1 Responses to RFQ

Responses to this RFQ [**Quotations**] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. The original signed RFQ will serve as the legal binding document and no copies will be accepted for evaluation purposes.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

 the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and

- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled. Similarly, if the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to exceed R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the **90/10** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sectorspecific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

I/We further agree that if, after I/we have been notified of the acceptance of my/our Quotation, I/we fail to deliver the said goods/service/s within the delivery lead-time quoted, Transnet may, without prejudice to any other legal remedy which it may have, cancel the order and recover from me/us any expenses incurred by Transnet in calling for Quotations afresh and/or having to accept any less favourable offer.

Notes to Pricing:

- a) All Prices must be quoted in South African Rand, exclusive of VAT
- b) To facilitate like-for-like comparison bidders must submit pricing strictly in accordance with this price schedule and not utilise a different format. Deviation from this pricing schedule could result in a bid being disqualified.
- c) Please note that should you have offered a discounted price(s), Transnet will only consider such price discount(s) in the final evaluation stage if offered on an unconditional basis.

PRICE ADJUSTMENT FOR INFLATION:

- 1.1. A contract price adjustment factor to be determined in accordance with the formula will be applied to allow for all increases or decreases in costs, from any cause whatsoever, which may occur after the closing date of the submission of tenders and before the date of completion.
- 1.2. The contract price adjustment factor shall be rounded off to six decimal places.

1.3. The formula for the contract price adjustment factor shall be -

$$(1-x)(0.20\frac{Lt}{Lo}+0.05\frac{Pt}{Po}+0.70\frac{Mt}{Mo}+0.05\frac{Dt}{Do}-1)$$

where x = 0.15 and

- Lo, Po, Mo and Do are respectively labour, machinery, material and diesel fuel indices ruling for the calendar month four (4) months prior to closing date of the tender;
- Lt, Pt, Mt and Dt are respectively labour, machinery, material and diesel fuel indices ruling for the calendar month four (4) months prior to the date of measurement.
- 1.4. The indices to be used shall be those for the Consumer Price Index, Production Price Index and Contract Price Adjustment Provisions as obtained from the monthly Statistical News Release published by STATS South Africa.
 - Lo and Lt shall be the labour indices as indicated in P0141; Table A; Consumer Price Index: Main Indices; Geographic indices, CPI for primary urban areas.
 - Po and Pt shall be the average of the producer price indices of Metals, machinery, equipment & computing equipment (weighted average of General & special purpose machinery and Household appliances & office machinery) and Transport Equipment (All) in the ratio of 1:1 (P0142.1).
 - Mo and Mt shall be the producer price indices for Intermediate manufactured goods, Table 2, Chemicals, rubber & plastic products (Basic and other chemicals), PO142.1.
 - Do and Dt shall be the producer price indices for selected materials (Diesel fuel, Coast & Witwatersrand) (Contract Price Adjustment Provisions, CPAP, P0151, Table 4).
- 1.5. When the value of an index at the time of calculation is not known the latest available index shall be used and any correction necessary shall be made by addition or subtraction in subsequent monthly payment certificates.
- 1.6. The amounts to be added to or subtracted from the monthly payment certificates shall be calculated by multiplying the amount certified for payment for that month (but excluding amounts not subject to price adjustment) by the contract price adjustment factor for that month.
- 1.7. Adjustment to measurements of previous months' quantities will be included in calculation of the amount certified for payment and will therefore be subject to the price adjustment factor of the current measurement month.
- 1.8. Any additions to or deductions from the amount payable, brought about by the application of the contract price adjustment factor, shall be deemed to have made full allowance for all increases or decreases in cost from any cause whatsoever, including all overhead costs as well as any increases and decreases therein, and profit.
- 1.9. Value added tax shall be excluded from individual payment item rates and price adjustment indices as it will be added to the total of the month's measurement, after price adjustment have been made in terms hereof.

Section 3

STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF GOODS OR SERVICES TO TRANSNET

A Supplier/Service Provider shall be obliged to adhere to the Standard Terms and Conditions for the Supply of Goods and Services to Transnet as expressed hereunder. Should the Respondent find any condition(s) unacceptable, it should indicate which condition(s) is/are unacceptable and offer an alternative(s). A Quotation submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

1 SOLE AGREEMENT

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, these terms [**Terms** and each **Term**] and **Transnet**'s purchase order(s) [**Order** or **Orders**] represent the only conditions upon which Transnet SOC Ltd [**Transnet**] procures goods [**the Goods**] or services [**the Services**] specified in the Order from the person to whom the Order is addressed [**the Supplier/Service Provider**]. Transnet does not accept any other conditions which the Supplier/Service Provider may specify, unless otherwise agreed to by Transnet in writing. In the event of any inconsistency between these Terms and any Order, these Terms shall take precedence.

2 CONFORMITY WITH ORDER

Goods/Services shall conform strictly with the Order. The Supplier/Service Provider shall not vary the quantities specified and/or the specification, if any, stipulated in the Order, without the prior written consent of Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider warrants that the Goods/Services shall be fit for their purpose and of satisfactory quality.

3 DELIVERY AND TITLE

- 3.1 The delivery dates and addresses are those in the Order. Time shall be of the essence in respect of the Supplier's/Service Provider's obligations under the Order.
- 3.2 The Supplier/Service Provider will not be excused for delay in delivery or performance except due to circumstances outside its control and then only subject to the Supplier/Service Provider having notified Transnet in writing on becoming aware of such circumstances. Transnet may terminate an Order, in whole or in part, without incurring any liability to the Supplier/Service Provider if such a delay becomes, in Transnet's absolute opinion, significant.
- 3.3 If on delivery, the Goods/Services do not conform to the Order, Transnet may reject the Goods/Services and the Supplier/Service Provider shall promptly rectify any defects or in Transnet's opinion, supply appropriate replacement Goods/Services at the Supplier's/Service Provider's expense within the specified delivery times, without any liability due by Transnet.

4 PRICE AND PAYMENT

4.1 Prices specified in an Order cannot be increased. Payment for the Goods/Services shall be made by Transnet against an original undisputed invoice(s) [a Tax Invoice], supporting documentation and month-end statement from the Supplier/Service Provider. Tax Invoices plus supporting documentation shall be posted to the address shown in the Order.

4.2 Payment of the Supplier's/Service Provider's valid Tax Invoice(s) will be made by Transnet in the South African currency and on the terms stated in the Order, the standard payment terms being 30 [thirty] days from date of receipt by Transnet of a month-end statement, unless otherwise agreed to in writing. Transnet shall arrange for payment of such Tax Invoices and any pre-authorised additional expenses incurred, provided that the authorised expenses are supported by acceptable documentary proof of expenditure incurred [where this is available]. Any amounts due in terms of these Terms shall be paid to the Supplier/Service Provider, taking into account any deduction or set-off and bank charges.

5 PROPRIETARY RIGHTS LIABILITY

If any allegations should be made or any claim asserted against Transnet that ownership of, or any act or omission by Transnet in relation to Goods/Services or any written material provided to Transnet relating to any Goods/Services or pursuant to an Order being a violation or infringement of any third party's contractual, industrial, commercial or intellectual property rights including but not limited to any patent, registered design, design right, trade mark, copyright or service mark on any application thereof, the Supplier/Service Provider hereby indemnifies Transnet against and hold it harmless from any and all losses, liabilities, costs, claims, damages and expenses [including any legal fees] arising directly or indirectly from such allegation or claim provided that this indemnity shall not apply where the allegation or claim arises solely as a result of the Supplier/Service Provider following a design or process originated and furnished by Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider shall either

- a) procure for Transnet the right to continue using the infringing Goods; or
- b) modify or replace the Goods/Services so that they become non-infringing,

provided that in both cases the Goods/Services shall continue to meet Transnet's requirements and any specifications stipulated in the Order. Should neither option be possible, the Supplier/Service Provider may remove, with Transnet's prior written consent, such Goods/Services and will pay to Transnet a sum equivalent to the purchase price. If Transnet refuses to give such consent, the Supplier/Service Provider shall have no liability in respect of any continued use of the infringing Goods/Services after Supplier's/Service Provider's prior written request to remove the same.

6 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

All information which Transnet has divulged or may divulge to the Supplier/Service Provider and any information relating to Transnet's business which may have come into the Supplier's/Service Provider's possession whilst carrying out an Order, and the existence of the Order, shall be treated by the Supplier/Service Provider as confidential information and shall not, without Transnet's prior written consent, be disclosed to any third party, or be used or copied for any purposes other than to perform the Order. This clause does not apply to information which is public knowledge or available from other sources other than by breach of this Term. Upon request by Transnet, the Supplier/Service Provider shall return all materials issued pursuant to the Order and, pending this, shall protect Transnet's rights in any such materials. Such confidential information shall at all material times be the property of Transnet.

7 PUBLICITY

The Supplier/Service Provider shall not name Transnet or use its trademarks, service marks [whether registered or not] or Goods in connection with any publicity without Transnet's prior written consent.

8 TERMINATION OF ORDER

- 8.1 Transnet may cancel an Order in whole or in part at any time upon at least 7 [seven] days' written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider, or when there is a change in control of the Supplier/Service Provider or the Supplier/Service Provider commits any serious breach or any repeated or continued material breach of its obligations under these Terms and/or Order or shall have been guilty of conduct tending to bring itself into disrepute, on written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider when such work on the Order shall stop.
- Transnet shall pay the Supplier/Service Provider a fair and reasonable price for justified work in progress, where such price reflects only those costs not otherwise recoverable by the Supplier/Service Provider, at the time of termination, and the Supplier/Service Provider shall give Transnet full assistance to check the extent of such work in progress. Payment of such price shall be in full and final satisfaction of any claims arising out of such termination and upon such payment the Supplier/Service Provider shall deliver to Transnet all work, including any materials, completed or in progress. The sum payable to the Supplier/Service Provider under this clause will not in any event exceed the total amount that would have been payable to the Supplier/Service Provider had the Order not been terminated.
- In the event of termination the Supplier/Service Provider must submit all claims within 2 [two] months of termination after which time claims will only be met in what Transnet considers exceptional circumstances.
- 8.4 If the Goods or Services are not provided in accordance with an Order, the Order shall be deemed terminated and the Supplier/Service Provider shall compensate Transnet for any costs incurred in obtaining substitute Goods or any damage caused due to the failure or delay in the delivery.

9 ACCESS

The Supplier/Service Provider shall be liable for the acts, omissions and defaults of its personnel or agents who, for the purposes of the Order, shall be treated as if they are the Supplier's/Service Provider's employees. The Supplier/Service Provider shall ensure that any such personnel or agents, whilst on Transnet's premises, shall comply with Transnet's health and safety, security and system security rules and procedures as and where required.

10 WARRANTY

The Supplier/Service Provider warrants that it is competent to supply the Goods/Services in accordance with these Terms to the reasonable satisfaction of Transnet and that all Goods/Services delivered under the Order: (a) conform and comply in all relevant legislation, standards, directives and orders related to [inter alia] the Goods/Services in force at the time of delivery, and to any specifications referred to in the Order; (b) will not cause any deterioration in the functionality of any Transnet equipment; and (c) do not infringe any third party rights of any kind. The Supplier/Service Provider hereby indemnifies Transnet against all losses, liabilities, costs, claims, damages, expenses and awards of any kinds incurred or made against Transnet in connection with any breach of this warranty.

11 INSOLVENCY

If the Supplier/Service Provider shall have a receiver, manager, administrator, liquidator or like person appointed over all or any part of its assets or if the Supplier/Service Provider compounds with its creditors or passes a resolution for the writing up or administration of the Supplier/Service Provider, Transnet is at liberty to terminate the Order or Orders forthwith, or at its option, to seek performance by any such appointed person.

12 ASSIGNMENT

The Supplier/Service Provider shall not assign its obligations under an Order without Transnet's prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

13 NOTICES

Notices under these Terms shall be delivered by hand to the relevant addresses of the parties in the Order or may be served by facsimile or by email, in which event notice shall be deemed served on acknowledgement of receipt by the recipient.

14 LAW

Orders shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with South African law and any disputes arising herein shall be subject to South African arbitration under the rules of the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa, which rules are deemed incorporated by reference in this clause. The reference to arbitration shall not prevent Transnet referring the matter to any South African courts, having jurisdiction, to which the Supplier/Service Provider hereby irrevocably submits but without prejudice to Transnet's right to take proceedings against the Supplier/Service Provider in other jurisdictions and/or obtaining interim relief on an urgent basis from a court of competent jurisdiction pending the decision in other courts or from instituting in any court of competent jurisdiction any proceedings for an interdict or any other injunctive relief. If the Supplier/Service Provider does not have a registered office in the South Africa it will at all times maintain an agent for service of process in South Africa and shall give Transnet the name and address of such agent as such may be amended, in writing, from time to time.

15 GENERAL

Completion or termination of an Order shall be without prejudice to any Term herein which by its nature would be deemed to continue after completion or termination, including but not limited to clauses **Error! Reference source not found.**, **Error! Reference source not found.**, **Error! Reference source not found.** and **Error! Reference source not found.** Headings are included herein for convenience only. If any Term herein be held illegal or unenforceable, the validity or enforceability of the remaining Terms shall not be affected. No failure or delay by Transnet to enforce any rights under these Terms will operate as a waiver thereof by Transnet. All rights and remedies available to either party under these Terms shall be in addition to, not to the exclusion of, rights otherwise available at law.

16 COUNTERPARTS

These Terms and conditions may be signed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Any party may enter into this agreement by signing any such counterpart.

Section 4 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS



PROJECT SPECIFICATION:

VEGETATION CONTROL IN STATION YARDS BY MEANS OF CHEMICAL HERBICIDE WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF EAST LONDON DEPOT

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GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE WORKS

1.1. EMPLOYERS OBJECTIVE

- 1.1.1. The essence of the Agreement is that Transnet Freight Rail requires the control of living vegetation and the management of dead remains of previously living vegetation, to the extent that areas treated in terms of the Agreement are free from any form of vegetation (dead or otherwise) which may obstruct, hinder or interfere with operational activities, or have the potential to damage equipment or facilities, on tracks or other areas included in the Agreement.
- 1.1.2. The ways and means by which the above-mentioned results are obtained are the responsibility of the Supplier. Transnet Freight Rail, however, shall have the right to monitor the materials and activities of the Supplier to ascertain that all procedures and herbicidal applications are in accordance with his/her tender, the relevant legislation and are conducive to the achievement of long-term control of vegetation. Such right of monitoring shall be entirely without prejudice to Transnet Freight Rail and shall in no way relieve the Supplier of his/her responsibility for satisfactory control of vegetation.
- 1.1.3. Failure to comply with the minimum performance proposed by the Supplier in his/her tender may form the basis for non-payment for work done, pending the achievement of control as defined and/or termination or cancellation of the Agreement.
- 1.1.4. The Supplier must obtain his/her own information regarding the extent, occurrence and the species of the vegetation over the work area. He/she must also determine the best method to control the vegetation.
- 1.1.5. The Agreement will only be awarded to a tenderer who has the required experience in the application of herbicides in Southern Africa as stipulated in terms of the Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act, Act 36 of 1947.

1.2. OVERVIEW OF THE WORKS

The Agreement covers the control of vegetation in mainly yards including declared weeds and declared invader plants, by means of chemical herbicides on Transnet property, to the extent that areas treated chemically or otherwise in terms of this Agreement are rendered and maintained free from obstructing vegetation as defined for the periods specified herein.

1.3. PERFORMANCE BOND:

- 1.3.1. Transnet Freight Rail requires a Performance Bond of 10% of the total value of the Agreement as security for the due and faithful performance by the Supplier of all the duties and obligations resting upon and assumed by him in terms of the Agreement.
- 1.3.2. The Performance Bond is to be returned to the Supplier upon completion of the Agreement after certification from the Project Manager that all Agreement requirements have been met

1.4. EXTENT OF THE WORKS

The service information briefly consists of the following:

- The control of vegetation, including declared weeds and declared invader plants by means of chemical herbicides of mainly yards as indicated in the Schedule of Requirements.
- The execution of the works shall include any work arising from or incidental to the service information or required of the Supplier for the proper completion of the Agreement in accordance with the true meaning and detail of the Agreement documents.
- The Supplier shall obtain his/her own information regarding species occurrence and extent of vegetation to be controlled in order to comply with the required standards.
- 1.4.1. The extent of the work consists of mainly yards as indicated in the Schedule of Requirements.

- 1.4.2. The performance due by the Supplier shall include any work arising from or incidental to the above or required of the Supplier for the proper completion of the Agreement in accordance with the true meaning and intent of the Agreement documents.
- 1.4.3. The Supplier shall obtain his/her own information regarding species, occurrence and extent of vegetation to be controlled in order to comply with the required standards.

1.5. LOCATION OF THE WORKS

- 1.5.1. The location of the works is as indicated in the Prices List and is in the geographical area controlled by the Depot Engineer (As per schedule of quantities).
- 1.5.2. Transnet Freight Rail's representative will provide one-copy schematic diagrams to the successful tenderer, indicating the areas to be treated.

1.6. DURATION OF AGREEMENT

The work provides for the control of vegetation for commencing on the date of notification of acceptance of tender with Transnet Freight Rail for a period of **24 months**.

2. GENERAL MAINTENANCE ASPECTS

2.1. WORK SPECIFICATIONS

2.1.1. Standard Specifications.

The following standard Specifications will be applicable to this Agreement:

- SANS 1200A General
- SABS Code of Practices no 0206-1983"Safety procedures for the disposal of surplus pesticides and associated toxic waste."
- 2.1.2. Generic Specifications:

The following Generic Specifications will be applicable to this Agreement:

- Transnet generic specifications.
- E4E (August 2006). Safety arrangements and procedural compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 and regulations.
- E7/1 (July 1998); Specifications for works on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and near high voltage equipment.

2.2. PLANT AND MATERIAL

- 2.2.1. Any plant and/or equipment provided to the Supplier at the beginning of the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet Freight Rail in the same condition, normal wear and tear accepted. Any loss or damage shall be made good by the Supplier, or the value thereof will be deducted from moneys falling due to him/her.
- 2.2.2. The Supplier shall provide written certification of compliance with specification of any materials (chemical) or equipment supplied by him / her.

2.3. CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT

All equipment necessary to execute the works shall be supplied by the Supplier.

2.4. EXISTING SERVICES

- 2.4.1. Reinstatement of services and property damaged during execution of the work.
- **2.4.2.** Any damages caused by the Supplier to Transnet property and services shall be rectified by the Supplier at his own cost and to the full satisfaction of the TransnetFreight Rail's representative.

2.5. SITE ESTABLISHMENT

2.5.1. SERVICES AND FACILITIES PROVIDED BY THE EMPLOYER:

- 2.5.1.1. In the case of an Agreement for vegetation control the following will be provided free of charge:
- 2.5.1.2. Water as required from Transnet Freight Rail's existing points of supply; such water may be untreated, chemically treated or borehole water. The Supplier shall be responsible for all work and equipment needed to fill the water trucks or spray units from the water point provided and to ensure that the water is suitable for its intended use. These water points may be up to 200km apart.
- 2.5.1.3. Road vehicle accessibility via service roads to the work site is not always possible.
- 2.5.1.4. Inspections of the areas of work by motor trolley may be arranged with the Project Manager's Deputy, but will have to coincide with normal track inspections carried out by the inspection /technical staff of the Depot. The Project Manager's Deputy shall be given timeous notice (4 calendar weeks) of the Supplier's intention to inspect.
- 2.5.1.5. Any plant and/or equipment provided to the Supplier at the beginning of the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet Freight Rail in the same condition, normal wear and tear accepted. Any loss or damage shall be made good by the Supplier, or the value thereof will be deducted from moneys falling due to him/her.

2.5.2. TO BE PROVIDED BY THE SUPPLIER

- 2.5.2.1. In addition to all labour materials, plant, equipment and incidentals needed to complete the work, the Supplier shall provide all accommodation and toilet facilities for his/her employees.
- 2.5.2.2. The Supplier shall provide safe and secure storage facilities for all herbicides or chemicals brought onto and in use on the site. Such facilities shall be capable of ensuring that unauthorised persons or animals cannot gain access to such chemicals.
- 2.5.2.3. The Supplier shall provide at his/her own cost any security measures he/she may deem necessary for safe and effective execution of the work within the Agreement area.
- 2.5.2.4. The personnel of the Supplier shall at all time, while on Transnet Freight Rail property and during vegetation control operations, wear reflective safety jackets. These jackets must either be yellow or light blue and preferably bear the name of the Supplier's company. Should the Supplier wish to use another colour this must first be cleared with the Project Manager's Deputy or his/her deputy.
- 2.5.2.5. An effective safety procedure to be followed by all personnel on any Transnet Freight Rail work site shall be compiled by the Supplier and implemented before any work commences. The procedure shall be updated whenever the need arises and any changes shall be communicated to all employees on a work site before work proceeds.

3. MANAGEMENT OF THE WORKS

3.1. SITE MEETINGS

The Supplier shall attend site meetings when required. These meetings will be held under the chairmanship of Transnet's representative. These meetings will be conducted to monitor progress and discuss agreed issues when required. A register will be kept of attendance and a minute of the proceedings will be recorded and distributed afterwards. When sub-Suppliers are required to attend, the Supplier shall ensure their attendance.

3.2. SITE BOOKS

- 3.2.1. A Site Instruction Book, A4 size, with triplicate pages shall be provided by the Supplier. The format for written communication on site shall be the Site Instruction Book. The site instruction shall have numbered sheet for receiving and recording instructions by the Employer's representative and shall be clearly marked "Site Instruction Book".
- 3.2.2. A Daily Diary Book with triplicate pages shall be provided by the Supplier and be available on site at all times. The number of staff and plant on site for every day shall be recorded. The hours of actual work and the accurate amount of work measured per item as in the Schedule of Requirements completed for each day shall also be recorded and signed off by both Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) and the Supplier at the end of each day. This site diary shall also serve as a daily record of all relevant information concerning herbicide application and site conditions prevailing on site and as required in terms of section 16 of Act 36 of 1947.
- 3.2.3. Only persons authorised in writing by the Project Manager or Supplier may make entries in the site books.

3.3. PROGRAMME OF WORK

- 3.3.1. The Supplier shall undertake the planning and programming of the entire vegetation control operation and shall submit to the Project Manager's Deputy for approval full particulars thereof within 2 weeks from the date of notification by Transnet Freight Rail of the acceptance of his/her tender or the commencement of the annual rainy reason as the case may be.
- 3.3.2. The particulars to be provided in respect of the Supplier's vegetation control programme shall include but not be limited to the following:
- 3.3.3. An assessment, based on a proper site investigation of the nature and types of vegetation to be controlled in the Agreement area,
- 3.3.4. The appropriate methods and procedures to be implemented by him/her to achieve the standards of vegetation control required in terms of the Agreement,
- 3.3.5. The chemicals to be applied, design mixes, rates of application and the timing and number of applications.
- 3.3.6. The methods and procedures to be implemented in mixing of chemicals pertaining to health and safety, quality control, protection of third parties and security,
- 3.3.7. The Supplier shall conduct regular site investigations and monitoring procedures for the purpose of:
 - Ascertaining the nature of weed infestation and factors that could influence the work;
 - monitoring the standard of weed control achieved;
 - identifying any damage or hazards which may have been caused by the weed control operation,
 - planning of timeous execution of remedial work where control is not being achieved.
- 3.3.8. The Supplier's programme shall allow for commencement with the initial application of chemicals at the appropriate timing, i.e. coinciding with the initial rainy season, for achieving maximum success and for completion in the shortest possible time, but not later than **six** weeks after commencement of the initial application.
- 3.3.9. The programme shall be based on the quantities and numbers of worklots shown in the Schedule of Requirements.
- 3.3.10. In addition to the annual programme provided the Supplier shall submit daily working programmes to the Project Manager's Deputy, 7 days in advance of the next working week, indicating the specific areas where the Supplier will be working each day of the week. Failure by the Supplier to submit a daily

programme and/or deviating from it without notifying the Project Manager's Deputy, preventing him/her from monitoring the Supplier's performance, may result in payment for such work being withheld.

3.4. PERFORMANCE MONITORING AND EVALUATION / INSPECTIONS

- 3.4.1. The Supplier shall at all times be responsible for supervision of the work and for follow-up inspections to monitor the successful control achieved over areas of completed application. He/she shall immediately take appropriate remedial action in areas where the specified standards of control are not achieved.
- 3.4.2. The Project Manager's Deputy shall at any time during the application periods carry out inspections of the Supplier's performance methods and procedures. He/she may at any time take samples of the chemicals applied and arrange for the testing thereof. Where test-samples fail to conform to the specifications the costs of testing will be recovered from the Supplier and he/she may be ordered by the Project Manager's Deputy to re-treat entire worklots or sections where such chemicals were applied.
- 3.4.3. The Project Manager's Deputy will during each growth season carry out [**two / three**] official inspections of the work for the purpose of measuring progress and evaluating whether control, as defined, has been achieved. The inspections shall be performed visually and the Supplier shall be present or forfeit his/her right to dispute the measurements and evaluation of the Project Manager's Deputy.
- 3.4.4. The first inspection shall be done at, or within [20] weeks after completion of the Supplier's initial spraying programme and after he/she has notified the Project Manager's Deputy that he/she has inspected the work and that control has been achieved. This inspection may be brought forward but not by more than four (4) weeks.
- 3.4.5. The second inspection of the season will be carried out at, or within [36] weeks after completion of the Supplier's initial spraying programme and after he/she has notified the Project Manager's Deputy that he/she has inspected the work and that control has been achieved. This inspection may be brought forward but not by more than four (4) weeks.
- 3.4.6. During each of these inspections the worklots treated will each be measured and evaluated. A worklot that does not comply with the specified level of control will be recorded as a "rejected worklot".
- 3.4.7. The rejection of worklots that do not comply with the standard of control for individual worklots will be final and valid for that inspection in that particular year.

The rejection by the Project Manager's Deputy of work performance may be contested by the Supplier only at the time and place of rejection.

The rejection of a worklot at a particular inspection shall remain final for that inspection for payment purposes, notwithstanding the fact that the Supplier may execute further remedial work in order to achieve control at further and final inspections.

3.4.8. In the case where the Project Manager's Deputy and the Supplier fail to agree on whether a worklot has failed, the worklot shall be recorded as a "disputed worklot" and the Supplier shall prepare an appropriate record of all disputed worklots in order that such disputes may be resolved by way of the disputes resolution procedures stipulated in the clause 25 of the standard terms and conditions of contract for the provision of services to Transnet.

4. ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

4.1. COMPLIANCE WITH STATUTES

- 4.1.1. The Supplier's procedures for the procurement, storage, handling, transportation, application and general use of chemicals shall comply with all applicable legislation, Codes of Practice and Local, Regional or Provincial Authorities, including but not restricted to:
 - a) The Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act (Act 36 of 1947) as amended.
 - b) The Hazardous Substance Act (Act 15 of 1973) as amended.
 - c) The Water Act (Act 54 of 1956) and the Water Amendment Act (Act 96 of 1984)(where applicable).
 - d) The National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998).
 - e) SABS Code of Practice No. 0206-1985 "Safety procedures for the disposal of surplus pesticide and associated toxic waste".
 - f) Conservation of Agricultural resources Act (Act 43 of 1983) as amended.
 - g) Common law of nuisance.
 - h) Mountain Catchment Area Act (Act 63 of 1970).
 - i) The National Veld and Forest Fire Act (Act 101 of 1989)
- 4.1.2. The Supplier's authorised representative on site shall be a **registered Pest Control Operator**, specialising in the field of **weed control** and registered in terms of the Farm Feeds Agricultural and Stock Remedies Act, Act 36 of 1947 as amended. A registered Pest Control Operator shall be in direct control of work taking place on site.

In the event of work taking place on numerous sites at the same time, the Supplier must ensure that there is a registered Pest Control Operator on each site.

4.2. DAMAGE TO FAUNA AND FLORA

- 4.2.1. The Supplier shall ensure that his/her employees at all times exercise care and consideration for the fauna and flora within and adjacent to the area to be sprayed.
- 4.2.2. The Supplier shall not apply any chemicals of an explosive, inflammable, highly volatile or corrosive nature, which may damage crops vegetation or property or be hazardous to humans or animals. The Supplier shall assume full responsibility for the efficiency and safety of whatever chemicals are used.
- 4.2.3. Dumping or polluting of any kind will not be permitted. This stipulation is also applicable to the washing out of tanks and equipment containing harmful chemicals and pollutants.

The Supplier shall institute and maintain procedures for the safe disposal of all chemicals and residual materials originating from the execution of the works.

Containers and residual material shall not be disposed of on Transnet Freight Rail property or as part of Transnet Freight Rail refuse.

4.2.4. The Supplier shall take particular note of environmentally sensitive areas and shall plan and execute his/her work with the utmost care and responsibility.

5. PARTICULAR SPECIFICATIONS

This part covers the techniques, types and use of spraying equipment, required standards of workmanship, inspections, measurement, payment, and acceptability of the works in respect of the control of vegetation required in terms of the Agreement.

5.1. DEFINITIONS

5.1.1. **Project Manager's Deputy**. Any person appointed by the Employer to deputise for him / her in supervising and carrying out the Agreement.

5.1.2. CONTROL

- 5.1.2.1. Control is achieved when all existing or potential growth of vegetation is permanently impaired or destroyed by the application and effects of chemical herbicides, to the extent that:
 - The constituent parts of all plants occurring within the area of treatment (worklots) cease to exist as living organisms or entities; and
 - the development of new growth of plants from dormant seeds is effectively counteracted or suppressed, for at least the growing season of the year in question;
 - there are no dead or dry remains of any vegetation within the treated area (worklot), which may constitute a hazard, danger, or hindrance to Transnet Freight Rail personnel, equipment trucks or operations.
- 5.1.2.2. Control constitutes a process or situation where the destruction of vegetation on treated areas occurs on an *on-going basis* and not only at the time of measurement and payment inspections.

5.1.3. WORKLOTS

- 5.1.3.1. A WORKLOT is a subdivision of any area on which the Supplier shall control vegetation.
 - In the case of yards and areas of a worklot will be areas of 300m² each.
 - Worklots in yards, depots/areas are not demarcated individually. The number of
 worklots within any area to be treated is calculated by dividing the total surface area by
 the surface area of single worklot i.e. 300 square metres.
 - In yards, depots/areas where control is required worklots may be irregular in shape.
 For inspection and payment purposes, worklots shall be physically measured where necessary. In such instances the Project Manager's Deputy shall decide in advance and advise the Supplier accordingly, of the method of measurement to be adopted in any particular area.
 - In yards, depots/areas worklots will normally be measured parallel to the main direction
 of the track work present, or parallel to the main axis of any other area. Worklots will
 not be measured individually in different directions but will form part of a pattern of
 continuous and parallel worklots covering, in the most effective manner possible, the
 surface of any particular area.
 - A worklot for cable routes will normally be areas of 0.75m wide on both sides and parallel to the cable route and 200m long.
- 5.1.3.2. However, if any provisional worklot has been sprayed under this Agreement the previous year and the same worklot is again sprayed the next year, payment for the second and consecutive years sprayed would be at the normal rate applicable for that area and the work would be considered as additional work to the Schedule of Requirements.
- 5.1.3.3. Formation is the finished earthworks surface upon which the track is laid.
- 5.1.3.4. Ballast means that part normally consisting of crushed stone, gravel, ash or muck, (the material placed on the formation to support the track superstructure).
- 5.1.3.5. Declared weeds means category 1 plants and declared invader plants means category 2 and 3 plants proclaimed under the Conservation of Agricultural Resources Act, Act No. 43 of 1983, including amendments (GN Regulation 1048 of 25/05/1984 amended by GN Regulation 280 of 30/03/2001) thereto.

5.1.3.6. Spraying means the even and uniform application of chemical herbicides at the rate specified and applies to liquid, granular or any other formulation.

5.2. METHOD OF VEGETATION CONTROL

- 5.2.1. The Supplier's methods and program shall provide rapid and effective control in all areas. Techniques, programming and chemicals employed shall therefore be directed at this aim. The Supplier shall carry out immediate treatment of growth in all instances where rapid and effective control is not achieved during any period of the Agreement.
- 5.2.2. Where a chemical approach to vegetation control is adopted, hoeing (skoffel) will not be allowed as method of achieving control. Herbicides which act as a scorching agent (e.g. with Paraquat or similar active ingredient) are incapable of meeting the definition of control and shall not be used. Scorching of canopy growth only shall not constitute control of vegetation as defined. Slashing of dead material to below the height specified in **5.3.3.** will be permitted.
- 5.2.3. Vegetation control in terms of the Agreement will normally be required in respect of the yards. The type of herbicides and the methods of application to be employed are as specified in the applicable returnable documents (clause 8.2) and are subject to the approval of, and monitoring by the Project Manager's Deputy.
- 5.2.4. The Project Manager's Deputy's approval shall first be obtained for use of other herbicides.
- 5.2.5. Application methods shall, however, be entirely in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and recommendations for safe and effective use of the herbicides or herbicide mixtures concerned.
- 5.2.6. Any deviation from the method of work submitted as per the applicable returnable document (Clause 8.2) by the Supplier shall be subject to the approval of the Project Manager's Deputy.

5.3. STANDARDS OF WORKMANSHIP

- 5.3.1. Standard of vegetation control for individual worklots.
- 5.3.2. Vegetation control shall be such that there is no live vegetation growth (including creepers) exceeding 150mm in any dimension, occurring in the worklot, nor more than fifteen (15) live plants of any lesser size

This excludes overhanging canopy growth of plants: -

- (a) with rootstock established entirely outside the worklot.
- (b) with rootstock established on the boundary of the worklot, provided that:
 - control was achieved over the remainder of the worklot.
 - a clear spray line is visible, showing that herbicide was effectively applied over the entire surface of the worklot.
 - the Supplier took the presence of such growth into account and that the choice of herbicides and chemical use was adjusted accordingly.
 - The boundary concerned is not the boundary of an adjoining worklot.

This exception does not apply in the case of creeping grasses (e.g. Cynodon) with nodal rooting within the worklot even though such growth may originate from a plant outside the worklot.

5.3.3. In addition, there shall be no dry or dead remains of vegetation within the worklot greater than 150mm in height and of a density such that it constitutes a hazard, hindrance or danger to Transnet Freight Rail operations, trucks or equipment in the area.

The evaluation to what density of dry or dead growth constitutes a hazard, hindrance or obstruction shall be made by the Project Manager's Deputy.

5.4. MANUAL REMOVAL OF VEGETATION

No felling or hoeing of vegetation will be allowed during the two months preceding final inspection. Herbicides may not be applied 2 weeks preceding final inspection for a season or a year's program. All lots where such hoeing and felling or herbicides application were done will be rejected.

For this Agreement, the Supplier should timeously acquaint him/herself with the existing conditions of the sites and ensure that his/her tender prices for the **first year only**, includes all work necessary to achieve the required control, e.g. slashing and removal of debris before or just after spraying. The intention to slash and remove should be cleared with the Project Manager's Deputy prior to work starting.

5.5. PRICE ADJUSTMENT FOR INFLATION:

5.5.1. A contract price adjustment factor to be determined in accordance with the formula will be applied to allow for all increases or decreases in costs, from any cause whatsoever, which may occur after the closing date of the submission of tenders and before the date of completion. The factor shall be rounded off to six decimal places.

The contract price adjustment factor shall be -

$$(1-x)\left(0.20\frac{Lt}{Lo} + 0.05\frac{Pt}{Po} + 0.70\frac{Mt}{Mo} + 0.05\frac{Dt}{Do} - I\right)$$

where x = 0.15 and

Lo, Po, Mo and Do are respectively labour, machinery, material and diesel fuel indices ruling for the calendar month four (4) months prior to closing date of the tender;

Lo, Po, Mo and Do are respectively labour, machinery, material and diesel fuel indices ruling for the calendar month four (4) months prior to closing date of the tender;

Lt, Pt, Mt and Dt are respectively labour, machinery, material and diesel fuel indices ruling for the calendar month four (4) months prior to the date of measurement.

- 5.5.2. The indices to be used shall be those for the Consumer Price Index and Production Price Index as obtained from the monthly Statistical News Release published by STATS South Africa.
- 5.5.3. Lo and Lt shall be the labour indices for Metropolitan Areas (P0141.1 Table 7.1).

Po and Pt shall be the average of the price indices of Non-Electrical Machinery multiplied by an equalizing factor of 1.00866 and Transport Equipment in the ratio of 1:1 (P0142.1 Table 10 item 2.16 and 2.21 respectively).

Mo and Mt shall be the price indices of Chemical and Chemical herbicides used in table 10 of the PO142.1 item 2.11 Basic Chemicals

Do and Dt shall be the price indices of "Diesel Oil -Coast & Witwatersrand" (P0142.1 Table 16).

- 5.5.4. When the value of an index at the time of calculation is not known the latest available index shall be used and any correction necessary shall be made by addition or subtraction in subsequent monthly payment certificates.
- 5.5.5. The amounts to be added to or subtracted from the monthly payment certificates shall be calculated by multiplying the amount certified for payment for that month (but excluding amounts not subject to price adjustment) by the Agreement price adjustment factor for that month.

- 5.5.6. Adjustment to measurements of previous months' quantities will be included in calculation of the amount certified for payment and will therefore be subject to the price adjustment factor of the current measurement month.
- 5.5.7. Any additions to or deductions from the amount payable, brought about by the application of the Agreement price adjustment factor, shall be deemed to have made full allowance for all increases or decreases in cost from any cause whatsoever, including all overhead costs as well as any increases and decreases therein, and profit.
- 5.5.8. Value added tax shall be excluded from individual payment item rates and price adjustment indices as it will be added to the total of the month's measurement, after price adjustment have been made in terms hereof.
- 5.5.8.1. The Price Adjustment Factor calculated at the completion of the works is used for calculating price adjustment after this date.

5.6. REMEDIAL WORK

- 5.6.1. The Supplier shall carry out remedial work to all worklots where control has not been achieved, prior to the official inspections taking place. Such remedial work shall include the removal of dry or dead growth with any dimensions in excess of 150mm and forming a nuisance or hazard to Transnet Freight Rail operations, from the treated worklots.
- 5.6.2. The Project Manager's Deputy may, at any time after the first measurement order the Supplier to carry out remedial action, to commence within 2 weeks after being so ordered. Prior to the commencement of this proposed remedial action an envisaged remedial work program must be submitted to the Project Manager's Deputy for his/her approval. Failing to do so the Project Manager's Deputy may arrange for such action to be carried out by others at the cost of the Supplier.
- 5.6.3. Hoeing (skoffel) will not be allowed on its own as a remedial action.
- 5.6.4. Fire may not be used as a method of vegetation control or as a method of remedial action.

5.7. OVERALL CONTROL

5.7.1. The overall standard of control to be achieved by the Supplier over the Agreement area, defined as "Overall Control" and expressed as a percentage, will be determined by application of the following formula;

5.7.2. The standard of "Overall Control" (service level table) to be provided on each district by the Supplier shall be:

5.7.3. Failure by the Supplier to achieve the standard of "Overall Control" shall constitute a material breach of Agreement by the Supplier, which will entitle the Employer to act in terms of the standard terms and conditions of contract for the provision of services to Transnet.

6. **GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS**

6.1. GENERAL

- 6.1.1. E4E (January 2004) Safety Arrangements and Procedural Compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
- 6.1.2. Specification E7/1 (Jul 1998): Specification for works on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and near high voltage

6.2. HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 6.2.1. The Supplier shall at all time comply with safety rules, regulations and legislation, as well as Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) Safety Guidelines for Infrastructure (Latest Edition).
- 6.2.2. The Supplier shall at all times comply with the Basic Conditions of Employment Act as well as all other relevant labour legislation. The Supplier must conduct his own formal risk assessment to identify all risks. The Supplier is to clearly indicate in his tender submission the processes and procedures he intends implementing to mitigate the total of all these risks; e.g.
 - Working with herbicides
 - live OHTE
 - Executing work on one line while a normal train service is running on adjacent line/s
 - Sanitation and refuse disposal as a threat to the environment.
- 6.2.3. The Supplier shall be responsible to ensure the use of only technically competent trained staff on all types of work. The Supplier will have to ensure that the Supplier's personnel operating his/her own locomotives, haulage equipment, road rail vehicles or any other track vehicles on Transnet Freight Rail lines undergo a Transnet Freight Rail Operating course and also receive a certificate of track section competency. This cost is to be borne by the Supplier.
- 6.2.4. The Supplier shall ensure that all workers are appropriately equipped and wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and that Safety Talks are conducted and noted in the Site Diary before the start of every shift.
- 6.2.5. The Supplier shall be responsible to ensure that site staff is always competently trained with regards to Electrical Awareness Training.
- 6.2.6. The Supplier shall be responsible to ensure that workers working on machines (high risk areas), operators, machine fitters, area Project Manager's Deputies and Agreement 'supervisors' site staff are always competently trained with regards to PWC Electrical Educational Training.
- 6.2.7. The Supplier shall also be responsible to ensure that Agreement managers in charge of sites are always competently trained with regards to COM Competency Electrical Training (to follow PWC Training).
- 6.2.8. The Supplier shall ensure that all his employees undergo medical surveillance where required by legislation.
- 6.2.9. Non-compliance with safety requirements will result in an immediate suspension of work without payment.
- 6.2.10. Where training is required by the Supplier and Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) is committed to provide training, the Supplier shall qualify his tender as to what and how many staff, training will be required for. After award of the Agreement, the Supplier shall then arrange with the appropriate Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) representative, through the Project Manager's Deputy, for this training / testing.

The following training shall be arranged for the following Suppliers staff:

7.1. GENERAL

- 7.1.1. Measurement and payment shall be in accordance with relevant provisions of clause 8 of each of the SANS 1200 Standardised Specifications for Civil Engineering Construction referred to in the Service Information.
- 7.1.2. The units of measurement described in these Schedule of Requirements are metric units. Abbreviations used in the Schedule of Requirements are as follows:

7.1.3. For the purpose of these Schedule of Requirements, the following word shall have the meanings assigned to them:

Unit: The unit of measure for each item of work as defined in the COLTO

Standard specification.

Quantity: The number of units of works for each item.

Rate: The agreed payment per unit measurement.

Amount: The product of the quality and the agreed rate for an item.

7.1.4. No allowance is made for waste on items in the Schedule of Requirements.

- 7.1.5. It will be assumed that the prices included in the Schedule of Requirements are based on Acts,
 Ordinances, regulations, By-laws, International Standards and National Standards that were published
 28 day before the closing date for tenders.
- 7.1.6. Such prices and rates cover all costs and expenses that may be required for the execution of the works described in accordance with the provisions of the Service Information, and shall cover the cost of all general risks, liabilities and obligations set forth or implied in the Agreement Data, as well as overhead charges and profit.
- 7.1.7. The quantities set out in the Schedule of Requirements are estimated and may be more or less than stated. The Supplier shall submit with his/her tender a complete and detailed priced Schedule of Requirements (prepared in black ink) for the Works.
- 7.1.8 Each item shall be priced by the Tenderer. If the Supplier has omitted to price any items in the Schedule of Requirements, the cost of the work included in such items will be held to be spread over and included in the prices given in the other items of work.
- 7.1.9. Payment for this Agreement shall be based on the Schedule of Requirements and the payment will be made in accordance with the rates tendered in the Schedule of Requirements.

The absence of stated quantities in the Schedule of Requirements is no guarantee that none will be required. Reasonable prices should therefore be inserted for every item as these prices may be considered in adjudication of tenders.

The short descriptions of the items in the Schedule of Requirements are for identification purposes only.

Items classified as "provisional worklots" in the Schedule of Requirements indicate that there is no certainty about the amount of work, which will be required. In this Agreement the provisional items, where applicable, are for the treatment of areas, which are not necessarily treated annually.' These areas will be measured per provisional worklot as defined in 5.1.3 and stated in the Schedule of Quantities. The standard of control for individual worklots shall apply.

7.2. MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

- 7.2.1. Payment will be based on the numbers of worklots treated as instructed by the Supervisor and to which the Supplier successfully applied the vegetation control measures and has achieved the standard of control defined in clause 5.3.
- 7.2.2. No payment will be made for rejected worklots where control achieved does not meet the standards of control specified.
- 7.2.3. Measurement and payment for the work completed will be made in [3] stages.
- 7.2.4. After completion of the initial spraying of the entire Agreement area the Supervisor or his deputy and the Supplier will measure the work performed (number of worklots sprayed). The Supplier will thereafter receive payment at [50%] of the rates tendered for all of the completed work.
- 7.2.5. A second measurement and evaluation will be made concurrent with the first official inspection conducted in accordance with clause 3.4.4. The Supplier will thereafter receive payment at [25%] of the rates tendered for all worklots where control as specified has been achieved or clear signs are evident that control is in the process of being achieved.
- 7.2.6. A third measurement and evaluation will be made concurrent with the second official inspection conducted in accordance with clause 3.4.5. The Supplier will thereafter receive payment at [25%] of the rates tendered for all worklots where control has been achieved.

- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time 1.3 subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

GENERAL DEFINITIONS 2.

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 "B-BBEE status of contributor" means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 "Bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;

- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "**rand value**" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 "subcontract" means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 "total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 **"trust"** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to another bidder.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.

3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

E7/1 - SPECIFICATION FOR GENERAL WORK AND WORKS ON, OVER, UNDER OR ADJACENT TO RAILWAY LINES AND NEAR HIGH VOLTAGE EQUIPMENT

Circulation Not Restricted

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1.0 SCOPE

1.1 This specification covers the network operator's requirements for general work and works on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and near high voltage equipment.

2.0 DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply:

"Authorised Person" - A person whether an employee of the network operator or not, who has been specially authorised to undertake specific duties in terms of Transnet' publication Electrical Safety Instructions, and who holds a certificate or letter of authority to that effect.

"Barrier" Any device designed to restrict access to "live" high-voltage electrical equipment.

"Bond" - A short conductor installed to provide electrical continuity

"Contractor" - Any person or organisation appointed by the network operator to carry out work on its behalf

"Contract Supervisor" - The person or juristic person appointed by the network operator from time to time as the Contract Supervisor, to administer the Contractor's performance and according to the powers and rights held by and obligations placed upon the Contract Supervisor in terms of the Contract.

"Dead" - Isolated and earthed.

"Electrical Officer (Contracts)" - The person appointed in writing by the Project Manager in terms of this specification as the person who shall be consulted by the Contractor in all electrical matters to ensure that adequate safety precautions are taken by the Contractor.

"Executive Officer" - The person appointed by the network operator from time to time as the Executive Officer to act according to the rights and powers had by and obligations placed upon him in terms of the Contract.

"High-Voltage" - A voltage normally exceeding 1000 volts

"Live" - A conductor is said to be "live" when it is at a potential different from that of the parth or any other conductor of the system of which it forms a part.

"Near" - To be in such a position that a person's body or the tools he is using or any equipment he is handling may come within 3 metres of "live" exposed high-voltage electrical equipment.

"Occupation" - An authorisation granted by the network operator for work to be carried out under specified conditions on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines.

"Occupation Between Trains" An occupation during an interval between successive trains.

"Optical Fibre Cable" - Burled or suspended composite cable containing optical fibres used in.

- telecommunication activorts for transmission of digital information and
- safety sensitive train operations systems

"Project Manager" - As defined in the special conditions of the contract. The person or juristic person appointed by the network operator from time to time as the Project Manager, to administer the Contract according to the powers and rights hold by and obligations placed upon him in terms of the Contract.

"Responsible Representative" - The responsible person in charge, appointed by a contractor, who has undergone specific training (and holds a certificate) to supervise (general or direct) staff under his controt who perform general work or to work on, over, under or adjacent to railway lines and in the vicinity of high-voltage electrical equipment.

"Total Occupation" - An occupation for a period when trains are not to traverse the section of tine covered by the occupation,

"Work on" - Work undertaken on or so close to the equipment that the specified working clearances to the "five" equipment cannot be maintained.

"Work Permit" - A combined written application and authority to proceed with work on or near dead electrical equipment.

"Works" -- The contractual intent for the work to be done as defined in the contract at a defined work site

PART A - CENERAL SPECIFICATION

3.0 AUTHORITY OF OFFICERS OF TRANSNET

- 3.1 The Contractor shall co-operate with the officers of the network operator and shall comply with all instructions issued and restrictions imposed with respect to the Works which bear on the existence and operation of the network operator's railway lines and high-voltage equipment.
- 3.2 Without limiting the generality of the provisions of clause 3.1, any duly authorised representative of the network operator, having identified himself, may stop the work if, in his opinion, the safe passage of trains or the safety of the network operator's assets or any person is affected. CONSIDERATIONS OF SAFETY SHALL TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER ALL OTHER CONSIDERATIONS.

4.0 CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIVES AND STAFF

- 4.1 The Contractor shall nominate Responsible Representatives of whom at teast one shall be available at any hour for dalf-out to cases of emergency. The Contractor shall provide the Contract Supervisor with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the representatives.
- 4.2 The Contractor guarantees that he has satisfied himself that the Responsible Representative is fully conversant with this specification and that he shall comply with all his obligations in respect thereof.
- 4.3 The Contractor shall ensure that all contractor staff receives relevant awareness, educational and competence training regarding safety as prescribed.

5.0 OCCUPATIONS AND WORK PERMIT'S

- 9.1 Work to be done during total occupation or during an accupation between trains or under a work permit shall be done in a manner decided by the Contract Supervisor and at times to suit the network operator requirements.
- 5.2 The Contractor shall organise the Works in a monner which will minimise the number and duration of occupations and work permits required.
- 5.3 The network operator will not be liable for any financial or other loss suffered by the Contractor arising from his failure to complete any work scheduled during the period of an occupation or work permit.
- 5.4 The Contractor shall submit to the Contract Supervisor, in writing, requests for occupations or work permits together with details of the work to be undertaken, at least 21 days before they are required. The network operator does not undertake to grant an occupation or work permit for any particular date, time or duration.
- The network operator reserves the right to cancel any occupation or work permit at any time before or during the period of occupation or work permit. If, due to cancellation or change in date or time, the Contractor is not permitted to start work under conditions of total occupation or work permit at the time arranged, all costs caused by the cancellation shall be born by the Contractor except as provided for in clauses 5.6 to 5.8.
- When the Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the scheduled starting time that the occupation or work permit is cancelled, he may claim reimburgement of his direct financial losses caused by the loss of working time up to the time his labour and plant are employed on other work, but not exceeding the period of the cancelled occupation or work permit.
- 5.7 When the Contractor is notified less than 2 hours before the scheduled starting time, or during an occupation of work permit, that the duration of the occupation or work permit is reduced, he may claim reimbursement of his direct linancial losses caused by the loss of working lime due to the reduced duration of the occupation or work permit.
- Reimbursement of the Contractor for any loss of working time in terms of clause 5.6 and 5.7, shall be subject to his claims being aubmitted within 14 days of the event with full dotails of labour and plant involved, and provided that the Contract Supervisor certifies that no other work on which the labour and plant could be employed was immediately available.
- Before starting any work for which an occupation has been arranged, the Contractor shall obtain from the Contract Supervisor written confirmation of the date, time and duration of the occupation.
- 5.10 Before starting any work for which a work permit has been arranged, the Responsible Representative shall read and sign portion C of the Work Permit, signifying that he is award of the work boundaries within which work may be undertaken. After the work for which the permit was granted has been completed, or when the

work permit is due to be terminated, or if the permit is cancalled after the start, the same person who signed portion C shall sign portion O of the Work Permit, thereby acknowledging that he is aware that the electrical equipment is to be made "live". The Contractor shall advise all his worknern accordingly.

6.0 SPEED RESTRICTIONS AND PROTECTION

- When speed restrictions are imposed by the network operator because of the Contractor's activities, the Contractor shall organise and carry out his work so as to permit the removal of the restrictions as soon as possible.
- 6.2 When the Contract Supervisor considers protection to be necessary the Contractor shall, unless otherwise agreed, provide all protection including flagmen, other personnel and all equipment for the protection of the network operator's and the Contractor's personnel and assets, the public and including trains.
- 6.2.1 The network operator will provide training free of charge of the Contractor's flagmen and other personnel performing protection duties. The Contractor shall consult with the Contract Supervisor, whenever be considers that protection will be necessary, taking into account the minimum permissible clearances set out in the Manual for Track Maintenance (Document no. BB80481):
 - Drawing no. 86-97 Sheet 1: Horizontal Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 4 sheet 1)
 - Orawing no. BE-97 Sheet 2: Vertical Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 2)
 - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 3: Clearances: Platform (Annexure 1 sheet 3)
 - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 5: Clearances: 610mm Gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 5)
- 6.3 The Contractor shall appoint a Responsible Representative to receive and transmit any instruction which may be given by the network operator personnel providing protection.

7.0 ROADS AND ROADS ON THE NETWORK OPERATOR'S PROPERTY

- 7.1 The Contractor shall take every reasonable precaution to prevent damage to any roads or bridges used to obtain access to the site, and shall select routes, use vehicles, and restrict loads so that any extraordinary traffic as may arise from the moving of plant or material to or from the site shall be limited as far as is reasonably possible.
- The Contractor shall not occupy or interfere in any way with the free use of any public or private road, right-of-way, path or street unless the Contract Supervisor has obtained the approval of the road authority concerned.

8.0 CLEARANCES


- 8.1 No temporary works shall encroach on the appropriate minimum clearances set out in the Manual for Track Maintenance (Document no. EBB0481);
 - Drawing no. BE 97 Sheet 1: Horizontal Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 1)
 - Drawing no. 86-97 Sheet 2: Vertical Clearances: 1065mm gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 2)
 - Drawing no. BE-97 Sheet 3: Clearances: Platform (Annexure 1 sheet 3)
 - Drawleg to SE-97 Sheet 5: Clearances: 610mm Gauge (Annexure 1 sheet 5)

9.0 STACKING OF MATERIAL

9.1 The Contractor shall not stack any material closer than 3m from the centre line of any railway line without prior approval of the Contract Supervisor.

10.0 EXCAVATION, SHORING, DEWATERING AND DRAINAGE

10.1 Unless otherwise approved by the Contract Supervisor any excavation adjacent to a railway fine shall not encroach on the hatched area shown in Figure 1.



- 10.2 The Contractor shall provide, at his own cost any shoring, deviatering or dramage of any excavation unless otherwise stipulated elsewhere in the Contract.
- 40.3 Where required by the Contract Supervisor, drawings of shoring for any excavation under or adjacent to a railway line shall be submitted and permission to proceed, obtained before the excavation is commenced.
- 10.4 The Contractor shall prevent ingress of water to the excevation but where water does enter, he shall dispose of it as directed by the Contract Supervisor.
- 10.5 The Contractor shall not block, obstruct or damage any existing drains either above or below ground level unless he has made adequate prior arrangements to deal with drainage.

11.0 FALSEWORK FOR STRUCTURES

- Drawings of falsework for the construction of any structure over, under or adjacent to any railway line shall be submitted to the Contract Supervisor and his permission to proceed obtained before the falsework is erected. Each drawing shall be given a title and a distinguishing number and shall be signed by a registered professional engineer certifying that he has checked the design of the falsework and that the drawings are correct and in accordance with the design.
- After the falsework has been erected and before any load is applied, the Contractor shall submit to the Contract Supervisor a certificate signed by a registered professional engineer certifying that he has checked the falsework and that it has been erected in accordance with the drawings. Titles and numbers of the drawings shall be stated in the certificate. Notwithstanding permission given by the Contract Supervisor to proceed, the Contractor shall be entirely responsible for the safety and adequacy of the falsework.

12.0 PILING

12.1 The Contract Supervisor will specify the conditions under which piles may be installed on the network operator's property

13.0 UNDERGROUND SERVICES

- 13.1 No page or stakes shall be driven or any excavation made before the Contractor has established that there are no underground scryices which may be clamaged thereby.
- 13.2 Any damage shall be reported immediately to the Contract Supervisor, or to the official in charge at the nearest station, or to the traffic controller in the case of centralised traffic control.

14.0 BLASTING AND USE OF EXPLOSIVES

- 14.1 When blasting within 500m of a railway line, the Contractor shall observe the requirements adjulated in this specification.
- 14.2 No blasting shall be carried out except with the prior written permission of the Contract Supervisor and under such conditions as the may impose.
- On electrified lines the Contractor shall also obtain the permission of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) before blasting, and shall give at least 21 days notice of his intention to blast. No blasting shall be done in the vicinity of electrical personnel is present.
- 14.4 The Contractor shall arrange for the supply, transport storage and use of explosives.
- The Cornector shall have labour, tools and plant, to the satisfaction of the Contract Supervisor, available on the site to clear immediately any atones or debris deposited on the track or formation by blasting, and to repair any demage to the track or formation immediately after blasting. Repairs to the track shall be carried out only under the supervision of a duty authorised representative of the network operator.
- 14.6 The Contractor shall notify the Contract Supervisor of his intention to blast at least 21 days before the commencement of any blasting operations.
- Before any blasting is undertaken, the Contractor and the Contract Supervisor shall jointly examine and measure up any buildings, houses or structures in the vicinity of the proposed blasting to establish the extent of any existing cracking or damage to such structures, etc. The Contractor, shall, subject to the provisions stipulated in the Contract Insurance Policy, make good any deterioration of such buildings, houses, or structures, which, in the opinion of the Contract Sopervisor, was directly caused by the blasting.
- 14.8 After completion of the blasting the Contractor shall obtain a written diverance from each languager in

- the vicinity of the blasting operations to the effect that all claims for compensation in respect of damage caused by the blasting operations to their respective properties, have been settled.
- 14.9 The Contractor shall provide proof that he has complied with the provisions of clauses 10,17.1 to 10,17.4 of the Explosives Regulations (Act 26 of 1956 as amended)
- 14.10 Stasting within 500m of a railway line will only be permitted during intervals between trains. A person appointed by the Contract Supervisor, assisted by flagmen with the necessary protective equipment, will be in communication with the controlling railway station.
 - Only this person will be authorised to give the Contractor permission to blast, and the Contractor shall obey his matructions implicitly regarding the time during which blasting may take place
- 14.11 The flagmen described in clause 14.10, where provided by the network operator, are for the protection of trains and the network operator's property only, and their presence does not refleve the Contractor in any manner of his responsibilities in terms of Explosives Act or Regulations, or any obligation in terms of this Contract.
- 14.12 The person described in clause 14.10 will record in a book provided and retained by the network operator, the dates and times:
 - (i) when each request is made by him to the controlling station for permission to blast;
 - (ii) when blosting may take place:
 - (iii) when blasting actually takes place; and
 - (iv) when he advises the controlling etation that the line is safe for the passage of trains,
- 14.13 Before each blast the Contractor shall record in the same book, the details of the blast to be carried out. The person appointed by the Contract Supervisor and the person who will do the blasting shall both sign the book whonever an entry described in clause 14.12 is made.

15.0 RAIL TROLLEYS

- 15.1 The use of rail trolleys or trestle trolleys on a railway line for working on high voltage equipment will be permitted only if approved by the Contract Supervisor and under the conditions stipulated by him.
- 15.2 All costs in connection with trolley working and any train protection services requested by the Contractor shalf, be borne by the Contractor, unless otherwise agreed.

16.0 SIGNAL TRACK CIRCUITS

- Where signal track circuits are installed, the Contractor shall ensure that no material capable of conducting an electrical current makes centect between rails of railway line/lines.
- 46.2 No signal connections on track-circuited tracks shall be severed without the Contract Supervisor's knowledge and consent.

17.0 PENALTY FOR DELAYS TO TRAINS

17.1 If any trains are delayed by the Contractor and the Contract Supervisor is satisfied that the delay was avoidable, a penalty will be imposed on the Contractor as stipulated in the contract, for the period and number of trains delayed.

18.0 SURVEY BEACONS AND PEGS

- 18.1 The Contractor shall not on any account move or damage any beacon, bench mark, reference mark, signal or trigonometrical station in the execution of the Works without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor.
 - Should the Contractor be responsible for any such occurrence, he shall report the circumstances to the Contract Supervisor who will arrange with the Director-General of Surveys for replacement of the beacon or mark at the cost of the Contractor.
- The Contractor shall not move or damage any cadastration mining beacon without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor and before it has been referenced by a registered land surveyor. Any old boundary beacon, which becomes an internal beacon on creation of new boundaries, shall not be moved without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor.

- Should the Contractor move or damage any cedastral or mining beacon without authority, he shall be responsible for having it reptaced, at his cost, by a land surveyor.
- The Contractor shall preserve all pags and bench marks. Such survey points shall not be removed without the written approval of the Contract Supervisor. Should any pag or benchmark be removed without authority, the Contract Supervisor will arrange for its replacement and the cost will be recovered from the Contractor. No claim will be considered for delay in replacing any such pag or bench mark. Each pag replaced shall be checked by the Contractor.
- Where a new boundary has been established, beacons on the fence line shall not be disturbed, and fence posts or anchors may not be placed or excavations made within 0.6 m of any beacon without the prior willten approval of the Contract Supervisor.

19.0 TEMPORARY LEVEL CROSSINGS

- 19.1 The Contract Supervisor may, on request of the Contractor, and if necessary for the purpose of execution of the Works, partit the construction of a temporary level crossing over a railway a line at a position approved by the Contract Supervisor and at the Contractor's cost. The period for which the temporary level crossing is permitted will be at the discretion of the Contract Supervisor.
- 19.2 The Contractor will provide protection and supervise the construction of the road over the track(s) and within the railway servitude at the level crossing, as well as the erection of all road signs and height gauges. All cost to be borne by the applicant.

The Contractor shall exercise extreme caution in carrying out this work, aspecially in respect of damage to tracks, sorvices, overhead power and communications routes and prevent contact with "live" overhead electrical equipment.

Unless otherwise agreed, the Contractor will provide the service deviations or afterations to the network operator's track-, structure-, drainage-, electrical-, telecommunications- and train authorisation systems to accommodate the level crossing

- The Contractor shall take all necessary steps including the provision of gates, locks and, where necessary, watchmen to restrict the use of the temporary level crossing to himself and his employees, his subcontractors and their employees, the staff of the network operator and to such other persons as the Contract Supervisor may permit and of whose identity the Contractor will be advised. It so ordered by the Contract Supervisor, the Contractor shall provide persons to control road traffic using the temporary level crossing. Such persons shall stop all road traffic when any approaching train is within seven hundred and fifty (750) metres of the temporary level crossing, and shall not allow road traffic to proceed over it until the lines are clear.
- 19.4 The Contractor shall maintain the temporary level crossing within the railway servitude in good condition for the period it is in use. A temporary agreement with the road authority to be concluded for the maintenance of the level crossing outside the railway servitude.
- 19.5 When the temporary level crossing is no longer required by the Contractor, or permitted by the network operator, the Contractor shall at his own cost remove it and restore the site and the network operator's track-, structure, distinge-, electrical-, telecommunications- and train authorisation systems to its original condition. Work over the tracks and within the railway servitude will be supervised by the network operator.

20.0 COMPLETION OF THE WORKS

On completion of the works, the Contractor shall remove all the remaining construction plant and material from the site, other than material which is the property of the notwork operator, and leave the site in a clean, neat and tidy condition. If material and plant is required for the liability and maintenance period the Contract supervisor must sutherise it's retention on site.

21.0 PROTECTION OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY

21.1 The Contractor shall provide and maintain all lights, guards, barriers, fending and watchmen when and where necessary or as required by the Contract Supervisor or by any statutory authority, for the protection of the Works and for the safety and convenience of the public.

Red, yellow, green or blue lights may not be used by the Contractor as they can be mistaken for signals. Red, yellow, green or white flags shall only be used for protection by the Contractor. Within the precincts of a port the Contractor shall obtain the permission of the Port Captain before installing any light.

- 21.2 The Contractor shall take all the requisite measures and precautions during the course of the Works to
 - (i) protect the public and property of the public.
 - (ii) protect the property and workmen of both the network operator and the Contractor.
 - (iii) avoid damage to and prevent trespass on adjoining properties, and
 - (iv) ensure compliance with any instruction issued by the Contract Supervisor or other authorised person, and with any stipulation embodied in the contract documents which affects the safety of any person or thing.
- 21.3 The network operator will provide, at its own cost, protection for the safe working of trains during such operations as the Contract Supervisor may consider necessary. Protection by the network operator for any purpose whatsoever, does not absolve the Contractor of his responsibilities in forms of the Contract.
- 21.4 The Contractor shall take all precautions and appoint guards, watchmen and compound managers for prevention of disorder among and misconduct by the persons employed on the Works and by any other persons, whether employees or not, on the work site and for the preservation of the peace and protection of persons and property in the direct neighbourhood. Any relocation of camps because of disorder shall be at the Contractor's expense.
- 21.5 All operations necessary for the execution of the Works, including the provision of any temporary work and camping sites, shall be carried out so as not to cause void fires, ground and environmental pollution, soil erosion or restriction of or interference with streams, furrows, drains and water supplies.
 - If the original surface of the ground is disturbed in connection with the Works, it shall be made good by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the land owner, occupier or responsible authority
- 21.6 The Contractor shall take all reasonable steps to minimise noise and disturbance when carrying out the Works, including work permitted outside normal working hours.
- 24.7 Dumping of waste or excess materials by the Contractor shall, in urban areas, be done under the direction and control of, and at sites made available by the local authority. Dumping outside local authority boundaries shall be done only with the express permission and under the direction and control of the Contract Supervisor.
- 21.8 The Contractor shall comply with environmental protection measures and specifications stipulated by the Contract Supervisor and/or local and environmental authorities.

22.0 INTERFERENCE WITH THE NETWORK OPERATOR'S ASSETS AND WORK ON OPEN LINES

- 22.1 The Contractor shall not interfere in any manner whatsoever with an open line, nor shall be carry out any work or perform any act which affects the security, use or safety of an open line except with the authority of the Contract Supervisor and in the presence of a duly authorised representative of the network operator.
- 22.2 The Contractor shall not carry out any work or operate any plant, or place any material whatsoever nearer than three motres from the centre line of any open line except with the written permission of the Contract Supervisor and subject to such conditions as he may impose
- 22.3 Core must be taken not to interfere with or damage any services such as everhead wire routes, cables or pipes and optical fibre cable, except as provided for the work specified. The Contractor will be held responsible for any damage to or interruption of such services arising from any act or omission on his part or of any of his employees, or persons engaged by him on the Works. The cost of repairing, replacing or restoring the services, as well as all other costs arising from any damage to services, shall be borne by, and will be recovered from the Contractor.
- 22.4 Authority granted by the Contract Supervisor and the presence of an authorised representative of the network operator in terms hereof, shall not relieve the Contractor of his duty to compty with this specification.

23.0 ACCESS, RICHTS-OF-WAY AND CAMPSITES

- 23.1 Where entry onto the network operator's property is restricted, permission to enter will be given only for the purpose of carrying out the Works and will be subject to the terms and conditions tail down by the network operator.
- 23.2 The Contractor shall arrange for campailes, workplaces and access thereto as well as for any right-of-

way over private property to the site of the Works, and for access within the boundaries of the network operator's property. The owners of private property to be traversed shall be approached and treated with tact and courtesy by the Contractor, who shall, if necessary, obtain a letter of introduction to such property owners from the Contract Supervisor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the closing of all gutes on roads and tracks used by him or his employees. Except with the prior approval of the Contract Supervisor and the owner or occupier of any private land to be traversed, the Contractor shall not cut, lower, damage, remove or otherwise interfere with any fonce or gate which is either on the network operator's property or on private property and which restricts access to the Works. Where such approval has been given, the Contractor shall prevent entry of animals or unauthorised persons onto the network operator's or private property, and shall make the fonces safe against trespass at the close of each day's work.

- 23.3 The Contractor shall take all reasonable steps to confine the movement of vehicles and plant to the approved right-of-way to minimise damage to property, crops and natural vegotation.
- 23.4 When access is no longer required, and before completion of the Works, the Contractor shall repair, restore or replace any fence or gate damaged during execution of the Works to the satisfaction of the Contract Supervisor and shall furnish the Contract Supervisor with a certificate signed by the owner and occupier of land over which he has gained access to a campatte, workplace and the Works, certifying that the owner and occupier have no claim against the Contractor of the natwork operator arising from the Contractor's use of the land. Should the Contractor be unable to obtain the required certificate, he shall report the circumstances to the Contract Supervisor.

24.0 SUPERVISION

- 24.1 The Contract Supervisor will provide overall technical superintendence of the Works, and may direct the Contractor in terms of the provisions of the Contract or in respect of any measures which the Contract Supervisor may require for the operations of the network operator, the safety of trains, property and workmen of the network operator, and for the safety of other property and persons. The Contractor shall carry out the directions of the Contract Supervisor. The superintendence exercised by the Contract Supervisor, including any agreement, approval, refusal or withdrawal of any approval given, shall not relieve the Contractor of any of his duties and liabilities under the Contract, and shall not imply any assumption by the network operator or by the Contract Supervisor of the legal and other responsibilities of the Contractor in carrying out the Works.
- 24.2 The Contract Supervisor may delegate to any deputy or other person, any of his duties or functions under the Contract. On receiving notice in writing of such delegation, the Contractor shall recognise and obey the deputy or person to whom any such duties or functions have been delegated as if he were the Contract Supervisor.
- 24.3 The Contractor shall exercise supervision over the Works at all times when work is performed or shall be represented by an agent having full power and authority to act on behalf of the Contractor. Such agent shall be competent and responsible, and have adequate experience in carrying out work of a similar nature to the Works, and shall exercise personal supervision on behalf of the Contractor. The Contract Supervisor shall be notified in writing of such appointment which will be subject to his approval.
- 24.4 The Contractor or his duly authorised agent shall be available on the site at all times while the Works are in progress to receive the orders and directions of the Contract Supervisor.

25.0 HOUSING OF EMPLOYEES

- 25.1 The Contractor shall, where necessary, make his own arrangements for suitable housing of his employees. Where temporary housing is permitted by the Contract Supervisor on any part of the site, the Contractor shall provide suitable sanitation, lighting and potable water supplies in terms of the requirements of the local authority or the current network operator's specification, Minimum Communal Health Requirements in Areas outside the Jurisdiction of a Local Authority E.48, as applicable
- 28.2 Fouting the area inside or outside the network operator's boundaries shall be prevented. The Contractor will be called upon by the Contract Supervisor to dispose of any foul or waste matter generated by the Contractor.

26.0 OPTICAL FIBRE CABLE ROUTES

- 26.4 The Contractor shall not handle, impact, move or deviate any optical fibre cable without prior approval.
- 26.2. Works that in any way affect the optical fibre cable requires prior approval from the Contract Supervisor



PART B - SPECIFICATION FOR WORK NEAR HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

- 27.0 GENERAL
- 27.1 This specification is based on the contents of Transnet's publication ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS, as amonded, a copy of which will be made available on loan to the Contractor for the duration of the contract.
 - These instructions apply to all work near "live" high-voltage equipment maintained and/or operated by the network operator, and the onus rests on the Contractor to ensure that he obtains a copy.
- 27.2 This specification must be read in conjunction with and not in fieu of the Electrical Safety Instructions
- 27.3 The Contractor's attention is drawn in particular to the contents of Port I, Sections 1 and 2 of the falcotrical Safety Instructions.
- 27.4 The Electrical Safety Instructions cover the minimum safety precautions which must be taken to ensure safe working on or near high-voltage electrical equipment, and must be observed at all times. Should additional safety measures be considered necessary because of peculiar local conditions, these may be ordered by and at the discretion of the Electrical Officer (Contracts).
- 27.5 The Contractor shall obtain the approval of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) before any work is done which causes or could cause any portion of a person's body or the tools he is using or any equipment he is bandling, to come within 3 motres of any "live" high-voltage equipment.
- 27.6 The Contractor shall regard all high-voltage equipment as "live" unless a work permit is in force.
- 27.7 Safety precautions taken or barriers erected shall comply with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contracts), and shall be approved by him before the work to be protected is undertaken by the Contractor The Contractor shall unless otherwise agreed, bear the cost of the provision of the barriers and other safety precautions required, including the attendance of the network operator's staff where this is necessary.
- 27.8 No barrier shall be removed unless authorised by the Electrical Officer (Contracts).
- 28.0 WORK ON BUILDINGS OR FIXED STRUCTURES
- 28.1 Before any work is carried out or measurements are taken on any part of a building, fixed structure or parthworks of any kind above ground level situated within 3 metres of "live" nigh-voltage equipment, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to ascertain the conditions under which the work may be carried out.
- 28.2 No barrier eracted to comply with the requirements of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be used as temporary staging or shuttering for any part of the Works.
- 28.3 The shuttering for bridge piecs, abutments, retaining walls or parapets adjacent to or over any track may be permitted to serve as a barrier, provided that it extends at least 2,5 metres above any working level in the case of piers, abutments and retaining walls and 1,5 metres above any working level in the case of parapets.
- 29.0 WORK DONE ON OR OUTSIDE OF ROLLING STOCK, INCLUDING LOADING OR UNLOADING
- 29.1 No person may stand, climb or work, whilst on any platform, surface or footbold:
- 29.1.3 higher than the normal unrestricted access way, namely -
- 29 1.1.1 external walloways on diesel, steam and electric locomotives, steam heat vans, etc. and
- 29 1 1.2 walkways botween coaches and locomotives
- 29.1.2 of restricted access ways in terms of the Electrical Safety Instructions namely -
- 29.1.2.1 Rie floor level of open wagons
- 20.1.2.2 external walkways or docks of road-rail vehicles, on-track maintenance machines and material trains
- 29.1.3 Unauthorised staff working on these platforms must be directly supervised by duly authorised persons in terms of clause 607.1.3 of the Electrical Safety instructions. These persons must attend the relevant electrical safety module training. A letter of training must then be issued by an accredited training authority. A Category C Certificate of Authority must be obtained from the

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local depot examining officer

- 29.2 When in the above positions no person may raise his hands or any equipment he is handling above his head.
- 29.3 In cases where the Contractor operates his own rall mounted equipment, he shall arrange for the walkways on this plant to be inspected by the Electrical Officer (Contracts) and approved, before commencement of work.
- 29.4 The handling of long longiths of material such as metal pipes, reinforcing bars, etc should be avoided, but if essential they shall be handled as nearly as possible in a horizontal position below head height.
- 29.5 The Responsible Representative shall were all persons under his control of the danger of being near "live" high-voltage equipment, and shall ensure that the warning is fully understood.
- 29.6 Where the conditions in clauses 30.1 to 30.4 cannot be observed the Electrical Officer (Contracts), shall be notified. He will arrange for suitable Salaty measures to be taken. The Electrical Officer (Contracts), may in his discretion and in appropriate circumstances, simange for a suitable employee of the Contractor to be specially trained by the network operator and at the Contractor's cost, as an Authorised Person to work closer than 3 metres from three overhead conductors and under such canditions as may be imposed by the senior responsible electrical engineer of the network operator.

30.0 USE OF EQUIPMENT

- 30.1 Measuring Tapes and Devices
- 30.1.1 Measuring tapes may be used near "live" high-voltage equipment provided that no part of any tape or a person's body comes within 3 metres of the "live" equipment.
- 30.1.2 In windy conditions the distance shall be increased to ensure that if the tape should fell it will not be blown nearer than 3 metres from the "live" high-vollage equipment.
- 30.1.3 Special measuring devices longer than 2 metres such as survey sticks and rods may be used if these are of non-conducting material and approved by the responsible Electrical Engineer of the network operator, but these devices must not be used within 3 maters of "live" high-voltage equipment in rainy or wet conditions.
- 30.1.4 The assistance of the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be requested when measurements within the limits defined in clauses 31.1.1 to 31.1.3 are required.
- 30.1.5 The restrictions described in 31.1.1 to 311.3 do not apply on a bridge deck between permanent parapats nor in other situations where a barrier effectively prevents contact with the "five" high-voltage equipment,
- 30.2 Portable Ladders
- 30.2.1 Any type of portable ladder longer then 2 metres may only be used near "live" high-voltage equipment under the direct supervision of the Responsible Representative. He shall ensure that the ladder is always used in such a manner that the distance from the base of the ladder to any "live" high-voltage equipment is greater than the fully extended length of the ladder plus 3 metres. Where these conditions cannot be observed, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be advised, and he will arrange for suitable safety measures to be taken.

31.0 CARRYING AND HANDLING MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT

- 31.3 Pipes, scalfolding, iron sheets, reinforcing bars and other material which exceeds 2 metres in length shall be carried completely below head height near "live" high voltage equipment. For maximum safety such unaterial should be carried by two or more persons so as to maintain it as nearly as possible in a horizontal position. The utmost care must be taken to ensure that no part of the material comes within 3 metres of any "tive" high-voltage equipment.
- 21.2 Long lengths of wire or cable shall never be run out in conditions where a part of a wire or cable can come within 3 metres of any "live" high-voltage equipment unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) has been advised and has approved appropriate safety precautions.
- 31.3 The presence of overhead power lines shalf always be taken account of especially when communications lines or cables or acrial cables, stay wires, etc. are being erected above ground level.
- 32.0 PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN WHEN ERECTING OR REMOVING POLES, ANTENNAE, TREES ETC.
- 32.1 A pole may be handled for the purpose of crection or removal near high-voltage equipment under the following conditions:

- (i) If the distance between the point at which the pole is to be erected or removed and the meanest "live" high-voltage equipment is more than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the work shall be supervised by the Responsible Representative.
- (ii) If the distance described in (i) is less than the length of the pole plus 3 metres, the Electrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted to arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the pole is earthed where possible. The pole shall be kept in contact with the point of eraction, and adequate precautions shall be taken to prevent contact with "live" high-voltage equipment,
- 32.2 The cost of supervision by an Authorised Person and the provision of parthing shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor.
- 32.3 The provisions of clauses 33.1 and 33.2 shall also apply to the erection or removal of columns, antennae, trees, posts, etc.

33.0 USE OF WATER

33.1 No water shall be used in the form of a jet if it can make contact with any "live" high-voltage equipment or with any person working on such equipment.

34.0 USE OF CONSTRUCTION PLANT

- 34.1 "Construction plant" entails all types of plant including cranes, pilling frames, boring machines, excavators, draglines, dewatering equipment and rood vehicles with or without lifting equipment.
- When work is being undertaken in such a position that it is possible for construction plant or its load to come within 3 metres of "live" high-voltage equipment, the Efectrical Officer (Contracts) shall be consulted. He will arrange for an Authorised Person to supervise the work and to ensure that the plant is adequately earthed. The Efectrical Officer (Contracts) will decide whether further safety measures are necessary
- 34.3 The cost of any supervision by an Authorised Person and the provision of earthing shall, unless otherwise agreed, be borne by the Contractor.
- When loads are handled by cranes, non-metallic rope hand lines shall be used, affixed to such loads so as to prevent their swinging and coming within a metres of "live" high-voltage equipment
- 34.6 Clauses 35.1 to 35.4 shall apply mutatis mutaridis to the use of maintenance machines of any nature.

35.0 WORK PERFORMED UNDER DEAD CONDITIONS UNDER COVER OF A WORK PERMIT

- 35.1 If the Responsible Representative finds that the work cannot be done in safety with the high-veltage electrical equipment "live", he shall consult the Electrical Officer (Contracts) who will decide on the action to be taken.
- 35.2 If a work permit is issued the Responsible Representative shafe
 - (f) before commencement of work ensure that the limits within which work may be carried out have been explained to him by the Authorised Person who issued the permit to him, and that he fully understands these limits.
 - (ii) sign portion C of the permit before commencement of work;
 - (iii) explain to all persons under his control the limits within which work may be carried out, and ensure that they fully understand these limits;
 - (iv) care for the safety of all persons under his control whitst work is in progress, and
 - (v) withdraw all personnel under his control from the equipment on completion of the work before he signs portion D of the work permit.

30.0 TRACTION RETURN CIRCUITS IN RAILS

- 36.1 DANGEROUS CONDITIONS CAN BE CREATED BY REMOVING OR SEVERING ANY BOND.
- 36.2 Broken rails with an air gap between the ends, and joints at which fishplates are removed under "broken bond" conditions, are potentially lethal. The rails on either side of an air gap between rail ends on electrified lines shall not be touched simultaneously until rendered safe by the network operator personnel.
- 36.3 The Contractor shall not break any permanent bonds between rada or between rada and any structure. He shall give the Contract Supervisor at least 7 days written notice when removal of such bonds is necessary.

- 36.4 No work on the track which involves interference with the traction return rail circuit either by cutting or removing the rails, or by removal of bonds shall be done unless the Electrical Officer (Contracts) is consulted. He will take such precautions as may be necessary to ensure continuity of the return circuit before permitting the work to be commenced.
- 37.0 HIGH-VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT NOT MAINTAINED AND/OR OPERATED BY THE NETWORK OPERATOR

Where the work is undertaken on or near high-voltage electrical equipment which is not maintained and/or operated by the network operator, the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993, and Regulations and Instructions, or the Mines Health and Safety Act (Act 29 of 1996), shall apply.



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

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

SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT: ACT 85 OF 1993 AND REGULATIONS

1. GENERAL

The Contractor and Transnet Limited are individual employers, each in its own right, with duties and obligations prescribed in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and Regulations.

The Contractor accepts, in terms of the general conditions of contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an Employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the procedures stipulated in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Policy and Programme on the Site and Place of Work for the duration of the Contract.

Transnet Limited accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the contractor and Technical Officer or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Work.

2. DEFINITION

The work included in this Contract shall for the purposes of compliance with the Act be deemed to be a "Construction Work" which, in terms of the General Administrative Regulations of the Act, means any work in connection with:

- (i) The erection, maintenance, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar engineering structure;
- (ii) The installation, erection or dismantling of plant or machinery;
- (iii) The construction, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam, canal, road, railwayline, street, runway, sewer or water reticulation system, or any similar engineering structure; or
- (iv) The moving of earth, clearing of land or making of an excavation, piling, tunnelling or work on any similar project.

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3. PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE

3.1 Notice of carrying out of Building Work

The Contractor shall, in terms of the General Administrative Regulation 14, deliver a "Notice of Carrying out of Construction Work" in accordance with Annexure 1, appended hereto, whenever the contract work will take more than 3 months to complete and

- Includes the making of an excavation deeper than 1,5 metres and the volume exceeds 3 m³; or
- requires persons to work at a height exceeding 6 metres above the ground or floor level.

The notification shall be sent to the Provincial Director, Department of Labour in the area where the work is to be carried out. See General Administrative Regulations 1 (Act 85 of 1993).

- 3.2 The Contractor shall, in compliance with the Act and except in the case where he himself has appropriate experience and supervises the work personally, make the following appointments in writing and deliver copies thereof to the Technical officer:-
 - (i) A "Designated Employee" (or Construction Work Supervisor) in terms of General Safety Regulation 11(1) to supervise the performance of the work in accordance with Annexure 2.
 - (ii) An "Experienced Person" in terms of General Safety Regulation 13D (3)(b): Scaffold, with the necessary training and experience to supervise the erection, alteration or dismantling of any scaffolding required in the performance of the work in accordance with Annexure 3.

The above written appointments shall also be made by subcontractors and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Technical Officer.

- 3.3 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate experience and supervises the work himself, the appointments in terms of clause 3.2 are not necessary. The Contractor shall in such case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 4, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.4 The Contractor, sub-contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Technical Officer an access certificate as in Annexure 5 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work.
- 3.5 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Technical Officer with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and Transnet's safety requirements and procedures.

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4. SPECIAL PERMITS

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hotwork, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Technical Officer or the **relevant external** authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Contractor shall, in terms of Sections 7 and 9 of the Act and when so directed by the Chief Inspector or the Technical Officer prepare a written policy concerning the protection of the health and safety of his employees, other persons on the site or place of work and under the Contractor's control and other persons who may be directly affected by his activities, with particular reference to his performance of the contract work. He shall in addition prepare such guidelines for the implementation of the policy as are appropriate and applicable to the type of work to be performed, taking account of Transnet's Safety provisions and requirements specified elsewhere in the contract documents.

6. HEALTH AND SAFETY PROGRAMME

- 6.1 The Contractor shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of :-
 - (i) the provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act.
 - (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety,
 - (iii) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which it would be an offense for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 6.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk analysis in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under their control, that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 6.3 The Health and Safety Programme shall include full particulars in respect of :-
 - (i) the safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable.

- (ii) the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
- (iii) the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
- (iv) the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented,
- (v) the arrangements in respect of communication of health and safety related matters and incidents between the Contractor, his employees, subcontractors and the Technical Officer with particular reference to the reporting of incidents in compliance with Section 24 and General Administrative Regulation 6 of the Act and with the pertinent clause of the General Conditions of Contract forming part of the Contract and
- (vi) the introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Programme is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 6.4 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Technical Officer's agreement and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act and Regulations. The Technical Officer or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.

7. HAZARDS AND POTENTIAL HAZARDOUS SITUATIONS

The Contractor and the Technical Officer shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

Senerally, suppliers have their own business standards and regulations. Although Transnet cannot control the actions of our suppliers, we will not tolerate any illegal activities.







