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4.5 The responses to this RFQ will be opened as soon as possible after the closing date and time. Transnet shall not, at the opening of responses, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Proposals / information received, i.e. pricing, delivery, etc. The names and locations of the Respondents will be divulged to other Respondents upon request.

4.6 Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RFQ other than that shown on the envelope.

5 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

As described in more detail in the attached BBBEE Claim Form and as prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that Transnet will allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.

Respondents are required to complete Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.1 **B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums**

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFQ as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFQ submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFQ process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note the requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a Respondent will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such Respondent intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to an entity/entities that do not qualify for at least the same points that the Respondent qualifies for, unless the intended sub-Respondent is an EME with the capability to execute

¹ The Minister of the Department of Trade and Industry has the power to designate certain Organs of State or Public Entities as B-BBEE Facilitators. For example, the South African National Military Veterans' Association (SANMVA) has been designated as a B-BBEE Facilitator. As such they will be treated as having rights of ownership held 100% by Black People, 40% by Black Women and 20% by Black designated groups.

- 10.4 not necessarily accept the lowest priced Proposal or an alternative bid;
- 10.5 reject all Proposals, if it so decides;
- 10.6 withdraw the RFQ on good cause shown;
- 10.7 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFQ's closing date;
- 10.8 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ;

1 SCOPE OF WORKS:

1.1 THIS CONTRACT COVERS THE FOLLOWING:

- Rendering of pest control services to office buildings and other buildings on a quarterly basis,
 i.e. carry out inspections and treatments, bring under control any infestation of pesticides.
- Pest Management should offer innovative pest prevention program for cockroaches, gnats, rodents, rats, booklice, bees and flies.
- The routine treatment program should include but not limited to "pest species" specific and focus on the identification of the pest species followed by specific elimination treatments and maintenance treatment methods.
- Installation of temper proof bait boxes/stations.
- Service to be provided and delivered timeously by the Respondent. (Inspections and treatments).
- A low odour pesticide to be used.

1.2 LOCATION OF THE WORKS

Refer to Schedule of Prices.

1.3 REQUIREMENTS

- Registration with the Department of Agriculture. (Pest Control Officer registration certificate in Industrial Weed Control).
- Registration with South African Pest control Association (SAPCA).
- Chemicals used to comply with South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) and the Department of Agriculture approved.
- Submission of material safety data sheet (MSDS).
- Letter of good standing with the Compensation Commissioner.

1.4 WORKS INFORMATION

 Pest management should offer innovative pest prevention programme for cockroaches, rodents and flies as well as prevention programme against stored product pests such as rice weevils, Indian meal moth, warehouse moth, mealworm beetle, flat grain beetle, lesser grain borer and granary weevils.

- The routine treatment program should include but not limited to "pest species" specific and
 focus on the identification of the pest species followed by the elimination treatments and
 maintenance treatment methods.
- Should the use of insecticides be necessary, the Respondent should take the form of
 systematic applications in the form of insecticidal dust, liquid residuals, liquid non-residuals,
 baits, non-residual insecticidal gas or insecticidal thermal fog, all which will be expertly applied
 through the various parts of the affected facility.
- All treatment methods, pesticides and pest materials should be in strict compliance with the Department of Agricultural, SABS and local regulations.

2 **DURATION OF CONTRACT**

This contract will be for the period of three years commencing on the date of notification of acceptance of tender with Transnet Freight Rail.

2.1 DELEGATION OF SUPERVISOR POWERS:

The Supervisor in charge may delegate in writing to any deputy or other person any of his powers or function under the contract.

2.2 RESPONDENT'S SUPERVISION:

The Respondent shall exercise supervision over the works at all times during the hours of work or shall be represented by an agent having full power and authority to act on his behalf.

2.3 HOURS OF WORK:

The Respondent shall confine his work to normal working hours except when work outside these hours is permitted by the Supervisor in charge at the Respondent's request or ordered by the Supervisor in charge.

2.4 TO BE PROVIDED BY THE RESPONDENT:

The successful respondent will provide the necessary tools and equipment to execute the work to the satisfaction of the Supervisor/Supervisor from Transnet Freight Rail. All equipment to be kept in a good and safe condition at all times and to comply with all safety regulations.

All respondents to state, separately for each action of the work to be done, the amount of workers that will be on site.

2.5 PERFORMANCE MONITORING AND EVALUATION:

The Respondent(s) shall at all times be responsible for supervision of work and for follow up inspections to monitor the successful service rendered. He/she shall immediately take appropriate remedial action in areas where the specified standards of control are not achieved.

The Supervisor (or his deputy) shall at any time during the contract period carry out inspections of the Respondent (s) performance methods and procedures.

2.6 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT:

Payment will be done after receiving the tax invoice and a full detail list of all work done
during that period. The Supervisor in charge from Transnet Freight Rail will certify on the
invoice that all work was done according to the contract and site diary book.

- Any work specified in the contract that needs to be done in the last month of the contract before the contract expires, have not been done, then no payment will be made for any work that was done during the last month, until such work has been done.
- Quarterly payments to be made. Invoice to be submitted after all sites have been inspected, treated and invoiced.
- In the event of no inspection or treatment at a site, payment for that period will be withheld.
- The signed register of work performed to be submitted with the invoice.
- The register to be signed by the Supervisor of the specific area.
- Invoice to be signed by the relevant Supervisor to indicate that work was performed to the satisfaction of TFR.

2.7 SCHEDULE OF PRICES

The short descriptions of the items in the schedule are for identification purposes only. In so far as these documents have any bearing, they shall be referred to for details of the description, quality, and test of plant and material used, and the workmanship, conditions, obligations, liabilities and instructions generally which shall be complied with in carrying out the Agreement. The cost of complying with all conditions, obligations and liabilities described in the Agreement documents including profit, shall be deemed to be included in the rates quoted by the Respondent.

2.8 AGREEMENT PRICE AND ADJUSTMENT FACTOR

• No price adjustment will be applicable in this Agreement. Any price increase due to escalation will be for the Respondent account and any price decrease will be to his/her benefit.

2.9 VALUE-ADDED TAX

Value-added tax in terms of the Value-added Tax Act No. 89 of 1991 should not be included
in the unit rates. Provision is made in the Schedule of Prices for the lump addition of Valueadded Tax.

2.10 SITE REGISTER

- The Respondent shall provide a site register and a daily diary book at the various sites as directed by the Supervisor for the duration of the Agreement.
- The register shall only be used by the Supervisor or his/her deputy and will be used for the issuing of instructions to the Respondent and the monitoring of services supplied.
- The Respondent shall complete the register and a detailed description of the work done shall be
 recorded on a daily basis. The register shall not be removed from the site without the permission
 of the Supervisor or his/her deputy.

2.11 PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

Protective clothing according to Safety Code should be worn at all times in Transnet Freight Rail
operational areas whenever executing services to fulfil contract obligations. All staff to be
supplied with all necessary clothing, e.g. gloves, shoes etc. when entering the sites where the
service is to be rendered.

2.12 SERVICE LEVELS

 The Parties hereto agree to adhere to the following criteria in terms of acceptable Service levels to be provided by the Respondent for the duration of this Agreement The Respondent shall -

- provide a detailed implementation plan to Transnet Freight Rail, which is to include, inter alia,
 time lines, check points and defined responsibilities for the Parties; and
- Maintain a site register per the various centers which will be signed off the Client employee and the Respondent
- Provide a contact number for customer which will be available 24 hours a day.
- The Parties will hold quarterly reviews, such meetings to be arranged and minutes recorded by Transnet Freight Rail.

2.13 BREACH OF CONTRACT

The client (Transnet Freight Rail) will be allowed to terminate the contract by giving 30 days' notice should the service not be according to specification and to the client's full satisfaction.

3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- The Respondent shall supply all the materials, chemicals and equipment required to perform the works.
- The Respondent shall be responsible for the safe-keeping of all his/her material and equipment.
 Transnet (Property) shall not be responsible for any losses or damages to the material and equipment.
- All work shall be carried out in a neat and orderly manner to the satisfaction of the Supervisor in charge of this project.
- The Respondent shall ensure that the site is left in a neat and tidy condition on a daily basis and after the completion of the works.
- The tendered price for the above works must include the costs of all chemicals, material and labour necessary for the proper execution of the works in every aspect.
- No sub-Respondent will be allowed on site without prior permission from the Supervisor in charge.

4 SAFETY

The Respondent shall ensure that a competent Supervisor overseas the safe running and completion of works and related activities. The Respondent shall be responsible in adhering to the safety clauses of ACT 85 of 1993 as applicable on type of work performed. The Respondent shall issue all its workers with the necessary protective clothing applicable to the type of work performed.



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NON DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT - SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made between

Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] [Registration No. 1990/000900/30]

whose registered office is at 49th Floor, Carlton Centre, 150 Commissioner Street, Johannesburg 2001,

WHEREAS

Transnet and the Company wish to exchange Information [as defined below] and it is envisaged that each party may from time to time receive Information relating to the other in respect thereof. In consideration of each party making available to the other such Information, the parties jointly agree that any dealings between them shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement which themselves will be subject to the parameters of the Bid Document.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED

1. INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement:

- 1.1 **Agents** mean directors, officers, employees, agents, professional advisers, contractors or sub-contractors, or any Group member,
- 1.2 **Bid or Bid Document** means Transnet's Request for Information [RFI] Request for Quote [RFQ] or Request for Quotation [RFQ], as the case may be;

 - a) is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available [other than as a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of this Agreement]; or
 - was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by
 its written records or other reasonable evidence] free of any restriction as to its use or
 disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or

- c) following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;
- 1.4 **Group** means any subsidiary, any holding company and any subsidiary of any holding company of either party; and
- 1.5 **Information** means all information in whatever form including, without limitation, any information relating to systems, operations, plans, intentions, market opportunities, know-how, trade secrets and business affairs whether in writing, conveyed orally or by machine-readable medium.

2. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 2.1 All Confidential Information given by one party to this Agreement [the Disclosing Party] to the other party [the Receiving Party] will be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, without the Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or indirectly communicate or disclose [whether in writing or orally or in any other manner] Confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2.2 The Receiving Party will only use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and commercial discussions between the parties in relation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information:
 - to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in clause 2.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. - 2.5 In the event that any Confidential Information shall be copied, disclosed or used otherwise than as permitted under this Agreement then, upon becoming aware of the same, without prejudice to any rights or remedies of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party shall as soon as practicable notify the Disclosing Party of such event and if requested take such steps [including the institution of legal proceedings] as shall be necessary to remedy [if capable of remedy] the default and/or to prevent further unauthorised copying, disclosure or use.
- 2.6 All Confidential Information shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and its disclosure shall not confer on the Receiving Party any rights, including intellectual property rights over the Confidential Information whatsoever, beyond those contained in this Agreement.

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3. RECORDS AND RETURN OF INFORMATION

- 3.1 The Receiving Party agrees to ensure proper and secure storage of all Information and any copies thereof.
- 3.2 The Receiving Party shall keep a written record, to be supplied to the Disclosing Party upon request, of the Confidential Information provided and any copies made thereof and, so far as is reasonably practicable, of the location of such Confidential Information and any copies thereof.
- 3.3 The Company shall, within 7 [seven] days of receipt of a written demand from Transnet:
 - a) return all written Confidential Information [including all copies]; and
 - expunge or destroy any Confidential Information from any computer, word processor or other device whatsoever into which it was copied, read or programmed by the Company or on its behalf.
- 3.4 The Company shall on request supply a certificate signed by a director as to its full compliance with the requirements of clause 3.3 b) above.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- 4.1 Neither party will make or permit to be made any announcement or disclosure of its prospective interest in the Bid without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 4.2 Neither party shall make use of the other party's name or any information acquired through its dealings with the other party for publicity or marketing purposes without the prior written consent of the other party.

5. DURATION

The obligations of each party and its Agents under this Agreement shall survive the termination of any discussions or negotiations between the parties regarding the Bid and continue thereafter for a period of 5 [five] years.

6. PRINCIPAL

Supplier Development within the contest of the B-BBEE scorecard must be differentiated from Transnet's Supplier Development Initiatives. Whereas the former relates to the definition above, the latter relates to improving the socio-economic environment through initiatives that are committed to as part of a contract award that contribute to the development of a competitive supplier base in relation to a particular industry.

⁷ "Enterprise Development" means monetary and non-monetary contributions carried out for the following beneficiaries, with the objective of contributing to the development, sustainability and financial and operational independence of those beneficiaries:

⁽a) Enterprise Development Contributions to Exempted Micro-Enterprises or Qualifying Small Enterprises which are at least 51% Black owned or at least 51% Black women owned;
