1 Responses to RFQ

Responses to this RFQ [**Quotations**] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point system is applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After

the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

ANNEXURE A: B-BBEE PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM

This preference form contains general information and serves as a claim for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [**B-BBEE**] Status Level of Contribution.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A total of 20 preference points shall be awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.
- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [SANAS] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [IRBA] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [CCA] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "all applicable taxes" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 **"B-BBEE status of contributor"** means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4 **"Bid"** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by Transnet for the provision of goods, works or services;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 [Act No. 53 of 2003];
- 2.6 **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can utilised have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining

- their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 "**EME**" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;
- 2.10 "firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes reference to a juristic person;
- 2.14 "QSE" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928
- 2.15 "**rand value**" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.16 **"subcontract"** means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.17 "total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.18 **"trust"** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.19 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

3.1 The Bidder obtaining the highest number of total points for the evaluation criteria as enumerated in Section 2 of the RFP will be awarded the contract, unless objective criteria justifies the award to

another bidder.

- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored will be rounded off to 2 [two] decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event of equal points scored, the Bid will be awarded to the Bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more Bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful Bid will be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more Bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

4.1 In terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, preference points shall be awarded to a Bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 4.3 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.4 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership.
- 4.5 In terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice, Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.6 In terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, Bidders who qualify as QSEs are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R50 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership. Large enterprises must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.7 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for its B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits its B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 4.8 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if

- they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 4.9 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialised scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 4.10 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the Bid documents that such a Bidder intends subcontracting more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the same number of points that such a Bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- 4.11 A person awarded a contract may not subcontract more than 25% [twenty-five per cent] of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the subcontract.
- Bidders are to note that in terms of paragraph 2.6 of Statement 000 of the Revised Codes of Good 4.12 Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, any representation made by an entity about its B-BBEE compliance must be supported by suitable evidence or documentation. As such, Transnet reserves the right to request such evidence or documentation from Bidders in order to verify any B-BBEE recognition claimed.

ANNEXURE D: SCOPE OF SERVICES

REPAIRS TO 10.97M GRP LADDERS

1. SCOPE

This contract covers the Repairs of 10,97m GRP Extension Ladders for Transnet Freight Rail (RME) OHTE in Richards Bay on an "as and when" required basis. The extension ladders need to be collected and delivered to Richards Bay.

2. WORK TO BE PERFORMED

- 1. The Equipment Controller will contact the Service Provider with the specific requirement.
- 2. The ladders will be collected from Transnet's store with a collection note and access permit.
- 3. The Service Provider will assess the ladders and forward a quotation for the necessary Labour and materials required for the repair, together with the quotation/s from their suppliers.
- 4. Transnet will review and approve the quotation, but only on receipt of an official Purchase Order, the required repair may proceed. If Transnet does not approve the quotation given due to the repair being too expensive or the ladder being beyond repair the ladder shall be returned to Transnet's store, and the Service Provider will only be paid for the labour cost on the initial repair quotation submitted.

3. SPECIFICATIONS:

- 1. The ladders may only be repaired by an accredited/approved supplier
- 2. A certificate that proves that "after repairs" the ladders comply with the attached specification (Annexure E) must be provided

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- 1. All repairs must be performed at the Service Providers premises.
- 2. The ladders remain the property of Transnet.
- 3. The relevant Transnet Site Agent or Contract Manager must certify invoices for payment after the equipment was returned, inspected and tested.

1. SCOPE

This specification covers Transnet requirements for portable glass reinforced polyester (GRP) extension ladders for use on high voltage electrical equipment.

2. STANDARDS

- 2.1 Unless otherwise specified this specification shall be read in conjunction with the current edition of the relevant SANS, ANSI or Spoornet publication where applicable.
- 2.2 The following publications are referred to in this specification:
- 2.2.1 (a) SANS 1304:1980 Standard Specification for light ladders
 - (b) SANS 121: 2000 Hot dipped galvanised coatings on fabricated iron and steel articles Specifications and test methods.
 - (c) SANS 911: 2004 Natural fibre ropes
 - (d) ANSI A14.5:2000 Safety requirements for portable reinforced plastic ladders.
 - (e) Transnet Electrical safety Instructions: 2000

2.2.2 QUALITY ASSURANCE

Shall comply with SABS/ISO 9000: 2000 series.

3. SERVICE CONDITIONS

3.1 The ladders are required for service outdoors, under the following conditions:

Altitude : 0 to 1850m above sea level.

Ambient temperature : Minimum: Minus 5°C

: Maximum: Plus 45°C

Relative humidity conditions : As high as 90%

Lightning conditions : Severe

Ultra violet radiation : Severe

4. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 The collapsed ladder shall have a profile height viewed from the side of not more than 145mm with an overlap of 1220mm for the "Type 1" and 180mm for the "Type 1A" in order that it may take up minimum space during transport.
 - 4.1.1 The working length of a fully extended ladder shall be 9, 75 meters with at least 1, 22 meters overlap or 10, 97 meters with at least 1, 22 meters overlap as required.

- 4.1.2 The width between stiles of the fly section shall be 295 \pm 5mm and the width of the base section shall suit that of the fly section.
- 4.1.3 Rung spacing shall be 275m ±5mm centre to centre
- 4.1.4 The mass, without the rope, of the "Type 1 shall not exceed 52kg and that of the "type 1A"shall not exceed 70kg.

4.2 DESIGN

- 4.2.1 The design shall comply, generally with the American national Standards Institute specification ANSI A14.5:2000, rating heavy duty Type 1 and extra heavy duty Type 1A.
- 4.2.2 The rope (Item number: 54033700- approved item name: "rope, fibre-specification: SANS 911 date 2004-markers part number: A12/03 Inflight-stores description: cotton rope 12mm 3 strand, breaking load 4.7kN') shall be located out of the user and to the side of the ladder in such a manner that loose rope will not pile up at the same base when the ladder is extended.
- 4.2.3 The cotton rope shall be fitted to the ladder by the manufacturer.
- 4.2.5 Locks shall be reliable, user friendly and extremely robust constructed. Parts shall not bend easily when the ladder is handled in a rough manner.
- 4.2.6 Locks shall be tested in accordance with ASNI A14.5: 2000
- 4.2.7 Robust constructed galvanised steel feet shall be fitted to the bottom section and shall be pointed to ensure proper anchoring in the ground when the ladder is in use.
- 4.2.8 All steel parts, including Bolts, nuts and rivets shall not be hot dip galvanised in accordance with specification SANS 121 or manufactured from corrosion resistant material. (Verification tests may be called for).

4.3 STILES

- 4.3.1 The ladders stiles shall be manufactured from "GRP" material complying in all aspects with ANSI A14.5.2000
- 4.3.2 The mechanical properties of the "GRP: shall in accordance to the table below.

- 4.3.3 The tensile shall have additional weather and ultra violet radiation protection in the form of a surface veil of acceptable material and shall be fully described when tendering.
- 4.3.4 Furthermore the surface of the stiles shall be painted with at least one coat of a special polyurethane paint, for extra protection. Plascon No 8.Plascodure or exact equivalent
- 4.3.5 The stiles of the fly section shall be protected against abrasion damage when sliding over rungs and through the guides.
- 4.3.6 The flange of the stiles of the fly section which can slid along the overhead conductor shall be protected by means of sacrificial hard, long lasting material preferably with some adhesion to prevent excessive wear when the ladder is slid along the overhead.
- 4.3.7 This material shall be easy to replace or renew before it is worn away to such an extent that the stiles are damaged.
- 4.3.8 The bottom ends of the stiles of the fly and the base sections, both inside and outside shall be strengthened for at least 300mm with snug fitting galvanised or corrosion resistant flat sheet sections to prevent damage to the glass fibre material.
- 4.3.9 The bottom ends of the fly section shall be supplied with suitable robust impact resisting end fittings, which will be able to protect the ends against damage when the fly section is dropped at speed.
- 4.3.10 All other ends of stiles shall be finished off with suitable durable metal caps of sufficient strength.
- 4.3.11 Prismatic fluorescent yellow green reflective tape with rounded corners shall be applied to each stile between every second rung fixing 50mm wide by 150mm long and coated with clear varnish. The warranty of the reflective tape shall be at least 7 years.

4.4 RUNGS

- 4.4.1 Rungs may be of the metal type.
- 4.4.2 Rungs shall have a suitable flat top surface for greater comfort and suitably dimpled or serrated to prevent slipping.
- 4.4.3 The rungs shall be fitted to the slides so that the top flat surface is horizontal when the ladder is standing at an angle of 75±1 degree to the horizontal.
- 4.4.4 The bottom rung of the fly section shall be arranged in such a manner that it will not injure a person's foot placed against the bottom rung on the base to stabilize the ladder when the fly section is lowered or dropped.
