submit a tender without F.1.1.3 having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.

#### F.1.2 **Tender Documents**

The documents issued by the employer for the purpose of a tender offer are listed in the tender data.

#### F.1.3 Interpretation

The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules F.1.3.1 that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender.



- These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are only F.1.3.2 required for tender evaluation purposes, shall not form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender.
- For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply: F.1.3.3
  - a) conflict of interest means any situation in which:
    - i) someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfill his or her duties impartially;
    - ii) an individual or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal or corporate benefit; or
    - iii) incompatibility or contradictory interests exist between an employee and the organisation which employs that employee.
  - b) comparative offer means the tenderer's financial offer after all tendered parameters that will affect the value of the financial offer have been taken into consideration in order to enable comparisons to be made between offers on a comparative basis
  - c) corrupt practice means the offering, giving, receiving a soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of the employer or his staff or agents in the tender process; and
  - d) fraudulent practice means the misrepresentation of the facts in order to influence the tender process or the award of a contract arising from a tender offer to the detriment of the employer, including collusive practices intended to establish prices at artificial levels
  - e) organisation means a company firm, enterprise, association or other legal entity, whether incorporated or not, or a public body
  - f) quality (functionality) means the totality of features and characteristics of a product or service that bear on its ability to satisfy stated or implied needs

#### Communication and employer's agent F.1.4

Each communication between the employer and a tenderer shall be to or from the employer's agent only, and in a form that can be readily read, copied and recorded. Communications shall be in the English llanguage. The employer shall not take any responsibility for non-receipt of communications from or by a tenderer. The name and contact details of the employer's agent are stated in the tender

#### The employer's right to accept or reject any tender offer F.1.5

The employer may accept or reject any variation, deviation, tender offer, or alternative tender offer, and may cancel the tender process and reject all tender offers at any time before the formation of a contract. The employer shall not accept or incur any liability to a tenderer for such cancellation and rejection, but will give written reasons for such action upon written request to do so.

The employer may not subsequent to the cancellation or abandonment of a F.1.5.2 tender process or the rejection of all responsive tender offers re-issue a tender covering substantially the same scope of work within a period of six months unless only one tender was received and such tender was returned unopened to the tenderer.

#### Procurement procedures F.1.6

#### F.1.6.1 General

Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, a contract will, subject to F.3.13, be concluded with the tenderer who in terms of F.3.11 is the highest ranked or the tenderer scoring the highest number of tender evaluation points, as relevant, based on the tender submissions that are received at the closing time for tenders.



#### Competitive negotiation procedure F.1.6.2

- Where the tender data require that the competitive negotiation procedure is to be F.1.6.2.1 followed, tenderers shall submit tender offers in response to the proposed contract in the first round of submissions. Notwithstanding the requirements of F.3.4, the employer shall announce only the names of the tenderers who make a submission. The requirements of F.3.8 relating to the material deviations or qualifications which affect the competitive position of tenderers shall not apply.
- All responsive tenderers, or not less than three responsive tenderers that are F.1.6.2.2 highest ranked in terms of the evaluation method and evaluation criteria stated in the tender data, shall be invited in each round to enter into competitive negotiations, based on the principle of equal treatment and keeping confidential the proposed solutions and associated information. Notwithstanding the provisions of F.2.17, the employer may request that tenders be clarified, specified and fine-tuned in order to improve a tenderer's competitive position provided that such clarification, specification, fine-tuning or additional information does not alter any fundamental aspects of the offers or impose substantial new requirements which restrict or distort competition or have a discriminatory effect.
- At the conclusion of each round of negotiations, tenderers shall be invited by the F.1.6.2.3 employer to make a fresh tender offer, based on the same evaluation criteria, with or without adjusted weightings. Tenderers shall be advised when they are to submit their best and final offer.
- The contract shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions of F.3.11 and F.1.6.2.4 F.3.13 after tenderers have been requested to submit their best and final offer.
- Proposal procedure using the wo stage-system F.1.6.3
- Option 1 F.1.6.3.1

Tenderers shall in the first stage submit technical proposals and, if required, cost parameters around which a contract may be negotiated. The employer shall evaluate each responsive submission in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data, and in the second stage negotiate a contract with the tenderer scoring the highest number of evaluation points and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.

#### Option 2 F.1.6.3.2

- Tenderers shall submit in the first stage only technical proposals. The employer F.1.6.3.2.1 shall invite all responsive tenderers to submit tender offers in the second stage, following the issuing of procurement documents.
- The employer shall evaluate tenders received during the second stage in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data, and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.

## Tenderer's obligations

#### **Eligibility** F.2.1

- Submit a tender offer only if the tenderer satisfies the criteria stated in the tender F.2.1.1 data and the tenderer or any of his principals, is not under any restriction to do business with employer.
- Notify the employer of any proposed material change in the capabilities or F.2.1.2 formation of the tendering entity (or both) or any other criteria which formed part of the qualifying requirements used by the employer as the basis in a prior process to invite the tenderer to submit a tender offer and obtain the employer's written approval to do so prior to the closing time for tenders.



### F.2.2 Cost of tendering

Accept that, unless otherwise stated in the tender data, the employer will not compensate the tenderer for any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of a tender offer, including the costs of any testing necessary to demonstrate that aspects of the offer complies with requirements.

### F,2.3 Check documents

Check the tender documents on receipt for completeness and notify the employer of any discrepancy or omission.

## F.2.4 Confidentiality and copyright of documents

Treat as confidential all matters arising in connection with the tender. Use and copy the documents issued by the employer only for the purpose of preparing and submitting a tender offer in response to the invitation.

## F.2.5 Reference documents

Obtain, as necessary for submitting a tender offer, copies of the latest versions of standards, specifications, conditions of contract and other publications, which are not attached but which are incorporated into the tender documents by reference.

## F.2.6 Acknowledge addenda

Acknowledge receipt of addenda to the tender documents, which the employer may issue, and if necessary apply for an extension to the closing time stated in the tender data, in order to take the addenda into account.

## F.2.7 Clarification meeting

Attend, where required, a clarification meeting at which tenderers may familiarise themselves with aspects of the proposed work, services or supply and raise questions. Details of the meeting(s) are stated in the tender data

### F.2.8 Seek clarification

Request clarification of the tender documents, if necessary, by notifying the employer at least five working days before the closing time stated in the tender data.

### F.2.9 Insurance

Be aware that the extent of insurance to be provided by the employer (if any) might not be for the full cover required in terms of the conditions of contract identified in the contract data. The tenderer is advised to seek qualified advice regarding insurance.

## F.2.10 Pricing the tender offer

- Include in the rates, prices, and the tendered total of the prices (if any) all duties, taxes (except Value Added Tax (VAT), and other levies payable by the successful tenderer, such duties, taxes and levies being those applicable 14 days before the closing time stated in the tender data.
- **F.2.10.2** Show VAT payable by the employer separately as an addition to the tendered total of the prices.
- **F.2.10.3** Provide rates and prices that are fixed for the duration of the contract and not subject to adjustment except as provided for in the conditions of contract identified in the contract data.
- **F.2.10.4** State the rates and prices in Rand unless instructed otherwise in the tender data. The conditions of contract identified in the contract data may provide for part payment in other currencies.



#### **Alterations to documents** F.2.11

Do not make any alterations or additions to the tender documents, except to comply with Instructions issued by the employer, or necessary to correct errors made by the tenderer. All signatories to the tender offer shall Initial all such alterations. Erasures and the use of masking fluid are prohibited.

#### Alternative tender offers F.2.12

- Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, submit alternative tender offers only if F.2.12.1 a main tender offer, strictly in accordance with all the requirements of the tender documents, is also submitted as well as a schedule that compares the requirements of the tender documents with the alternative requirements that are proposed.
- Accept that an alternative tender offer may be based only on the criteria stated in F.2.12.2 the tender data or criteria otherwise acceptable to the employer.

#### Submitting a tender offer F.2.13

- Submit one tender offer only, either as a single tendering entity or as a member F.2.13.1 in a joint venture to provide the whole of the works, services or supply identified in the contract data and described in the scope of works, unless stated otherwise in the tender data.
- Return all returnable documents to the employer after completing them in their F.2.13.2 entirety, either electronically (if they were issued in electronic format) or by writing legibly in non-erasable ink.
- Submit the parts of the tender offer communicated on paper as an original plus F.2.13.3 the number of copies stated in the tender data, with an English translation of any documentation in a language other than English, and the parts communicated electronically in the same format s they were issued by the employer.
- Sign the original and all copies of the tender offer where required in terms of the F.2.13.4 tender data. The employer will hold all authorized signatories liable on behalf of the tenderer Signatories for tenderers proposing to contract as joint ventures shall state which of the signatories is the lead partner whom the employer shall hold liable for the purpose of the tender offer.
- Seal the original and each copy of the tender offer as separate packages F.2.13.5 marking the packages as "ORIGINAL" and "COPY". Each package shall state on the outside the employer's address and identification details stated in the tender data, as well as the tenderer's name and contact address.
  - Where a two-envelope system is required in terms of the tender data, place and seal the returnable documents listed in the tender data in an envelope marked "financial proposal" and place the remaining returnable documents in an envelope marked "technical proposal". 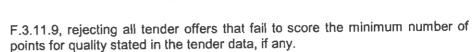

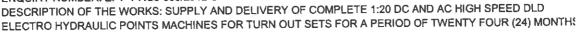
