1. PROPOSAL REQUEST

2 FORMAL BRIEFING

Transnet shall not, at the opening of responses, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Proposals / information received, i.e. pricing, relivery, etc. The names and locations of the Respondents will be divulged to other Respondents upon request.

Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RTP other than that shown on the envelope.

No slips are to be attached to the response documents. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Alterations, as titions or deletions should not be made by the Respondent to RFP documents. Any alterations must be initialed by the person who signs the Bid Documents

Tenders may only be submitted on the tender documentation that is issued. Telegraphic, telephonic, facsimile, email and late tenders will not be accepted.

Tenders submitted by Tenderers must be leatly bound and the inclusion of loose documents must be avoided.

Requirements for sealing addressing, delivery, opening and assessment of tenders are stated in the Tender Data.

Compliance of tender(1) with Transnet's requirements is the sole responsibility of the Tenderer and any costs incurred in subsequent modifications to or replacement of equipment accepted by Transnet SOC Libin good faith on the grounds of certified compliance with specified standards by the contractor and in fact found to be inadequate in such respects, will be to the relevant Tenderer's account.

3 BNOAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC SLIGATIONS

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

Transnet would therefore prefer to do business with enterprises who share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered responses. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

The Department of Trade and Industry [DTI] is currently in the process of reviewing the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice [Code Series 000]. Transnet reserves the right to amend this RFP in line with such reviews and/or amendments once they have come into effect. Transnet furthermore reserves the right to adjust the thresholds and evaluation processes to be aligned with such changes which may be issued by the DTI after the issue date of this RFP.

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3.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations. Respondents are to note the following:

- Proposals will be evaluated on price which will be allocated 80 or 90 points and preference which will be allocated 20 or 10 points, dependent on the value of the Services.
- The 80/20 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Services will be less than R 1,000,000.00. However, if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received exceed R 1,000,000.00, the RFP will be cancelled.
- The 90/10 preference point system applies where the acquisition of the Services will exceed R 1,000,000.00. However, if the 307 0 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids reserved are equal to or below R 1,000,000.00, the RFP will be cancelled.

The 80/20 / 90/10 preference point system is applied ble to this RFP.

When Transnet invites prospective service providers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents [Large Enterprises and QSE's - see below] to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Government Gazette No 34612, Notice No. 754 data of 3 September 2011. Valid B-BBEE Verification Certificates must be issued by

- a) Verification Agencies accorded by the South African National Accreditation System [SANAS]; o
- b) Registered Auditors approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA], in accordance with the approval granted by the Department of Trade and Industry

A Verification Certificate issued must reflect the weighted points attained by the measured entity for each element of the scorecard as well as the overall B-BBEE rating. Enterprises will be rated by Verification Agencies or Registered Auditors based on the following.

- a Large Enterprises [i.e. annual turnover greater than R35 million]:
 - Rating level based on all seven elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
 - Qualifying Small Enterprises QSE [i.e. annual turnover between R5 million and R35 million]:
 - Rating based on any four of the elements of the B-BBEE scorecard
- c) Exempted Micro Enterprises EME [i.e. annual turnover less than R5 million]: In accordance with B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice, any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R 5 million or less qualifies as an EME.
 - Automatic rating of B-BBEE Level 4 irrespective of race or ownership
 - Black¹ ownership greater than 50% or Black Women ownership greater than 50% automatically qualify as B-BBEE Level 3

Black means South African Blacks , Coloureds and Indians, as defined in the B-BBEE Act, 53 of 2003



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Sufficient evidence to qualify as an EME would be a certificate [which may be in the form of a letter] from an auditor, accounting officer or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS. The certificate must confirm the company's turnover, Black ownership / Black female ownership and B-BBEE status level.

Respondents are required to furnish proof of the above to Transnet. [i.e. a detailed scorecard as stipulated above in respect of Large Enterprises and QSEs, or a certificate in respect of EMEs].

In this RFP, Transnet will accordingly allocate a maximum of 10/20 [ten/twenty] points in accordance with the 80/20 / 90/10 preference point system prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations to the Respondent's final score based on an entity's B-BBEE scorecard rating.

N.B. Failure to submit a B-BBEE certificate, which is valid as at the Closing Date of this RFP, will result in a score of zero being allocated in 13-BBEE.

3.2 B-BBEE Joint Ventures, Consortiums and/or Subcontractors

In addition to the above, Respondents who would wish to enter into a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with, a subcontract portions of the contract to, B-BBEE entities, must state in their RFPs the percentage of the total contract value that would be allocated to such B-BBEE entities, should they be successful in being awarded any business. A valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate in respect of such B-BBEE JV or consortium partners and/or subcontractor(s), as well as a breakdown of the distribution of the aforementioned percentage must also be furnished with the RFI Bic to enable Transnet to evaluate in accordance with the processes outlined in the B-BBEE Preference Points Claim Form appended hereto.

a) JVs or Consortiums

If contemplating a JV or consortium, Respondents should also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

As part of an incorporated JV/consortium's Bid response, the incorporated JV/consortium must submit a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate in its registered name.

(ii) Unincorporated JVs/Consortiums

As part of an unincorporated JV/consortium's tendered response. the unincorporated JV/consortium must submit a consolidated B-BBEE certificate as if it was a group structure and such scorecard must have been prepared for this RFP in particular.

N.B. Failure to submit a B-BBEE certificate in respect of the W or Consortium, which is valid as at the Closing Date of this RFP, will result in a sex of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

Supplier Development Initiatives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development and inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. 

SUPPLIER CODE OF CONDUCT

Transnet aims to achieve the best value for money when buying or selling goods and obtaining services. This however must be done in an open and fair manner that supports and drives a competitive economy. Underpinning our process are several acts and policies that any supplier dealing with Transnet must understand and support. These are:

- The Transnet Supply Chain Policy
- Section 217 of the Constitution the five pillars of Public PSCM [Procurement and Supply Chain Management]: fairness, equity, transparency, competitiveness and cost effectiveness;
- The Public Finance Management Act [PFMA];
- The Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act [PPPFA];
- The Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act [B-BBEL] and
- The Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act

This Code of Conduct has been included in this RFP to formally apprise prospective Transnet Suppliers of Transnet's expectations regarding the behaviour and conduct of its Suppliers.

Prohibition of bribes, kickbacks, unlawful payments, and other corrupt practices

Transnet is in the process of transforming itself into a self-sustaining State Owned Company [SOC], actively competing in the logistic industry. Our aim is to become a world class, profitable, logistics organisation. As such, our transformation is focused on adopting a performance culture and to adopt behaviours that will enable this transformation.

 - illegally influence their judgement or conduct or to ensure the desired outcome of a sourcing activity;
 - win or retain business or to influence any act or decision of any decision stakeholders involved in sourcing decisions; or
 - gain an improper advantage.
 - There may be an occasion when a Supplier is confronted with fraudulent or corrupt behaviour by a Transnet employee. We expect our Suppliers to use our "Tip-offs Anonymous" Hot line to report these acts [0800 003 056].

- b) Transnet is firmly committed to the ideas of free and competitive enterprise.
 - Suppliers are expected to comply with all applicable laws and regulations regarding fair competition and antitrust.
 - Transnet does not engage with non-value adding agents or representatives solely for the purpose of increasing B-BBEE spend [fronting].
- c) Transnet's relationship with Suppliers requires us to clearly define requirements, exchange information and share mutual benefits.
 - Generally, Suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our Suppliers, we will not to cate any illegal activities. These include, but are not limited to:
 - misrepresentation of their product [e.g. of the manufacture, specifications, intellectual property rights];
 - collusion;

The *Contractor* must consider all equipment as "live", notwithstanding any safety measures introduced into the system to reduce induced stray voltages to a safe level.
- 3.1.4. All personnel under the control of the *Contractor* must be made aware of the danger of "live" electrical wires and cables as well as induced stray voltages into cables and equipment before a commencement is made with the work.
- 3.1.5. During installation all syn to measures prescribed by the Machinery And Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1095 as ociated with working on a project of this nature shall be adhered to and particular a teption shall be given to the storage of inflammable materials and the use of naked flame for ther fire hazard operations.
- 3.1.6. Special cart shall be exercised when welding or flame cutting operations occur and Contactors e required to provide suitable fire fighting equipment at close hand to these operations.
- 3.1.7 To the application of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 the site and works shall be deemed to be under the *Contractor's* control for the duration of the contract and any subsequent maintenance period during which work is taking place. The *Contractor* shall be regarded as the employer and shall be responsible for ensuring that the requirements of the Act and the regulations are implemented on the work site.

The weighbridge shall be able to automatically (i.e. without an operator present) weigh individual wagons whilst in motion, at an accuracy of CIML class 2, initial verification accuracy, as specified in regulation R106-1 of 1997 (or latest). Under this can be understood that during in-motion tests with a test train, the maximum permissible error on 90% of the number of wagons on the test train during any test run is 1%. The maximum permissible error for the remaining vagons, which may not exceed 10% of the total amount of wagons in the test their, is 2%. This accuracy is applicable for speeds from just in motion up to the maximum operating speed on the specific site.
- 1.4. The weighbridge shall comply with Sport et specification No. BBC7593 with the exception that accuracy that meets the SABS requirements for commercial in-motion weighing as stated in paragraph 5.1.1 will not be reculied.
- 1.5. The Contractor shall state at nown constraints to the effective operation of their weighbridge not otherwise covered in this and associated specifications.

Communication

- 1.6. The weighbridge shall include a GPRS modem to communicate its data as specified in BBC7593 to the ITCMs and e control office.
- 1.7. The *Contractor* shall provide detail on the protocol for and content of communication between the very toridge and the ITCMS, within the constraints of specification BBC7593.

Calibration

1.8. The weighbridge shall be calibrated on commissioning and maintain the specified accuracy for minimum period of at least 12 months unless the ballast has been disturbed (e.g. by a ballast tamper or sifting machine).

Enclos re

- 1.9 The Contractor shall supply a suitable enclosure to contain the equipment (excluding the rail-mounted equipment). The enclosure shall preferably be a concrete cubicle (similar to the Rocla cubicles used for signalling equipment between Mount Vernon and Cato Ridge).
- 1.10. The enclosure shall be weatherproof and resistant to vandalism, fire and corrosion. It shall be erected or placed at a level higher than the surrounding area in a manner which minimises the possibility of flooding as a result of rain, hail or snow. It shall be equipped with a sturdy lockable door (lockable at top, bottom and middle), adequate ventilation (with or without extractor fan) and adequate measures to prevent ingress of birds and rodents. The standard IP rating shall be at least IP 56.
- 1.11. If forced ventilation is required, it shall be by means of an extractor fan through dust filters.
- 1.12. If the system requires an air-conditioned environment, then a dual air conditioning system and adequate measures to prevent ingress of birds and rodents shall be provided. The air conditioning system must function in such a way that only one unit is working at a time and that automatic switching between the units takes place at preset intervals.
- 1.13. The enclosure shall be equipped with a light suitable for maintenance purposes and with a 15A power socket.



Contract

- 1.14. The enclosure shall have enough space to allow access to all parts of the equipment necessary for maintenance. Adequate space shall be made available for communication equipment, e.g. a modem and/or flexmux.
- 1.15. The *Contractor* shall provide an electrical Certificate of Compliance for each enclosure.

Power supply

- 1.16. The incoming power supply will be single phase only with nominal voltage 230V at 50Hz. This will not be an uninterruptible supply.
- 1.17. The voltage fluctuation which can be expected ranges from +8% to -23% from nominal. Total harmonic distortion of up to 40% can be expected, as indicated in Appendix B.
- 1.18. All equipment directly connected to the external supply or susceptible to transients originating from the external supply shall be capable of operating no mally without suffering damage with the supply as specified.
- 1.19. The Contractor shall supply and install the power supply cable from the designated termination point at the H-mast, switching structure or termination cabinet provided by Transnet Freight Rail to the enclosure. In DC electrified areas the creen of the power cable shall not be connected to the switching structure or termination cabinet, but shall be isolated from it by means of an approved "block joint". Any conclusive protection pipe for the cable shall also be isolated from the structure. Refer to the schematic diagram of a typical power supply step-down point in Appendix A.
- 1.20. In addition to the lightning protection required for the AWIMS in terms of specification BBC7593, the *Contractor* shall provide adequate lightning protection on the incoming power supply.
- 1.21. The *Contractor* shall supply a sulfable uninterruptible power supply (UPS). The UPS shall utilise a true online topology is a connected loads are isolated from irregularities of the main supply without interruption and are supplied from the UPS. The UPS shall have a battery standby period of at least 4 hours at full load.
- 1.22. The quality of UPS of tou will be in accordance with South African Bureau of Standards publication No. NRS 048-2 996 ("Electricity Supply Quality of Supply") Part 2. Note that the quoted SAB2 publication is not attached to the specification. *Contractors* are expected to source their cory from the SABS.
- 1.23. The Contractor shar specify in his tender the total power rating required at each site. This rating shall include provision for illumination and for tools and instruments required during maintenance and calibration.

Installation

- 1.24. The Contractor shall be responsible for the entire installation, including the enclosure, power example of the contractor and earthworks (where required) at the site shall be done or arranged by the Contractor and shall be included in the contract.
- 25. The installation shall comply with the standards specified in specification CSE-504/7.
- 1.26. Installation shall be according to the approved drawings, applicable specifications and standards.
- 1.27. The Contractor shall supply all track equipment necessary for the successful functioning and protection of the weighbridge including trackside monitoring equipment, gauges, sensors and protection plates.
- 1.28. Track equipment must be installed as indicated on the approved equipment layout drawing from the supplier and the site and enclosure layout.
- 1.29. Trenching and cable laying shall be to Specification CSE-516/1 (January 1985). The Technical Officer must inspect and approve the cable trench before closure. All trench depths must be 800mm and slabbed. Danger tape is to be provided 110 mm above the slabs.
- 1.30. In the event of the *Contractor* wanting to make use of sub-contractors for cable laying and trenching, these sub-contractors must be nominated from Transnet's approved list. This list is confidential and for information of the main *Contractor* only. The list shall not be distributed to any trenching and cable laying sub-contractor.



Contract

- 1.31. The Contractor must provide for all the tail cables, trenching, pipe crossings, jointing, termination and testing of equipment cables. Screened cable shall be used where appropriate.
- 1.32. Cables supplied must conform to equipment specification and industry standards approved by Transnet Freight Rail.
- 1.33. The Contractor must provide sand, stone, cement and GI piping where needed to protect cables.
- 1.34. Cables must be properly secured in hydraulic hosing, cable flex or GI pipes as specified.

Testing and commissioning

Maintenance

- 1.41. The Contractor gives the under aking that all parts, calibration details and any other information and/or items that may be required for the maintenance, calibration and repair of the weighbridge will be made available at ruling market prices to TFR and to repairing or servicing agents in the industry
- 1.42. The Contractor shall include in his tender the prices of all parts, software, documentation, test equipment and any other items that will be required for the repair and maintenance of the weighbridge under normal as well as abnormal conditions (e.g. direct lightning, derailments, the tail divandalism).

MINIMUM COMMUNAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS IN AREAS CUTSIDE THE JURISDICTION OF A LOCAL AUTHORITY: TEMPORARY FACILITIES FOR CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL

1. CAMPS

- 1.1 Prior to the erection of any camp, the Contractor shall submit to the Technical Officer, for his approval, details of his proposals as to the site, water supply, sanitation, and size and type of buildings. Where the site is on private land, the Contractor shall submit the written approval for the use of the site of the relevant statutory authority and of the owner and occupier of the land (as applicable).
- 1.2 Camps must not be erected on land infested with field rodents.
- 1.3 Adequate drain ge shalbe provided to carry off storm and waste water.
- 1.4 Buildings shall be built to a neat and orderly pattern.
- 1.5 All buildings shall have smooth, hard, impervious floors, graded to provide effective drainale and to permit washing.
- 1.6 Catyps shall be maintained by the Contractor at his own expense in a clean and tidy condition. The Contractor shall take such steps as the Technical Officer and landowner/occupier may demand to prevent the creation of a nuisance.
- 1.7 When so instructed by the Technical Officer, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, erect suitable screens between the camp and any public road, thoroughfare or railway line.
- 1.8 After removal of a camp, the Contractor shall, at his own expense, restore the site to its original condition to the satisfaction of the Technical Officer and of the landowner and occupier where the site is on private land.

2. HOUSING

2.1 Every living room shall have cross ventilation, both constant and occasional. Where only one window is provided, it shall not be in the same wall as the door.



- 2.2 Dimensions of living rooms shall be sufficient to allow 3.5 square metres of floor area and 11 cubic metres of air space for each person over the age of 10 years. The floor area of any living room shall not be less than 7,8 square metres.
- 2.3 Flat-roofed quarters shall have a minimum roof height of 3 metres above floor level. For quarters with pitched roofs, the wall height shall be not less than 2,6 metres above the floor with a minimum height above floor of 3 metres at the top of the pitch.
- 2.4 Doors shall not be less than 2m x 0,75m and must be halved.
- 2.5 Windows of each living room shall have an area not less than one twelfth of the floor area and shall be capable of opening to at least half their full area.
- 2.6 In areas where malaria is prevalent, doors and with dows must be fitted with gauze screens.
- 2.7 Cooking shelters shall comprise roofed structures, three sides of which shall be enclosed by a weatherproof material, approved by the Technical Officer to a height of at least **1m** above ground level.
 - 2.7.1 Sleeping quarters shall not accommodate more than 8 persons per room.
 - 2.7.2 Pegboards shall be carried on metal or concrete supports and shall be separated by partitions not less than 0,4 metres high extending to within 150mm of the end of the bunk. Pegboards shall be removable for cleaning.

3. WATER SUPPLY AN APLUTION FACILITIES

- 3.1 The Contractor shall ensure that an adequate and conveniently situated supply of potal le water is provided.
- 3.2 Sparate buildings for ablution facilities shall be provided. Where approval has been blamed for the housing of both males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportion shall be 1 cubicle for 20 persons.
- 3.3 Waste water shall be hygienically disposed of.

4. **SANITATION**

4.1 Separate buildings for latrine facilities shall be provided. Where housing are provided for both males and females, separate facilities for each sex shall be provided. The proportions shall be at least one squatting seat for every 15 persons or less in the case of pit latrines, or one for every 10 persons or less in case of pail latrines.

Latrines shall be fly proof and sited at least 10 metres from any other building, and shall not face on any public road, thoroughfare, railway line or residential property. Pits shall not be less than 2,5 metres deep and sited not less than 120 metres from nearest underground water source.



- 4.2 Latrines shall be so constructed, situated and maintained, and night soil so disposed of as to prevent access by animals, breeding of flies, pollution of streams and domestic water supplies, and other nuisances. Where a night soil removal service is operated by a competent authority, use of such service shall be obligatory, and the use of pit latrines and atria pits will not be permitted.
- 4.3 At least one refuse bin of adequate size with close fitting lid shall be provided for each building. Refuse bins shall be emptied and cleaned out daily.
- 4.4 Labour shall be employed on camp sanitation duties on the following basis:-
 - 4.4.1 Where the number of persons living at the campus 0 or less one unit.
 - 4.4.2 For additional numbers over 20 living at the comp one unit per 100 or part thereof.
- 4.5 Unless refuse is removed by a competent authority, it shall be disposed of in pits and covered over daily with a layer of court of sufficient thickness to prevent depredations by rodents and the breeding of flies.
- 4.6 Adequate measures shall be taken a ainst all vermin and insects responsible for the spread of disease. Any instructions of a competent health authority shall be carried out promptly and implicitly.
- 4.7 Buildings and bedboards shall be treated whenever necessary with an approved insecticide.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall permit and facilitate inspection of the camp and structures on the site by the stuff or Transnet or any other competent authority, and shall comply with any reas nable request by such staff or any other competent authority to eliminate any upsant ary condition.
- 4.9 outbreak of infectious disease shall immediately be reported telephonically and confirmed in writing to the Technical Officer.
- 4.10 The keeping of animals of any sort is not permitted.
- 4.11 The Contractor shall have on hand at the camp the necessary tools, disinfectants and cleaning materials to maintain and clean the sanitary facilities.

5. **RATIONS**

Rations, where supplied by the Contractor, shall be stored in a suitable and rodent proof building with sufficient shelving.

SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE RECULATIONS

1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and Transnet SOC Ltd (helpinafter referred to as "Transnet") are individual employers, each in its own right with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises of the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Si fety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by Transnet, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulator's notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 Transhet accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Project Manager or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -



- 2.2 The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be "Construction Work", which, in terms of the Construction Regulations, 2003 means any work in connection with: -
 - (a) the erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - (b) the installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling;
 - (c) the construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system or any similar civil engineering structure; or
 - (d) the moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling, or any similar type of work;
- 2.3 "competent person" in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed: Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority 2 st, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 "contractor" means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 "fall protection plan" means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and necode applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 "health and salety file" means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information equired to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;
- 2.7 "Health and Safety Plan" means a documented plan which addresses the hazards Nortified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 "Risk Assessment" means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.
- 3. Procedural Compliance
- 3.1 The Contractor who intends to carry out any construction work shall, before carrying out such work, notify the Provincial Director in writing if the construction work:-
 - (a) includes the demolition of a structure exceeding a height of 3 metres; or



- (b) includes the use of explosives to perform construction work; or
- includes the dismantling of fixed plant at a height greater than 3m. (c)

and shall also notify the Provincial Director in writing when the construction work exceeds 30 days or will involve more than 300 person days of construction work and if the construction work:-

- includes excavation work deeper than 1m; or (a)
- includes working at a height greater than 3 metres about (b) round or a landing.
- The notification to the Provincial Director shall be on a form similar to Annexure A of 3.2 the Construction Regulations, 2003, also shown in Agreement of this Specification. The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the completed notification form is kept on site for inspection by an inspector, Project Manager or employee.
- The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to 3.3 Annexure 2 of this Specification and cally r copies thereof to the Project Manager. Copies should also be retained on the heath and safety file.
- Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor 3.4 shall deliver copies thereof to the Project Manager.
- In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a 3.5 construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be ne essary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, at in Amexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.6 The Confector shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Project Manager an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and in access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any contractors under his control.
- 3.7 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Project Manager with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

Special Permits 4.

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Project Manager or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.



5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
 - (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act:
 - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
 - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, it terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and vafety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a sisk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any Construction Work and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Nearth and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the ollowing:
 - (a) \text{ identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
 - the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
 - a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
 - (d) a monitoring and review plan.
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
 - (a) The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
 - (b) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
 - (c) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;

- (d) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;
- the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Project Manager with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 8 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
- (f) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.4 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Project Manager's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Project Manager's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Project Manager or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.5 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken, shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.6 The Contractor that stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site or inspection by an inspector, Project Manager, agent, subcontractor, employee, registred employee organisation, health and safety representative or any member of the leath and safety committee.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.



5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1 In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include:-
 - (a) A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - (b) the procedures and methods to idd ess all the identified risks per location;
 - (c) the evaluation of the employees hysical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions,
 - (d) the training of employees working from elevated positions; and
 - (e) the procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Project Manager shall immediately notify one another of any hazardors or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other as section to the contract work.

8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Project Manager, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Project Manager.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Project Manager upon completion of the Construction Work and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.



6.1. Basic Conditions of Employm BCE The relevant sections are to be complied with special attention to at least the following —

Working hours,

Conditions of employment and Remuneration, Termination of employment,

6.2. Compensition for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 1993 (Act No 130 of 1993) COIDA The Act provides for compensation for health conditions, death, diseases and or injuries that arises out of and in the course of an employee's duties. All employers-Principle Contractor and Contractors must register with a compensation insurer - either COIDA or FEMA. They must be in good standing - have proof of having paid their current assessment - in the form of either a receipt of payment or a letter of good standing from their compensation insured prior to commencing work on the project with a copy on Site.

6.3. Occupational Health and Safety Act 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993)

OH&SA

The OH&SA is the primary law regulating occupational health and safety matters. The Act is a framework Act that provides for the development of detailed rules and standards through regulation. As a framework, the Act prescribes that -

- (a) the employer must provide and maintain a safe and healthy working environment for his employees and any person, who may enter onto the premises,
- (b) the duties of employers to their employees, employees to their employer and suppliers to the employer and
- (c) the "reasonable man" approach by the employer in decisions concerning occupational health and safety,

- (d) the management, application and enforcement of the Act and regulations are the responsibility of the employer i.e. be he the appointed agent where applicable, Project Managers, each principle Contractor and Contractor.
- (e) each principle Contractor and Contractor shall have a copy of the Act which must be available on site at all times. Employees are to be allowed reasonable access to the Act during normal working hours.

NB Interpretation

Where there is any question as to the interpretation of any legislation and an agreement cannot be reached the matter is to be escalated from Contractor to Principle Contractor to the client. Should the matter still not be resolved it needs to be referred to the Provincial Director – Department of Labour.

Occupational injury

Means any personal injury sustained as a result of an accident.

Classifications.

Fatal - Where the employee dies.

Disabling - When an employee cannot continue to perform the duty he was employed for.

Lost time incident - When an employee does not return to perform the work he was employed for on the next normal working day.

Disabling Lost Time - When an employee sustains an injury on duty and does not return to perform the duties he was employed to do on the next normal working day.



Medical treatment incident - When an employee sustains an injury at work and requires medical – more than first aid treatment i.e. medical, surgical, hospital or skilled nursing services.

First Aid case - Where the wound is treated from the contents of a first aid box

Disabling Lost Time Injury Frequency Rate (DIFR) It is the number of disabling injuries, including a death multiplied by 1 million (1,000,000) divided by the total number of man-hours worked by all employees on the project for a specific month or the project to-date.

DIFR = No of disabling lost time injuries x 1,000,000

8.1.2. Reporting.

COIDA

An incident must be reported to the relevant Provincial Director and on the prescribed W.CL 2(E) document and within the prescribed time frame i.e. when the employer becomes aware of or the incident was reported to him.

8.1.3. Recording.

All incidents must be recorded on a document similar to the intry statistic form provided.

8.1.4 Investigation.

Sect 31 The

severity of the injury will dictate whom and when the irrestigation must be conducted. Where reasonable and practicable all incidents must be investigated prior to be end on the shift on which it occurred, reported to or his employer became aware thereof.

Fatal and serious injuries must be investigated before the end of the shift on which it occurred or as soon as reasonably practical after the occurrence. A team consisting of the Principle Contractor, the construction safety officer and the health and safety representative in whose area the incident occurred must conduct the incident investigation.

Where an employee of a Contractor is figured the Contractor and the health and safety representative for the area in which it occurred will be per of the team. The client or his agent may if they wish form part of the team. A record of the proceeding including signed statements, the name of the person conducting the investigation and persons assisting team members must be kept. All photographs etc must also be kept in the health and safety file.

NB In the event of a fatal, or potentially fatal incident the relevant DoL and the nearest South African Police Services station sust be contacted. The scene of the incident may only be altered or disturbed with permission of a Linspector or when it is necessary to rescue a person or lives in danger.

8.1.5. Analysis

The statistics for the total project, each principle Contractor and Contractor must be analysed to ascertain if there is or if any trends are developing by the construction safety officer or a competent person appointed by the client, his agent, the principle Contractor's and all Contractors.

8.1.6. Statistics.

Comprehensive incident / injury statistics must be kept for the total project i.e. the Principle Contractor and every Contractor. The following information must be recorded and kept on the health and safety file of the principle Contractor / s and the Contractor / s.

The client or where applicable his appointed agent must ensure that the relevant statistics are collected, recorded, analysed and the appropriate action instituted. Where a construction safety officer is appointed it will form part of his duties and responsibilities.

Statistics must be kept in the format, suggested which is attached to this document.

The following incidents must be recorded – Fatal, disabling lost time, days lost, medical and first aid cases and man-hours worked. Statistics for the month under review and for the project to-date must be kept either together on one or more documents.



NB The Compensation Commissioner still refers to and reports the Disabling Injury Frequency Rate (DIFR). It has been decided to use the same formula. Contractors may use 200,000 in the formula. However they need to multiply by 5 to reflect the COIDA statistic rate.

8.1.7. Occupational disease / conditions

These must be reported and recorded as prescribed.

The Health and safety representatives will be required to attend the health and safety committee meetings. The Olient and his appointed Construction safety officer are ex-officio members.

8.2.2. Meetings.

Meetings will be held on the day, date, time and blee as mutually agreed upon by the health and safety representatives and management. The frequency will also be determined by the aforementioned. Where the Principle Contractor has established a Health and Safety Committee the designated Health and Safety Representative shall serve on the Committee and the formula applied.

8.3. Legal compliance audits

8.3.1. Audit schedule

The attached schedule or a similar one approved by the Client and or the Principle Contractor must be used. The person conducting the assessment must report in writing any major deviations observed and where reasonable, practicable the corrective action recommended, the party responsible to take the action and a date by which successed must be implemented.

8.3.2. Audit frequent

An internal legar compliance audit will be conducted monthly.

A legal compliance audit will be conducted by an external / independent auditor one (1) per month.

8.3.3. Analysis.

Each audit report must be tabled and discussed at the next relevant health and safety committee meeting. The chairman shall make any appropriate comments and or recommendations and sign the minutes. The Client, Principle Agent must receive a copy of the minutes. The audit of the Contractors must be consolidated, analysed and submitted to the principle Contractor and the client. The findings will be documented, analyses and recommendations made. Where necessary the client / agent will be consulted with to ascertain if additional resources and or finances are required. The action agreed on i.e. the responsible man test - and the time scheduling must be implemented. As the project progresses it may become necessary to increase the frequency of audits.

NB The construction safety office will assume and be appointed to perform these functions.
