# 2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBE

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's black-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

# 2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Raing

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note the following:

- Proposals will be a luated on price which will be allocated 80 points and preference which will be allocated 20 points, dependent on the value of the Services
- The 81/20 reference point system applies where the acquisition of the Services will be less than 18,000 000.00.



The Contractor shall perform the following:

3.1 Install all equipment in accordance with Transnet specification BBB 5452 version-1.

#### 3.2 Stillwater traction substation.

- 3.2.1 Supply, install, test and commission 1 x 132kV high voltage AC primary circuit breaker in accordance with Transnet specification BBB 1267 version-6.
- 3.2.2 Install steel structure for PCB.
- 3.2.3 Install AC earth leakage CT in separate polycarbonals b.x.a.id supply cable ((4mm² x 4 Core)
- 3.2.4 Supply and install control and protection cable to the control panel from PCB (2.5mm<sup>2</sup> x 19 Core and 2mm<sup>2</sup> x 2 Core for heater) to the ontrol panel. The Contractor shall wire the electrical interlock between the AC disconnect and the PCB.
- 3.2.5 Supply and install low SF6 gas, spring tharg, and spring discharge indications in panel.
- 3.2.6 Supply and install flying bushars complete with clamps from the AC disconnects to PCB to the CTs to the surge arresters to the main transformers.

#### 3.3 Rosetta traction substation.

- 3.3.1 Install, test and commission 1 x existing 132kV high voltage AC primary circuit breaker in accordance with Transnet specification BBB 1267 version-6. The AC primary circuit breaker will be seed lied by Transnet.
- 3.3.2 Install the Studdre for PCB.
- 3.3.3 Install AC earth leakage CT in separate polycarbonate box.and supply cable ((4mm² x 4 Core)
- 3.3 Supery and install control and protection cables to the control panel from PCB (2.5mm<sup>2</sup> x 19 core and 2mm<sup>2</sup> x 2 Core for heater) to the control panel. The Contractor shall wire the electrical interlock between the AC disconnect and the PCB.
- 3.35 Supply and install low SF6 gas, spring charge and spring discharge indications in panel.
- 3.3.6 Supply and install flying busbars complete with clamps from the AC disconnects to PCB to the CTs to the surge arresters to the main transformers.
- 3.4 All steelwork shall be galvanised in accordance with SANS 121 and where required, painted in accordance with specification CEE 0045. The manufacture of any steelwork shall not take place prior to the approval of the design drawings. Transnet shall inspect the steelwork at the manufacturer's works prior to dispatch. All fasteners (nuts & bolts) shall be secured using flat or bevelled washers, where necessary, as well as lock washers.
- Ensure that no ballast stone is contaminated during digging and filling of cable trenches and that the soil is compacted to the same density as surrounding soil when trenches are filled.
- 3.6 Dismantle and transport old equipment to Infra Depot.

3.7 On completion of the installation, it will be required from the Contractor to submit as built drawings and schematic diagrams of all new equipment as well as indicating interfaces with the existing equipment.

#### 4.0 CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

- 4.1 Over and above the conditions mentioned in the General Conditions of Contract, the Contractor shall also be responsible for the conditions mentioned hereunder.
- 4.2 The Contractor shall not make use of any subcontractor to perform the vorks or parts thereof without prior permission from the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 4.3 The Contractor shall ensure that a safety representative is at cite at all times. All safety measures prescribed by Transnet Electrical Safety Instructions and the "occupational Health and Safety Act 1993 (Act 85 of 1993)" associated with working on a project of his nature shall be adhered to.
- 4.4 The Contractor shall supply a **site diary** (with triplicate lages) This book shall be used to record any unusual events during the period of the work. Any delays can work shall also be recorded such as delays caused by poor weather conditions, delays caused by permits being cancelled etc. The appointed Manager or Technical Officer must countersign such delays. Other delays such as non-availability of equipment from 3<sup>rd</sup> party suppliers must be communicated to the Manager or Technical Officer in writing.
- 4.5 The Contractor shall supply a **site instruction book** (with triplicate pages). This book shall be used to record any instructions to the Contractor regarding problems encountered on site for example the quality of work or the placement of equipment. This book shall be filled in by the Manager or Technical Officer and must be countersigned by the Contractor.
- Both books mentioned in 4.1 and 4.5 shall be the property of Transnet and shall be handed over to the Manager or Technical Onter on the day of energising or handing over.
- 4.7 The penalty charge will 0.15% per day of the total value of the contract.
- 4.8 Notwithstanding what is stated in clause 27 of the E5 (MW) General Conditions of Contract, no surety will be required for this contract; only 10% retention will be retained when payment is made.

#### 5.0 INSTALLATION

- 5.1 Se Contractor shall be responsible for the transport to site, off-loading, handling, storage and security of all material required for the construction/execution of the works.
- 5.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for all necessary (as decided by the Transnet Manager or Technical Officer) connections between the equipment supplied and other components in the substation including connections to the earth-mat.
- 5.3 All fasteners on steelwork, components and electrical connections (nuts and bolts) shall be secured using flat as well as lock washers.

## 6.0 INTERCONNECTION OF EQUIPMENT

6.1 All HT electrical equipment interconnections shall be done using conductors similar to that being used in the existing substation yard.

- 6.2 Conductors between separately mounted outdoor equipment shall incorporate a degree of flexibility to avoid any over-stressing of these connections due to the foundation movement or conductor expansion/contraction and to facilitate alignment of equipment.
- 6.3 High conductive silicon grease shall be liberally applied to all the connections.
- All dissimilar metal connections (Cu to Al) shall be made using bi-metallic clamps that are specifically designed and manufactured to make that particular connection (ad hoc fabricated clamps are not acceptable).

#### 7.0 WORK TO BE DONE BY TRANSNET

- 7.1 Transnet shall have an electrician available for isolation and the electric of barriers to live electrical equipment and issuing of work permits.
- 7.2 Upon successful completion of the works to the satisfaction of Transnet, Transnet shall perform necessary protection tests and commission the said equipment.
- 7.3 The depot staff will be responsible for reconnecting ele-control equipment in the substation.

#### 8.0 TENDERING PROCEDURE

- 8.1 Contractors shall duly fill in the attached 'Schedule of quantities and prices'. Items not reflected in this Schedule, but covered in the project specification or agreed at site meetings, shall be added to the 'Schedule of quantities and prices' by the Contractor and quoted for accordingly.
- An addendum reflecting changes to the project specification and 'Schedule of quantities and prices' shall be forwarded to Contractors after the site meeting and Contractors should quote accordingly.
- 8.3 Contractors shall provide a provisional Gantt or a similar chart showing when the substation will be done and energie d, when submitting the tender. A final chart should be submitted to the Manager or Technical Office within 14 days after the award has been made to the successful Contractor.
- 8.4 Contractors shall ubmit qualifications of the staff that will be performing the works. Qualified technical personne small perform the works on the electrical equipment or installations. During the duration of the contractor are successful Contractor will be required to inform the Technical Officer of any staff changes and provide the qualifications of the replacement staff for approval.
- 8.5 Intractors shall indicate clause-by-clause compliance with the specification. This shall take the form of a separate document listing all the specifications clause numbers indicating the individual statement of compliance or non-compliance. This document can be used by Contractors to elaborate on their clause.
- 8.6 Contractors shall motivate a statement of non-compliance.
- 8.7 Where equipment offered does not comply with standards or publications referred to in the specification, Contractors shall state which standards apply and submit a copy in English or certified translation.
- 8.8 Contractors shall submit equipment type test certificates as specified with the Tender. These shall be in English or certified translation.

# 9.0 DRAWINGS, INSTRUCTION MANUALS AND SPARE PART CATALOGUES

- 9.1 All as built drawings shall be supplied in electronic format (Microstation/Acad).
- 9.2 All drawings (paper prints) shall be submitted to the Manager or Technical Officer for approval. No construction or manufacturing activity will be allowed prior to the associated drawings having been approved by the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 9.3 All drawings, catalogues, instruction book and spares lists shall be in accordance with Transnet's specification CEE.0224.2002.
- 9.4 All final as built drawings shall be provided to Transnet within four weeks after commissioning.

#### 10.0 SITE TESTS

- 10.1 The equipment shall be inspected or tested and approved by Transnet Quality Assurance at the Contractor's workshop prior to it being taken to site. Only of ce the approval has been granted in writing can the equipment be taken to site for installation. The approval should also be recorded on the site instruction book and countersigned by both parties.
- 10.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for farrying out of on-site tests and commissioning of all equipment supplied and installed in terms. Other specification and the contractual agreement.
- 10.3 Functional on-site tests shall be conducted or all items of equipment and circuitry to prove the proper functioning and installation thereof
- 10.4 The Contractor shall submit a letailed list of on-site tests for the approval of the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 10.5 The Contractor shall arrange for the Technical Officer or his representative to be present to witness the on-site tests.
- The on-site tests and absequent commissioning will not commence until ALL CONSTRUCTION work has been completed. Construction staff, material and equipment shall be removed from site prior to the comme cement of testing. Testing and commissioning of the substation equipment will not be allowed to take place in a construction site environment.
- 10.7 \_\_\_\_\_ o -site tests shall include the following:
  - est for the functionality of all electrical circuitry.
  - The tests on relays.
  - Test on equipment as per manufacturer's instructions.
  - Insulation tests
- 10.8 At the completion of the on-site tests, the Manager or Technical Officer or his representative shall either sign the tests sheets (supplied by the Contractor) as having witnessed the satisfactory completion thereof, or hand to the Contractor a list of defects requiring rectification.
- 10.9 Upon rectification of defects, the Contractor shall arrange for the Manager or Technical Officer or his representative to certify satisfactory completion of on-site tests.
- 10.10 Acceptance by the Manager or Technical Officer of satisfactory completion of on-site tests in no way relieves the Contractor of his obligation to rectify defects which may have been overlooked or become evident at a later stage.

## 11.0 COMMISSIONING OF EQUIPMENT

- 11.1 Commissioning will only take place after all defects have been rectified to the satisfaction of the Manager or Technical Officer.
- 11.2 Commissioning will include energising of equipment from the primary isolator to the track feeder circuits. The Contractor must prove the satisfactory operation of all equipment under live conditions.
- 11.3 On completion of commissioning, the Contractor will hand the equipment over to the Manager or Technical Officer in terms of the relevant instruction.
- 11.4 The commissioning of protection equipment by Transnet will in no way absolve the Contractor from any of his responsibilities during the guarantee period. - 12.6 If urgent repairs have to be carried out by Transnet staff to maintain supply during the guarantee period, the Contractor shall inspect such repairs to ensure that the guarantee period is not affected and should they be covered by the guarantee, reimburse Transnet the cost of material and labour.

- 5.1 A non-refundable charge may be raised for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing the Bid Document.
- 5.2 If any of the drawings or specifications referred to in Bid Documents are the official publications of recognised standardising bodies, copies of such drawings and specifications shall be acquired by Respondents at their own expense.

#### **6 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS**

- 6.1 If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of the last to:
  - a) enter into a formal contract when called upor to do so in terms of clause 14 [Contract Documents], within such period as Transnet may specify or
  - b) accept an order in terms of the Bid; or
  - c) when called upon to do so, furnish satisfactory security of the fulfilment of the contract in terms of clause 15 [Securities]

Transnet may, in any such case, without p ejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bit or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Bids afresh, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent an, additional expense incurred by it in calling for new offers or in accepting a higher offer.

- 6.2 If any Respondent, who cas submitted a Bid and/or concluded a contract with Transnet [hereinafter referred to as the Service Provider], or in the capacity of agent or subcontractor who has been associated with such Bid or contract:
  - a) has withdrawn such Bid after the advertised date and hour for the receipt of Bids; or
  - b) has, after having been notified of the acceptance of its Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the Bid Documents; or
  - has carried out any contract resulting from such Bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of such contract; or
  - d) has offered, promised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or the execution of such contract; or
  - e) has acted in a fraudulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any government department or towards any public body, company or person; or
  - f) has made any incorrect statement in the affidavit or certificate referred to in clause 12 [Formal Notification Regarding Name of Successful Respondent] and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that
    - (i) it made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and

- (ii) before making such statement, it took all reasonable steps to satisfy itself of its correctness; or
- g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the Service Provider's requirements which could not be recovered from the Service Provider;

then a Bid from any such Respondent shall be disqualified and the person, enterprise or company [including any directors] shall, subject to clause 6.3 below, be disqualified from bidding for any Transnet business through its "blacklisting" process.

- Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision has been given under the provisions of clauses 6.2b), 6.2d) or 6.2e) above, may make representations to the Chief Operating Officer of Transnet Group, whose decision shall be final.
- Any disqualification [Blacklisting] imposed upon any person or enterprise or company, may also apply to any other enterprise under the same or different names of disqualified persons or enterprise or company [or associates thereof] and shall for avoidance of doubt also be applied to any agent or employee of the person or enterprise or company concerned.

#### 7 CURRENCY

Prices or fees must be quoted in the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR] in respect of local Services. Prices or fees in any other currency may be rejected by Transnet save where such price is quoted by a foreign Respondent.

# 8 EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas. The service shall, if requested to do so by the Service Provider, effect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal or manufacturer of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents and any variation in the amount to be so paid, which may arise as a result of fluctuations in the rate of exchange involved, will be for the account of the Service Provides.

- the respondent who desires to avail itself of the aforementioned facility must at the time of bidding furnish the information called for in the clause "Exchange and Remittance" of the Bid Documents and also furnish full details of the principals or service providers to whom payment is to be made.
- 8.2 The Service Provider shall at its own cost obtain forward exchange cover on foreign currency to protect itself against any currency rate fluctuation risks for the duration of any resulting contract or order. Transnet will NOT accept any fluctuations in the rate of exchange at the time when payments are made.

Transnet will not recognise any claim for adjustment of the order and/or contract price under clause 8.2 above, if the increase in price arises after the date on which the Services were to be completed, as set out in the order and/or contract, or any subsequent agreement between the parties.

#### 9 ACCEPTANCE OF BID

9.1 Transnet does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any Bid.

- 9.2 Transnet reserves the right to accept any Bid in whole or in part.
- 9.3 Upon the acceptance of a Bid by Transnet, the parties shall be bound by these General Bid Conditions and the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract [Form ST&C Services] and any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- 9.4 Where the Respondent has been informed by Transnet per facsimile message or email of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowledgement of the receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of delivery to the Respondent.

#### 10 LAW GOVERNING CONTRACT

The law of the Republic of South Africa shall govern the contract created by the acceptance of a Bid. The domicilium citandi et executandi shall be a place in the Republic of South Africa to be specified by the Respondent in its Bid at which all legal documents may be served to the espondent who shall agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa. A foreign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative in the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be entered into in the event of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

#### 11 IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be fullished.

# 12 FORMAL NOTIFICATION REGARDING NAME OF SUCCESSFUL RESPONDENT

In the case of Bias summitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, unsuccessful Respondents will be formally notified on the names of successful Respondent(s) as soon as possible after the closing date for receipt on the Bid\_in question.

# 13 MAY HOKISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Were Bids are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communicate with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential suppliers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, may be disqualified.

#### 14 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

14.1 The contract documents will comprise these General Bid Conditions and the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract [Form ST&C – Services] and any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.

14.2 These contract documents will constitute the contract between the parties upon receipt by the Respondent of Transnet's letter of acceptance / intent, subject to all additional amendments and/or special conditions thereto as agreed to by the parties.

## 15 SECURITIES

- 15.1 The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of a deed of suretyship [Deed of Suretyship] furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.
- 15.2 The security may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any loss or damage which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.
- 15.3 Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stip vaccount the Bid Documents.
- 15.4 For the purpose of clause 15.1 above, Transnet will supply a Deed of Suretyship form to the successful Respondent for completion and no guarantee in any other form will be accepted. A copy of such form will be supplied to Respondents on request. For this purpose a Deed of Suretyship form will be provided which shall be completed and returned to Transnet or a designated official by the successful Respondent within 30 [thirty] lays from the date of the letter of acceptance. No payment will be made until the form, duly completed is delivered to Transnet. Failure to return the Deed of Suretyship within the prescribed time small, save where prior extension has been granted, entitles Transnet without notice to the Service provider to cancel the contract with immediate effect.
- 15.5 Additional costs incur of by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Service Provider in relation to the conditions of this clause 15 will be for the account of the Service Provider.

# 16 PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- 16.1 A Bid with prices which are subject to confirmation will not be considered.
- 16.2 Plus where him prices are quoted for the duration of any resulting order and or contract will receive precidence over prices which are subject to adjustment.

## 17 DELETION OF SERVICES EXCLUDED FROM BID

Respondent must delete Services for which it has not tendered or for which the price or fee has been included elsewhere in its Bid.

# 18 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alterations made by the Respondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be done by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items/Services concerned. All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) or Services concerned being excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

#### 19 VALUE-ADDED TAX

- 19.1 In respect of local Services, i.e. Services to be provided by a South African company, the prices or fees quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive of VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Service Provider's Tax Invoice.
- 19.2 In respect of Services to be provided by a foreign principal:
  - a) the invoicing by the Service Provider on behalf of its foreign principal represents a service rendered by the principal;
  - b) the Service Provider's Tax Invoice(s) for the local portion only [i.e. the "commission" for the services rendered locally] must show the VAT separately

## 20 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF BID

- 20.1 The Service Provider shall adhere to the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract as set out in Form ST&C Services, a copy of which is issued with the Bid Decuments, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form pair of the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract as set out in Form ST&C Services, a copy of which is issued with the Bid Decuments, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form pair of the Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract as set out in
- 20.2 Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer alternatives by writter submission on a company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Nantset's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

# 21 IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

## 21.1 Method of Payment

- a) The attersion of the Respondent is directed to clause 10 [Invoices and Payment] of Form ST&C s vices which sets out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- b) have er, in addition to the aforegoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or financing proposals.
- The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the financial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is adjudicated.
- d) The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender strictly in accordance with clause 21.1a) above. Failure to comply with clause 21.1a) above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.

NOTE: The successful Respondent [the **Service Provider**] shall, where applicable, be required to furnish a guarantee covering any advance payments.

#### 21.2 Conditional Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated as from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Service Provider's month-end statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax

Invoice is correct in all respects as referred to in the contract or order. Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the conditional period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

# 22 PLANS, DRAWINGS, DIAGRAMS, SPECIFICATIONS AND DOCUMEN

Copyright in plans, drawings, diagrams, specifications and documents compiled by the Service Provider for the purpose of contract work shall be governed by the terms and conditions detailed in clause 12 of Form ST&T - Services (Intellectual Property Rights).

# 23 VISITS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES

- 23.1 Respondents must furnish details in a covering letter if it is considered necessary that employees of Transnet should carry out inspection and/or review any operational Services at the premises of the preferred Respondent or its subcontractors overseas for the propose of a product demonstration and/or final acceptance or for any other reason.
- 23.2 If the Respondent considers overseas visits to be recessary it must provide the following information in a covering letter in respect of each proposal visit:
  - a) countries and places to be visited
  - b) number of employees and disciplines evolved;
  - c) number of man-days inv lved; and
  - d) motivation for the sit.
- 23.3 Transnet will make all accordenests with regard to booking of air journeys, hotel reservations, transport to and from a sorts, places of inspection or demonstration, etc. and all expenses will be for the account of The isnet.
- 23.4 Before a visit is undertaken, such as envisage in this clause 23, Transnet and the Respondent will agree in viting on the number of employees of Transnet that should undertake the visit and the number of man-days involved in the visit.

# 24 BY OK ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded direct by the principals to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents, or may be so forwarded on the principal's behalf by its South African representative or agent provided that written proof is submitted that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.
- 24.2 When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.
- 24.3 South African representatives or agents of a successful foreign Respondent must when so required enter into a formal contract in the name of their principals and must sign such contract on behalf of

the latter. In every such case a legal Power of Attorney from their principals must be furnished to Transnet by the South African representative or agents authorising them to enter into and sign such contract.

- a) Such Power of Attorney must comply with Government Notice No. 1160 of 27 June 1930 [and any amendments thereto] "Rules of the Supreme Court of South Africa for the authentication of documents executed outside the Republic for use within the Republic."
- b) The Power of Attorney must be signed by the principal under the same title as used in the Bid Documents.
- c) On arrival within the Republic of South Africa this Power of Attor v is to be completed in terms of Section 8(2) of the Stamp Duties Act No. 77 of 1968, or any amendment thereof.
- d) If a Power of Attorney held by the South African representative or agent includes matters of a general nature besides provision for the entering into an signing of a contract with Transnet, a certified copy thereof should be furnished.
- e) The Power of Attorney must authorise the South African representative or agent to choose the domicilium citandi et executandi as provided for in clause 26 [Addresses for Notices] of the Standard Conditions of Contract, For a \$7.&C - Services.
- 24.4 If payment is to be made in South Africa, the Toreign Supplier [i.e. the principal, or its South African agent or representative], must notify San met in writing whether, for payment by electronic funds transfer [EFT]:
  - a) funds are to be transferred to the credit of the foreign Supplier's account at a bank in South Africa, in which case it name and branch of such bank shall be furnished; or
  - b) funds are to be transferred to the credit of its South African agent or representative, in which case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished.
- 24.5 The attention of the Respondent is directed to clause 15 above [Securities] regarding the provision of security for the fulfilment of contracts and orders and the manner and form in which such security is to be furnished.

## 1 INTRODUCTION

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] and the appointed supplier of Services to Transnet [the Service Provider], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Services, the General Bid Conditions, a Schedule of Requirements or Work Order including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet.

### 2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly receives otherwise:

- 2.1 **AFSA** means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- 2.2 **Agreement** means the Agreement and its associated schedules and/or annexures and/or appendices, including the Work Order(s), specification for the Services and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General Tender Conditions and any additional provisions in the associated bid documents tendered by the Service Provider [as agreed in writing between the Parties], which collectives, and exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet;
- 2.3 **Background Intellectual Property** in an all Intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their bligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party or their affiliates prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Date otherwise pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.4 **Business Day(s)** means dondays to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as proclaimed in South Africa;
- 2.5 **Commenter at Date** means [•], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- 2.6 **Co. fide tial Information** means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, graphic or in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, natebooks, reports, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, pans, formulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other Party [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
  - a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
  - b) the contents of the Agreement;
  - private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
  - d) any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret:
  - e) information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;
- information relating to the business activities, business relationships, products, services, customers, clients and Subcontractors of the disclosing Party where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
- h) information contained in the software and associated material and documentation belonging to the disclosing Party;
- technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;
- j) Copyright works;
- k) commercial, financial and marketing information;
- data concerning architecture, demonstrations, tools and techniques, processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, functional and technical requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;
- n) information concerning faults or defects it goods, equipment, hardware or software or the incidence of such faults or defects and
- o) information concerning the charges, Fees and / or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcontractors, a bein methods, practices or service performance levels actually achieved;
- 2.7 Copyright means the light in expressions, procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, computer program codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, artistic works, sound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographic work, or cinematographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the doing of certamacts specified in respect of the different categories of works;
- 2.8 **Default** neans any breach of the obligations of either Party [including but not limited to condamental breach or breach of a fundamental term] or any Default, act, omission, negligence or determent of either Party, its employees, agents or Subcontractors in connection with or in relation to the subject of the Agreement and in respect of which such Party is liable to the other;
- Deliverable(s) means any and all works of authorship, products and materials developed, written, prepared, assembled, integrated, modified or provided by the Service Provider in relation to the Services;
- 2.10 Designs mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right granted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
- 2.11 **Fee(s)** shall mean the agreed Fees for the Services to be purchased from the Service Provider by Transnet, as detailed in the Work Order(s), issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement from time to time;

- 2.12 **Foreground Intellectual Property** means all Intellectual Property developed by either Party pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.13 Intellectual Property means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- 2.14 Know-How means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, processing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, programation concerning materials and marketing and business information in general;
- 2.15 Materials means the Deliverables, the Service Provider Materials and the bird Party Materials;
- 2.16 **Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their subsidiaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and their assigns;
- 2.17 Party means either one of these Parties;
- 2.18 Patents mean registered Patents and Patent applications, ence the latter have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any invention, roducts or processes in all fields of technology;
- 2.19 Permitted Purpose means any activity or process to be undertaken or supervised by Personnel or employees of one Party during the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party'r confidential Information or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such activity or process to be accomplished;
- Personnel means any partner, employee, agent, consultant, independent associate or supplier, Subcontractor and the st.ff of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;
- 2.21 **Purchase Order(s)** means official orders issued by an operating division of Transnet to the Service Provides for the provision of Services;
- 2.22 **Service**) means [\*], the Service(s) provided to Transnet by the Service Provider, pursuant to e Work Order(s) in terms of the Agreement;
- Jervice Level Agreement or SLA means the processes, deliverables, key performance indicators and performance standards relating to the Services to be provided by the Service Provider;
- 2.24 Subcontract means any contract or agreement or proposed contract or agreement between the Service Provider and any third party whereby that third party agrees to provide to the Service Provider the Services or any part thereof;
- 2.25 **Subcontractor** means the third party with whom the Service Provider enters into a Subcontract;
- 2.26 Service Provider Materials means all works of authorship, products and materials [including, but not limited to, data, diagrams, charts, reports, specifications, studies, inventions, software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques] owned by, or licensed to, the Service Provider prior to the Commencement Date or independently developed by the Service Provider outside the scope of the Agreement at no expense to Transnet, and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;

- 2.27 **Tax Invoice** means the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 2.28 Third Party Material means software, software development tools, methodologies, ideas, methods, processes, concepts and techniques owned by, or licensed to a third party and used by the Service Provider in the performance of the Services;
- 2.29 Trade Marks mean registered Trade Marks and trade mark applications and includes any sign or logo, or combination of signs and/or logos capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one undertaking from those of another undertaking;
- 2.30 **VAT** means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time; and
- 2.31 **Work Order(s)** means a detailed scope of work for a Service required by Transnet, including timeframes, Deliverable, Fees and costs for the supply of the Tervice of Transnet, which may be appended to the Agreement from time to time.

## 3 INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 Clause headings in the Agreement are included for ease of reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of interpretation or for any other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have structured or drafted such provision.
- 3.2 Any term, word, acronym of phrase used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions" half be given its plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used in the Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings accorded thereto.
- 3.3 A reference to the singular incorporates a reference to the plural and vice versa.
- 3.4 A reference to neutral persons incorporates a reference to legal persons and vice versa.
- 3.5 Afterence to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

# 4 JUNEAND SCOPE

- The Agreement is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Service Provider will arrange for the provision to Transnet of the Services which meet the requirements of Transnet, the delivery of which Services is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Transnet and executed by the Service Provider, in accordance with the Agreement.
- 4.2 Such Purchase Orders shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the relevant Work Order(s).
- 4.3 Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- 4.4 During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Work Order(s), in accordance with procedures set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control] below. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.
- 4.5 Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Work Order(s) conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, or where the Agreement is

- silent on the matter, the term, provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.
- 4.6 Time will be of the essence and the Service Provider will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the timeframe(s) [if any] set out in the relevant schedule, save that the Service Provider will not be liable under this clause if it is unable to meet such obligation within the time required as a direct result of any act or omission by Transnet and it has used its best endeavours to advise Transnet of such act or omission. In the event of such delay, any time deadlines detailed in the relevant schedule shall be extended by a period equal to the period of that delay.

## 5 **AUTHORITY OF PARTIES**

- Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute the Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsoever.
- 5.2 Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the power or authority to enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or give any warranty representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or create any liability against the other are billed the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

## **6 WARRANTIES**

- 6.1 The Service Provider warrants to rransnet that:
  - a) it has full calculate and authority to enter into and to perform the Agreement and that the Agreement is a ecuted by a duly authorised representatives of the Service Provider;
  - b) if will discharge its obligations under the Agreement and any annexure, appendix or checkle hereto with all due skill, care and diligence;
  - c) will be solely responsible for the payment of remuneration and associated benefits, if any, of its Personnel and for withholding and remitting income tax for its Personnel in conformance with any applicable laws and regulations;
  - d) it will procure licences for Transnet in respect of all Third Party Material detailed in the Work Order(s), and will procure the right for Transnet to take such copies [in whole or in part] of such Third Party Materials as it may reasonably require for the purposes of backup for archiving and disaster recovery; and
  - e) the use or possession by Transnet of any Materials will not subject Transnet to any claim for infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
- 6.2 The Service Provider warrants that it will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the Service Levels as defined in the relevant schedule. Transnet may at its discretion audit compliance with the Service Levels, provided that any such audit is carried out with reasonable prior notice and in a reasonable way so as not to have an adverse effect on the performance of the Services. Without prejudice to clause 6.3 below, in the event that the Service Provider fails to meet the Service Levels, Transnet may claim appropriate service credits or invoke a retention of Fees as detailed in the relevant schedule and/or Work Order.

- 6.3 The Service Provider warrants that for a period of 90 [ninety] days from Acceptance of the Deliverables they will, if properly used, conform in all material respects with the requirements set out in the relevant schedule. The Service Provider will at its expense remedy any such non-conformance as soon as possible but in any event within 30 [thirty] days of notification by Transnet. In the event that the Service Provider fails or is unable to remedy such non-conformance within such time-scale, Transnet will be entitled to employ a third party to do so in place of the Service Provider and any excess charges or costs incurred by Transnet as a result shall be paid by the Service Provider.
- 6.4 The Service Provider will remedy any defect within 30 [thirty] days of being notified of that defect by Transnet in writing.
- 6.5 The Service Provider will not be liable to remedy any problem arising from or caused by any modification made by Transnet to the Deliverables, or any part thereof, without the prior approval of the Service Provider.
- 6.6 The Service Provider shall advise Transnet of the effect of any steps proposed by Transnet pursuant to clause 6.5 above, including but not limited to any cost implications or any disruption or delay in the performance of the Services. The Parties agree that any changes to the Services, including the charges for the Services or any time ables for delivery of the Services, will be agreed in accordance with the change control procedure, as set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control].
- 6.7 The Service Provider warran s that:
  - a) it has, using the most in-to date software available, tested for [and deleted] all commonly known viruses in the Materials and for all viruses known by the Service Provider at the date of the real rank Wood Order; and
  - b) at the time of delivery to Transnet, the Materials do not contain any trojan horse, worm, logic bonds, time bomb, back door, trap door, keys or other harmful components.

The Service povider agrees that, in the event that a virus is found, it will at its own expense use its best endeavours to assist Transnet in reducing the effect of the virus and, particularly in the event that a virus causes loss of operational efficiency or loss of data, to assist Transnet to the extent to mitigate such losses and to restore Transnet to its original operating efficiency.

- The Service Provider undertakes to comply with South Africa's general privacy protection in terms of the Bill of Rights [Section 14] in connection with the Agreement and shall procure that its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and reenactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.
- 6.9 The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.
- 6.10 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for

the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

## 7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- 7.1 Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information concerning Transnet's operations and activities, that relates to the Services as may be necessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confidentiality obligations under the Agreement.
- 7.2 The Service Provider shall give Transnet reasonable of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- 7.3 Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's Per onnel], transnet agrees to provide the Service Provider or its Personnel such access to and use of its facilities as is necessary to allow the Service Provider to perform its obligations under the Agreement.

# 8 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SELVICE ROVIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider shall:
  - a) respond promptly to all complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
  - b) inform Translet is mediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Services.
  - c) acaduc its ousiness in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service rovice and the Service Provider's Services;
  - d) p full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider relating to the performance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
  - e) obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and
    the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of
    the business and activities of the Service Provider;
  - observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
  - g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and
  - h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Accreditation Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any

liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.

- 8.2 The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
  - a) render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
  - communicate openly and honestly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;
  - c) endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and professionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
  - d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent effort to meet a reed deadlines;
  - e) treat its own Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
  - f) practice and promote its own internal policies aim that promoting and preventing unfair discrimination [as further referred to in clause 22 Figurality and Diversity];
  - g) treat all enquiries from Transnet in connection with the Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the provisions of this clause. He Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
  - h) when requested by Tansnet, art vide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties;
  - i) not allow a connect of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any parts of er customers] and the interests of Transnet;
  - j) Not an ept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any
    gatuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an
    attempt to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
  - not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;
  - not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
  - m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

# 9 FEES AND EXPENSES

- 9.1 In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.
- 9.2 Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Transnet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].

- 9.3 Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
  - a) are agreed by Transnet in advance;
  - b) are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies;
  - c) are passed on to Transnet at cost with no administration fee; and
  - d) will only be reimbursed if supported by relevant receipts.
- 9.4 All Tax Invoices relating to Fees, out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the Personnel carrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

### 10 INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- 10.1 Transnet shall pay the Service Provider the amount stipulated in the relevant schedule or Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Section Provider, upon receipt of a correct and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the undisputed Tax invoices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are undisputed become due and payable to he Service Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below.
- 10.3 All Fees and other sun't payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rate.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be sub-litted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such month-end statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the tatement together with all undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting documentation.
- 10.5 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge interest on the outstanding amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the period from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.

# 11 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.
- 11.3 Should Transnet and the Service Provider fail to reach an agreement on Fees for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 25 of this Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution].

#### 12 **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

## 12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- a) Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt, all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Service Provider an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive c) licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intelect at Toperty for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sur-licent to other parties.
- d) The Service Provider shall grant Transnet ccess ne Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be beared negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of commercially exploiting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

# 12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest a and to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider, its researchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and Intellectual Property. The Service Provider shall not at any time during to the Forego termination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or bility of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or hing contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title d interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- C) Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to

sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.

e) Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

## 12.3 Title to Improvements

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider hereby undertakes to sign all documents and documents, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Translet and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining or documenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

# 12.4 Unauthorised Use of Confidential Into mation

The Service Provider shall not a thorise any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transne whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promatly notify Transnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Transnet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at the party's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

# 12.5 Unauthorized Use of Intellectual Property

- a) The Service Provider agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and coplications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of management, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- b) It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be taken against the infringer and the Service Provider shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- c) The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.
- d) If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other award arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other award arising out of proceedings.

### 13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

- The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at all times as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no relationship of employer and employee shall arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.
- 13.2 The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Services are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Provider will ensure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any Transnet premises or any other premises upon which the Services are to be performed [including out not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and santy requirements]. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personnel at all times at in a layful and proper manner in accordance with these requirements.
- 13.4 Transnet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personnel whose admission or presence would, in the reasonable opinion of Transnet, be undesirable or who represents a threat to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and regulations governing Transnet's Personnel, Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The provided that Transnet notifies the forvi reasonable exclusion of any such individual from such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its gations under the Agreement.
- The Service Provider agrees se all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its 13.5 o perform the Services. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those saly, old Transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been orod, then the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent and experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to ng provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

# ITATION OF LIABILITY

- Neither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
  - a) death or personal injury due to negligence; or
  - b) fraud.
- The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement. The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calendar year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
- 14.3 Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 above, the liability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise, for direct loss or damage arising out of each Default or series of

- related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.
- 14.4 Subject to clause 14.1 above, and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for any reason the exclusion of liability in clause 14.4 above is void or unenforceable, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in clause 14.3 above.
- 14.6 Nothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Sel vice Provider in respect of clause 12 [Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16 [Confidentiality].

### 15 INSURANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider unds the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a result of its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury as any person and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of sech insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- 15.2 The Service Provider shall alreage insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy renewals:

# 16 CONFIDENTIALIT

- 16.1 The Parties Rereby undertake the following, with regard to Confidential Information:
  - to divulge or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
  - b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
  - c) not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;

- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, sensitive or Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such cases.
- g) the Parties shall not make or permit to be made by an other person subject to their control, any public statements or issue press releases is disclose Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement unless written authorisation to do so has first been obtained from the Party first disclosing such information;
- h) each Party shall be entitled to disclore such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the course of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and men only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations on the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such employees or consultants honour such obligations;
- i) each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any tonfig ritial Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- information shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by the person or entity; and
- each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees,
   officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
- 16.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
  - a) a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel;
     or
  - was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality; or

- can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a breach of a duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
- d) is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
- 16.3 This clause 16 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all documentation furnished to the Service Provider by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation all corporate identity equipment including dies, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

# 17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglect to execute the work or to deliver any portion of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transpet may cancel the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or reject a portion of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining commitment shall remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

# 18 TERM AND TERMINATION

- 18.1 Notwithstanding the date of signature here of, the Commencement Date if the Agreement is [•] and the duration shall be for a 17 [twelv ] nonth period, expiring on [•], unless:
  - a) the Agreement is terminated treather Party in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules of annexures appended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity; or
  - b) the Agreement is extended at Transnet's option for a further period to be agreed by the Parties.
- 18.2 Either Park man serminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party where the other Parky has committed a material Default and, where such Default is capable of remedy, has failed to remedy such Default within 30 [thirty] days of receiving notice specifying the Default and requiring its remedy.
- the Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
  - a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
  - b) its winding-up or dissolution;
  - c) the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer; or
  - d) any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
- 18.4 Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice in writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.

- 18.5 Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Order hereto at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
- 18.6 Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice thereof to the other Party.

## 19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

- 19.1 Termination in accordance with clause 18 [Term and Termination] shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall main in force and in effect.
- 19.2 On termination of the Agreement or a Work Order, the Service Provider will immediately deliver up, and procure that its Personnel will immediately deliver up to Transnet, all Deliverables and property belonging to Transnet [or, in the event of termination of a Work Order, such as is relevant to that Work Order] which may be in the possession of, or under the control of the Service Provider, and certify to Transnet in writing that this has been done.
- 19.3 To the extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above are in electronic form and contained on non-detechable storage devices, the Service Provider will provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will irretrievably destroy and delete copies so held.
- 19.4 In the event that the Agreement is terminated by the Service Provider under clause 18.2 [Term and Termination], or in the event that a Work Order is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5 [Term and Termination], Transnet will pay to the Service Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned or a provide basis] relating to the work undertaken by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider in relation to the such work for which the Service Provider has paid or is legally abliged to pay, in which case, on delivery of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will presently deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- ne provisions of clauses 0 [Definitions], 6 [Warranties], 12 [Intellectual Property Rights], 14 [Umitation of Liability], 16 [Confidentiality], 19 [Consequence of Termination], 25 [Dispute Resolution] and 29 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.
- 19.6 If either Party [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party [hereinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.

## 19.7 Should:

- a) the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under judicial management,
   whether provisionally or finally; or

 either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of business or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, to terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damages against the other.

# 20 ASSIGNMENT

Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Agreement or any interest hereunder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wishes to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment or novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment, in novation.

# 21 FORCE MAJEURE

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either party under the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire floor, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, government action, laws or regulations, riots, terrorism or civil disturbance, defaults, delays or discontinuance on the part of independent contractor, suppliers, or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended.
- 21.2 Each Party vill take an reasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of force majeure. If a Party fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 0 [ninety] days of the act of force majeure first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

# 22 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

- 22.1 The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or part-time status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- 22.2 Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

### 23 **NON-WAIVER**

Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enforce any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not, in any manner, be construed to be a waiver of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.

23.2 Such failure or neglect shall not, in any manner, affect the continued, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

### 24 PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining providions shall not be affected thereby.

### 25 **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

- 25.1 Should any dispute of whatsoever nature arise between Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to resolve the dispute by negotiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such dispute arising.
- 25.2 If the dispute has not been resolved by such negotiation, either of the Parties may refer the dispute to AFSA and notify the other party accordingly, which proceedings shall be held in Johannesburg.
- 25.3 Such dispute shall be finally reso accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or arbitrators appointed by AFS
- This clause constitutes in irrevocable consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, 25.4 shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim and neither of the Portu at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 25.
- 25.5 everable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the ent is erminated for any reason. Agreen
- This clause 25 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate risdation, where grounds for urgency exist.

# 27 WHOLE AND ONLY AGREEMENT

- 27.1 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement constitutes the whole and only agreement between them with regard to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 27.2 The Parties hereby confirm that the Agreement replaces all other agreements which exist or may have existed in any form whatever between them, with regard to the subject matter dealt with in the Agreement, including any annexures, appendices, schedules or Work Order(s) appended hereto.

## 28 AMENDMENT AND CHANGE CONTROL

- 28.1 Any requirement for an amendment or change to the Agreement or to a Work Order shall only be valid if it is in writing, signed by both Parties and added to the Agreement as an addendum hereto.
- 28.2 In the event the Parties cannot agree upon changes, the Parties shall in good faith seek to agree any proposed changes using the dispute resolution procedures in clause 25 [Dispute Resolution].

# 29 GOVERNING LAW

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

# 29.1 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended or reenacted and any regulations made under it, provided that in the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments to the Agreement as may be appropriate in the circumstances. If, within a reasonable period of time, the Service Proviser and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or or medification of Fees, Deliverables, warranties, or other terms and conditions, either Party may stack to have the matter determined in accordance with clause 25 [Dispute Resolution] above.

## 30 COUNTERPARTS

The Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Either Parts may enter into the Agreement by signing any such counterpart.
