5 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

As described in more detail in the attached BBBEE Claim Form and as prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 c. 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that Transnet will allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate.

The value of this bid is estimated to be exceed \$1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the **90/10** system shall be applicable.

Respondents are required to complete Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit availed and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.1 **B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums**

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note the requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate for the JV or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.2 **Subcontracting**

Transnet fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting Respondents are requested to give preference to companies which are

Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs including any companies designated as B-BBEE Facilitators¹.

If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a Respondent will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such Respondent intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to an entity/entities that do not qualify for at least the same points that the Respondent qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME with the capability to execute the contract.

A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

In terms of Section 7 of this RFP [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] Respondents are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

5.3 **B-BBEE Improvement Plan**

Transnet encourages its Suppliers to constantly strive to improve their B-BBEE rating. Whereas Respondents will be allocated points in terms of a preference point system based on its B-BBEE scorecard to be assessed as detailed in paragraph 5.1 above, in addition to such scoring, Transnet also requests that Respondents submit a B-BBEE improvement plan. Respondents are therefore requested to indicate the extent to which they will maintain or improve their B-BBEE status over the contract period.

Respondents are requested to submit their B-BBEE Improvement Plan as an additional document with their Proposals by completion of **Annexure D**_appended hereto. [Refer to Section 11 and Annexure D for further instructions]

5.4 Supplier Development Initiatives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development which has resulted in inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. There have been a number of Government initiatives developed to address these challenges. In particular, the New Growth Path [NGP] and New Development Plan [NDP] aligns and builds on previous policies to ensure the achievement of Government's development objectives for South Africa.

Transnet fully endorses and supports Government's economic policies through its facilitation of Supplier Development [**SD**] initiatives. Hence Respondents are required to submit their commitments with regard to Supplier Development Initiatives over the duration of this contract.

¹ The Minister of the Department of Trade and Industry has the power to designate certain Organs of State or Public Entities as B-BBEE Facilitators. For example, the South African National Military Veterans' Association (SANMVA) has been designated as a B-BBEE Facilitator. As such they will be treated as having rights of ownership held 100% by Black People, 40% by Black Women and 20% by Black designated groups.

As a prequalification criterion to participate in this bid, Respondents are required to provide a commitment that the monetary value of all SD initiatives to be undertaken by them will not be less than 5% [Five percent] for Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME's), 10% [Ten percent] Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE's) and [15%] Large Enterprises (LE's) —of the contract value.

All Respondents must refer to Section 9 for instructions and complete Section_10 [Declaration of Supplier Development Commitments] as this is a mandatory returnable document. In addition, Respondents are required to submit a Supplier Development Plan and SD Value Summary, Annexure B and C as these are required as essential returnable documents.

Note: Should a JV be envisaged the principal Respondent is required to submit the required responses as indicated above.

The commitments made by the successful Rispondents will be incorporated as a term of the contract and monitored for compliance.

Furthermore, Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and

restricted from doing business with Transnet in the future.

7 CONFIDENTIALITY

7.1 All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information gleaned from provision of the Goods, which is either directly or indirectly related to Transnet's business, written approval to divulge such information must be obtained from Transnet.

8 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE RFP

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 10.1 modify the RFP's Goods and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- 10.2 reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- 10.3 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 10.4 not necessarily accept the lowest priced Proposal or an alternative bid;
- 10.5 reject all Proposals, if it so decides;
- 10.6 withdraw the RFP on good cause shown;
- 10.7 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;

- 10.8 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 10.9 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier, should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;

Section 2: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) is a business unit of Transnet Limited, and has a broad range of telecommunication services and devices that ensures the safe movement of trains. Such devices include train radios and telemeters which makes use of the Ultra High Frequency (UHF) and Very High Frequency (VHF) triband antennas for train authorisation between the train driver and the Train Control Officer (TCO), and for better train handling of the loco consist while the train is in transit.

TFR is embarking on an exercise to equip the new 1064 locomotive fleet with the train radios and Telemeters that require the UHF and VHF triband antennas or functionality.

2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Whereas Transnet is seeking a partner(s) to provide solutions for its Locomotive's train radio antennas nationally, it also seeks to improve its current processes for providing these Goods to its end user community throughout its locations.

The selected Supplier(s) will share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met by meeting contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Supplier(s) will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partner hip will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service and profitability.

Specifically, Transnet Freight Ran seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- 2.1 Transnet must receive reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Supplier's economies of scale and streamlined service processes.
- 2.2 Transnet must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both Transnet and the mosen Supplier(s).
- 2.3 Transnet must receive proactive improvements from the Supplier with respect to supply of Goods and related processes.
- 2.4 Transnet's overall competitive advantage must be strengthened by the chosen Supplier's leading edge technology and service delivery systems.
- 2.5 Transnet end users must be able to rely on the chosen Supplier's personnel for service enquiries, recommendations and substitutions.
- 2.6 Transnet must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Goods, including managed service processes on a Group basis.

3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 The scope of the tender includes the following:
 - UHF, GSM/Wi-Fi and GPS triband antennas
 - VHF, GSM/Wi-Fi and GPS triband antennas
- 3.2 This specification covers the requirements of TFR for the supply of UHF and VHF low profile triband (UHF/VHF, GSM/Wi-Fi and GPS) antennas used on the trains. The UHF triband antenna must be supplied cut for the combined 406 430 MHz and 450 470 MHz frequency bands while the VHF triband antenna must be supplied cut to 136 174 MHz frequency band. The maximum transmit power for these antennas is 25 Watts, 0dB gain and the VSWR must not exceed 1.5:1.

The following requirements shall be adhered to by the bidders; bidders shall submit:

- 1. A comprehensive proposal including the specifications, diagrams and detailed information for the items in the Schedule of Requirements and as called for in the specification;
- 2. Respondent will be required to submit a sample of the UHF antenna tendered for failure to submit, tenderer will be disqualified;

For VHF antennas not approved by TFR, samples shall be submitted to TFR with the tender bids.

If the antenna offered by the respondent in this tender differs in structure, model number or operationally, then the antenna must be re-submitted with the tender bids for evaluation.

Quantities to be provided per sample shall be one (1) of each antenna, per supplier (i.e 1×1 UHF Triband Antenna and 1×1 VHF Triband Antenna).

- Each unit shall be packaged in a separate enclosure, clearly marked the type of unit enclosed and the supplier's name;
- Manuals, cashes and performance results of the antennas shall also be supplied;

The Laboratory tests will be conducted for two (2) weeks against the following:

- Technical Specification Low Profile DC Grounded Combined VHF, UHF, GSM /W-Fi, and CPS Vain Antennas Specification.
- Hardware Compliance Tests
- Dimensions of the antennas against the Low Profile DC Grounded Combined VHF, UHF, GSM /W-Fi, and GPS Train Antennas Specification

The supplier's antennas that have passed the product approval stage will proceed to the next stage of evaluation (Technical Functionality).

Technical Evaluation Results (Laboratory Tests) can be made available to the supplier's on request.

Suppliers can use the product evaluation results from the National Test Center to correct the areas of non-conformances for future tendering.

Equipment supplied must be ICASA approved; ICASA approval certificate and dealers licence must be submitted with the tender bids.

- 3. A comprehensive delivery schedule including equipment lead times;
- 4. List of previous projects and similar work undertaken with traceable references;
- A detailed outline of the company's technical capacity including the organisational structure and technical personnel qualifications;

- 6. Bidders must submit a clause by clause compliance to the Low Profile DC Grounded Combined VHF, UHF, GSM /W-Fi, and GPS Train Antennas specification bearing the following letters

3.3 NOTES:

The awarded bidder will have to adhere to the following requirements;



2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;

- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual ordal revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "**rand value**" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and roudes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 "subcontract" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 **"total revenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 **"trust"** means the arangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to at ustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for supproperty to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

- 4.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Fegistered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black whereship.
- 4.4 In terms of the 2003 version of the Codes of Good Practice, Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.5 The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a transitional period ending 30 April 2015. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. - 4.10 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.

Section 9: SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

1.1 Aim and Objectives

Historically in South Africa there has been a lack of investment in infrastructure, skills and capability development and an inequality in the income distribution and wealth of a significant portion of the population. There have been a number of Government initiatives developed to address these challenges. In particular, the New Growth Path [NGP] and New Development Plan [NDP] aligns and builds on previous policies to ensure the achievement of Government's development objectives for South Africa. Transnet fully endorses and supports Government's New Growth Path policy.

The key focuses of the NGP include:

- increasing employment intensity of the economy
- addressing competitiveness
- balancing spatial development of rura areas and poorer provinces
- reducing the carbon intensity of the conomy
- creating opportunities in improving perional and global cooperation
- enabling transformation that be refits a wider range of social actors in society e.g. workers, rural communities, youth and women

1.0 Scope

This specification defines Spoornet requirements for the mechanical and electrical safety requirements for roof-mounted antennas on locomotives.

This specification applies to new tri-band antennas, which will be installed on all type of locomotives that will operate under an electrical supply system with nominal voltages of 3kV DC and/or 25kV AC or 50kV AC. The specification does not cover the safety installation requirements such as whicle gauge and electrical clearance requirements.

2.0 Note

Much of the content in this specification are abstracts from draft specification RSE/TE/SPC/0088. The draft specification shall supersede this specification once approved.

6.0 Introduction

Spoornet is to acquire tri-band antennas for signalling and telecommunication purposes. These antennas are to be rolled out on locomotives operating on 3kV DC and/or 25 kV AC in the near future and on the Iron Ore line (50 kV AC) in the long run. Since these tri-band antennas are to be installed long after the locomotives are in service, extra care has to be taken to ensure the antennas meet HV safety requirements as well as the mechanical safety requirements as called for in draft specification RSE/TE/SPC/0088.

7.0 General requirements of antenna

Table 1: List of general requirements on the antennas

Description of requirement
Antenna must be properly labeled with manufactures name, antenna type or model number, the serial number of the antenna in numerate, contract number, date of manufacture and the Spoorne logo must appear on the nameplate.
The maximum reight of antenna measured vertically between
the top of the ocomotive roof and the top of the antenna enclosure must not exceed 110 mm.
The design of antenna assembly must ensure compliance with the environmental conditions that are applicable to locomotives as set out below:
Maximum altitude above sea level: 1 980 m.
 Operating in a saline atmosphere with relative humidity as high as 86% non condensing. Temperature range: -10°C to 50°C.
The insulation material must be durable for the specified
environmental and mechanical shock and vibration conditions.
me material must maintain its insulation characteristics for the life of the antenna.
Material of antenna enclosure must be UV stabilized
The antenna must be properly earthed as specified in clause
901.0 of the ESI. This requires that "All metal structures within a distance of 3 m from live overhead track equipment must be earthed. The antenna wiring must provide a secondary level of protection, with the earth wires thick enough to enable a potential fault current to safely flow to ground.

8.0 Performance requirements

8.1 Mechanical vibration requirement

The complete antenna assembly must be tested for compliance with the vibration requirements throughout the range of frequencies and acceleration levels experienced in service as described in the test method below.

Test method

The complete antenna is fixed, in a suitable position and in the orientation that it will be mounted on the vehicle. A machine producing sinusoidal vibrations of adjustable amplitude and frequency must be used to simulate vibrations on the antenna structure. The excitation must be applied on the antenna-mounting base.

To detect the possible existence of a critical frequency, the frequency is progressively varied from 1 Hz to 50 Hz in increments of 1 Hz. The frequency is held at a particular setting for at least 30 seconds. Oscillation amplitude in millimeters is given by the following formulae.

$$a = \frac{25}{f}$$
 for 1 Hz \leq f \leq 10 Hz
 $a = \frac{250}{f^2}$ for 10 Hz \leq f \leq 50 Hz

The test must be carried out in each of the three directions: Vertical direction, longitudinal direction and Lateral direction. In the event of resonance, the corresponding frequency must be naintained for at least five minutes to ensure that there are no harmful effects on the atisfactory operation of the antenna.

After the successful completion of the above test, the antenna must then be subjected to a sustained vibration test for a period of 2 hours. This will be at the critical (resonance) frequency or if such a frequency was not detected then a frequency of 10 Hz must be used. The test must be carried out in each of the three directions: Vertical direction, longitudinal direction and Lateral direction.

Acceptance criteria

These tests will be considered successful if there is no resulting damage to the antenna assembly and if the insulated cover is still mechanically intact and forms mechanically a but with the antenna base.

8.2 Mechanical impact requirement

After completion of the vibration test an impact load must be applied to the antenna. The complete antenna is fixed, in a suitable position and in the orientation that it will be mounted on the vehicle. An impact load of +3g is applied by means of a pendulum to the top to the antenna enclosure. The test must be carried out separately for the vertical direction, the longitudinal direction and lateral direction.

Acceptance criteria

There must be no physical damage to the antenna enclosure and the enclosure and the base must still form an integral unit mechanically.

8.3 Requirement on the degree of protection provided by the antenna

The antenna enclosure shall ensure that the assembly is dust tight and protected against the ingress of water projected in jets from any direction. This requires that the antenna enclosure rating shall be not less than *IP65* and *IP68* as defined in IEC 60529.

8.4 Dielectric requirements

Clause 5.6 of publication IEC 61133 requires that dielectric tests be performed on electrical equipment in order to test the insulation integrity. IEC 60077-1 is the most appropriate specification for test voltages to confirm the insulation integrity of the insulated antenna enclosure.

Since the antenna is roof mounted, the insulated enclosure must comply with the same insulation value as that of the locomotive roof equipment. The dielectric test voltages obtained from IEC 60077-1 are given in Table 2 below for the three type of electrification at Spoornet. For the dielectris test IEC 60077-1 requires that the AC test voltage be applied for one minute. There shall be no flash over, insulation breakdown or surface tracking.

8.5 Requirements on high voltage safety

The antenna has to be evaluated for high voltage safety in case of accidental contact with loose overhead equipment. These conditions are possible under abnormal operating conditions when defective or loose live overhead support structure equipment, e.g. steady arms, droppers, overhead wires or other such equipment may could be or come in contact with or drop onto the antenna.

Since the antenna is connected to low voltage equipment the design must ensure that under normal and abnormal conditions, the output voltage from the antenna conforms to the step and touch voltage values specified in Annexure 9.5 of the Spoornet ESI as follows:

- Shall not exceed 50 V under normal conditions.
- Shall not exceed 430 V for a duration of not longer than 100 ms under fault conditions.

1. SCOPE

1.1. This specification covers the requirements of Transnet for the supply of combined VHF, UHF (Bands: 406 - 430 MHz and 450 - 470MHz), GSM / Wi-Fi and GPS low profile train antennas.

2. SCHEDULE OF REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. The equipment required is listed in the Schedule of Requirements. The tenderer's clause-by-clause statement of compliance shall also cover the relevant clauses in the Schedule of Requirements.
- 2.2. Any special requirements not covered by this specification will be included in the Schedule of Requirements.

3. COMPLIANCE

- 3.1 Tenderers must theirs offers in terms of this specification.
 - 3.1.1 Offers, which include deviations of a minor nature, not departing greatly from the specification will be considered at the discretion of Transnet.
- 3.2 Tenderers may submit afternative offers for equipment considered by them to be equal or better than that called for in the specification.
 - 3.2.1 Such alternation offers must be accompanied by full explanation supporting the lenderer's claim regarding the suitability of the equipment.
 - 3.2.2 Such alterative offers will be considered at the discretion of Transnet.

4.2 All component parts, including viring, must be manufactured and processed to ensure reliable operation under these conditions.

5. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ANTENNA

5.1 General Requirements Cerning Antenna Construction

- 5.1.1 The antenna construction must be such as to incorporate the functionality of the UHF GSM/Wi-Fi+ GPS antenna into the same unit. Each of the antennas must have a separate connector, but all antennas must be incorporated into the same physical housing.
- 5.1.2 The antenna must be constructed for mounting on a metal train roof and mounting dimensions as per Figure 1.
- 5.1.3 Care must be taken to ensure easy access to the connectors while the antenna is mounted in position. Fly leads are not preferred. If fly leads cannot be avoided, it must be kept to a distance of less than 20cm. Flyleads must also be protected against chafing.
- 5.1.4 The mechanical dimensions of the antenna are as follows:

- 5.1.5 All necessary mounting hardware, gaskets and seals must be supplied, including three mounting studs, 8mm thick x 3 cm long, including star washers and nyloc nuts. See figure 1 for location of mounting studs.
- 5.1.6 Where mounting studs are used, they must be waterproofed by means of Orings or similar means. Tenderers must give full detail of the mechanism used.
- 5.1.7 The antennas must be insulated against sparking and other discharge from the electrified traction overhead wire as per report RS-2006/143.
- 5.1.8 If a protective cover or dome is used to cover the internal components of the antenna, it must be of good mechanical standard. The protective cover must have very little or no effect on the efficiency of the antenna.
- 5.1.9 The protective cover must be able to withstand the impact as per report RS-2006/143 under subclasses 8.2.
- 5.1.10 The protective cover must be able to withstand contact with sparks from the electrified traction overhead vires as per the report RS-2006/143 under sub clauses 8.4 and 8.5.
- 5.1.11 The antenna must be able to operate continuously at speeds of up to 150 km/hour.
- 5.1.12 The antenna must not be constructed of any materials that may pose a health risk to diverse maintenance personnel or any other person that may come into contact with the antenna.
- 5.1.13 The antennal must not require routine maintenance.

5.2 UHF Antenna Specific Requirements

- 5.2.1 The antenna must be supplied cut and tuned for the frequencies specified and no field tuning must be necessary (406-430 and 450-470 MHz).
- 5.2.2 Transmit power to antenna will not exceed 25 watts.
- 5.2.3 The antenna must be suitable for operation on frequencies on the band specified in the on 5.2.1. Above. Tenderers must state bandwidth of the antenna offered.
- 5.2.4 The VSWR must not exceed 1, 5:1 max over the entire specified bandwidth.
- 5.2.5 The nominal impedance must be 50 ohms measured at the antenna terminal when mounted as specified..,
- 5.2.6 The antenna must be vertically polarised.



- 5.2.7 The material used for the construction of the antenna and mounting clamps etc. must be chosen and/or suitably treated so as to resist weathering and avoid corrosion due to dissimilar metals being in physical contact.
- 5.2.8 The antenna cable connector must be waterproofed by means of a rubber O-ring or similar arrangement. Tenderers are to give full details of how this is achieved.
- 5.2.9 Tenderers must submit full technical details, including, but not limited to, polar diagrams showing antenna radiation patterns, mass, wind rating and gain with their quotations. Tenderers must state the protection mechanism from lightning and contact with overhead electric line e.g. direct ground.

5.2.10 Antenna gain

- 5.2.10.1 The gain of the antenne in any direction must be taken to mean the ratio of:
 - i. the power received in the far-field in that direction by a reference test dipole antenna when a test signal is injected into the antenna-under-test while it is mounted on the roof of a locomotive.
 - ii. to the power received at the same place in the far-field by the reference test dipole antenna when the test signal is injected into a half-wave dipole antenna mounted in free space at the same height and in the same position as the antenna-under-test, with the locomotive and the antenna-under-test removed, and all other test conditions the same. The half-wave dipole must be mounted one-half-wave-wavelength from the non-metallic, insulating support post.
- 5.2.10.2 The antenna must have an Omni-directional radiation pattern with a minimum gain of 0 dBd (\pm 1 dB) in the horizontal plane (measured at antenna termination point).
- 5.2.10.3 The gain in the vertical plane for angles less than 30 degrees from the horizontal plane must not vary more than 1dB from the gain in the horizontal plane.
- 5.2.10.4 The gain must not vary more than $\pm 1 dBr$ over the entire frequency band.



- 5.2.10.5 The radio antenna must be able to transmit at rated output and specified frequency, without affecting or de-sensing the GPS /GSM receivers/antenna system. Tenderers must provide documentary proof of this.
- 5.2.10.6 Certified radiation polar diagrams and VSWR readings must be provided with the tender.
- 5.2.10.7 The antenna connector must be suitable for the frequency of the antenna. The type of connector shall be 50 ohm "N" type female. If another type is proposed, full details must be provided.

- 5.3.9 Tenderers must submit full technical details, including, but not limited to, polar diagrams showing antenna radiation patterns, mass, wind rating and gain with their quotations. Tenderers must state the protection mechanism from lightning and contact with overhead electric line e.g. direct ground.

5.3.10 Antenna gain.

5.3.10.1 The gain of the antenna in any direction must be taken to mean the ratio of-:

- the power received in the far-field in that direction by a reference test dipole antenna when a test signal is injected into the antenna-under-test while it is mounted on the roof of a locomotive;
- ii. to the power received at the same place in the far-field by the reference test dipole antenna when the test signal is injected into a half-wave dipole antenna mounted in free space at the same height and in the same position as the antenna-under-test with the locomotive and the antenna-under-test removed, and all other test conditions the same. The half-wave dipole must be mounted one-nelf-wave-wavelength from the non-metallic, insulating support post.
- 5.3.10.2 The antenna flust have an Omni-directional radiation pattern with a minimum gain of 0 dBd (± 1 dB) in the horizontal plane (measured at antenna termination point).
- 5.3.10.3 The gain in the vertical plane for angles less than 30 degrees from the horizontal plane must not vary more than 1dB from the gain of the horizontal plane.
- 5.3.10.4 The gain must not vary more than ± 1 dBr over the entire frequency band.
- 5.3.10.5 The radio antenna must be able to transmit at rated output and specified frequency, without affecting or de-sensing the GPS /GSM receivers/antenna system. Tenderers must provide documentary proof of this.
- 5.3.10.6 Certified radiation polar diagrams and VSWR readings must be provided with the tender.
- 5.3.10.7 The antenna connector must be suitable for the frequency of the antenna. The type of connector shall be 50 ohm "N" type female. If another type is proposed, full details must be provided.

5.4 GPS Antenna Specific Requirements



- 5.4.1 The antenna must be suitable for the use with any GPS receiver unit in the 1, 2-1, 6 GHz band.
- 5.4.2 The antenna must be DC protected, to prevent high voltage from entering the equipment connected to the antenna. This protection mechanism must prevent the GPS equipment from receiving high voltages die to accidental contact with wires of lightning strikes. Tenderers must indicate the proposed mechanism of protection.
- 5.4.3 The antenna must have a nominal impedance of 50 ohm.
- 5.4.4 The antenna cable connector must be waterproofed by means of a rubber O-ring or similar arrangement. Tenderers must give full details of how this is achieved.
- 5.4.5 The antenna must be suitable for operation on locomotives working under 25 k Volt AC, 50 k V AC and 3 Volt DC overhead cables and on diesel and diesel-electric locomotives.

5.5 GSM/Wi-Fi Antenna Specific Fequirements

- 5.5.1 The GSM and Wi Fi elements can be a combination, covering the appropriate bands GSM 900/1800/1900 MHz and Wi-Fi band 2, 4 -2, 5 GHz).
- 5.5.2 The antenna hust be supplied cut and tuned for the frequencies specified and no field tuning must be necessary for both bands.
- 5.5.3 The anterna must be suitable for operation on frequencies in the band specified in the Schedule of Requirements. Tenderers must state bandwidth of the antenna offered.
- 5.5.4 The VSWR must not exceed 2:1 max over the entire specified bandwidth.
- 5.5.5 The nominal impedance must be 50 ohms measured at the antenna terminal when mounted as specified.
- 5.5.6 The antenna must be vertically polarised.
- 5.5.7 The materials used for the construction of the antenna and mounting clamps etc. must be chosen and/or suitably treated so as to resist weathering and avoid corrosion due to dissimilar metals being in physical contact.
- 5.5.8 The antenna cable connector must be waterproofed by means of a rubber O-ring or similar arrangement. Tenderers are to give full details of how this is achieved.



- 5.5.9 Tenderers must submit full technical details, including, but not limited to, polar diagrams showing antenna radiation patterns, mass, wind rating and gain with their quotations. Tenderers must state the protection mechanism from lightning and contact with overhead electric line e.g. direct ground.
- 5.5.10 The antenna must have an Omni-directional radiation pattern in the horizontal plane (measured at antenna termination point).
- 5.5.11 The gain in the vertical plane for angles less than 30 degrees from the horizontal plane must not vary more than 1dB from the gain in the horizontal plane.
- 5.5.12 The radio antenna must be able to transmit at rated output and specified frequency, without affecting or descending the UHF / VHF receivers/antenna system. Tenderers must provide documentary proof of this.
- 5.5.13 Certified radiation polar diagrams and VSWR readings must be provided with the tender.
- 5.5.14 The antenna connector most be suitable for the frequency of the antenna.

 The type of connector shall be 500hm FME/SMA type female in-line If another type is proposed, full details must be provided.

6. QUALITY OF MATERIAL

All materials used must be of the best quality and of the class most suitable for the purpose for which it is required. Tenderers must quote the authorised standards to which the material or the equipment offered conforms.

7. EVALUATION


- 7.1 Tenderers shall be required to submit samples for test and evaluation purposes. The prototype must be available for evaluation within two weeks from the date it is requested. Tests conducted on the sample antenna may include high voltage tests, which may damage the antenna. The cost of the antenna will not be recoverable.
- 7.2 The supplier must provide specifications of the proposed antenna as well as design and test results on the antenna.



8. GENERAL
