5 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWER FINT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

As described in more detail in the attacked BBBEF Claim Form and as prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that Transnet will allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate.

The value of this bid is estimated, exceed R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and therefore the **90/10** system shall be applicable.

Respondents are required to complete Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.1 B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note the requirements for B-BBEE compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by Section 7 [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate for the JV or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

5.2 **Subcontracting**

Transnet fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting Respondents are requested to give preference to companies which are Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs including any companies designated as B-BBEE Facilitators¹.

If contemplating subcontracting, please note that a Respondent will not be awarded points for B-BBEE if it is indicated in its Proposal that such Respondent intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to an entity/entities that do not qualify for at least the same points that the Respondent qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME with the capability to execute the contract.

A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 23% [twenty-five percent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is su contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.

In terms of Section 7 of this RFP [the B-BLFE Preference Point Claim Form] Respondents are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

5.3 **B-BBEE Improvement No.**

Transnet encodages its suppliers to constantly strive to improve their B-BBEE rating. Whereas Respondents will be allocated points in terms of a preference point system based on its B-BBEE scorecard to be assessed as detailed in paragraph 5.1 above, in addition to such scoring, Transnet also requests that Respondents submit a B-BBEE improvement plan. Respondents are therefore requested to indicate the extent to which they will maintain or improve their B-BBEE status over the contact period.

Respondents are requested to submit their B-BBEE Improvement Plan as an additional document with their Proposals by completion of *Annexure* **F** appended hereto. *[Refer to Section* 9)

¹ The Minister of the Department of Trade and Industry has the power to designate certain Organs of State or Public Entities as B-BBEE Facilitators. For example, the South African National Military Veterans' Association (SANMVA) has been designated as a B-BBEE Facilitator. As such they will be treated as having rights of ownership held 100% by Black People, 40% by Black Women and 20% by Black designated groups.

5.4 Compulsory Local Content Threshold

In terms of section 9(1) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, and the Instruction Note issued by National Treasury on the "Invitation and Evaluation of Bids based on a stipulated minimum threshold for local content and production for the Textile, Clothing, Leather and Footwear Sector, Transnet is required to set a stipulated minimum threshold be set for this RFP.

5.5 Local Content Threshold

A Local Content threshold of **100%** [**Hundred** percent] will be required for all Goods to be manufactured by a successful Respondent.

The successful Respondent is required to continuously update Declarations C, D and E with the actual values for the duration of the contract. In addition to what is stated above regarding Annexures D and E, please note that these declarations are to be submitted as part of the Essential Returnable Documents - See Section 2 of RFP.

5.7 Challenges meeting the Local Content Threshold

Should, after the award of a Bid, the Supplier experience challenges in meeting the stipulated minimum threshold for Local Content, Transnet is required to inform the DTI accordingly in order for the DTI to verify the circumstances and provide directives in this regard.

6 COMMUNICATION

Furthermore, Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with transport to the future.

- 8.3 Both sets of documents are to be submitted to the address specified in paragraph 4 above, and Bidders must ensure that the original and copies (where applicable) are identical in all respects as Transnet will not accept any liability for having disqualified a bidder for failing to provide a mandatory returnable document in either the original or the copy of the RFP albeit that it was included in the other.

Section 2: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND

TFR in terms of the Bargaining Council agreement provides uniform clothing to operational grade workers annually in terms of the agreed entitlement. The current contracts for the supply of these uniform clothing items will expire at the end 2015 and the purpose of this RFP is to engage the market with a view of renewing these contracts. The RFP's will source suppliers to supply Transfer Uniform Clothing on an "as and when" require basis, over a 5 year period.



- 2.7 **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract:
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 **"EME**" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;

- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue be wen R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BREC Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of betwee R10 [en] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 Occuper 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, an includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 **"subcontract"** means the primar, contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract.
- 2.17 **"total revence**" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Clack Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;

- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

- 4.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approved to the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as IMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confinding that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity Level of Black ownership.

This South African technical specification was approved by National Colombiee SABS TC 180, Conformity assessment (CASCO), in accordance with procedures of the VTO/TBT agreement.

This SATS was published in November 2011.

This document is being issued as a South African technical specification because there is a need for clarity and the ability to measure and validate the local sontent of goods, works and services in order to implement a procurement system that takes the local content into account.

Introduction

Preferential procurement policies and their associated regulations, such as local content requirements, are mechanisms used by the government and organs of state in the adjudication of tenders, to give consideration to procuring locally manufactured products that comply with specified requirements. Governments may identify specific industries which are deemed to be of critical importance to the economic sustainability and industrial development of their country.

In order to calculate and verify local content, a standardized approach is essential, and this document specifies the approach used in South Africa.

Local goods, services and works — Measurement and verification of local content

1 Scope

1.1 This technical specification specifies requirements and procedures to define, measure, declare and verify the local content of goods, services and wirks when required for procurement and other purposes, in terms of the relevant national regislation, see foreword):

NOTE The product should contain no less than the level of local content as determined by the relevant national legislation (see foreword) and oner produrement requirements.

1.2 This technical specification does not specify the required safety, quality or other properties of the product.

The responsibility to include the procurements rests with the procurement authority.

2 Definition

For the purpose of this document, the following definitions apply.

democary part (element or portion) of a product

2.2

imported content

that portion of the tender price represented by

- a) the cost of imported components, and
- b) the cost of parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the suppliers or the suppliers' subcontractors or any other third party) the costs of which are inclusive of the costs abroad,

plus freight and other direct importation costs, such as landing cost, dock duties, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African port of entry excluding value added tax (VAT)

3. Calculation of local content

The local content percentage of the product shall be as specified (see annex A). The local content, *LC*, expressed as a percentage of the tender price, shall be calculated as follows:

$$LC = (1 - x/y)*100$$

where

- x is the imported content (see 2.2), in Rand (ZAR);
- y is the tender price (see 2.7), in Rand (ZAR).

Prices referred to in the determination of x shall all be converted to Rand (ZAR) by using the exchange rate as specified (see annex A).

3.2 Documentation required for the calculation of local content

- **3.2.1** Documentation used for the purposes of measuring local content shall include, but is not limited to, details of all imported components, parts or materials indicating origin, manufacturer, freight cost and other direct importation costs, such as landing cost, dock duties, and import duty and sales duty, i.e. landed cost.
- **3.2.2** Documentary proof used for calculating x in the measurement of local context and proof of the tender price y shall be kept accessible for a period of no less than five years.
- 3.2.3 The tenderer shall be responsible for the accuracy of the information including the imported content in the supply chain.
- **3.2.4** If information on the origin of components, parts or magnitude is not available, it will be deemed to be imported content.

3.3 Control of documents and records by the tenderer

Documents and records to provide evidence if consultance with the requirements of this technical specification shall be controlled.

A documented procedure to define the controls needed for the identification, storage, protection, retrieval, retention and disposition of records shall be established.

Records shall remain legible, reactivist ntifiable and retrievable.

4 Declaration

The tenderer shall attach the declaration in annex B signed by the Chief Financial Officer or other legally responsible person dominated in writing by the Chief Executive, or senior member/person with management has possibility (close corporation, partnership or individual) to the purchaser stating the local content percentage of the product, calculated in accordance with 3.1, and confirming the heal tender price.

5 Verification

- 1 The procurement authority may require that the measurement of local content be verified. The verification shall be conducted by:
- a) an accredited verification body (see foreword); or.
- b) an independent registered auditor (see foreword).
- **5.2** Those conducting the verification shall have defined and documented procedures for the verification activities.

In addition to data clearly describing the product ordered, the following requirements shall be specified in tender invitations and in each order or contract:

- a) the local content percentage requirements (see 3.1), and
- b) the exchange rate requirements (see 3.1).

1 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in this Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 1.1 Bid shall mean a Respondent's tendered response / proposal to a Transnet RFP or RFQ;
- 1.2 **Bid Document(s)** shall mean a reference to a Request for Proposal or Request for Quotation;
- 1.3 **Business Day** shall mean any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday;
- 1.4 Goods shall mean the goods required by Transnet as specified in its Bid Document;
- 1.5 **Respondent(s)** shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Bid Document;
- 1.6 **RFP** shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.7 **RFQ** shall mean Request for Quotation;
- 1.8 **RFX** shall mean RFP or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.9 **Supplier** shall mean the successful Respondent;
- 1.10 **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as requiled by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time:
- 1.11 Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd. a State Owned Company; and
- 1.12 **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and sub-requent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following general conditions as laid down by Transpect and are to be strictly adhered to by any Respondent to this RFX.

3 SUBMITTING OF BID POCUMENTS

- 3.1 A sid, which shall hereinafter include reference to an RFP or RFQ, shall be submitted to Transnet no ter that the closing date and time specified in accordance with the directions issued in the Bid Documents. Late Bids will not be considered.
- Bids shall be delivered in a sealed envelope in accordance with the instructions indicated in the Bid Documents with the Bid number and subject marked on the front of the envelope.
- 3.3 The Respondent's return address must be stated on the reverse side of the sealed envelope.

4 USE OF BID FORMS

- 4.1 Where special forms and/or formats are issued by Transnet for the submission of Bids, Respondents are required to submit their Bids by completion of the appropriate sections on such official forms and/or formats and not in other forms and/or formats or documents bearing their own terms and conditions of contract. Non-compliance with this condition may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- 4.2 Respondents must note that the original Bid forms and/or formats must be completed for submission and not a reprocessed copy or other format thereof.
- 4.3 Only if insufficient space has been allocated to a particular response may a Respondent submit additional information under separate cover using the Company's letterhead. This must be duly cross-referenced in the RFX.

5 BID FEES

- 5.1 A non-refundable fee may be charged for Bid Documents, depending on the administrative cost of preparing and issuing the Bid Document.
- 5.2 Where necessary, only Respondents that have paid the Bid fee and provided proof of payment when submitting their proposal will be considered.

6 VALIDITY PERIOD

- 6.1 The Respondents must hold their Bid valid for acceptance by Transnet at any time within the requested validity period after the closing date of the bid.
- Respondents may be requested to extend their validity period for a specified additional period. In such instances, Respondents will not be allowed to change any aspect on their Bid, unless they are able to demonstrate that the proposed change/s is as a direct and unavoidable consequence of Transnet's extension of the validity period.

7 SITE VISITS / BRIEFING SESSIONS

Respondents may be requested to attend a site visit or triefing session where it is necessary to view the site in order to prepare their Bids, or where Transfet drems it necessary to provide Respondents with further information to allow them to complete their bids properly. Where such visits or sessions are indicated as compulsory in the RFX Document, Respondents are obliged to attend these meetings as failure to do so will result in their disqualification.

8 CLARIFICATION BEFORE WE LOSING DATE

Should clarification be required in any aspect of the Bid before the closing date, the Respondent must direct such queries to the confect person listed in the RFX Document in the stipulated manner.

9 COMMUNICATION AFTER THE CLOSING DATE

After the loging date of a Bid (i.e. during the evaluation period) the Respondent may only communicate with the challpers or the Secretary of the relevant Acquisition Council.

10 WAUTHORISED COMMUNICATION ABOUT BIDS

Where Bids are submitted to the Secretary of an Acquisition Council, Respondents may at any time communicate with the Secretary on any matter relating to its Bid but, in the absence of written authority from the Secretary, no communication on a question affecting the subject of a Bid shall take place between Respondents or other potential service providers or any member of the Acquisition Council or official of Transnet during the period between the closing date for the receipt of the Bid and the date of the notification of the successful Respondent(s). A Bid, in respect of which any such unauthorised communication has occurred, may be disqualified.

11 POST TENDER NEGOTIATIONS

Transnet reserves the right to conduct post tender negotiations with the preferred bidder or a shortlist of preferred bidders. Should Transnet decide to conduct post tender negotiations, bidders will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. A final evaluation will be conducted in terms of 80/20 or 90/10 (whichever is applicable) and the contract will be negotiated and awarded to the successful bidder(s).

12 RETURNABLE DOCUMENTS

All returnable documents listed in the RFX Documents must be submitted with Respondent's Bid. Failure to submit mandatory returnable schedules / documents will result in disqualification. Failure to submit other schedules / documents may result in disqualification.

13 DEFAULTS BY RESPONDENTS

If the Respondent, after it has been notified of the acceptance of its Bid fails to:

- 13.1 enter into a formal contract when called upon to do so within such period as Transnet may specify; or
- 13.2 accept an order in terms of the Bid;
- 13.3 furnish satisfactory security when called upon to do so for the fulfilment of the contract; or
- 13.4 comply with any condition imposed by Transnet,

Transnet may, in any such case, without prejudice to any other lead relically which it may have, proceed to accept any other Bid or, if it is necessary to do so, call for Bids and sin, and may recover from the defaulting Respondent any additional expense incurred by Transnet in calling for new offers or in accepting a less favourable offer.

14 CURRENCY

All monetary amounts referred to in a Bid espon e must be in Rand, the currency of the Republic of South Africa [ZAR], save to the extent specifically parameted in the RFP.

15 PRICES SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION

- 15.1 Prices which are gutted tub, at to confirmation will not be considered.
- 15.2 Firm prices quoted or the duration of any resulting order and/or contract will receive precedence over prices which are subject to fluctuation if this is in Transnet's best interests.

16 ALTERATIONS MADE BY THE RESPONDENT TO BID PRICES

All alteration made by the Respondent to its Bid price(s) prior to the submission of its Bid Documents must be low by deleting the incorrect figures and words where required and by inserting the correct figures and words against the items concerned. All such alterations must be initialled by the person who signs the Bid Documents. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the particular item(s) concerned being excluded in the matter of the award of the business.

17 EXCHANGE AND REMITTANCE

- 17.1 The Respondent should note that where the whole or a portion of the contract or order value is to be remitted overseas, Transnet shall, if requested to do so by the Supplier, effect payment overseas directly to the foreign principal or manufacturer of such percentage of the contract or order value as may be stipulated by the Respondent in its Bid Documents.
- 17.2 It is Transnet's preference to enter into Rand-based agreements. Transnet would request, therefore, that the Respondent give favourable consideration to obtaining forward exchange cover on the foreign currency portion of the Agreement at a cost that is acceptable to Transnet to protect itself against any currency rate fluctuation risks for the duration of any resulting contract or order.

- 17.3 The Respondent who desires to avail itself of the aforementioned facility must at the time of bidding furnish the information called for in the Exchange and Remittance section of the Bid Documents and also furnish full details of the principals or manufacturer to whom payment is to be made.
- 17.4 The South African Reserve Bank's approval is required before any foreign currency payments can be made to or on behalf of Respondents.
- 17.5 Transnet will not recognise any claim for adjustment of the order and/or contract price if the increase in price arises after the date on which the Goods were to be delivered, as set out in the order and/or contract, or any subsequent agreement between the parties.
- 17.6 Transnet reserves the right to request a pro-forma invoice/tax invoice in order to ensure compliance with the contract and Value-Added Tax Act no. 89 of 1991 [VAT Act].

18 ACCEPTANCE OF BID

- 18.1 Transnet does not bind itself to accept the lowest priced or any bic.
- 18.2 Transnet reserves the right to accept any Bid in whole or in part
- 18.3 Upon the acceptance of a Bid by Transnet, the parties shall be bound by these General Bid Conditions and any contractual terms and/or any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- 18.4 Where the Respondent has beet informed by Transnet of the acceptance of its Bid, the acknowledgement of receipt transmitted shall be regarded as proof of delivery to the Respondent.

19 NOTICE TO UNSUCCESSFUL RESPONDENTS

19.1 Unsuccessful Respondents shall be advised in writing that their Bids have not been accepted as soon as possible after the closing date of the Bid. On award of business to the successful Respondent all unsuccessful Respondents must be informed of the name of the successful Respondent and of the reason as to why their Bids had been unsuccessful.

20 TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- The Supplier shall adhere to the Terms and Conditions of Contract issued with the Bid Documents, together with any schedule of "Special Conditions" or otherwise which form part of the Bid Documents.
- 20.2 Should the Respondent find any conditions unacceptable, it should indicate which conditions are unacceptable and offer amendments/ alternatives by written submission on a company letterhead. Any such submission shall be subject to review by Transnet's Legal Counsel who shall determine whether the proposed amendments /alternative(s) are acceptable or otherwise, as the case may be.

21 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- 21.1 The contract documents will comprise these General Bid Conditions, the Terms and Conditions of Contract and any schedule of "Special Conditions" which form part of the Bid Documents.
- 21.2 The abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Bid response will constitute the contract between the parties upon receipt by the Respondent of Transnet's letter of acceptance / intent, subject to all additional amendments and/or special conditions thereto as agreed to by the parties.

21.3 Should Transnet inform the Respondent that a formal contract will be signed, the abovementioned documents together with the Respondent's Bid response [and, if any, its covering letter and any subsequent exchange of correspondence] as well as Transnet's Letter of Acceptance/Intent, shall constitute a binding contract until the final contract is signed.

22 LAW GOVERNING CONTRACT

The law of the Republic of South Africa shall govern the contract created by the acceptance of a Bid. The domicilium citandi et executandi shall be a place in the Republic of South Africa to be specified by the Respondent in its Bid at which all legal documents may be served on the Respondent who shall agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa. A foreign Respondent shall, therefore, state in its Bid the name of its authorised representative in the Republic of South Africa who is empowered to sign any contract which may be entered into in the event of its Bid being accepted and to act on its behalf in all matters relating to the contract.

23 IDENTIFICATION

If the Respondent is a company, the full names of the directors shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a close corporation, the full names of the members shall be stated in the Bid. If the Respondent is a partnership or an individual trading under a trade name, the full names of the partners or of such individual, as the case may be, shall be furnished.

24 RESPONDENT'S SAMPLES

- 24.1 If samples are required from Respondents, such samples shall be suitably marked with the Respondent's name and access, the Bid number and the Bid item number and must be despatched in time to reach the addressee as stipulated in the Bid Documents on or before the closing date of the Bid. Failure to submit samples by the due date may result in the rejection of a Bid.
- 24.2 Transpet reserves the right to retain samples furnished by Respondents in compliance with Bid conditions.
- 24.3 Pymes will not be made for a successful Respondent's samples that may be retained by Transnet or the purpose of checking the quality and workmanship of Goods delivered in execution of a contract.
- 24.4 If Transnet does not wish to retain unsuccessful Respondents' samples and the Respondents require their return, such samples may be collected by the Respondents at their own risk and cost.

25 SECURITIES

- 25.1 The successful Respondent, when called upon to do so, shall provide security to the satisfaction of Transnet for the due fulfilment of a contract or order. Such security shall be in the form of a Deed of Suretyship [Deed of Suretyship] furnished by an approved bank, building society, insurance or guarantee corporation carrying on business in South Africa.
- The security may be applied in whole or part at the discretion of Transnet to make good any loss or damage which Transnet may incur in consequence of a breach of the contract or any part thereof.
- 25.3 Such security, if required, shall be an amount which will be stipulated in the Bid Documents.
- 25.4 For the purpose of clause 25.125.1 above, Transnet will supply a Deed of Suretyship form to the successful Respondent for completion and no guarantee in any other form will be accepted. A copy

of such form will be supplied to Respondents on request. For this purpose a Deed of Suretyship form will be provided which shall be completed and returned to Transnet or a designated official by the successful Respondent within 30 [thirty] calendar days from the date of the letter of acceptance. No payment will be made until the form, duly completed, is delivered to Transnet. Failure to return the Deed of Suretyship within the prescribed time shall, save where prior extension has been granted, entitle Transnet without notice to the Supplier to cancel the contract with immediate effect.

25.5 Additional costs incurred by Transnet necessitated by reason of default on the part of the Supplier in relation to the conditions of this clause 25 will be for the account of the Supplier.

26 PRICE AND DELIVERY BASIS FOR GOODS

- 26.1 Unless otherwise specified in the Bid Documents, the prices quoted for Goods must be on a Delivered Duty Paid [ICC Incoterms 2010] price basis in accordance with the terms and at the delivery point or points specified in Transnet's Bid Documents. Bids for supplying any other basis of delivery are liable to disqualification. The lead time for delivery stated by the Respondent must be inclusive of all non-working days or holidays, and of periods occupied in stricktaking or in effecting repairs to or overhauling plant, which would ordinarily occur within the delivery period given by the Respondent.
- 26.2 Respondents must furnish their Bid prices in the Price Schedule of the Bid Documents on the following basis:
 - a) Local Supplies Prices for Glods to be manufactured, produced or assembled in the Republic of South Africa, or imported supplies held in South Africa, to be quoted on a Delivered RSA named destination pasis.
 - b) Imported Supplies Prices for Goods to be imported from all sources to be quoted on a Deliverer Duty and [ICC Incoterms 2010] basis, to end destination in South Africa, unless other use specified in the Bid Price Schedule.

27 EXPORT LICENCE

The award of a Bid for Goods to be imported may be subject to the issue of an export licence in the country of oligin or supply. If required, the Supplier's manufacturer or forwarding agent shall be required to apply for such licence.

28 QUALITY OF MATERIAL

Unless otherwise stipulated, the Goods offered shall be NEW i.e. in unused condition, neither second-hand nor reconditioned.

29 DELETION OF ITEMS EXCLUDED FROM BID

The Respondent must delete items for which it has not tendered or for which the price has been included elsewhere in its Bid.

30 VALUE-ADDED TAX

30.1 In respect of local supplies, i.e. Goods to be manufactured, produced or assembled in the Republic of South Africa, or imported supplies held or already in transit to South Africa, the prices quoted by the Respondent are to be exclusive of VAT which must be shown separately at the standard rate on the Tax Invoice.

31 IMPORTANT NOTICE TO RESPONDENTS REGARDING PAYMENT

31.1 Method of Payment

- a) The attention of the Respondent is directed to the Terms and Conditions of Contract which set out the conditions of payment on which Bid price(s) shall be based.
- b) However, in addition to the aforegoing the Respondent is invited to submit offers based on alternative methods of payment and/or financing proposals.
- c) The Respondent is required to give full particulars of the terms that will be applicable to its alternative offer(s) and the financial merits thereof will be evaluated and taken into consideration when the Bid is adjudicated.
- d) The Respondent must, therefore, in the first instance, tender street in accordance with clause 31.1 (a) above. Failure to comply with clause 31.1 (a) above may preclude a Bid from further consideration.

NOTE: The successful Respondent [the **Supplier**] shall, well applicable, be required to furnish a quarantee covering any advance payments.

31.2 Conditional Discount

Respondents offering prices which are subject to a conditional discount applicable for payment within a specific period are to note that the conditional period will be calculated as from the date of receipt by Transnet of the Supplier's month and statement reflecting the relevant Tax Invoice(s) for payment purposes, provided the conditions of the order or contract have been fulfilled and the Tax Invoice is correct in all respects as referred to in the contract or order. Incomplete and/or incorrect Tax Invoices shall be returned and the conditional period will be recalculated from the date of receipt of the correct documentation.

32 CONTRACT QUANTA IES AND DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

32.1 Contract quantities

- It must be clearly understood that although Transnet does not bind itself to purchase a definitive quantity under any contract which may be entered into pursuant to this Bid, the successful Respondent nevertheless undertakes to supply against the contract such quantities as may be ordered against the contract, which orders are posted or delivered by hand or transmitted electronically on or before the expiry date of such contract.
- b) It is furthermore a condition that Transnet will not accept liability for any material/stocks specially ordered or carried by the Respondent with a view to meeting the requirements under any such contract.
- c) The estimated planned quantities likely to be ordered by Transnet per annum are furnished in relevant section of the Bid Documents. For avoidance of doubt the estimated quantities are estimates and Transnet reserves the right to order only those quantities sufficient for its operational requirements.

32.2 Delivery Period

a) Period Contracts and Fixed Quantity Requirements

It will be a condition of any resulting contract/order that the delivery period embodied therein will be governed by the provisions of the Terms and Conditions of Contract.

b) Progress Reports

The Supplier may be required to submit periodical progress reports with regard to the delivery of the Goods.

c) Emergency Demands as and when required

If, due to unforeseen circumstances, supplies of the Goods covered by the Bid are required at short notice for immediate delivery, the Supplier will be given first right of refusal for such business. If it is unable to meet the desired critical delivery period, Transnet reserves the right to purchase such supplies as may be required to meet the emergency outside the contract if immediate delivery can be offered from any other source. The *Total or Partial Failure to Perform the Scope of Supply* section in the Terms and Conditions of Contract will not be applicable in these circumstances.

33 PLANS, DRAWINGS, DIAGRAMS, SPECIFICATIONS AND NOCEMENTS

- 33.1 Copyright
- 33.2 Copyright in plans, drawings, diagrams, specifications and documents compiled by the Supplier for the purpose of contract work shall be governed by the Intellectual Property Rights section in the Terms and Conditions of Contract.
- 33.3 Drawings and specifications
- In addition to what may be stated in any Bid Document, the Respondent should note that, unless notified to the contrary by Translet or a designated official by means of an official amendment to the Bid Documents, it is required to tender for Goods strictly in accordance with the drawings and/or specifications surplied by Franslet, notwithstanding that it may be aware that alterations or amendments to such drawings or specifications are contemplated by Translet.
- 33.5 Responder 's a swings
- 33.6 Drawings by vired to be submitted by the Respondent must be furnished before the closing time and dat of the Bid. The non-receipt of such drawings by the appointed time may disqualify the Bid.
- 33.7 Funcion specifications
- The Respondent quoting for Goods in accordance with foreign specifications, other than British and American standards, is to submit translated copies of such specifications with the Bid. In the event of any departures or variations between the foreign specification(s) quoted in the Bid Documents, full details regarding such departures or variations must be furnished by the Respondent in a covering letter attached to the Bid. Non-compliance with this condition may result in disqualification.

34 BIDS BY OR ON BEHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- 34.1 Bids submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded directly by the principals or by its South African representative or agent to the Secretary of the Acquisition Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents.
- 34.2 In the case of a representative or agent, written proof must be submitted to the effect that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.

- 34.3 When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.
- 34.4 South African representatives or agents of a successful foreign Respondent must when so required enter into a formal contract in the name of their principals and must sign such contract on behalf of the latter. In every such case a legal Power of Attorney from their principals must be furnished to Transnet by the South African representative or agents authorising them to enter into and sign such contract.
 - a) Such Power of Attorney must comply with Rule 63 (Authentication of documents executed outside the Republic for use within the Republic) of the Uniform Rules of Court: Rules regulating the conduct of the proceedings of the several provincial and local divisions of the Supreme Court of South Africa.
 - b) The Power of Attorney must be signed by the principal under the same title as used in the Bid Documents.
 - c) If a Power of Attorney held by the South African representative or agent includes matters of a general nature besides provision for the entering into and signing of a contract with Transnet, a certified copy thereof should be harpshed.
 - d) The Power of Attorney must author to the South African representative or agent to choose the domicilium citandi et executano.
- 34.5 If payment is to be made in South Africa, the foreign Supplier [i.e. the principal, or its South African agent or representative), must notify Transnet in writing whether, for payment by electronic funds transfer [EFT]:
 - a) funds are of be transferred to the credit of the foreign Supplier's account at a bank in South

 Africa, in which case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished; or
 - b) funds are to be transferred to the credit of its South African agent or representative, in which case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished.
- 34.6 The Extention of the Respondent is directed to clause 25 above [Securities] regarding the provision of security for the fulfilment of contracts and orders and the manner and form in which such security is to be furnished.

35 CONFLICT WITH ISSUED RFX DOCUMENT

35.1 Should a conflict arise between these General Bid Conditions and the issued RFX document, the conditions stated in the RFX document shall prevail.

36 TRANSNET'S LIST OF EXCLUDED TENDERERS (BLACKLIST)

- 36.1 All the stipulations around Transnet's blacklisting process as laid down in Transnet's Supply Chain Policy and Procurement Procedures Manual are included herein by way of reference. Below follows a condensed summary of this blacklisting procedure.
- 36.2 Blacklisting is a mechanism used to exclude a company/person from future business with Transnet for a specified period. The decision to blacklist is based on one of the grounds for blacklisting. The standard of proof to commence the blacklisting process is whether a "prima facie" (i.e. on the face of it) case has been established.

- 36.3 Depending on the seriousness of the misconduct and the strategic importance of the Goods/Services, in addition to blacklisting a company/person from future business, Transnet may decide to terminate some or all existing contracts with the company/person as well.
- 36.4 A supplier or contractor to Transnet may not subcontract any portion of the contract to a blacklisted company.
- 36.5 Grounds for blacklisting include: If any person/Enterprise which has submitted a Bid, concluded a contract, or, in the capacity of agent or subcontractor, has been associated with such Bid or contract:
 - a) Has, in bad faith, withdrawn such Bid after the advertised closing date and time for the receipt of Bids:
 - b) has, after being notified of the acceptance of his Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the bid documents;
 - c) has carried out any contract resulting from such bit in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of the contract;
 - d) has offered, promised or given a labe in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract;
 - e) has acted in a fraudulent or impoper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any Government Department or towards any public body, Enterprise or person;
 - f) has made any incorrect statement in a certificate or other communication with regard to the Local Content of his woods or his B-BBEE status and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transne that.
 - (i) he rade the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and
 - (ii) If fore making such statement he took all reasonable steps to satisfy himself of its correctness;
 - g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the contractor's requirements and which could not be recovered from the contractor;
 - h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith.
- 36.6 Transnet recognizes that trust and good faith are pivotal to its relationship with its suppliers. When a dispute arises between Transnet and its supplier, the parties should use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner, whenever possible. Litigation in bad faith negates the principles of trust and good faith on which commercial relationships are based. Accordingly, Transnet will not do business with a company that litigates against it in bad faith or is involved in any action that reflects bad faith on its part. Litigation in bad faith includes, but is not limited to the following instances:
 - a) Vexatious proceedings. These are frivolous proceedings which have been instituted without proper grounds;
 - b) Perjury. Where a supplier commits perjury either in giving evidence or on affidavit;

- c) Scurrilous allegations. Where a supplier makes allegations regarding a senior Transnet employee which are without a proper foundation, scandalous, abusive or defamatory.
- d) Abuse of court process. When a supplier abuses the court process in order to gain a competitive advantage during a bid process.
- 36.7 Where any person or Enterprise has been found guilty by a court of law, tribunal or other administrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 Years, such person/Enterprise may also be blacklisted. Serious breaches of the law would include but are not limited to corruption, fraud, theft, extortion, or contraventions of the Competition Act 89 of 1998 (e.g. collusive tendering). This process excludes minor convictions such as thaffic offences or personal disagreements between parties which have no bearing on the business operations of the person or Enterprise.
- 36.8 Grounds for blacklisting include a company/person recorded as being a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Trassay's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Tender Defaulters.
- 36.9 Companies associated with the person/s guilty of misconduct (i.e. entities owned, controlled or managed by such persons), any companies sub-equently formed by the person(s) guilty of the misconduct and/or an existing company where such person(s) acquires a controlling stake may be considered for blacklisting. The decision to extend the blacklist to associated companies will be at the sole discretion of Transnet.
- 36.10 Any person or enterprise or compact, against whom a decision to blacklist has been taken, may make representations to the Chien Financial Officer of Transnet SOC Ltd, whose decision shall be final.

1 INTRODUCTION

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [**Transnet**] and the appointed supplier of Goods to Transnet [**the Supplier**], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Goods, a Schedule of Requirements including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the supply of Goods and provision of ancillary Services by the Supplier to Transnet

2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 2.1 **AFSA** means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- 2.2 **Agreement** means the Agreement and its associated Schelules and/or annexures and/or appendices, and/or schedules, including the Schedule of requirements, the technical specifications for the Goods and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General Tender Conditions and any additional precisions in the associated bid documents tendered by the Supplier [as agreed, in arching, between the Parties], which collectively and exclusively govern the supply of Goods and provision of ancillary Services by the Supplier to Transnet;
- 2.3 **Background Intellectual Property** neans all Intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their obligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party or their affiliates prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Date otherwise pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.4 **Business Lay(s)** means Mondays to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as prograin ed in South Africa;
- 2.5 Control cement Date means [•], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- 2.6 **Confidential Information** means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, graphic or in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, notebooks, reports, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, plans, formulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other Party [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
 - a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
 - b) the contents of the Agreement;
 - private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
 - d) any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret;
 - e) information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;
- g) information relating to the business activities, business relationships, products, services, customers, clients and Subcontractors of the disclosing Party where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information;
- h) information contained in the software and associated material and documentation belonging to the disclosing Party;
- i) technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;
- j) Copyright works;
- k) commercial, financial and marketing information;
- data concerning architecture, demonstrations, tools and trainiques, processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, function and technical requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;
- n) information concerning faults or defects and Goods, equipment, hardware or software or the incidence of such faults or defect, and
- o) information concerning the charges, fees and/or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcontlactors, or their methods, practices or service performance levels actually achieved;
- 2.7 Copyright means the right in expressions, procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, computer sangram codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, axistic works, sound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographic works, or cinematographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the desired for the different categories of works;
- 2.8 **Lesigns** mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right cranted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
- 2.9 **Expiry Date** means [●];
- 2.10 Foreground Intellectual Property means all Intellectual Property developed by either Party pursuant to the Agreement;
- 2.11 **Goods** means [●], the material / products specified in the Schedule of Requirements appended as Schedule 1 hereto;
- 2.12 ICC Incoterms 2010 means the set of commercial trade terms as published by the International Chamber of Commerce, Paris [ICC], which are otherwise referred to as purchase terms and which define precisely the responsibilities, costs and risks of the buyer [Transnet] and the seller [the Supplier]. Incoterms are only applicable to contracts involving the import or export of Goods from one country to another and for the purpose of the Agreement, if applicable, shall mean the designated Incoterm as stipulated in Schedule 1 hereto. Further details of the Incoterm [purchase terms] for the Agreement, if applicable, can be viewed at the International Business Training website http://www.i-b-t.net/incoterms.html;

- 2.13 Imported content means that portion of the bid price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or its subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad (this includes labour or intellectual property costs), plus freight and other direct importation costs, such as landing costs, dock duties, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African port of entry;
- 2.14 **Intellectual Property** means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- 2.15 **Know-How** means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, accessing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, information concerning materials and marketing and business information in general:
- 2.16 **Local content** means that portion of the bid price which is not included in the imported content, provided that local manufacture does take place;
- 2.17 **Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their subsidiaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and assigns;
- 2.18 **Party** means either one of these parts s,
- 2.19 **Patents** mean registered Patents and Patent applications, once the latter have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any inventions, products or processes in all fields of technology;
- 2.20 **Permitted Put tos** in this any activity or process to be undertaken or supervised by a Staff member of the Party during the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party's Confidential Information or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such a divity or process to be accomplished;
- 2.21 **(Price(s)** means the agreed Price(s) for the Goods to be purchased from the Supplier by Transnet, as detailed in the Schedule of Requirements, issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the terms and conditions in the Agreement from time to time;
- **Purchase Order(s)** means official orders issued by an operating division of Transnet to the Supplier for the supply of Goods or ancillary Services;
- 2.23 **Services** means Services provided to Transnet including activities such as consultation, advisory services, implementation services and day-to-day assistance provided by the Supplier, pursuant to the Schedule of Requirements in terms of the Agreement;
- 2.24 Staff means any partner, employee, agent, consultant, independent associate or contractor, Subcontractor and the staff of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;
- 2.25 Schedule of Requirements means Schedule 1 hereto;
- 2.26 Subcontract means any contract or agreement or proposed contract or agreement between the Supplier and any third party whereby that third party agrees to provide to the Supplier the Goods or related Services or any part thereof or material used in the manufacture of the Goods or any part thereof;
- 2.27 **Subcontractor** means the third party with whom the Supplier enters into a Subcontract;

- 2.28 **Tax Invoice** means the document as required by Section 20 of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 2.29 Trade Marks mean registered Trade Marks and Trade Mark applications and include any sign or logo, or combination of signs and/or logos capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one undertaking from those of another undertaking; and
- 2.30 **VAT** means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

3 INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 Clause headings in the Agreement are included for ease of reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of interpretation or for any other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have structured or drafted such purposes.
- 3.2 Any term, word or phrase used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions" shall be given its plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used in the Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings accorded thereto.
- 3.3 A reference to the singular incorporates reference to the plural and *vice versa*.
- 3.4 A reference to natural personairi orporates a reference to legal persons and *vice versa*.
- 3.5 A reference to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

4 NATURE AND SCOPE

- 4.1 The Agreement is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Supplier will arrange for the Lippi, to Transnet of the Goods which meet the requirements and specifications of Transnet, the delivery of which is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Transnet and executed by the Supplier in accordance with the Agreement.
- 4.2 Such Parchase Orders and deliveries to Transnet shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the Schedule of Requirements.
- Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Schedule of Requirements in accordance with procedures set out in clause 30 [Amendment and Change Control]. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.
- 4.5 Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Schedule of Requirements conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, the term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.

5 AUTHORITY OF PARTIES

5.1 Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute the Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsoever.

- 5.2 Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the power or authority to:
 - a) enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or
 - b) give any warranty, representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or
 - c) create any liability against the other or bind the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

6 DURATION AND CANCELLATION

- 8.1 Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, the Commencement Date if the Agreement is [•] and the duration shall be for a [•] [[•]] year period, expiring on [•], the second state of the Agreement is [•]
 - a) the Agreement is terminated by either Party in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules or annexures appended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity; or
 - b) the Agreement is extended at Transnet's order for a further period to be agreed by the Parties.
- 6.2 Notwithstanding clause 18 [Breach and Tennination], either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] calcular days prior written notice thereof to the other Party, provided that in such instance, the Agreement will nevertheless be applicable in respect of all Purchase Orders which have been place! prior to the date of such cancellation.

7 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SUP LIER

- 7.1 The Supplier shall:
 - a) respond promitly to all complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
 - b) ip orn, granget immediately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the storage ar delivery of the Goods;
 - duct its business in a professional manner which will reflect positively upon the Supplier and the Supplier's products;
 - keep full records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Supplier relating to the delivery of the Goods and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
 - e) obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Goods and ancillary Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Supplier;
 - f) observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993, as may be amended from time to time;
 - g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, demonstrate sound environmental performance and have an environmental management policy which ensures that its products, including the Goods or ancillary Services are procured, produced, packaged, delivered and are capable of being used and ultimately disposed of in a way that is environmentally appropriate; and
 - h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Verification Certificate, throughout the entire term of the

Agreement. Should the Supplier fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Supplier.

- 7.2 The Supplier acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
 - render the supply of the Goods and ancillary Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
 - communicate openly and honestly with Transnet regarding the supply and performance of the Goods and demonstrate a commitment to effecting the supply and performing ancillary Services timeously, efficiently and at least to the required standards;
 - c) endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of tervice and workmanship, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
 - d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent enor to meet agreed deadlines;
 - e) treat its own Staff, as well as all Transnet's Staff, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
 - f) practice and promote its own literal policies aimed at prohibiting and preventing unfair discrimination;
 - g) treat all enquiries from Transhet in connection with the supply of the Goods and/or ancillary Services with courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the supplier is unable to comply with the provisions of this clause, the Supplier will advise Transh t or the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transhet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
 - h) when requested by Transnet, provide clear and accurate information regarding the Stoplier's own policies and procedures, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties;
 - not allow a conflict of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any of its other customers] and the interests of Transnet;
 - not accept or offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any gratuity, enticement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attempt to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
 - not mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;
 - not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
 - m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the supply of Goods or ancillary Services to Transnet.
- 7.3 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, as may be amended from time to time, the Supplier shall ensure that the Goods and ancillary Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the Specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety

requirements and/or regulations. Permission for the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Supplier, as applicable, shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Supplier and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

8 B-BBEE AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

8.1 B-BBEE Scorecard

- a) Transnet fully endorses and supports the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past. It is also a fundamental requirement of the RFP that the Supplier also contributes to the Supplier Development Programme, as applied by Transnet.
- b) In response to this requirement, the Suppler shall submit to Transnet's Contract Manager or such other designated person details of its B-BBEE status in terms of the latest Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the LaBBEE Act and proof thereof at the beginning of March each year during the currency of the Agreement.
- c) The Supplier undertakes o notify and provide full details to Transnet in the event there is:
 - (i) a change in the Supplier's B-BBEE status which is less than what it was at the time of its appointment including the impact thereof; and
 - (ii) a contout or internal restructure or change in control of the Supplier which has or likely stimpact negatively on the Supplier's B-BBEE status.
- d) M twitestarding any other reporting requirement in terms hereof, the Supplier undertakes to provide any B-BBEE data (underlying data relating to the Supplier which has been relied to nor utilised by a verification agency or auditor for the purposes of issuing a verification certificate in respect of the Supplier B-BBEE status) which Transnet may request on written notice within 30 (thirty) calendar days of such request. A failure to provide such data shall constitute a Supplier Default and may be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of clause 18.
- e) In the event there is a change in the Supplier's B-BBEE status, then the provisions of clause 18 shall apply.

8.2 **B-BBEE Improvement Plan**

- a) Transnet encourages its Suppliers to constantly strive to improve their B-BBEE levels. To this end, the Supplier undertakes to provide Transnet with a B-BBEE Improvement Plan to indicate the extent to which their B-BBEE status will be maintained or improved over the contract period, as per Annexure of the RFP.
- b) The Supplier shall, for the duration of the Agreement, comply with the B-BBEE Improvement Plan.
- c) The terms of the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and monetary value of the commitments thereunder shall not (unless otherwise agreed in writing) be less or less favourable than the commitments made by the Supplier in such B-BBEE Improvement Plan.

8.3 Supplier Development Implementation Plan

- a) In addition to the Supplier Development Plan which the Supplier provided as part of its bid, the Supplier undertakes, as stipulated in the RFP, to provide Transnet with a Supplier Development Implementation Plan [the Implementation Plan] setting out the nature, extent and monetary value of the Supplier's commitments which the Supplier shall undertake, as well as mechanisms and procedures to allow for access to information and verification of the Supplier's compliance with the Implementation Plan, as shall be agreed with Transnet but in any event no later than 45 (forty five) calendar days from the signature date of the LOI/LOA.
- b) The Parties undertake to negotiate in good faith with a view to agreeing the content of the Implementation Plan by no later than 45 (forty five) calendar days as aforesaid (or such later date as Transnet may consent to in writing).
- c) If the Parties (acting reasonably and in good faith with due consideration to the Supplier Development Plan proposed by the Supplier in reasons to the RFP fail to reach agreement on the Supplier Development Implementation Fair within the time limit stipulated in the clause above, it shall constitute a Supplier Default and Clause 18 shall apply.
- d) The Supplier's Implementation Plan shall include, but not be limited to Technology transfer,

 New skills development, Job creation, sob preservation, Small business promotion and

 Rural integration and regional development.
- e) The terms of the Implementation Plan's and the monetary value of the commitments thereunder shall not (unless otherwise agreed in writing) be less or less favourable than the commitments made by the Supplier in the Supplier Development Implementation Plan.

8.4 Green Economy/ Footprint

a) In addition to the Supplier Development and B-BBEE commitments that the Supplier makes, the Supplier has in its bid provided Transnet with an understanding of the Supplier's position with regard to issues such as waste disposal, recycling and energy called servation.

R pc ting

- The Supplier shall monitor, audit, and record in an auditable manner, its own implementation and compliance with the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and the Supplier Development Implementation Plan and provide the Contract Manager with such information as the Contract Manager may reasonably request concerning the implementation of the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and the Supplier Development Implementation Plan.
- b) The Supplier shall, on a monthly basis from the Commencement Date and within 7 (seven) calendar days of the end of the previous calendar month, provide Transnet with a report (for monitoring purposes only) in respect of each of the undertakings stipulated in this clause 8.5.
- c) Transnet, through its Supplier Development division, shall, every 6 (six) months from the Commencement Date, review and verify the Supplier's undertakings stipulated in this clause with respect to B-BBEE and Supplier Development commitments, based on the Supplier's report.
- d) The Supplier shall attach adequate proof to enable Transnet to verify compliance with the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and Supplier Development Implementation Plan.

- e) Post verification of the submitted report to Transnet, Transnet shall engage with the Supplier on the findings. The Contract Manager, assisted by the relevant specialist from Transnet's Supplier Development division, must report to the Supplier at the end of every 6 (six) months as to whether or not the Contract Manager and/or the Supplier Development specialist reasonably considers, based on the information available to it, that the Supplier has during such time complied with the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and the Supplier Development Implementation Plan and the extent, if any, to which the Supplier has not so complied.
- f) Without prejudice to the Transnet's rights under the Agreement:
 - (i) if the Contract Manager and/or Transnet's Supplier Development specialist reasonably considers that the Supplier is not at any time complying with B-BBEE Improvement Plan and/or the Supplier Development Implementation Plan, the Contract Manager and/or the Supplier Development specialist may make such recommendations as is considered reasonably appropriate to the Supplier as to the steps he reasonably considers should be taken by the Supplier in order for the Supplier to remedy such non-tompliance and the time period within which such steps must be taken;
 - (ii) If such recommendations are not implemented by the Supplier in accordance with such recommendations, then the provisions of clause 8.6 shall apply; and
 - (iii) Transnet make at any time request a meeting with the Supplier to consider any non-compliance reported to it by the Supplier Development specialist of Transnet and/or the Courtant Manager or which otherwise comes to its attention. Both Parties must attend such a meeting and negotiate in good faith with a view to reach agreement on the steps or actions that the Supplier must undertake in order to remedy that non-compliance.
 - Transnet shall impose a non-compliance penalty as provided for in clause 8.6 below or shall be entitled to terminate in terms of clauses 17 and 18.
- h) For the sake of completion of its contractual obligations, the Supplier shall be obliged to complete all the undertakings made under the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and the Supplier Development Implementation Plan 3 to 6 months before the Termination Date.

8.6 Penalties

Non Compliance Penalties:

- a) If the Supplier fails, at any time, to achieve its commitments under and in accordance with the B-BBEE Improvement Plan and the Supplier Development Implementation Plan ("a Non Compliance"), the Supplier shall, subject to the applicable Non Compliance Penalty Cap, pay a Non Compliance penalty ("Non Compliance Penalty") to Transnet in respect of such Non Compliance at the applicable rate ("Applicable Rate"), as prescribed in clause 8.6Error! Reference source not found. to I) below.
 - (i) Non Compliance Penalties shall be calculated as a percentage of the Contract Value and accrue at the Applicable Rate per month until:

- (ii) the date on which the Supplier has remedied such Non Compliance by complying with the Supplier Development Implementation Plan and/or the B-BBEE Improvement Plan (as applicable); or
- (iii) the Agreement being terminated.

Applicable Rates of Non Compliance Penalties (for Large Enterprises Only):

- b) In relation to the Supplier Development Implementation Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall accrue -based on the difference between the committed SD value for the period under review and the delivered SD value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value) plus an additional 10% (ten percent) of such difference
- c) In relation to the B-BBEE Improvement Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall accrue at the following Applicable Rates based on a percentage of the Contract Value:
 - (i) for the first month (or part thereof), a rate of 0% (ore percent);
 - (ii) for the second month (or part thereof) a rate or 1.5% (one and a half percent);
 - (iii) for the third month (or part thereof) a rate of 2.0% (two percent);
 - (iv) for the fourth month (or part thereof), a rate of 2.5% (two and a half percent); and
 - (v) for any period of Non compliance after the fourth month, a rate of 3% (three percent).

Non Compliance Penalty Cap for Large Enterprises:

- d) The Non Compliance Penalty Cap in respect of Supplier Development commitments shall not exceed the difference between the committed SD value for the period under review and the delivered value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value), plus a radius val 10% (ten percent) of such difference.
- e) The maximum amount of the Supplier's liability to pay Non Compliance Penalties in the case of the B-BBEE Improvement Plan shall not exceed 5% (five percent) of the Contract (See.

Applicable Rates of Non Compliance Penalties for Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSEs):

- In relation to the Supplier Development Implementation Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall accrue based on the difference between the committed SD value for the period under review and the delivered SD value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value) plus an additional 5% (five percent) of such difference;
- g) In relation to the B-BBEE Improvement Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall apply annually at the rate of 0.5% (one half percent).

Non Compliance Penalty Cap for QSEs:

- h) The Non Compliance Penalty Cap in respect of Supplier Development commitments shall not exceed the difference between the committed SD value for the period under review and the delivered value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value), plus an additional 5% (five percent) of such difference.
- The maximum amount of the Supplier's liability to pay Non Compliance Penalties in the case of the B-BBEE Improvement Plan shall not exceed 1.5% (one and a half percent) of the Contract Value.

Applicable Rates of Non Compliance Penalties for Exempted Micro Enterprises (EMEs):

- j) In relation to the Supplier Development Implementation Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall accrue based on the difference between the committed SD value and the delivered SD value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value) plus an additional 3% (three percent) of such difference;
- k) In relation to the B-BBEE Improvement Plan, Non Compliance Penalties shall apply annually at the rate of 0.5% (one half percent).

Non Compliance Penalty Cap for EMEs:

- The Non Compliance Penalty Cap in respect of Supplier Development commitments shall not exceed the difference between the committed SD value for the period under review and the delivered value (i.e. 100% of the undelivered portion of the committed SD value), plus an additional 3%(three percent) of such difference.
- m) The maximum amount of the Supplier's liability to any Non Compliance Penalties in the case of the B-BBEE Improvement Plan shall not voca 1.5% (one and a half percent) of the Contract Value.

Non Compliance Penalty Certificate:

- n) If any Non Compliance Penalty arise, he Contract Manager shall issue a Non Compliance Penalty Certificate on the last day of each month during such Non Compliance indicating the Non Compliance Penalties which have accrued during that period.
- o) A Non Compliance Penalty Certificate shall be prima facie proof of the matters to which it relates. If the Supplier disjutes any of the amounts set out in a Non Compliance Penalty Certificate:
 - (i) the dispute shall be resolved in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement;
 - if arsuant to that referral, it is determined that the Supplier owes any amount to fransnet pursuant to the Non Compliance Penalty Certificate, then the Supplier shall pay such amount to Transnet within 10 (ten) Business Days of the determination made pursuant to such determination and an accompanying valid Tax Invoice.

Parme t Non Compliance Penalties:

- p) Subject to Clause o), the Supplier shall pay the Non Compliance Penalty indicated in the Non Compliance Penalty Certificate within 10 (ten) Business Days of Transnet issuing a valid Tax Invoice to the Supplier for the amount set out in that certificate. If Transnet does not issue a valid Tax Invoice to the Supplier for Non Compliance Penalties accrued during any relevant period, those Non Compliance Penalties shall be carried forward to the next period.
- q) The Supplier shall pay the amount due within 10 (ten) Business Days after receipt of a valid Tax Invoice from Transnet, failing which Transnet shall, without prejudice to any other rights of Transnet under the Agreement, be entitled to call for payment which may be in any form Transnet deems reasonable and/or appropriate.
- r) Should the Supplier fail to pay any Non Compliance Penalties within the time indicated in above (as applicable), Transnet shall be entitled to deduct (set off) the amount not paid by the Supplier from the account of the Supplier in the ensuing month.
- s) The Non Compliance Penalties set forth in this Clause 8.6 are stated exclusive of VAT. Any VAT payable on Non Compliance Penalties will be for the account of the Supplier.

9 LOCAL CONTENT OBLIGATIONS

- 9.1 The Supplier is required to note that Transnet, the Department of Trade and Industry [DTI] and/or the body appointed by the DTI as the verification authority for local content may conduct compliance audits with regard to the local content requirements as prescribed in Regulation 9 of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011 issued in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act.
- 9.2 The Supplier is required to continuously update Declarations C, D and E of the Local Content Declaration templates with the actual local content values for the duration of the contract.

10 INVOICES AND PAYMENT

- 10.1 Transnet shall pay the Supplier the amounts stipulated in each such as Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- 10.2 Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Supplier up a receipt of a valid and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation, as specified in the Schedule of Requirements appended hereto, once the valid and undisputed Tax Invoices or such portions of the Tax Invoices which are valid and undisputed become due and payable to the Supplier for the delivery of the Goods ordered, in terms of clause 10.4 Labow.
- 10.3 All Prices set out in the Agreement and Schedule of Requirements hereto are exclusive of VAT.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Schedule of Requirements appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be submitted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such monthend statement shall be made by Transnet within 30 [thirty] calendar days after date of receipt by Transnet of the Scholler's statement together with the relevant valid and undisputed Tax Invoice(s) and supporting documentation.
- 10.5 Where the partner of any Tax Invoice, or any part of a Tax Invoice which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Supplier shall be entitled to charge interest on the distancing amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the wriod from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.
- [collectively, **the Supplier's Goods**] provided to Transnet until Transnet has paid in full for the Supplier's Goods, it being specifically agreed that Transnet shall acquire no rights [including liens] of whatsoever nature in such Supplier's Goods until date of final payment by Transnet. Subject to the aforegoing, all risk and benefit to the Supplier's Goods shall pass from the Supplier to Transnet on delivery of the Supplier's Goods by the Supplier to Transnet.

11 PRICE ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Prices for Goods supplied in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Schedule of Requirements annexed hereto.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Price adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Prices for the next period or as otherwise indicated in Schedule 1 hereto. The Parties shall have regard for market-related pricing of equivalent goods, continuous improvement initiatives, costs [including labour, raw materials and transport/delivery], order size and frequency and changes to the specification of the Goods.
- 11.3 Pursuant to clause 11.2 above, the Supplier shall keep full and accurate records of all costs associated with the supply of the Goods to Transnet, in a form to be approved in writing by

- Transnet. The Supplier shall produce such records to Transnet for inspection at all reasonable times on request and such records may, at Transnet's option, be audited by Transnet or its designated representatives.
- 11.4 Should Transnet and the Supplier fail to reach an agreement on Price for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 27 of the Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution].
- If during the period of the Agreement Transnet can purchase similar Goods of a like quality from 11.5 another supplier at a total delivered cost to a Transnet facility that is lower than the total delivered cost of the Goods purchased hereunder from the Supplier, Transnet, may notify the Supplier of to adjust the Price of the such total delivered cost and the Supplier shall have an opportunity Goods purchased hereunder, on such a basis as to result in fine me total delivered cost to Transnet, within 30 [thirty] calendar days of such notice. If the Supplier fails to do so or cannot legally do so, Transnet may (i) purchase the Goods fra m su th er supplier in which case the obligations, including, but not limited to, any ase and sale requirements and/or commitments, if any, of Transnet and the Supplier here inder shall be reduced accordingly; (ii) terminate the Agreement without any penalty, liability or further obligation; or (iii) continue purchases under the Agreement.
- 11.6 If during the period of the Agreement e Supplier sells any materials which are the same as. equivalent to, or substantially similar to the Goods herein, at a total delivered cost to a third party Transnet facility, then the Supplier has an opportunity to lower than the total delivered cost adjust its Price for the Good purchased hereunder within 30 [thirty] calendar days so that the Price is the same a lower than the total delivered cost of such third party. If the Supplier fails to do so or cannot gally do so, Transnet may (i) purchase the Goods from any other such supplier, in which case the obligations, including, but not limited to, any purchase and sale requirements and/or conspitutority, if any, of Transnet and the Supplier hereunder shall be reduced accordingly; or ii) ta min to the Agreement without any penalty, liability or further obligation. Within 30 [thi/ty] calendar days of the Commencement Date of the Agreement or at any time Transnet so κ s, the Supplier shall certify in writing to Transnet that it is in compliance with this clause and shall provide all information that Transnet reasonably requests in order to verify such compliance.

12 WARRANTIES

The Supplier warrants that:

- 12.1 pursuant to clause 7.3 [General Obligations of the Supplier], the Goods will be manufactured in accordance with the specifications appended hereto at Schedule 1, or the manufacturer's specifications, as agreed in writing by both Parties;
- 12.2 the execution and performance of the Agreement by the Supplier does not infringe any rights of a third party or breach any obligation of the Supplier to any third party; and
- it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Supplier to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Supplier shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.

13 THIRD PARTY INDEMNITY

The Supplier hereby indemnifies and shall hold Transnet harmless against any direct damages suffered by or claims arising against Transnet in respect of clause 12.2 above.

14 INSPECTION

- 14.1 Transnet reserves the right to arrange for the inspection of all Goods forming the subject of any Purchase Order, at any stage before final acceptance and by any means it may think fit, and when such inspection is to be carried out, the relevant Purchase Order(s) shall be endorsed accordingly.
- 14.2 When inspection at the Supplier's works or warehouse is specified, Transnet's authorised inspector shall have free access to the premises of the Supplier at all times during working hours on a Business Day; shall have liberty to inspect work which is the subject of the Purchase Order at any stage of manufacture, and may reject any Goods which are found to be incomplete, defective or in any way not in conformity with the terms and specifications on the Agreement; and the Supplier shall afford all reasonable facilities for such access and inspection.
- 14.3 The Supplier shall provide inspection gauges, measuring and test equipment to ensure that the requirements of the Agreement are satisfied. All gauges, templates, tools and other equipment required to check the accuracy of the work shall be calibrated at regular and reasonable intervals by a laboratory which has been approved in writing by Transnet. This certificate shall not be more than 12 [twelve] months old.
- 14.4 The Supplier shall prepare and sounds, without charge to Transnet, all test pieces, samples and specimens; shall provide all labour and apparatus for carrying out tests and analyses in accordance with the terms of the Agreement or Purchase Order, and render all reasonable assistance in meking such tests and analyses.
- 14.5 All special rules governing gauging, testing, analysis and other inspection procedures shall be adhered to strictly in accordance with the terms of the Agreement or Purchase Order and the conditions of any specifications and drawings quoted therein.
- 14.6 In spection will be arranged by the Staff of Transnet, as indicated in the Purchase Order(s).
- 4.7 When Goods are ready for inspection, the Supplier shall apply promptly to the appropriate authority for instructions regarding such inspection. All applications for inspection shall quote Transnet's Agreement or Purchase Order number. 7 [seven] Business Days' notice of readiness from the Supplier shall be given to the authorised inspector appointed by Transnet to carry out such inspection.
- 14.8 Transnet shall have the right to recover from the Supplier the cost of inspection of any Goods that have been rejected by its authorised inspector in terms of this clause 14.

15 DEFECTIVE GOODS

15.1 Notwithstanding any certificate and/or receipt that may have been issued by or on behalf of Transnet either in South Africa or overseas, Goods will be accepted at the place of delivery or at the port of shipment, as specified in the Agreement, only as regards outward condition of packages and Transnet retains the right to reject the Goods supplied, on or after arrival at the place to which they are consigned, or after they have been placed in use in South Africa, should they be found defective.

- 15.2 If Goods are rejected owing to latent defects becoming apparent during machining operations or other preparation necessary on the part of Transnet before they can be put into use, the Supplier shall bear all expenses incurred by Transnet in carrying out such necessary operations.
- 15.3 If such Goods are rejected, the Supplier will pay the following costs:
 - a) for Goods purchased in South Africa on an ex works basis, the cost of transport from the Supplier's works in South Africa to the named destination where the Goods have been rejected by Transnet, plus handling charges and storage, if leviable; or
 - b) for Goods manufactured overseas, the Supplier shall pay all replacement costs including the overseas inland transport cost, freight and insurance charge incurred plus railage or other inland transport costs from the South African port to the place where the Goods have been rejected by Transnet, including handling charges, storage landing charges, customs duty and surcharges, if leviable.
- 15.4 If Transnet requires rejected Goods to be replaced, the Tupp! shall, when called upon to do so, arrange prompt replacement of the Goods within the prescribed manufacturing lead times for such Goods, as indicated in Schedule 1.
- 15.5 If Goods are found to be defective but the defects are, in the opinion of Transnet, not of so serious a nature as to warrant total rejection of the Goods, the Supplier shall, when called upon to do so, remedy or make good such defects at the request of the Supplier and recover from the Supplier all costs or expenses reasonably incurred by it in doing so.
- 15.6 Should the Supplier hil, when called upon to remedy or make good such defects within a reasonable time or to havest Transnet to do so, Transnet may proceed to remedy or make good such defects and thereafter recover from the Supplier all such costs and expenses as aforementioned.
- 15.7 Any amount acoverable from the Supplier in terms of this clause may, without prejudice to any other legs remedies available to Transnet, be deducted in whole or in part from any monies in the hands of Transnet which are due for payment to the Supplier.

16 OTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SUPPLY

- ▶6.1 In the case of Goods to be specially manufactured for it, if Transnet at any time ascertains that:
 - a) no manufacturing of the Goods specified in a Purchase Order has commenced and there is little or no prospect, in Transnet's opinion, that manufacturing will commence within a reasonable time; or
 - b) delivery of any of the Goods is being or is likely to be delayed beyond the promised delivery date(s), and there is little or no prospect of the Purchase Order(s) being carried out within reasonable adherence to the promised delivery rate(s) or time(s),
 - then Transnet may, irrespective of the cause of the delay, by notice to the Supplier, cancel as from a future date specified in such notice the whole or any part of the Agreement or Purchase Order in respect of which the Goods to be supplied have not been completed by that date, without incurring any liability by reason of such cancellation except as provided in this clause.
- 16.2 The Supplier shall thereupon, as soon as possible after such date, deliver to Transnet the Goods [if any] already completed, and payment for the part performance shall be made on a *pro rata* basis, provided the uncompleted part is not an integral or essential part of the completed Goods.

- Where an integral or essential part of the work has not been completed, the amount to be paid to the Supplier will be calculated on the basis of Transnet's enrichment. The Supplier shall, wherever practicable, supply Transnet with the necessary drawings and/or specifications to enable it to complete the work.
- 16.3 Whenever, in any case not covered by clause 16.1 above, the Supplier fails or neglects to execute the work or to deliver any portion of the Goods as required by the terms of the Agreement or Purchase Order, or if any Goods are rejected on any of the grounds mentioned in clause 15 [Defective Goods], Transnet may cancel the Agreement or Purchase Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or the undelivered or rejected portion of the Goods, and in such event, the supply of the remaining portion shall remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

17 RIGHTS ON CANCELLATION

- 17.1 If the Agreement or Purchase Order is cancelled in whole or a part in terms of clause 16 [Total or Partial Failure to Perform the Scope of Supply], Transpet hay execute or complete the Agreement with any other entity and do so on such terms as it may deem proper, or may procure other comparable Goods in substitution for those reglected to be manufactured or supplied or rejected as aforesaid, and may recover from the Scopplier the difference between the cost of such Goods and the Price [if the latter was lower] as well as any costs and expenses [including any additional transport costs] which Transpet may have had to incur in consequence of the Supplier's default.
- 17.2 Any amount which may be recoverable from the Supplier in terms of clause 17.1 above, without prejudice to any other legal remedies available to Transnet, may be deducted in whole or in part from any monies in the hands of Transnet and due for payment to the Supplier.

18 BREACH AND TERMINATION

- 18.1 If either Party **(th) Defaulting Party**] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] calendar days of written notice thereof, the other Party (nereinafter **the Aggrieved Party**], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.
- 18.2 Either Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
 - a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
 - b) its winding-up or dissolution;
 - c) the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer; or
 - d) any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
- 18.3 Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Supplier by notice in writing to the Supplier. For the purposes of this clause, **control** means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.

- 18.4 Notwithstanding this clause 18, Transnet may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] calendar days prior written notice thereof to the Service Provider.
- 18.5 The provisions of clauses 2 [Definitions], 12 [Warranties], 17 [Rights on Cancellation], 21 [Confidentiality], 23 [Limitation of Liability], 24 [Intellectual Property Rights], 27 [Dispute Resolution] and 31.1 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.

19 CESSION

- 19.1 Upon written notice to the Supplier, Transnet shall be entitled:
 - a) to appoint Transnet's financier of the Goods as first payer under the Agreement, without transferring the ultimate responsibility for payment which will temain with Transnet; and
 - b) to cede, assign and transfer its right, title and interest in the Goods to such financier as part of the funding consideration for the Goods.
- 19.2 The Supplier is not entitled to cede, delegate, assign, Scatca at or in any other manner dispose of any of its rights or obligations in terms of the green entitle without the prior written consent of Transnet, which consent shall not be withheld or delived in reasonably.

20 FORCE MAJEURE

- Neither Party shall have any claim again of the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either Party under the Agreement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire, mood, war, lockout, government action, laws or regulations, terrorism or civil disturbance, defaults or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either forty, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by writue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended. Transnet may however rely on strikes, industrial dispute and riots as a ground of *in ce majeure*.
- 20.2 Fig. Party will take all reasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available to resume full performance as soon as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant procisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of force majeure. If a Party fails to agree with such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [ninety] calendar days of the act of force majeure first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

21 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 21.1 The Parties hereby undertake the following with regard to Confidential Information:
 - a) not to divulge or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance with a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
 - b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement,

- for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
- c) not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;
- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement,
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Conh lential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, set alive at Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information oncerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for a chapter of the information in such cases;
- g) the Parties shall not make or termit to be made by any other person subject to their control, any public tratements or issue press releases or disclose Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement, unless written authorisation to do so has first been by ined from the Party first disclosing such information;
- h) each arty shall be entitled to disclose such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to the or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are equilibred in the course of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Parmitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to the extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such employees or consultants honour such obligations;
- each Party shall notify the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any Confidential Information has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- j) each Party shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential Information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by such person or entity; and
- k) each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees, officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
- 21.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 21 shall not apply where:
 - a) a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Staff; or

- b) was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality; or
- c) can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a breach of a duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
- d) is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
- 21.3 This clause 21 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all decumentation furnished to the Supplier by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation, all corporate identity equipment including dyes, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

22 INSURANCES

- 22.1 Without limiting the liability of the Supplier under the Igreement, the Supplier shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is prudent for the Supplier to insure against including any liability it may have as a result of it activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, loss of or damage to Goods, death or injury to any person and damage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an annual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the least of such insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Supplier.
- 22.2 The Supplier shall arrange insurance with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies on an annual basis within 30 [thirty] calendar days after date of policy mewals.
- 22.3 Subject to chuse 22.4 below, if the Supplier fails to effect adequate insurance under this clause 23, it has notify Transnet in writing as soon as it becomes aware of the reduction or inadequate to be and Transnet may arrange or purchase such insurance. The Supplier shall promptly reincurse Transnet for any premiums paid provided such insurance protects the Supplier's liability. Transnet assumes no responsibility for such insurance being adequate to protect all of the Supplier's liability.
- 22.4 In the event that the Supplier receives written notice from its insurers advising of the termination of its insurance cover referred to in clause 22.1 above or if the insurance ceases to be available upon commercially reasonable terms, the Supplier shall immediately notify Transnet in writing of such termination and/or unavailability, where after either the Supplier or Transnet may terminate the Agreement on giving the other Party not less than 30 [thirty] calendar days prior written notice to that effect.

23 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 23.1 The Supplier's liability under this clause 23 shall be in addition to any warranty or condition of any kind, express or implied by law or otherwise, relating to the Goods or ancillary Services, including the quality of the Goods or ancillary Services or any materials delivered pursuant to the Agreement.
- 23.2 Neither Party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:

- a) death or personal injury caused by its negligence, [including its employees', agents' or Subcontractors' negligence]; or
- b) fraud.
- 23.3 Neither Party accepts liability for damages and claims of a special, indirect or consequential nature arising as a result of the performance or non-performance of the Agreement, provided that such loss, damages or claims are not the direct result of the wilful acts or omissions and/or negligence or of any event which could reasonably have been foreseen and avoided on the part of the other Party. The phrase, "special, indirect or consequential" is deemed to include economic loss, loss of opportunity, loss of profit or revenue, and loss or damage in connection with claims against the principal by third parties.
- 23.4 Nothing in this clause 23 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Parties in respect of clauses 21 [Confidentiality] and 24 [Intellectual Property Rights].

24 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

24.1 Title to Confidential Information

- Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Supplier acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet For the avoidance of doubt all the Supplier's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Supplier.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Supplier an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit the Supplier to sub-license to other parties.
- c) The Supplier shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to see the Supplier's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sub-license to other parties.
- The Supplier shall grant Transnet access to the Supplier's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be *bona fide* negotiated between the Parties for the purpose of commercially exploiting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

24.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest in and to Foreground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Supplier, its researchers, agents and employees shall vest in Transnet and the Supplier acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreground Intellectual Property. The Supplier shall not at any time during or after the termination or cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or enforceability of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or anything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- b) Transnet shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Property anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Supplier shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.

- c) Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Supplier or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Supplier who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Supplier for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Supplier to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Supplier undertakes to sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.
- e) Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonally withheld], the Supplier shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

24.3 Title to Improvements

Any improvements, developments, adar to ions and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The supplies chall disclose promptly to Transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Supplier hereby undertakes to sign all locuments and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or assoveries to Transnet and the Supplier shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining or documenting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

24.4 Up authorised Use of Confidential Information

The supplier shall not authorise any party to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transnet whether or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promptly notify Transnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Transnet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at Transnet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

24.5 Unauthorised Use of Intellectual Property

- a) The Supplier agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of infringement, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet of which the Supplier acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the right, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- b) It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be taken against the infringer and the Supplier shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- c) The Supplier shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.

d) If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other awards arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other awards arising out of proceedings.

25 NON-WAIVER

- 25.1 Failure or neglect by either Party, at any time, to enforce any of the provisions of the Agreement, shall not in any manner be construed to be a waiver of any of that Party's rights in that regard and in terms of the Agreement.
- 25.2 Such failure or neglect shall not in any manner affect the coptinuid, unaltered validity of the Agreement, or prejudice the right of that Party to institute subsequent action.

26 PARTIAL INVALIDITY

If any provision of the Agreement shall be held to be invaid, illeral r unenforceable, or shall be required to be modified, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected thereby.

27 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 27.1 Should any dispute of whatsoe er nature arise between the Parties concerning the Agreement, the Parties shall try to rest ve the dispute by negotiation within 10 [ten] Business Days of such dispute arising.
- 27.2 If the dispute has not been resolved by such negotiation, either of the Parties may refer the dispute to ArSA and notify the other Party accordingly, which proceedings shall be held in Johannesburg.
- 27.3 Such dispute shall be finally resolved in accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or appointed by AFSA.
- 27.4 Nis clause constitutes an irrevocable consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 27.
- >.5 This clause 27 is severable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement is terminated for any reason.
- 27.6 This clause 27 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction, where grounds for urgency exist.

28 ADDRESSES FOR NOTICES

28.1 The Parties to the Agreement select the physical addresses and facsimile numbers, as detailed hereafter, as their respective addresses for giving or sending any notice provided for or required in terms of the Agreement, provided that either Party shall be entitled to substitute such other address or facsimile number, as may be, by written notice to the other:

- 29.1 The Parch's havely confirm that the Agreement constitutes the whole and only agreement between their with regard to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 29.2 The Partie hereby confirm that the Agreement replaces all other agreements which exist or may have existed in any form whatsoever between them, with regard to the subject matter dealt with make Agreement, any annexures appended hereto and the Schedule of Requirements.

MENDMENT AND CHANGE CONTROL

Any amendment or change of any nature made to the Agreement and the Schedule of Requirements thereof shall only be valid if it is in writing, signed by both Parties and added to the Agreement as an addendum hereto.

31 GENERAL

31.1 Governing Law

The Agreement is exclusively governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa and is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the Republic of South Africa.

31.2 Change of Law

In the Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a statutory provision include references to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended or reenacted and any regulations made under it, provided that in the event that the amendment, extension or re-enactment of any statutory provision or introduction of any new statutory

provision has a material impact on the obligations of either Party, the Parties will negotiate in good faith to agree such amendments to the Agreement as may be appropriate in the circumstances. If, within a reasonable period of time, the Supplier and Transnet cannot reach agreement on the nature of the changes required or on modification of Prices, delivery schedules, warranties, or other terms and conditions, either Party may seek to have the matter determined in accordance with clause 27 [Dispute Resolution] above.

31.3 Counterparts

The Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Either Party may enter into the Agreement by signing any such counterpart.

32 TRANSNET'S LIST OF EXCLUDED TENDERERS (BLACKLIST)

- 32.1 All the stipulations around Transnet's blacklisting process as aid 1 wn in Transnet's Supply Chain Policy and Procurement Procedures Manual are included herein by way of reference. Below follows a condensed summary of this blacklisting procedure.
- 32.2 Blacklisting is a mechanism used to exclude a company/person from future business with Transnet for a specified period. The decision to blacklist is based on one of the grounds for blacklisting. The standard of proof to commence the blacklisting process is whether a "prima facie" (i.e. on the face of it) case has been established.
- 32.3 Depending on the serio sness of the misconduct and the strategic importance of the Goods/Services, in addition to blacklisting a company/person from future business, Transnet may decide to terminate some or all existing contracts with the company/person as well.
- 32.4 A supplier or contractor to Transnet may not subcontract any portion of the contract to a blacklisted company.
- 32.5 Ground for blacklisting include: If any person/Enterprise which has submitted a Bid, concluded a contract or, in the capacity of agent or subcontractor, has been associated with such Bid or contract:
 - a) Has, in bad faith, withdrawn such Bid after the advertised closing date and time for the receipt of Bids;
 - b) has, after being notified of the acceptance of his Bid, failed or refused to sign a contract when called upon to do so in terms of any condition forming part of the bid documents;
 - c) has carried out any contract resulting from such bid in an unsatisfactory manner or has breached any condition of the contract;
 - d) has offered, promised or given a bribe in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract;
 - e) has acted in a fraudulent or improper manner or in bad faith towards Transnet or any Government Department or towards any public body, Enterprise or person;
 - f) has made any incorrect statement in a certificate or other communication with regard to the Local Content of his Goods or his B-BBEE status and is unable to prove to the satisfaction of Transnet that:

- (i) he made the statement in good faith honestly believing it to be correct; and
- (ii) before making such statement he took all reasonable steps to satisfy himself of its correctness;
- g) caused Transnet damage, or to incur costs in order to meet the contractor's requirements and which could not be recovered from the contractor;
- h) has litigated against Transnet in bad faith.
- 32.6 Transnet recognizes that trust and good faith are pivotal to its relationship with its suppliers. When a dispute arises between Transnet and its supplier, the parties should use their best endeavours to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner, whenever possible. Litigation in bad faith negates the principles of trust and good faith on which color ercial relationships are based. Accordingly, Transnet will not do business with a company that atigates against it in bad faith or is involved in any action that reflects bad faith on its part. It it gation in bad faith includes, but is not limited to the following instances:
 - a) Vexatious proceedings. These are frivolous proceedings which have been instituted without proper grounds;
 - b) Perjury. Where a supplie commits perjury either in giving evidence or on affidavit;
 - c) Scurrilous allegation. Where a supplier makes allegations regarding a senior Transnet employee which are without a proper foundation, scandalous, abusive or defamatory.
 - d) Abuse of solut process. When a supplier abuses the court process in order to gain a competitive advantage during a bid process.
- 32.7 Where any operson or Enterprise has been found guilty by a court of law, tribunal or other annihistrative body of a serious breach of any law, during the preceding 5 Years, such person/Enterprise may also be blacklisted. Serious breaches of the law would include but are not limited to corruption, fraud, theft, extortion, or contraventions of the Competition Act 89 of 1998 (e.g. collusive tendering). This process excludes minor convictions such as traffic offences or personal disagreements between parties which have no bearing on the business operations of the person or Enterprise.
- 32.8 Grounds for blacklisting include a company/person recorded as being a company or person prohibited from doing business with the public sector on National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Tender Defaulters.
- 32.9 Companies associated with the person/s guilty of misconduct (i.e. entities owned, controlled or managed by such persons), any companies subsequently formed by the person(s) guilty of the misconduct and/or an existing company where such person(s) acquires a controlling stake may be considered for blacklisting. The decision to extend the blacklist to associated companies will be at the sole discretion of Transnet.
- 32.10 Any person or enterprise or company against whom a decision to blacklist has been taken, may make representations to the Chief Financial Officer of Transnet SOC Ltd, whose decision shall be final.

In consideration of each party making available to the other such Information, the parties jointly agree that any dealings between them shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement which themselves will be subject to the parameters of the Bid Document.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED

1. INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement:

- 1.1 **Agents** mean dire tors officers, employees, agents, professional advisers, contractors or sub-contractors, or any Croup member;
- 1.2 **Bid of Bid Document** means Transnet's Request for Information [**RFI**] Request for Proposal [**RFP**] or Request for Auditation [**RFQ**], as the case may be;
- 1.3 **Carifornation** means any information or other data relating to one party [the **Disclosing Party**] and/or the business carried on or proposed or intended to be carried on by that party and which is made available for the purposes of the Bid to the other party [the **Receiving Party**] or its Agents by the Disclosing Party or its Agents or recorded in agreed minutes following oral disclosure and any other information otherwise made available by the Disclosing Party or its Agents to the Receiving Party or its Agents, whether before, on or after the date of this Agreement, and whether in writing or otherwise, including any information, analysis or specifications derived from, containing or reflecting such information but excluding information which:
- is publicly available at the time of its disclosure or becomes publicly available [other than as a result of disclosure by the Receiving Party or any of its Agents contrary to the terms of this Agreement]; or
- 1.3.2 was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] free of any restriction as to its use or disclosure prior to its being so disclosed; or

- 1.3.3 following such disclosure, becomes available to the Receiving Party or its Agents [as can be demonstrated by its written records or other reasonable evidence] from a source other than the Disclosing Party or its Agents, which source is not bound by any duty of confidentiality owed, directly or indirectly, to the Disclosing Party in relation to such information;
- 1.4 **Group** means any subsidiary, any holding company and any subsidiary of any holding company of either party; and
- **Information** means all information in whatever form including, without limitation, any information relating to systems, operations, plans, intentions, market opportunities, know-how, trade secrets and business affairs whether in writing, conveyed orally or by machine-readable medium.

2. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- All Confidential Information given by one party to this Agreement [the Disclosing Party] to the other party [the Receiving Party] will be treated by the Receiving Party as secret and confidential and will not, without the Disclosing Party's written consent, directly or adjunctly communicate or disclose [whether in writing or orally or in any other manner] Confidential Information to any other person other than in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- The Receiving Party will only use the Confidential Information for the sole purpose of technical and commercial discussions between the parties in plation to the Bid or for the subsequent performance of any contract between the parties in relation to the Bid.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information:
- 2.3.1 to those of its Agents who strictly need to know the Confidential Information for the sole purpose set out in clause 2.2 above, provided that the Receiving Party shall ensure that such Agents are made aware prior to the disclosure of any part of the Confidential Information that the same is confidential and that they owe a duty of confidence to the Disclosing Party. The Receiving Party shall at all times remain liable for any actions of such Agents that would constitute a breach of this Agreement; or
- 2.3.2 of the count required by law or the rules of any applicable regulatory authority, subject to clause

- 2.6 All Confidential Information shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party and its disclosure shall not confer on the Receiving Party any rights, including intellectual property rights over the Confidential Information whatsoever, beyond those contained in this Agreement.

3. RECORDS AND RETURN OF INFORMATION

- 3.1 The Receiving Party agrees to ensure proper and secure storage of all Information and any copies thereof.
- The Receiving Party shall keep a written record, to be supplied to the Disclosing Party upon request, of the Confidential Information provided and any copies made thereof and, so far as is reasonably practicable, of the location of such Confidential Information and any copies thereof.
- 3.3 The Company shall, within 7 [seven] days of receipt of a written demand from Transnet:
- 3.3.1 return all written Confidential Information [including all copies]; and
- 3.3.2 expunge or destroy any Confidential Information from any computer, word processor or other device whatsoever into which it was copied, read or programmed by the Company or on its behalf.
- 3.4 The Company shall on request supply a certificate signed by a director of its full compliance with the requirements of clause 3.3.2 above.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- 4.1 Neither party will make or permit to be made any announcement of disclosure of its prospective interest in the Bid without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 4.2 Neither party shall make use of the other party's name or any information acquired through its dealings with the other party for publicity or marketing surposes without the prior written consent of the other party.

5. DURATION

The obligations of each party and its Agents under this Agreement shall survive the termination of any discussions or negotiations be with the parties regarding the Bid and continue thereafter for a period of 5 [five] years.

6. PRINCIPAL

Each party confirm that it is acting as principal and not as nominee, agent or broker for any other person and that it was be responsible for any costs incurred by it or its advisers in considering or pursuing the Bid and a complying with the terms of this Agreement.

7. DOUACY OF DAMAGES

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as prohibiting the Disclosing Party from pursuing any other remedies available to it, either at law or in equity, for any such threatened or actual breach of this Agreement, including specific performance, recovery of damages or otherwise.

8. PRIVACY AND DATA PROTECTION



- 9.4 This Agreement may only be modified by a written agreement duly signed by persons authorised on behalf of each party.
- 9.5 Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute the creation of a pair restar, joint venture or agency between the parties.
- 9.6 This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with South African law and the parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the South African courts.
