2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's troad-lased Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "screen nee" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondential to note the following:

Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME would be a certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) from an auditor or accounting officer or a certificate from a writeation Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the company's turnover, back (whership / black female ownership, B-BBEE status level and validity date.

S. PREVIEW

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1) DEFINITIONS



Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- a) Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- b) Bid Document(s) shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- c) Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- d) Respondent(s) shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- e) RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- f) RFO shall mean Request for Quotation;
- g) RFX shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- h) Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as specific in its Bid Document;
- i) Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent,
- j) **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as require by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- k) Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC La, a State Owned Company; and
- I) VAT shall mean Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2) GENERAL

All Bid Document and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid from by Transnet and are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3) SUBMISSION OF B DOCUMENTS

- a) A Bid which shall hereinafter include reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be submitted to Transnet no attention the closing date and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Documents. Late Bids will not be considered.
- Documents with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.
- c) The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

4) USE OF BID FORMS

- a) Where special forms are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and not in other forms or documents bearing their own terms and conditions of contract. Non-compliance with this condition may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- b) Respondents must note that the original Bid forms must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed copy thereof.

c) Only if insufficient space has been allocated for a particular response may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using its company's letterhead. This must be duly cross-referenced in the RFX.



5) BID FEES

- a) A non-refundable fee may be charged for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing such Bid Documents.
- b) Only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment when submitting their Bid will be considered.

6) VALIDITY PERIOD

- a) Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transpet at any time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the RFX.
- b) Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a specified additional period. In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect of their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change(s) is as a direct and unavoidable consequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

7) SITE VISIT / BRIEFING SESSION

Respondents may be requested to attent (i) site visit where it is considered necessary to view the site prior to the preparation of Bids, or (ii) in RFX briefing session when Transnet deems it necessary to provide Respondents with additional information relevant to the compilation of their Bids. When such visits or sessions are included as compulsory in the Bid Document, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings as failure to do so will result in their disqualification.

8) CLARIFICATION BEFORE THE CLOSING DATE

Should deriffication be required on any aspect of the RFX before the closing date, the Respondent must direct such queries to the contact person identified in the Bid Document.

9) COMMUNICATION AFTER THE CLOSING DATE

After the closing date of a Bid [i.e. during the evaluation period] the Respondent may only communicate with the Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

10) UNAUTHORISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

12) DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

- b) The recurity may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any loss or amount which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.
- Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stipulated in the Bid Documents.
- The successful Respondent shall be required to submit to Transnet or Transnet's designated official the specified security document(s) within 30 [thirty] Days from the date of signature of the contract. Failure to return the securities within the prescribed time shall, save where prior extension has been granted, entitle Transnet without notice to the Service Provider to cancel the contract with immediate effect.
- e) Additional costs incurred by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider in relation to the conditions of this clause 23) will be for the account of the Service Provider.

24) DELETION OF ITEMS TO BE EXCLUDED FROM BID

The Respondent must delete items for which it does not wish to tender.

25) VALUE-ADDED TAX



- a) In respect of local Services, i.e. Services to be rendered in the Republic of South Africa, the prices quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive of VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Tax Invoice.
- b) In respect of foreign Services rendered:
 - i) the invoicing by a South African Service Provider on behalf of its foreign principal rendering such Service represents a Service rendered by the principal; and
 - ii) the Service Provider's Tax Invoice(s) for the local portion only [i.e. he "commission" for the Services rendered locally] must show the VAT separately.

26) IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

a) Method of Payment

- i) The attention of the Respondent is directed to the ferms and Conditions of Contract which set out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- ii) However, in addition to the foregoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/a finiting proposals.
- iii) The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the intencial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is accordinated.
- iv) The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender strictly in accordance with clause a)i) above. Failure to comply with clause a)i) above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.
 NOTH: The successful Respondent [the Service Provider], where applicable, shall be required to funcish a guarantee covering any advance payments, as set out in clause 23) above [Contractual Securities].

) Lond Monal Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Service Provider's month-end statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax Invoice is correct in all respects in terms of the contract or order. Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the conditional discount period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

27) DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

a) Period Contracts

It will be a condition of any resulting contract/order that the delivery period embodied therein will be governed by the provisions of the Terms and Conditions of Contract.

its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and re-enactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.



- **6.9** The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.
- In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Action of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to camply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement so review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- **7.1** Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information, concerning Transnet's operations and activities, that relates to the Services as may be incessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confider tiality obligations under the Agreement.
- **7.2** The Service rovider shall give Transnet reasonable notice of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- 78 Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's Personnel], Transnet agrees to provide the Service rounder or its Personnel such access to and use of its facilities as is necessary to allow the Service rovider to perform its obligations under the Agreement.

GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider shall:
- **8.1.1** respond promptly to all complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
- **8.1.2** inform Transnet immediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Services;
- **8.1.3** conduct its business in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service Provider and the Service Provider's Services;
- **8.1.4** keep full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider relating to the performance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;

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8.1.5 obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Service Provider;



- **8.1.6** observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
- **8.1.7** comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and
- **8.1.8** ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Verification Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.
 - **8.2** The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
- **8.2.1** render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
- **8.2.2** communicate openly and Longtly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;
- **8.2.3** endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and professionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
- **8.2.4** use its best endeaders and make every diligent effort to meet agreed deadlines;
- **8.2.5** treat it we Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with formes and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
- **8.2.6** Practice and promote its own internal policies aimed at prohibiting and preventing unfair discribination [as further referred to in clause 22 *Equality and Diversity*];
- treat all enquiries from Transnet in connection with the Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the previsions of this clause, the Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
- **8.2.8** when requested by Transnet, provide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties;
- **8.2.9** not allow a conflict of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any of its other customers] and the interests of Transnet;
- **8.2.10** not accept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any gratuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attempt to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
- **8.2.11** not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;

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8.2.12 not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and



8.2.13 immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

9 FEES AND EXPENSES

- **9.1** In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.
- **9.2** Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Translet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].
- **9.3** Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
- **9.3.1** are agreed by Transnet in advance;
- **9.3.2** are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies;
- **9.3.3** are passed on to Transnet at a st with no administration fee; and
- **9.3.4** will only be reimburse in up, orted by relevant receipts.
 - **9.4** All Tax Invoices relating to Fees out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the Personnel carrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

10 INVOICING ND AYMENT

- 10.1 Consider the Service Provider the amounts stipulated in the relevant schedule of Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Service Provider, upon receipt of a valid and up sputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the valid and undisputed Tax Invoices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are valid and undisputed become due and payable to the Service Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below.
- **10.3** All Fees and other sums payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rate.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be submitted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such month-end statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the statement together with all valid and undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting documentation.
- 10.5 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge

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interest on the outstanding amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the period from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.



11 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.
- 11.3 Should Transnet and the Service Provider fail to reach an agreement on Fees for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 25 of this Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution In].

12 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- **12.1.2** Transnet chall grace to the Service Provider an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet Bac ground Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- 12.1.3 The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sub-license to other parties.
- The Service Provider shall grant Transnet access to the Service Provider's Background In allector Property on terms which shall be *bona fide* negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of mmercially exploiting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- All right, title and interest in and to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider, its researchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreground Intellectual Property. The Service Provider shall not at any time during or after the termination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or enforceability of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or anything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- **12.2.2** Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider

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shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.



- 12.2.3 Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- 12.2.4 No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to the all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.
- Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground at atellectual Property.

12.3 Title to Improvement

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new eventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider handby undertakes to sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, neord and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Transnet and the Service Provider shall be sone bly assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining or documenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

12.4 Unauthorised Use of Confidential Information

The Service Provider shall not authorise any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transnet whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promptly notify Transnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Transnet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at Transnet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

12.5 Unauthorised Use of Intellectual Property

12.5.1 The Service Provider agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of infringement, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.

12.5.2 It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be taken against the infringer and the Service Provider shall cooperate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.



- **12.5.3** The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.
- 12.5.4 If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other awards arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible to the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other awards arising out of proceedings.

13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

- 13.1 The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at a firmes as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no platforship of employer and employee shall arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.
- 13.2 The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Strvices are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Proviner will easure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any Transnet premises or any other plemises upon which the Services are to be performed [including but not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and safety requirements. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personnel at all times act in a lawful and proper pages.
- Transhet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personnel whose admission or presence would in the reasonable opinion of Transhet, be undesirable or who represents a threat to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and regulations governing Transhet's Personnel, provided that Transhet notifies the Service Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The reasonable exclusion of any such individual from such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its obligations under the Agreement.
- The Service Provider agrees to use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its Personnel assigned to perform the Services. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those Personnel is necessary, or if Transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect unsatisfactory, including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been absent for any period, then the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent calibre and experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to commencing provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

14 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY



- **14.1** Neither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
 - 1. death or personal injury due to negligence; or
 - 2. fraud.
- 14.2 The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calcular year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
- Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 chove, the nability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise for direct loss or damage arising out of each Default or series of related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.
- Subject to clause 14.1 above and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for an Creason the exclusion of liability in clause 14.4 above is void or unenforce ale, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in cause 14.3 above.
- 14.6 Yothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Service Provider in respect of clause 12[Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16[Confidentiality].

5 INSULANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider under the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a result of its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury to any person and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of such insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- 15.2 The Service Provider shall arrange insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy renewals.
- **15.3** Subject to clause 15.4 below, if the Service Provider fails to effect adequate insurance under this clause 15, it shall notify Transnet in writing as soon as it becomes aware of

the reduction or inadequate cover and Transnet may arrange or purchase such insurance. The Service Provider shall promptly reimburse Transnet for any premiums paid provided such insurance protects the Service Provider's liability. Transnet assumes no responsibility for such insurance being adequate to protect all of the Service Provider's liability.




15.4 In the event that the Service Provider receives written notice from its insurers advising of the termination of its insurance cover referred to in clause 15.1 above or if the insurance ceases to be available upon commercially reasonable terms, the Service Provider shall immediately notify Transnet in writing of such termination and/or unavailability, whereafter either the Service Provider or Transnet may terminate the Agreement on giving the other Party not less than 30 [thirty] days prior written notice to that effect.

16 CONFIDENTIALITY

- **16.1** The Parties hereby undertake the following, Yun and to Confidential Information:
- 16.1.1 not to divulge or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any chenduly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall at what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in steking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
- not to use, explore ermit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the configuratial Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
- 16.1.3 notice make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except then reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;
- not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- **16.1.5** not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, sensitive or Confidential Information;
- **16.1.6** Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such cases;

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- each Party shall be entitled to disclose such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the course of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such employees or consultants honour such obligation.
- **16.1.9** each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any Confidential Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- each Party shall ensure that any person of entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the greement by the person or entity; and
- **16.1.11** each Party may by written potice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees, officers or agents are required to agree non-disclosure undertaking.
 - 16.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
- a Partic can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public brough no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel; or
- 16.2.2 was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-minimal party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality or
- can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a charge duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
 - is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
 - This clause 16 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all documentation furnished to the Service Provider by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation all corporate identity equipment including dyes, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglect to execute the work or to deliver any portion of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transnet may cancel the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or rejected portion of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining commitment shall remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

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
18 TERM AND TERMINATION

- **18.1** Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, the Commencement Date if the Agreement is $[\bullet]$ and the duration shall be for a $[\bullet]$ $[[\bullet]]$ year period, expiring on $[\bullet]$, unless:
- **18.1.1** the Agreement is terminated by either Party in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules or annexures appended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity; or
- **18.1.2** the Agreement is extended at Transnet's option for a further be jod to be agreed by the Parties.
 - 18.2 Either Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party where the other Party has committed a material Default and, where such Default is capable of remedy, has failed to remedy such Default within 30 satisfact lays of receiving notice specifying the Default and requiring its remedy.
 - 18.3 Either Party may terminate the Agreement for thwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to partite debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of inscreancy in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
- **18.3.1** a voluntary arrangement composition or reconstruction of its debts;
- **18.3.2** its winding-up or lice aution;
- 18.3.3 the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer; or
- - Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of beloning aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice in writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a impany whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.
 - **18.5** Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Order hereto at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
 - **18.6** Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice thereof to the other Party.

19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

19.1 Termination in accordance with clause 18*[Term and Termination]* shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall remain in force and in effect.

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- 19.3 To the extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above are in electronic form and contained on non-detachable storage devices, the Service Provider will provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will irretrievably destroy and delete copies so held.
- 19.4 In the event that the Agreement is terminated by the Carvice Provider under clause 18.2[Term and Termination], or in the event that a Work Qroot is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5[Term and Termination], Transnet will pay to the Survice Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned on a pro rata basis] relating to the work moderated by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider in relation to the such work is, which the Service Provider has paid or is legally obliged to pay, in which case, on activity of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will promptly deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- The provisions of claus s [Definitions], 6[Warranties], 12[Intellectual Property Rights], 14[Limitation of Liability], 16[Confidentiality], 19[Consequence of Termination], 25[Dispute Resolution] and 29[Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.
- If either 2 ty [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedia such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party increinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and lameties that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for camages against the Defaulting Party.
 - 5.7 Should:
- the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- **19.7.2** either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under judicial management, whether provisionally or finally; or
- either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of business or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, to terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damages against the other.

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20 ASSIGNMENT



Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Agreement or any interest hereunder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wishes to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment or novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment or novation.

21 FORCE MAJEURE

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either Party under the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire, flood, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, government action, laws or regulations, riots, terrorism or chil occurbance, defaults, delays or discontinuance on the part of independent contractors, suppliers, or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either Party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonable, extended.
- 21.2 Each Party will take all re-sorable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of *force majeure*. If a Patty fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [ninity] days of the act of *force majeure* first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminal the Agreement with immediate notice.

22 EQUALITY AND DEVERSITY

- The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or particle status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- **22.2** Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

23 NON-WAIVER

- **23.1** Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enforce any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not, in any manner, be construed to be a waiver of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.
- Such failure or neglect shall not, in any manner, affect the continued, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

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24 PARTIAL INVALIDITY



If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby.

25 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 25.1 Should any dispute of whatsoever nature arise between the Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to resolve the dispute by negotiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such dispute arising.
- 25.2 If the dispute has not been resolved by such negotiation, either of the Parties may refer the dispute to AFSA and notify the other Party accordingly, which proceedings shall be held in Johanneburg.
- 25.3 Such dispute shall be finally resolve in accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or arbitrators appointed by AFSA.
- This clause constitutes an iscure able consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such programs shat it is not bound by this clause 25.
- 25.5 This clause 25 is severable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement is terminated for any reason.
- 25.6 This clause 25 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction, where grounds for urgency exist.

26 ADDRESSES TOP NOTICES

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The Parties to the Agreement select the physical addresses and facsimile numbers, as a tailed hereafter, as their respective addresses for giving or sending any notice provided for or required in terms of the Agreement, provided that either Party shall be entitled to substitute such their address or facsimile number, as may be, by written notice to the other:

27 WHOLE AND ONLY AGREEMENT

- 27.1 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement constitutes the whole and only agreement between them with regard to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 27.2 The Parties hereby common hat the Agreement replaces all other agreements which exist or may have existed in any form whatever between them, with regard to the subject matter dealt with in the Agreement, including any annexures, appendices, schedules or Work Order(s) appended hereto.

28 AMENDMENT AND CHANGE CONTROL

- Any requirement for an amendment or change to the Agreement or to a Work Order Shall only be valid if it is in writing, signed by both Parties and added to the Agreement as an addendum hereto.
- In the event the Parties cannot agree upon changes, the Parties shall in good faith seek to agree any proposed changes using the dispute resolution procedures in clause 25[Dispute Resolution].

29 GOVERNING LAW

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

29.1 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended or reenacted and any regulations made under it, provided that in the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments to the Agreement as may be appropriate in the

circumstances. If, within a reasonable period of time, the Service Provider and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or on modification of Fees, Deliverables, warranties, or other terms and conditions, either Party may seek to have the matter determined in accordance with clause 25[Dispute Resolution] above.



30 COUNTERPARTS

The Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Either Party may enter into the Agreement by signing any such counterpart.

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SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS


1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet Limited (hereinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2.1 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall imprement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3.1 The Contractor accepts his obligation to amplying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omitsion of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.3.2 Transnet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and managed during execution of the Works.
- 1.3.3 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 It is Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context therwise indicates: -
- The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "**Construction Work**", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
 - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
 - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
 - (a)(d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;

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- 2.4 **"contractor"** means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a documer coupling which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigale, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 **"Risk Assessment"** means a programme to etermine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.8.1 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.

3.1 Procedural Compliance

- 3.2 The Contractor who wite ds to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
 - (a)includes the remolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or
 - (b) includes the ase of explosives to perform construction work; or
 - (singulates the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m,
 - and small also notify the Provincial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 says or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work.
 - (d) includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or
 - (e) includes working at a height greater than 3 metres above ground or a landing.
- 3.2.1 The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of the Construction Regulations, 2003, also shown in Annexure 1 of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer or employee.
- 3.2.2 The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.2.3 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.
- 3.2.4 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate

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competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.

- 3.2.5 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.2.6 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Protekon's safety requirements and procedures.

4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hot work, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
 - (i) The provision as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;
 - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Att that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
 - ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2.1 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.2.2 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
 - (a) The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
 - (b) the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;

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- (c) a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
- (d) a monitoring and review plan
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
 - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
 - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
 - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
 - (d) the site access control measures pertaining to leath and safety to be implemented;
 - the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer with particular respect to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Adh inistrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
 - (f) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.4.1 The Health and Safe's or gramme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different porking methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Technical Officer's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety complittee as an observer.
- 5.4. The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.4.3 The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.4.4 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Technical Officer, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.4.5 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.4.6 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before

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any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.

- 5.4.7 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.4.8 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1.1 In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in tents of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible to the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.1.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and montor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.2The fall protection plan shall include:-
 - (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - (b) the procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
 - (c) the evaluation of the employees physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated politicus;
 - (d) the training of imployees working from elevated positions; and
 - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall plotter in equipment.

7. Pazerds and Potential Hazardous Situations

the Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Technical Officer, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Technical Officer.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Technical Officer upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.
