OBJECTIVE:

This contract covers the following:

- Rendering of pest control services to office buildings and other buildings quarterly and on an as and when basis, i.e.
 Carry out inspections and treatments, bring under control any infestment of pesticides.
- Pest Management should offer innovative pest prevention programm for cockroaches, rodents, booklice, flies, bees,
 Ants, snakes and fumigation of the offices
- The routine treatment programme should include but not by limited to "pest species" specific and focus on the Identification of the pest species followed by specific elimination treatments and maintenance treatment methods.
- Installation of tamper proof bait boxes/stations.
- Service to be provided and delivered time usly by the Service Provider. (Inspections and treatments).
- A low odour pesticide to be used.

WORKS INFORMATION:

- Pest Management should offer innovative pest prevention programme for cockroaches, rodents. bees and flies, ants
 And snakes as well as prevention programme against stored product pests such as rice weevils, indian meal moth, warehouse moth, mealworm beetle, flat grain beetle, lesser grain borer and granary weevils.
- The routine treatment programme should include but not be limited to "pest species" specific and focus on the Identification of the pest species followed by the elimination treatments and maintenance treatment methods.
- Should the use of insecticides be necessary, the Service Provider should take the form of systematic applications in



the form of insecticidal dust, liquid residuals, liquid non-residuals, baits, non-residual insecticidal gas or insecticidal thermal fog, all which will be expertly applied through the various parts of the affected facility.

• All treatment methods, pesticides and pest materials should be in strict compliance with the Department of Agricultural, SABS and local regulations.

DURATION OF CONTRACT:

This contract will be for the period of two years.

SUPERVISION:

- The Service Provider shall exercise supervision over the works at all times during the hours of work or shall be represented by an agent having full power and authority to act on his/her behalf.
- The Service Provider shall be responsible in adhering to the safety clauses of ACT 85 of 1993 as applicable on type of work performed.

HOURS OF WORK:

The Service Provider shall confine the work to normal working hours except when work outside these hours is permitted by the Supervisor in charge at the Service Providers request or ordered by the Supervisor in charge.

PERFOMANCE MONITORING AND EVALUATION:

- On completion of the contract the Site Book/Site Books shall be returned to the Technical Officer managing the contract on behalf of TFR Real Estate Management.

SHE COMPLIANCE

• Contractor to conform with all Safety Requirements including Safety, Health, Environment (SHE) Inductions for Contractors as specified by Transnet Freight Rail (cor (en losed)

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT:

- Payment will be done after receiving the tax invoice, a full detail list of all work performed during the period and a register signed by the Supervisor.
- The Supervisor will certify or the invoice that all work was performed according to the contract and to the satisfaction of Transnet Freight Ran.
- Invoice to be submitted after all sites have been inspected, treated and invoiced.
- In the event of no hardestop or treatment at a site then payment for that period will be withheld.

AGREEMENT PRICE AND ADJUSTMENT FACTOR:

Any price increase due to escalation should be included on the cost of the contract

VALUE-ADDED TAX:

Value-added tax in terms of the Value-added Tax Act No.89 of 1991 should not be included in the rates. Provision is
 made in the Schedule of Prices for the lump addition of Value-added Tax.



SITE REGISTER:

- The Service Provider shall provide a site register and daily diary at the various sites as directed by the Supervisor for the duration of the agreement.

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



- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to prefer these, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levier.
- 2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of contract.
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;



- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise on the duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined tongs, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total levenul between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Covernment Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 "subcontract" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 "total revenue" Lears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empower tent, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and

- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the Nighest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- 4.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn



- 4.4 affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership.

SECTION 6 GENERAL BID CONDITIONS - SERVICES [March 2015]

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DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 1.2 Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- 1.3 **Bid Document(s)** shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 1.4 Business Day shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- 1.5 **Respondent(s)** shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- 1.6 **RFP** shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.7 **RFO** shall mean Request for Quotation;
- **1.8 RFX** shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.9 **Services** shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified in us bit occument;
- 1.10 **Service Provider** shall mean the successful Respondent;
- 1.11 **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by Section 2006 the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 1.12 **Transnet** shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a State Ow ed Jompany; and
- 1.13 **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by Transhit and are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3 SUBMISSION OF BID CONFITS

- A Bid, which shall hereinatter it clude reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be submitted to Transnet no later than the closing rate and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Documents. Late Bids will not be considered.
- 3.2 Bids shall be derivered in a sealed envelope in accordance with the instructions indicated in the Bid Documents with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.
- 3.3 The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

4 USE OF BID FORMS

- 4.1 Where special forms are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and not in other forms or documents bearing their own terms and conditions of contract. Non-compliance with this condition may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- 4.2 Respondents must note that the original Bid forms must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed copy thereof.



4.3 Only if insufficient space has been allocated for a particular response may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using its company's letterhead. This must be duly cross-referenced in the RFX.

5 BID FEES

- 5.1 A non-refundable fee may be charged for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing such Bid Documents.
- 5.2 Only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment with submitting their Bid will be considered.

6 VALIDITY PERIOD

- Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transnet at an, time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the bid.
- Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a specified additional period. In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect of their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change(s) is as a direct and unavoidable consequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

7 SITE VISIT / BRIEFING SESSION

Respondents may be requested to attend a site visit where it is considered necessary to view the site prior to the preparation of Bids, or where Transnet deems it necessary to provide Respondents with additional information relevant to the compilation of their Bids. When such visits or sessions are indicated as compulsory in the Bid Document, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings at failure to do so will result in their disqualification.

8 CLARIFICATION BEFORE THE CLOSING DATE

Should clarification be required on any aspect of the RFX before the closing date, the Responder on st direct such queries to the contact person identified in the Bid Document.

9 COMMUNICATION AFTER THE CLOSING DATE

After the closing date of a Bid [i.e. during the evaluation period] the Respondent may only communicate with the Chairperson or Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

10 UNAUTHORISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Where Bids are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communicate with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential service providers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s).



A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, may be disqualified.

11 POST TENDER NEGOTIATIONS

Transnet reserves the right to conduct post tender negotiations with the preferred bidder or a shortlist of preferred bidders. Should Transnet decide to conduct post tender negotiations, bidders will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. A final evaluation will be conducted in terms of 80/20 or 90/10 (whichever is applicable) and the contract will be negotiated and awarded to the successful bidder(s).

12 RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

All returnable documents listed in the RFX Documents must be submitted with Respondent's Bid. Failure to submit mandatory returnable schedules documents will result in disqualification. Failure to submit other schedules documents may result in disqualification.

13 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of its Bid fails to:

- enter into a formal contract when called upon to do so within such period as Transnet may specify; or
- 13.2 accept an order in terms of the Bid;
- 13.3 furnish satisfactory security when called on to do so for the fulfilment of the contract; or
- 13.4 comply with any condition imposed by ransnet,

Transnet may, in any fuch case, without prejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bid or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Bids afresh, and may recover from the refaulting Respondent any additional expense incurred by Transnet in calling for new oversor in accepting a less favourable offer.

14 CURRENC

All money amounts referred to in a Bid response must be in Rand, the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR], save to the extent specifically permitted in the RFX.

15 PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- 15.1 Prices which are quoted subject to confirmation will not be considered.
- 15.2 Firm prices quoted for the duration of any resulting order and/or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this is in Transnet's best interests.

16 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alterations made by the Respondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items concerned. All such alterations must



be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) concerned being excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

17 EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

- 17.1 The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, affect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- 17.2 It is Transnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. Transnet would request, therefore, that the Respondent give favourable consideration to obtaining forward exchange cover on the foreign currency portion of the Agreement at a cost that is acceptable to Transnet to protect itself against any currency rate fluctuation risks for the duration of any resulting contract or order.
- 17.3 The Respondent who desires to avail itself of the aforementioned facility must at the time of bidding furnish the information called for in the *Exchange and rymittance* section of the Bid Documents and also furnish full details of the principals to whom payment is to be made.
- 17.4 The South African Reserve Bank's approval is required before any foreign currency payments can be made to or on behalf of Respondents.
- 17.5 Transnet will not recognise any claim for adjustment of the order and/or contract price if the increase in price arises after the date on which agreement on an overall Rand contract has been reached.
- 17.6 Transnet reserves the right to request a pro-forma invoice/tax invoice in order to ensure compliance with the contract and Value-Added ax Act no. 89 of 1991 [VAT Act].

18 ACCEPTANCE OF BID

- 18.1 Transnet does not bind itself to accept the lowest priced or any Bid.
- 18.2 Transnet reserves the 19th to accept any Bid in whole or in part.
- 18.3 Upon the acceptance of a Bid by Transnet, the parties shall be bound by these General Bid Conditions and any contractual terms and/or any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- Where the Respondent has been informed by Transnet per fax message or email of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowledgement of receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of delivery to the Respondent.

19 NOTICE TO UNSUCCESSFUL RESPONDENTS

Unsuccessful Respondents shall be advised in writing that their Bids have not been accepted as soon as possible after the closing date of the Bid. On award of business to the successful Respondent all unsuccessful Respondents shall be informed of the name of the successful Respondent and of the reason as to why their Bids have not been successful.



20 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- 20.1 The Service Provider shall adhere to the Terms and Conditions of Contract issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- 20.2 Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer amendments/ alternatives by written submission on its company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed amendments/ alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

21 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- The contract documents will comprise these General Bid Conditions, the Terms and Conditions of Contract and any schedule of "Special Conditions" which form part on the Bid Documents.
- The abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Rid v sponse will constitute the contract between the parties upon receipt by the Respondent of Transnet's letter of award / intent, subject to all additional amendments and/or special conditions there as a greed to by the parties.
- 21.3 Should Transnet inform the Respondent that a forcal contract will be signed, the abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Bid response [and, if any, its covering letter and any subsequent exchange of correspondenc] as well as Transnet's Letter of Acceptance/Intent, shall constitute a binding contract until the final contract is signed.

22 LAW GOVERNING CONTRACT

The law of the Republic of South ofrica shall govern the contract created by the acceptance of a Bid. The *domicilium cital di et executandi* shall be a place in the Republic of South Africa to be specified by the Respondent in its Bid at which all legal documents may be served on the Respondent who shall be to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa. A foreign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative in the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be extered into in the event of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

23 IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be furnished.

24 CONTRACTUAL SECURITIES

The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of an advanced payment guarantee [APG] and/or a performance bond [Performance Bond], as the case may be, to be



furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.

- The security may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any loss or damage which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.
- 24.3 Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stipulated in the Bid Documents.
- The successful Respondent shall be required to submit to Transnet or Transnet's designated official the specified security document(s) within 30 [thirty] calendar days from the date of signature of the contract. Failure to return the securities within the prescribed time shall, save where prior extension has been granted, entitle Transnet without notice to the Service Provider to calcal he contract with immediate effect.
- Additional costs incurred by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider in relation to the conditions of this clause 24 will be for the account of the Service Provider.

25 DELETION OF ITEMS TO BE EXCLUDED FROM BID

The Respondent must delete items for which has not tendered or for which the price has been included elsewhere in its Bid.

26 VALUE-ADDED TAX

- In respect of local Services, i.e. Services to be rendered in the Republic of South Africa, the prices quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive as VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Tax Invoice.
- 26.2 In respect of foreign Services had ed:
- a) the invoicing by a South Trica Service Provider on behalf of its foreign principal rendering such Service represents a Service rendered by the principal; and
- b) the Service Provinc's Tax Invoice(s) for the local portion only [i.e. the "commission" for the Services rendered locally must show the VAT separately.

27 IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

27.1 Method of Payment

- a) The attention of the Respondent is directed to the Terms and Conditions of Contract which set out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- b) However, in addition to the aforegoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or financing proposals.
- c) The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the financial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is adjudicated.
- d) The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender strictly in accordance with clause 27.1a) above. Failure to comply with clause 27.1a) above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.



NOTE: The successful Respondent [the **Service Provider**], where applicable, shall be required to furnish a guarantee covering any advance payments, as set out in clause 24 above *[Contractual Securities]*.

27.2 Conditional Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Service Provider's month-end statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax Invoice is correct in all respects in terms of the contract or order. Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the moditional discount period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

28 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

28.1 Period Contracts

It will be a condition of any resulting contract/order (at the delivery period embodied therein will be governed by the provisions of the Terms and Condition) of Contract.

28.2 Progress Reports

The Service Provider may be required to submit periodical progress reports with regard to the delivery of the Services.

28.3 Emergency Demands as and when required

If, due to unforeseen circums ence, the rendering of the Services covered by the Bid are required at short notice for immediate relivery, the Service Provider will be given first right of refusal for such business. If it is the ble to meet the desired critical delivery period, Transnet reserves the right to purchase such services as may be required to meet the emergency outside the contract if immediate delivery cap be offered from any other source. The "Total or Partial Failure to Perform the Scope of Services" acts of in the Terms and Conditions of Contract will not be applicable in these circumstances.


29 SPECIFICATIONS AND COPYRIGHT

29.1 Specifications


30 BIDS BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- 30.1 Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded directly by the principals or by its South African representative or agent to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents.
- 30.2 In the case of a representative or agent, written proof must be submitted to the effect that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.
- When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the tames of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.
- 30.4 South African representatives or agents of a successful foreign Respondent has when so required enter into a formal contract in the name of their principals and must sign such contract on behalf of the latter.

 In every such case a legal Power of Attorney from their principals must be furnished to Transnet by the South African representative or agents authorising them to enter a to and sign such contract.
- a) Such Power of Attorney must comply with Rule 63 [Authoritication of documents executed outside the Republic for use within the Republic] of the Uniform Rules of Court: Rules regulating the conduct of the proceedings of the several provincial and local divisions of the Supreme Court of South Africa.
- b) The Power of Attorney must be signed by the principal under the same title as used in the Bid Documents.
- c) If a Power of Attorney held by the South African representative or agent includes matters of a general nature besides provision for the electric into and signing of a contract with Transnet, a certified copy thereof should be furnished.
- d) The Power of Attorney must a morise the South African representative or agent to choose the *domicilium* citandi et executandi as provided for in the Terms and Conditions of Contract.
- 30.5 If payment is to be need in South Africa, the foreign Service Provider [i.e. the principal, or its South African agent of representative], must notify Transnet in writing whether, for payment by electronic funds transfer [FT].
- a) funds are to be transferred to the credit of the foreign Service Provider's account at a bank in South
 Africa in Trich case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished; or
- b) funds are to be transferred to the credit of its South African agent or representative, in which case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished.

31 CONFLICT WITH BID DOCUMENT

Should a conflict arise between these General Bid Conditions and the Bid Document issued, the conditions stated in the Bid Document shall prevail.





32 TRANSNET'S LIST OF EXCLUDED TENDERERS (BLACKLIST)

- 32.1 All the stipulations around Transnet's blacklisting process as laid down in Transnet's Supply Chain Policy and Procurement Procedures Manual are included herein by reference. Below follows a condensed summary of this blacklisting procedure.
- Blacklisting is a mechanism used to exclude a company/person from future business with Transnet for a specified period. The decision to blacklist is based on one of the grounds for blacklisting. The standard of proof to commence the blacklisting process is whether a "prima facie" (i.e. on the face of it) case has been established.
- Depending on the seriousness of the misconduct and the strategic importance of the Goods/Services, in addition to blacklisting a company/person from future business, Transnet may decree to terminate some or all existing contracts with the company/person as well.
- 32.4 A supplier or contractor to Transnet may not subcontract any portion or sile contract to a blacklisted company.
- 32.5 Grounds for blacklisting include: If any person/Enterprise which has submitted a Bid, concluded a contract, or, in the capacity of agent or subcontractor, has been associated with such Bid or contract:
- a) Has, in bad faith, withdrawn such Bid after the advertiged closing date and time for the receipt of Bids;
- b) has, after being notified of the acceptance of his Bir, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the bid documents;
- c) has carried out any contract resulting from such bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of the contract;
- d) has offered, promised or even brie in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract;
- e) has acted in a fractive lent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any Government Department or towards any public body, Enterprise or person;
- f) has made any incorrect statement in a certificate or other communication with regard to the Service or his B-BETE status and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that:
- (i) he made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and
- (ii) before making such statement he took all reasonable steps to satisfy himself of its correctness;
- g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the contractor's requirements and which could not be recovered from the contractor;
- h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith.
- Transnet recognizes that trust and good faith are pivotal to its relationship with its suppliers. When a dispute arises between Transnet and its supplier, the parties should use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner, whenever possible. Litigation in bad faith negates the principles of





- 32.7 trust and good faith on which commercial relationships are based. Accordingly, Transnet will not do business with a company that litigates against it in bad faith or is involved in any action that reflects bad faith on its part. Litigation in bad faith includes, but is not limited to the following instances:
- a) Vexatious proceedings. These are frivolous proceedings which have been instituted without proper grounds;
- b) Perjury. Where a supplier commits perjury either in giving evidence or on affida
- c) Scurrilous allegations. Where a supplier makes allegations regarding a senior Tensnet employee which are without a proper foundation, scandalous, abusive or defamatory.
- d) Abuse of court process. When a supplier abuses the court process in order to gain a competitive advantage during a bid process.
- Where any person or Enterprise has been found guilty by a coult of law, tribunal or other administrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 Years, such person/Enterprise may also be blacklisted. Serious breaches of the law would include but are not limited to corruption, fraud, theft, extortion, or contraventions of the Competition Act 89 of 1998 (e.g. collusive tendering). This process excludes minor convictions such as traffic offences or personal disagreements between parties which have no bearing on the business operations of the person or Enterprise.
- Grounds for blacklisting include a company/pers in recorded as being a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public ector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Tender Defaulters.
- Ompanies associated with the person,'s guilty of misconduct (i.e. entities owned, controlled or managed by such persons), any companies subsequently formed by the person(s) guilty of the misconduct and/or an existing company where such person(s) acquires a controlling stake may be considered for blacklisting. 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PREAMBLE

Transnet values full compliance with all relevant laws and regulations, ethical standards and the principles of economical use of resources, fairness and transparency in its relations with its Bidders / Suppliers.

In order to achieve these goals, Transnet and the Bidder / Supplier hereby enter into this agreement hereinafter referred to as the "Integrity Pact" which will form part of the Bidder's / Supplier's application for registration with Transnet as a vendor.

The general purpose of this Integrity Pact is to agree on avoiding all forms of dishtnesty, fraud and corruption by following a system that is fair, transparent and free from any undue influence prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of any procurement and / or reverse logistics event and any further contract to be entered into between the Parties, relating to such event.

All Bidders / Suppliers will be required to sign and comply with undertaking contained in this Integrity Pact, should they want to be registered as a Transnet vendor.

14 OBJECTIVES

- 14.1 Transnet and the Bidder / Supplier agree to enter into this Integrity Pact, to avoid all forms of dishonesty, fraud and corruption including practices that are anti-competitive in nature, negotiations made in bad faith and under-pricing by allowing a system that is fair, transparent and free from any influence / unprejudiced dealings prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of the contract to be entered into with a view to:
 - a) Enable Transnet to obtain the desired contract at a reasonable and competitive price in conformity to the defined specifications of the works, goods and services; and
 - b) Enable Bidders / Supplies to abstain from bribing or participating in any corrupt practice in order to secure the contract

15 COMMITMENTS OF TRANSME

Transnet commits to talk at measures necessary to prevent dishonesty, fraud and corruption and to observe the following principles:

- 15.1 Transnet dere by undertakes that no employee of Transnet connected directly or indirectly with the sourcing evolution and ensuing contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept directly or through intermediatives any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the Bidder, either for themselves or for any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to any contract.

16 OBLIGATIONS OF THE BIDDER / SUPPLIER

- **16.1** The Bidder / Supplier commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its bid or during any ensuing contract stage in order to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and in particular the Bidder / Supplier commits to the following:
 - a) The Bidder / Supplier will not, directly or through any other various or firm, offer, promise or give to Transnet or to any of Transnet's employees involved in the bidding process or to any third person any material or other benefit or payment, in order to obtain in exchange an advantage during the bidding process; and
 - b) The Bidder / Supplier will not offer, directly of through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or manaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducer ent to any employee of Transnet, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for any alvantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- **16.2** The acceptance and giving of gifts may be confitted provided that:

 - b) many low retail value gifts. Inot exceed R 1 000 within a 12 month period;

- 16.5 The Bidder / Supplier will not commit any criminal offence urger the relevant anti-corruption laws of South Africa or any other country. Furthermore, the Bidder / Supplier will not use for illegitimate purposes or for restrictive purposes or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information provided by Transnet as part of the business relationship regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- 16.6 A Bidder / Supplier of foreign origin shall discrete the name and address of its agents or representatives in South Africa, if any, involved directly or indirectly in the registration or bidding process. Similarly, the Bidder / Supplier of South African nationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any involved directly or indirectly in the registration or bidding process.
- **16.7** The Bidder / Supplier will no reis epresent facts or furnish false or forged documents or information in order to influence the bidding process to the advantage of the Bidder / Supplier or detriment of Transnet or the competitors.
- **16.8** The Bidder / Supplier shall furnish Transnet with a copy of its code of conduct, which code of conduct shall reject the use of bribes and other dishonest and unethical conduct, as well as compliance programmed in the implementation of the code of conduct.
- **16.9** The Bidde 7 Sup Via will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to ach offences.

17 INDEPENDENT BIDDING

- **17.1** For the purposes of that Certificate in relation to any submitted Bid, the Bidder declares to fully understand that the word "competitor" shall include any individual or organisation, other than the Bidder, whether or not affiliated with the Bidder, who:
 - a) has been requested to submit a Bid in response to this Bid invitation;
 - b) could potentially submit a Bid in response to this Bid invitation, based on their qualifications, abilities or experience; and
 - c) provides the same Goods and Services as the Bidder and/or is in the same line of business as the Bidder.

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- **17.2** The Bidder has arrived at his submitted Bid independently from, and without consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor. The imposition and duration of the exclusion will be determined by the severity of the transgression. The decision to extend the blacklist to associated companies will be at the sole discretion of Transnet.

PREVIOUS TRANSCRISSIONS 20

- 20.2 If it is found to be that the Bidder / Supplier made an incorrect statement on this subject, the Bidder / Supplier can be rejected from the registration process or removed from the Bidder / Supplier database, if already registered, for such reason (refer to the Breach of Law Form contained in the applicable RFX document.)

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21 SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS

- 21.1 Transnet shall also take all or any one of the following actions, wherever required to:
 - a) Immediately exclude the Bidder / Supplier from the bidding process or call off the pre-contract negotiations without giving any compensation the Bidder / Supplier. However, the proceedings with the other Bidders / Suppliers may continue;
 - b) Immediately cancel the contract, if already awarded or signed, without giving any compensation to the Bidder / Supplier;
 - c) Recover all sums already paid by Transnet;
 - d) Encash the advance bank guarantee and performance bond or warranty bond, if furnished by the Bidder / Supplier, in order to recover the payments, already made by Transnet, along with interest;
 - e) Cancel all or any other contracts with the Bidder / Supplier; and
 - f) Exclude the Bidder / Supplier from entering into any bid with Transnet in intur-

22 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- **22.1** A conflict of interest includes, inter alia, a situation in which:
- a) A Transnet employee has a personal financial interest in bidding / supplying entity; and
- b) A Transnet employee has private interests or personal vonsiderations or has an affiliation or a relationship which affects, or may affect, or may be perceived to affect his / her judgment in action in the best interest of Transnet, or could affect the exployee's motivations for acting in a particular manner, or which could result in, or be perceived as favouritism or nepotism.
- **22.2** A Transnet employee uses his / her polition, or privileges or information obtained while acting in the capacity as an employee for:
 - a) Private gain or advancement; or
 - b) The expectation of private gain, or any other advantage accruing to the employee must be declared in a prescribed form.
 - Thus, conflicts of interest of any bid committee member or any person involved in the sourcing process must be declared in a prescribed form.
- 22.3 If a Bidder / Supplier has or becomes aware of a conflict of interest i.e. a family, business and / or social relationship between its owner(s) / member(s) / director(s) / partner(s) / shareholder(s) and a Transnet employee / member of Transnet's Board of Directors in respect of a bid which will be considered for the aid process, the Bidder / Supplier:
 - a) must disclose the interest and its general nature, in the Request for Proposal ("RFX") declaration form or
 - b) notes notes. Transnet immediately in writing once the circumstances has arisen.
- **22.4** The Bidder / Supplier shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any committee member or any person involved in the sourcing process, where this is done, Transnet shall be entitled forthwith to rescind the contract and all other contracts with the Bidder / Supplier.

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23 MONITORING

- 23.1 Transnet will be responsible for appointing an independent Monitor to:
 - a) Conduct random monitoring of compliance to the provisions of this Integrity Pact for contracts entered into between Transnet and the Bidder / Supplier for less than R100,000.000 (one hundred million Rand) in value;
 - b) Monitor compliance to the provisions of this Integrity Pact for contracts entered into between Transnet and the Bidder / Supplier for greater than R100,000.000 (one hundred million Rand) in value; and
 - c) Investigate any allegation of violation of any provisions of this Integrity Pact or contracts entered into between Transnet and the Bidder / Supplier, irrespective of value.
- 23.2 The Monitor will be subjected to Transnet's Terms of Conditions of Contract for the Provision of Services to Transnet, as well as to Transnet's Supplier Code of Conduct.

24 EXAMINATION OF FINANCIAL RECORDS, DOCUMENTATION AND RELECTRONIC DATA

For the purpose of Monitoring, as stipulated above, the Monitor hall be entitled to:

a) Examine the financial records, documentation and or electronic date of the Bidder / Supplier / Transnet. The Bidder / Supplier / Transnet shall provide all requested information / documentation / data to the Monitor and shall extend all held possible for the purpose of such examination.

25 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 25.1 Transnet recognises that trust and good faith are pivotal to its relationship with its Bidders / Suppliers. When a dispute arises her yeen Transnet and its Bidder / Supplier, the parties should use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner, whenever possible. Litigation in bad faith regards the principles of trust and good faith on which commercial relationships are based. Accordingly, following a blacklisting process as mentioned in paragraph 19 above, Transnet will not to business with a company that litigates against it in bad faith or is involved in any action that reflects bad faith on its part. Litigation in bad faith includes, but is not limited to the following a stances:
 - a) **Vexations proceedings:** these are frivolous proceedings which have been instituted without proper groups,
 - b) Per try: where a supplier make a false statement either in giving evidence or on an affidavit;
 - Scurrilous allegations: where a supplier makes allegations regarding a senior Transnet employee which are without proper foundation, scandalous, abusive or defamatory; and
 - d) **Abuse of court process:** when a supplier abuses the court process in order to gain a competitive advantage during a bid process.

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26 **GENERAL**

- 26.1 This Integrity Pact is governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa.
- 26.2 The actions stipulated in this Integrity Pact are without prejudice to any other legal action that may follow in accordance with the provisions of the law relating to any civil or criminal proceedings.
- 26.3 The validity of this Integrity Pact shall cover all the bidding processes and will be valid for an indefinite period unless cancelled by either Party.
- 26.4 Should one or several provisions of this Integrity Pact turn out to be invalid he remainder of this Integrity Pact remains valid.
- 26.5 Should a Bidder / Supplier be confronted with dishonest, fraudulen or con uptive behaviour of one or more Transnet employees, Transnet expects its Bidders / Suppliers to report this behaviour directly to a senior Transnet official / employee or alternatively by using Transnet's "Tip-Off Anonymous" hotline number 0800 003 056, whereby your confidentiality is guaranteed.

The Parties hereby declare that each of them has read and understood the clauses of this Integrity Pact and belief, the information provided in this and shall abide by it. To the best of the Parties' know Integrity Pact is true and correct.
