1 Responses to RFQ

Responses to this RFQ [Quotations] must not include documents or reference relating to any other quotation or proposal. Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Base. Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local cusiness enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferentia Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respon lents are to note that the following preference point system is applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for surfements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidder's are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFP and all by received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFP must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and the forethe 80/20 system shall be applicable.

When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure pre-rammes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Respondents are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.





2.1 BREACH OF CONTRACT

Transne small be entitled to retain 10% of the total value of an invoice for a particular month, should it be a covered that the service rendered did not meet Transnet's requirements, or where a service was not readered. A pro rata amount will be determined to calculate an amount equal to the cost of the work that would have been incurred to render such a service, for the work not rendered. Such a count will be retained from the retention amount and any difference will be refunded to the Contractor. Should the retention amount be less than the amount incurred, Transnet shall withhold the additional amount from the subsequent invoice payment.

2.3 PAYMENT

All suppliers shall be paid within 30 days from date of receipt of invoice by the Transnet Freight Rail Accounting, Johannesburg office, following acceptance of service by Transnet Freight Rail.

1 INTRODUCTION

When an Agreement is entered into between Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] and the appointed supplier of Services to Transnet [the Service Provider], these Standard Terms and Conditions of Contract, the technical specifications for the Services, the General Bid Conditions, a Schedule of Requirements or Work Order including such special conditions as may be applicable, and any terms in the associated Bid Documents, exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet.

2 DEFINITIONS

Where the following words or phrases are used in the Agreement, such words or phrases shall have the meaning assigned thereto in this clause, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 2.1 **AFSA** means the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa;
- 2.2 **Agreement** means the Agreement and its associated schedules and, it annexures and/or appendices, including the Work Order(s), specifications for the Services and such special conditions as shall apply to the Agreement, together with the General includer Conditions and any additional provisions in the associated bid documents tendered by the Service Provider [as agreed in writing between the Parties], which collectively and exclusively govern the provision of Services by the Service Provider to Transnet;
- 2.3 **Background Intellectual Property** means all intellectual Property introduced and required by either Party to give effect to their obligations under the Agreement owned in whole or in part by or licensed to either Party or their armites prior to the Commencement Date or developed after the Commencement Date otherwise pursual t to the Agreement;
- 2.4 **Business Day(s)** means Mo days to Fridays between 07:30 and 16:00, excluding public holidays as proclaimed in South Africa;
- 2.5 **Commencement Discon** ans [•], notwithstanding the signature date of the Agreement;
- 2.6 Confidentia Information means any information or other data, whether in written, oral, graphic of in any other form such as in documents, papers, memoranda, correspondence, notebooks, reports, drawings, diagrams, discs, articles, samples, test results, prototypes, designs, dans, for gulae, patents, or inventor's certificates, which a Party discloses or provides to the other Party [intentionally or unintentionally, or as a result of one Party permitting the representative of the other Party to visit any of its premises], or which otherwise becomes known to a Party, and which is not in the public domain and includes, without limiting the generality of the term:
 - a) information relating to methods of operation, data and plans of the disclosing Party;
 - b) the contents of the Agreement;
 - c) private and personal details of employees or clients of the disclosing Party or any other person where an onus rests on the disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information:
 - any information disclosed by either Party and which is clearly marked as being confidential or secret;
 - e) information relating to the strategic objectives and planning of the disclosing Party relating to its existing and planned future business activities;

- f) information relating to the past, present and future research and development of the disclosing Party;

- technical and scientific information, Know-How and trade secrets of a disclosing Party including inventions, applications and processes;

- data concerning architecture, demonstrations, tools and techniques processes, machinery and equipment of the disclosing Party;
- m) plans, designs, concepts, drawings, functional and echnical requirements and specifications of the disclosing Party;

- information concerning the charges, recound / or costs of the disclosing Party or its authorised Subcontractors, or their methods, practices or service performance levels actually achieved;
- 2.7 Copyright means the right in explassions procedures, methods of operations or mathematical concepts, computer program codes, compilations of data or other material, literary works, musical works, artistic works, sound recordings, broadcasts, program carrying signals, published editions, photographic works, or circ matographic works of the copyright owner to do or to authorise the doing of certain acts solcified in respect of the different categories of works;
- 2.8 **Default** means any breach of the obligations of either Party [including but not limited to fundamental transpeak or breach of a fundamental term] or any Default, act, omission, negligence or statement of either Party, its employees, agents or Subcontractors in connection with or in relation to the subject of the Agreement and in respect of which such Party is liable to the other;
- Deliverable(s) means any and all works of authorship, products and materials developed, written, prepared, assembled, integrated, modified or provided by the Service Provider in relation to the Services;
- Designs mean registered Designs and/or Design applications and will include the monopoly right granted for the protection of an independently created industrial design including designs dictated essentially by technical or functional considerations as well as topographies of integrated circuits and integrated circuits;
- 2.11 Fee(s) shall mean the agreed Fees for the Services to be purchased from the Service Provider by Transnet, as detailed in the Work Order(s), issued in accordance with the Agreement, as amended by mutual agreement between the Parties and in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement from time to time;

- 2.13 Intellectual Property means Patents, Designs, Know-How, Copyright and Trade Marks and all rights having equivalent or similar effect which may exist anywhere in the world and includes all future additions and improvements to the Intellectual Property;
- 2.14 Know-How means all Confidential Information of whatever nature relating to the Intellectual Property and its exploitation as well as all other Confidential Information generally relating to Transnet's field of technology, including technical information, processing or manufacturing techniques, Designs, specifications, formulae, systems, processes, information concerning materials and marketing and business information in general;
- 2.15 Materials means the Deliverables, the Service Provider Materials and the Third Party Materials;
- 2.16 **Parties** mean the Parties to the Agreement together with their subsidiaries, divisions, business units, successors-in-title and their assigns;
- 2.17 Party means either one of these Parties;
- 2.18 Patents mean registered Patents and Patent applications, once the second have proceeded to grant, and includes a right granted for any inventions, product or processes in all fields of technology;
- 2.19 **Permitted Purpose** means any activity or process to be undertaken or supervised by Personnel or employees of one Party during the term of the Agreement, for which purpose authorised disclosure of the other Party's Confidentia The rmatical or Intellectual Property is a prerequisite in order to enable such activity or process to be accomplished;
- 2.20 Personnel means any partner er ployee, agent, consultant, independent associate or supplier, Subcontractor and the staff of such Subcontractor, or other authorised representative of either Party;

- 2.30 VAT means Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time; and
- 2.31 **Work Order(s)** means a detailed scope of work for a Service required by Transnet, including timeframes, Deliverable, Fees and costs for the supply of the Service to Transnet, which may be appended to the Agreement from time to time.

3 INTERPRETATION

- 3.1 Clause headings in the Agreement are included for ease or reference only and do not form part of the Agreement for the purposes of interpretation or followy other purpose. No provision shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of either Party hereto by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have structured, drafted such provision.
- Any term, word, acronym or phrase used in the Agreement, other than those defined under the clause heading "Definitions" shall be given to plain English meaning, and those terms, words, acronyms, and phrases used in the large meaning to the interpreted in accordance with the generally accepted meanings accorded thereto.
- 3.3 A reference to the singular incorporates a reference to the plural and vice versa.
- 3.4 A reference to natura persons incorporates a reference to legal persons and vice versa.
- 3.5 A reference to a particular gender incorporates a reference to the other gender.

4 NATURE AND SCOPE

- 4.1 The Agreement is an agreement under the terms and conditions of which the Service Provider will arrange for the provision to Transnet of the Services which meet the requirements of Transnet, the elivery of which Services is controlled by means of Purchase Orders to be issued by Transnet and executed by the Service Provider, in accordance with the Agreement.
- 4.2 Such Purchase Orders shall be agreed between the Parties from time to time, subject to the terms of the relevant Work Order(s).
- 4.3 Each properly executed Purchase Order forms an inseparable part of the Agreement as if it were fully incorporated into the body of the Agreement.
- 4.4 During the period of the Agreement, both Parties can make written suggestions for amendments to the Work Order(s), in accordance with procedures set out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control] below. A Party will advise the other Party within 14 [fourteen] Business Days, or such other period as mutually agreed, whether the amendment is acceptable.
- 4.5 Insofar as any term, provision or condition in the Work Order(s) conflicts with a like term, provision or condition in the Agreement and/or a Purchase Order, or where the Agreement is

- silent on the matter, the term, provision or condition in this Master Agreement shall prevail, unless such term or provision or condition in this Master Agreement has been specifically revoked or amended by mutual written agreement between the Parties.
- 4.6 Time will be of the essence and the Service Provider will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the timeframe(s) [if any] set out in the relevant schedule, save that the Service Provider will not be liable under this clause if it is unable to meet such obligation within the time required as a direct result of any act or omission by Transnet and it has used its best endeavours to advise Transnet of such act or omission. In the event of such delay, any time deadlines detailed in the relevant schedule shall be extended by a period equal to the period of that delay.

5 AUTHORITY OF PARTIES

- Nothing in the Agreement will constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the Parties, or constitute or be deemed to constitute the Parties as agents or employees of one another for any purpose or in any form whatsoever.
- 5.2 Neither Party shall be entitled to, or have the power or authority to enter into an agreement in the name of the other; or give any warranty, representation or undertaking on the other's behalf; or create any liability against the other or bind the other's credit in any way or for any purpose whatsoever.

6 WARRANTIES

- 6.1 The Service Provider warrants to Transnet hat:
 - a) it has full capacity and authority to enter into and to perform the Agreement and that the Agreement is executed as a city authorised representatives of the Service Provider;
 - b) it will discharge is obligations under the Agreement and any annexure, appendix or schedule harett with all due skill, care and diligence;
 - c) it win by solely responsible for the payment of remuneration and associated benefits, if any, of the Personnel and for withholding and remitting income tax for its Personnel in conformance with any applicable laws and regulations;
 - it will procure licences for Transnet in respect of all Third Party Material detailed in the Work Order(s), and will procure the right for Transnet to take such copies [in whole or in part] of such Third Party Materials as it may reasonably require for the purposes of back-up for archiving and disaster recovery; and
 - e) the use or possession by Transnet of any Materials will not subject Transnet to any claim for infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
- 6.2 The Service Provider warrants that it will perform its obligations under the Agreement in accordance with the Service Levels as defined in the relevant schedule. Transnet may at its discretion audit compliance with the Service Levels, provided that any such audit is carried out with reasonable prior notice and in a reasonable way so as not to have an adverse effect on the performance of the Services. Without prejudice to clause 6.3 below, in the event that the Service Provider fails to meet the Service Levels, Transnet may claim appropriate service credits or invoke a retention of Fees as detailed in the relevant schedule and/or Work Order.

- 6.3 The Service Provider warrants that for a period of 90 [ninety] days from Acceptance of the Deliverables they will, if properly used, conform in all material respects with the requirements set out in the relevant schedule. The Service Provider will at its expense remedy any such non-conformance as soon as possible but in any event within 30 [thirty] days of notification by Transnet. In the event that the Service Provider fails or is unable to remedy such non-conformance within such time-scale, Transnet will be entitled to employ a third party to do so in place of the Service Provider and any excess charges or costs incurred by Transnet as a result shall be paid by the Service Provider.
- 6.4 The Service Provider will remedy any defect within 30 [thirty] days of being notified of that defect by Transnet in writing.
- 6.5 The Service Provider will not be liable to remedy any problem arising from or caused by any modification made by Transnet to the Deliverables, or any part thereof, without the prior approval of the Service Provider.
- 6.6 The Service Provider shall advise Transnet of the effects of any steps proposed by Transnet pursuant to clause 6.5 above, including but not limited to are cost implications or any disruption or delay in the performance of the Services. The Parties agree that any changes to the Services, including the charges for the Services or any timetables for deli ery of the Services, will be agreed in accordance with the change control procedure, as see out in clause 28 [Amendment and Change Control].
- 6.7 The Service Provider warrants that:
 - a) it has, using the most up-to date software available, tested for [and deleted] all commonly known viruses in the Material, and for all viruses known by the Service Provider at the date of the relevant Work Order; and
 - b) at the time of delivery to Transnet, the Materials do not contain any trojan horse, worm, logic bomb, time to b, back door, trap door, keys or other harmful components.

The Service Provider Roses that, in the event that a virus is found, it will at its own expense use its best cides ours to assist Transnet in reducing the effect of the virus and, particularly in the event that a virus causes loss of operational efficiency or loss of data, to assist Transnet to the same extent to mitigate such losses and to restore Transnet to its original operating efficiency.

- 6.8 The Service Provider undertakes to comply with South Africa's general privacy protection in terms of the Bill of Rights [Section 14] in connection with the Agreement and shall procure that its Personnel shall observe the provisions of Section 14 [as applicable] or any amendments and reenactments thereof and any regulations made pursuant thereto.
- The Service Provider warrants that it has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure that, in the event of a disaster, the impact of such disaster on the ability of the Service Provider to comply with its obligations under the Agreement will be reduced to the greatest extent possible, and that the Service Provider shall ensure that it has appropriate, tested and documented recovery arrangements in place.
- 6.10 In compliance with the National Railway Safety Regulator Act, 16 of 2002, the Service Provider shall ensure that the Services, to be supplied to Transnet under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, comply fully with the specifications as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto, and shall thereby adhere [as applicable] to railway safety requirements and/or regulations. Permission for

the engagement of a Subcontractor by the Service Provider [as applicable] shall be subject to a review of the capability of the proposed Subcontractor to comply with the specified railway safety requirements and/or regulations. The Service Provider and/or its Subcontractor shall grant Transnet access, during the term of the Agreement, to review any safety-related activities, including the coordination of such activities across all parts of its organisation.

7 TRANSNET'S OBLIGATIONS

- 7.1 Transnet undertakes to promptly comply with any reasonable request by the Service Provider for information, including information concerning Transnet's operations and activities, that relates to the Services as may be necessary for the Service Provider to perform the Services, but for no other purpose. However, Transnet's compliance with any request for information is subject to any internal security rules and requirements and subject to the observance by the Service Provider of its confidentiality obligations under the Agreement.
- 7.2 The Service Provider shall give Transnet reasonable notice of any information it requires in accordance with clause 7.1 above.
- 7.3 Subject to clause 13 [Service Provider's Personnel], Transing agrees to provide the Service Provider or its Personnel such access to and use of its ficilities as is necessary to allow the Service Provider to perform its obligations under the Agreement.

8 GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PTO VIDER

- 8.1 The Service Provider shall:
 - a) respond promptly to all complaints and enquiries from Transnet;
 - b) inform Transnet imme lately of any dispute or complaint arising in relation to the provision of the Services;
 - c) conduct its b Sives in a professional manner that will reflect positively upon the Service Provider and the Service Provider's Services;
 - d) keep we'records clearly indicating all transactions concluded by the Service Provider leaving to one performance of the Services and keep such records for at least 5 [five] years from the date of each such transaction;
 - obtain, and at all times maintain in full force and effect, any and all licences, permits and the like required under applicable laws for the provision of the Services and the conduct of the business and activities of the Service Provider;
 - f) observe and ensure compliance with all requirements and obligations as set out in the labour and related legislation of South Africa, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993;
 - g) comply with all applicable environmental legislation and regulations, and demonstrate sound environmental policies, management and performance; and
 - h) ensure the validity of all renewable certifications, including but not limited to its Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE Accreditation Certificate, for the duration of the Agreement. Should the Service Provider fail to present Transnet with such renewals as they become due, Transnet shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any

liability and without prejudice to any claims which Transnet may have for damages against the Service Provider.

- 8.2 The Service Provider acknowledges and agrees that it shall at all times:
 - a) render the Services and perform all its duties with honesty and integrity;
 - communicate openly and honestly with Transnet and demonstrate a commitment to performing the Services timeously, efficiently and to the required standards;
 - endeavour to provide the highest possible standards of service and professionalism, with a reasonable degree of care and diligence;
 - d) use its best endeavours and make every diligent effort to meet agreed deadlines;
 - e) treat its own Personnel, as well as all Transnet's officers, employees, agents and consultants, with fairness and courtesy and respect for their human rights;
 - f) practice and promote its own internal policies aimed at prohibiting and preventing unfair discrimination [as further referred to in clause 22 *Equality and Diversity*];
 - g) treat all enquiries from Transnet in connection with the Services wan courtesy and respond to all enquiries promptly and efficiently. Where the Service Provider is unable to comply with the provisions of this clause, the Service Provider will advise Transnet of the delay and the reasons therefor and will keep Transnet informed of progress made regarding the enquiry;
 - when requested by Transnet, provide clear and accurate information regarding the Service Provider's own policies and provideres, excluding Know-How and other Confidential Information, except where a non-disclosure undertaking has been entered into between the Parties;
 - i) not allow a conflict of interest to develop between its own interests [or the interests of any of its other cultivates] and the interests of Transnet;
 - not accept on offer, nor allow, induce or promote the acceptance or offering of any gratuity entirement, incentive or gift that could reasonably be regarded as bribery or an attenuat to otherwise exert undue influence over the recipient;
 - oo mislead Transnet or its officers, employees and stakeholders, whether by act or omission;
 - not otherwise act in an unethical manner or do anything which could reasonably be expected to damage or tarnish Transnet's reputation or business image; and
 - m) immediately report to Transnet any unethical, fraudulent or otherwise unlawful conduct of which it becomes aware in connection with Transnet or the provision of Services.

9 FEES AND EXPENSES

- 9.1 In consideration of the provision of the Services, Transnet will pay to the Service Provider the Fees detailed in the relevant schedule or Work Order.
- 9.2 Transnet will not be invoiced for materials used in the provision of the Services save for those materials [if any] set out in the Work Order and accepted by Transnet or in any relevant Work Order [which will be invoiced to Transnet at cost].

- 9.3 Unless otherwise agreed in a schedule or Work Order, Transnet will reimburse to the Service Provider all reasonable and proper expenses incurred directly and solely in connection with the provision of the Services, provided that all such expenses:
 - a) are agreed by Transnet in advance;
 - b) are incurred in accordance with Transnet's standard travel and expenses policies;
 - c) are passed on to Transnet at cost with no administration fee; and
 - d) will only be reimbursed if supported by relevant receipts.
- 9.4 All Tax Invoices relating to Fees, out of pocket expenses and, if applicable, travel and accommodation costs, will provide the detail for each of the Personnel carrying out the Services and incurring the expenses, and the Tax Invoice will, where appropriate, include VAT as a separate item.

10 INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- 10.1 Transnet shall pay the Service Provider the amounts stipulated in the relevant schedule or Work Order, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- 10.2 Transnet shall pay such amounts to the Service Provide, upon reclipt of a correct and undisputed Tax Invoice together with the supporting documentation as specified in the Work Order appended hereto, once the undisputed Tax Invoices, or such portion of the Tax Invoices which are undisputed become due and payable to the Tax Invoices Provider for the provision of the Services, in terms of clause 10.4 below.
- 10.3 All Fees and other sums payable under the Agreement are exclusive of VAT, which will be payable at the applicable rate.
- 10.4 Unless otherwise provided for in the Work Order(s) appended to the Agreement, Tax Invoices shall be submitted together with a month-end statement. Payment against such month-end statement shall be made at Transnet within 30 [thirty] days after date of receipt by Transnet of the statement together with all undisputed Tax Invoices and supporting documentation.
- 10.5 Where the payment of any Tax Invoice, or any part thereof which is not in dispute, is not made in accordance with this clause 10, the Service Provider shall be entitled to charge interest on the outstant in amount, at The Standard Bank of South Africa's prime rate of interest in force, for the eriod from the due date of payment until the outstanding amount is paid.

11 FL ADJUSTMENTS

- 11.1 Fees for Services rendered in terms of the Agreement shall be subject to review as indicated in the Work Order(s) annexed hereto from time to time.
- 11.2 No less than 2 [two] months prior to any proposed Fee adjustment, the Parties shall commence negotiations for Fees for the next period or as otherwise indicated and appended hereto.
- 11.3 Should Transnet and the Service Provider fail to reach an agreement on Fees for the successive period, either Party shall be entitled to submit this matter to dispute resolution in accordance with clause 25 of this Master Agreement [Dispute Resolution].

12 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

12.1 Title to Confidential Information

- a) Transnet will retain all right, title and interest in and to its Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property and the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Confidential Information and Background Intellectual Property that is proprietary to Transnet. For the avoidance of doubt, all the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property shall remain vested in the Service Provider.
- b) Transnet shall grant to the Service Provider an irrevocable, royalty free, non-exclusive licence to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property only for the Permitted Purpose. This license shall not permit the Service Provider to sub-license to other parties.
- c) The Service Provider shall grant to Transnet an irrevocable, royalt, free, non-exclusive licence to use the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property for the Permitted Purpose. This licence shall not permit Transnet to sub-license to other parties.
- d) The Service Provider shall grant Transnet access to the Service Provider's Background Intellectual Property on terms which shall be *bona fit*, they set debetween the Parties for the purpose of commercially exploiting the Foreground Intellectual Property, to the extent that such access is required.

12.2 Title to Intellectual Property

- a) All right, title and interest in and to Pereground Intellectual Property prepared, conceived or developed by the Service Provider acknowledges that it has no claim of any nature in and to the Foreground Intellectual experty. The Service Provider shall not at any time during or after the termination of cancellation of the Agreement dispute the validity or enforceability of such Foreground Intellectual Property, or cause to be done any act or anything contesting or in any way impairing or tending to impair any part of that right, title and interest to any of the Foreground Intellectual Property and shall not counsel or assist any person to do so.
- b) Franker shall be entitled to seek protection in respect of the Foreground Intellectual Reperty anywhere in the world as it shall decide in its own absolute discretion and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining and maintaining protection of the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- c) Where the Foreground Intellectual Property was created by the Service Provider or its researchers, agents and employees and where Transnet elects not to exercise its option to seek protection or decides to discontinue the financial support of the prosecution or maintenance of any such protection, Transnet shall notify the Service Provider who shall have the right of first refusal to file or continue prosecution or maintain any such applications and to maintain any protection issuing on the Foreground Intellectual Property.
- d) No consideration shall be paid by Transnet to the Service Provider for the assignment of any Foreground Intellectual Property from the Service Provider to Transnet, over and above the sums payable in terms of the Agreement. The Service Provider undertakes to

- sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of the Foreground Intellectual Property to Transnet.
- e) Subject to anything contrary contained in the Agreement and/or the prior written consent of Transnet [which consent shall not be unreasonably be withheld or delayed], the Service Provider shall under no circumstances be entitled as of right, or to claim the right, to use Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Foreground Intellectual Property.

12.3 Title to Improvements

Any improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications to the Foreground Intellectual Property, and any and all new inventions or discoveries, based on or resulting from the use of Transnet's Background Intellectual Property and/or Confidential Information shall be exclusively owned by Transnet. The Service Provider shall disclose promptly to transnet all such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries. The Service Provider hereby undertakes to sign all documents and do all things as may be necessary to effect, record and perfect the assignment of such improvements, developments, adaptations and/or modifications, inventions or discoveries to Transnet and the Service Provider shall reasonably assist Transnet in attaining, maintaining or descripting ownership and/or protection of the improved Foreground Intellectual Property.

12.4 Unauthorised Use of Confidential Information

The Service Provider shall not authorise any part to act on or use in any way any Confidential Information belonging to Transnet whicher or not such party is aware of such Confidential Information, and shall promptly nearly scartnet of the information if it becomes aware of any party so acting, and shall provide Translet the information with such assistance as Transnet reasonably requires, at Translet's cost and expense, to prevent such third party from so acting.

12.5 Unauthorised Use of Intellectual Property

- a) The Service Tracifor agrees to notify Transnet in writing of any conflicting uses of, and applications of registrations of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks or any act of infringement, unfair competition or passing off involving the Intellectual Property of Transnet or which the Service Provider acquires knowledge and Transnet shall have the nath, as its own option, to proceed against any party infringing its Intellectual Property.
- It shall be within the sole and absolute discretion of Transnet to determine what steps shall be taken against the infringer and the Service Provider shall co-operate fully with Transnet, at Transnet's cost, in whatever measure including legal action to bring any infringement of illegal use to an end.
- c) The Service Provider shall cooperate to provide Transnet promptly with all relevant ascertainable facts.
- d) If proceedings are commenced by Transnet alone, Transnet shall be responsible for all expenses but shall be entitled to all damages or other award arising out of such proceedings. If proceedings are commenced by both Parties, both Parties will be responsible for the expenses and both Parties shall be entitled to damages or other award arising out of proceedings.



13 SERVICE PROVIDER'S PERSONNEL

- 13.1 The Service Provider's Personnel shall be regarded at all times as employees, agents or Subcontractors of the Service Provider and no relationship of employer and employee shall arise between Transnet and any Service Provider Personnel under any circumstances regardless of the degree of supervision that may be exercised over the Personnel by Transnet.
- 13.2 The Service Provider warrants that all its Personnel will be entitled to work in South Africa or any other country in which the Services are to be performed.
- 13.3 The Service Provider will ensure that its Personnel comply with all reasonable requirements made known to the Service Provider by Transnet concerning conduct at any Transnet premises or any other premises upon which the Services are to be performed [including but not limited to security regulations, policy standards and codes of practice and health and safety requirements]. The Service Provider will ensure that such Personnel at all times act in a lawful and proper manner in accordance with these requirements.
- 13.4 Transnet reserves the right to refuse to admit or to remove from any premises occupied by or on behalf of it, any Service Provider Personnel whose admission or presence would, in the reasonable opinion of Transnet, be undesirable or who represent a direct to confidentiality or security or whose presence would be in breach of any rules and inquiations governing Transnet's Personnel, provided that Transnet notifies the Service Provider of any such refusal [with reasons why]. The reasonable exclusion of any such individual trans such premises shall not relieve the Service Provider from the performance of its obligations under the Agreement.
- 13.5 The Service Provider agrees to use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the continuity of its Personnel assigned to perform the Service. If any re-assignment by the Service Provider of those Personnel is necessary, or if transnet advises that any such Personnel assigned are in any respect unsatisfactory, including where any such Personnel are, or are expected to be or have been absent for any period when the Service Provider will promptly supply a replacement of equivalent calibre and experience, and any such replacement shall be approved by Transnet prior to commencing provision of the Services, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

14 LIMITATION OF LIBILITY

- 14.1 Norther party excludes or limits liability to the other Party for:
 - death or personal injury due to negligence; or
 - p) fraud.
- 14.2 The Service Provider shall indemnify and keep Transnet indemnified from and against liability for damage to any Transnet property [whether tangible or intangible] or any other loss, costs or damage suffered by Transnet to the extent that it results from any act of or omission by the Service Provider or its Personnel in connection with the Agreement. The Service Provider's liability arising out of this clause 14.2 shall be limited to a maximum amount payable in respect of any one occurrence or a series of related occurrences in a single calendar year, such amount to be agreed in writing by the Parties.
- 14.3 Subject always to clauses 14.1 and 14.2 above, the liability of either the Service Provider or Transnet under or in connection with the Agreement, whether for negligence, misrepresentation, breach of contract or otherwise, for direct loss or damage arising out of each Default or series of

- related Defaults shall not exceed 100% [one hundred per cent] of the Fees paid under the schedule or Work Order to which the Default(s) relates.
- 14.4 Subject to clause 14.1 above, and except as provided in clauses 14.2 and 14.3 above, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for indirect or consequential loss or damage or including indirect or consequential loss of profits, business, revenue, goodwill or anticipated savings of an indirect nature or loss or damage incurred by the other Party as a result of third party claims.
- 14.5 If for any reason the exclusion of liability in clause 14.4 above is void or unenforceable, either Party's total liability for all loss or damage under the Agreement shall be as provided in clause 14.3 above.
- 14.6 Nothing in this clause 14 shall be taken as limiting the liability of the Service Provider in respect of clause 12 [Intellectual Property Rights] or clause 16 [Confidentiality].

15 INSURANCES

- 15.1 Without limiting the liability of the Service Provider under the Agreement, the Service Provider shall take out insurance in respect of all risks for which it is regule at it, the Service Provider to insure against, including any liability it may have as a reaction its activities under the Agreement for theft, destruction, death or injury to any person and dimage to property. The level of insurance will be kept under review by Transnet, on an arrangual basis, to ensure its adequacy, provided that any variation to the level of such insurance shall be entirely at the discretion of the Service Provider.
- 15.2 The Service Provider shall arrange i sura re with reputable insurers and will produce to Transnet evidence of the existence of the policies of an annual basis within 30 [thirty] days after date of policy renewals.

16 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 16.1 The Parties hereb, undertake the following, with regard to Confidential Information:
 - a) not to divide or disclose to any person whomsoever in any form or manner whatsoever, either divide or indirectly, any Confidential Information of the other, without the prior written consent of such other Party, other than when called upon to do so in accordance while a statute, or by a court having jurisdiction, or by any other duly authorised and empowered authority or official, in which event the Party concerned shall do what is reasonably possible to inform the other of such a demand and each shall assist the other in seeking appropriate relief or the instituting of a defensive action to protect the Confidential Information concerned;
 - b) not to use, exploit, permit the use of, directly or indirectly, or in any other manner whatsoever apply the Confidential Information, disclosed to it as a result of the Agreement, for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purpose for which it is disclosed or otherwise than in strict compliance with the provisions in the Agreement;
 - c) not to make any notes, sketches, drawings, photographs or copies of any kind of any part of the disclosed Confidential Information, without the prior written consent of such other Party, except when reasonably necessary for the purpose of the Agreement, in which case such copies shall be regarded as Confidential Information;

- d) not to de-compile, disassemble or reverse engineer any composition, compilation, concept application, item, component de-compilation, including software or hardware disclosed and shall not analyse any sample provided by Transnet, or otherwise determine the composition or structure or cause to permit these tasks to be carried out except in the performance of its obligations pursuant to the Agreement;
- e) not to exercise less care to safeguard Transnet Confidential Information than the Party exercises in safeguarding its own competitive, sensitive or Confidential Information;
- f) Confidential Information disclosed by either Party to the other or by either Party to any other party used by such Party in the performance of the Agreement, shall be dealt with as "restricted" or shall be dealt with according to any other appropriate level of confidentiality relevant to the nature of the information concerned, agreed between the Parties concerned and stipulated in writing for such information in such cases;
- g) the Parties shall not make or permit to be made by any other percon subject to their control, any public statements or issue press releases or discusse Confidential Information with regard to any matter related to the Agreement, a loss written authorisation to do so has first been obtained from the Party first disclosing a confinformation;
- h) each Party shall be entitled to disclose such aspects of Confidential Information as may be relevant to one or more technically qualified employees or consultants of the Party who are required in the course of their duties to receive the Confidential Information for the Permitted Purpose provided that the employee or consultant concerned has a legitimate interest therein, and then only to be extent necessary for the Permitted Purpose, and is informed by the Party of the confidential nature of the Confidential Information and the obligations of the confidentiality to which such disclosure is subject and the Party shall ensure such employees or consultants honour such obligations;
- i) each Party ship roofy the other Party of the name of each person or entity to whom any Confidential Aformation has been disclosed as soon as practicable after such disclosure;
- j) each in the shall ensure that any person or entity to which it discloses Confidential information shall observe and perform all of the covenants the Party has accepted in the Agreement as if such person or entity has signed the Agreement. The Party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be responsible for any breach of the provisions of the Agreement by the person or entity; and
- each Party may by written notice to the other Party specify which of the Party's employees, officers or agents are required to sign a non-disclosure undertaking.
- 16.2 The duties and obligations with regard to Confidential Information in this clause 16 shall not apply where:
 - a) a Party can demonstrate that such information is already in the public domain or becomes available to the public through no breach of the Agreement by that Party, or its Personnel;
 or
 - was rightfully in a Party's possession prior to receipt from the other Party, as proven by the first-mentioned Party's written records, without an infringement of an obligation or duty of confidentiality; or

- c) can be proved to have been rightfully received by a Party from a third party without a breach of a duty or obligation of confidentiality; or
- d) is independently developed by a Party as proven by its written records.
- 16.3 This clause 16 shall survive termination for any reason of the Agreement and shall remain in force and effect from the Commencement Date of the Agreement and 5 [five] years after the termination of the Agreement. Upon termination of the Agreement, all documentation furnished to the Service Provider by Transnet pursuant to the Agreement shall be returned to Transnet including, without limitation all corporate identity equipment including dies, blocks, labels, advertising matter, printing matter and the like.

17 TOTAL OR PARTIAL FAILURE TO PERFORM THE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Should the Service Provider fail or neglect to execute the work or to deliver any polition of the Service, as required by the terms of the Agreement or Work Order, Transnet may cancer the Agreement or Work Order in so far as it relates to the unexecuted work or rejected portion of the Service, and, in such event, the provision of any remaining commitment shall remain subject in all respects to these conditions.

18 TERM AND TERMINATION

- 18.1 Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, the Communication and the duration shall be for a 12 [twelve] months region, expiring on [●], unless:
 - a) the Agreement is terminated by enter larty in accordance with the provisions incorporated herein or in any schedules or anne unexappended hereto, or otherwise in accordance with law or equity; or
 - b) the Agreement is extended at Transnet's option for a further period to be agreed by the Parties.
- 18.2 Either Party may tern increate Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party where the other Party has a somitted a material Default and, where such Default is capable of remedy, has failed to be needy such Default within 30 [thirty] days of receiving notice specifying the Default and recognizing its remedy.
- 18.3 Fither Party may terminate the Agreement forthwith by notice in writing to the other Party when the other Party is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or commits any act or omission which we be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time], or if any action, application or proceeding is made with regard to it for:
 - a) a voluntary arrangement or composition or reconstruction of its debts;
 - b) its winding-up or dissolution;
 - the appointment of a liquidator, trustee, receiver, administrative receiver or similar officer;
 or
 - d) any similar action, application or proceeding in any jurisdiction to which it is subject.
- 18.4 Transnet may terminate the Agreement at any time within 2 [two] months of becoming aware of a change of control of the Service Provider by notice in writing to the Service Provider. For the purposes of this clause, "control" means the right to direct the affairs of a company whether by ownership of shares, membership of the board of directors, agreement or otherwise.

- 18.5 Transnet may cancel any schedule or Work Order hereto at any time on giving the Service Provider 30 [thirty] days' written notice.
- 18.6 Notwithstanding this clause 18, either Party may cancel the Agreement without cause by giving 30 [thirty] days prior written notice thereof to the other Party.

19 CONSEQUENCE OF TERMINATION

- 19.1 Termination in accordance with clause 18 [Term and Termination] shall not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or shall thereafter accrue to either Party and all provisions which are to survive the Agreement or impliedly do so shall remain in force and in effect.
- 19.2 On termination of the Agreement or a Work Order, the Service Provider with immediately deliver up, and procure that its Personnel will immediately deliver up to Transnet, all Deliverables and property belonging to Transnet [or, in the event of termination of a work Order, such as is relevant to that Work Order] which may be in the possession on or under the control of the Service Provider, and certify to Transnet in writing that this has been done.
- 19.3 To the extent that any of the Deliverables and property referred to in clause 19.2 above are in electronic form and contained on non-detachable storage devices, the Service Provider will provide Transnet with unencrypted copies of the same on magnetic media and will irretrievably destroy and delete copies so held.
- 19.4 In the event that the Agreement is terminated by the Service Provider under clause 18.2 [Term and Termination], or in the event that a Non-Order is terminated by Transnet under clause 18.5 [Term and Termination], Transnet will pay to the Service Provider all outstanding Fees [apportioned on a pro rata basis] relating to the work undertaken by the Service Provider up until the date of such termination. Transnet will also pay the costs of any goods and materials ordered by the Service Provider increlation to the such work for which the Service Provider has paid or is legally obliged to pay, in which case, on delivery of such goods or materials, the Service Provider will promptly deliver such goods and materials to Transnet or as it may direct.
- 19.5 The provisions of clauses 0 [Definitions], 6 [Warranties], 12 [Intellectual Property Rights], 14 [Limitation of Liability], 16 [Confidentiality], 19 [Consequence of Termination], 25 [Dispute Resolution] and 29 [Governing Law] shall survive termination or expiry of the Agreement.
- Party [the Defaulting Party] commits a material breach of the Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within 30 [thirty] Business Days of written notice thereof, the other Party [hereinafter the Aggrieved Party], shall be entitled, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have in terms of the Agreement, to terminate the Agreement forthwith without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which the Aggrieved Party may have for damages against the Defaulting Party.

19.7 Should:

- a) the Service Provider effect or attempt to effect a compromise or composition with its creditors; or
- b) either Party be provisionally or finally liquidated or placed under judicial management, whether provisionally or finally; or

c) either Party cease or threaten to cease to carry on its normal line of business or default or threaten to default in the payment of its liabilities generally, or commit any act or omission which would be an act of insolvency in terms of the Insolvency Act, 24 of 1936 [as may be amended from time to time];

then the other Party shall be entitled, but not obliged, to terminate the Agreement on written notice, in which event such termination shall be without any liability and without prejudice to any claims which either Party may have for damages against the other.

20 ASSIGNMENT

Neither Party may assign the benefit of the Agreement or any interest hereunder except with the prior written consent of the other. Further, in the event that Transnet wishes to assign or novate the Agreement to any third party, the Service Provider agrees that it shall not unreasonably withhold or delay its consent to such assignment or novation and that it shall only be entitled to recover from Transnet any reasonable legal costs incurred by it as a direct result of such assignment or novation

21 FORCE MAJEURE

- 21.1 Neither Party shall have any claim against the other Party arising from any failure or delay in the performance of any obligation of either Party under the Agriement caused by an act of *force majeure* such as acts of God, fire, flood, war, strike, lockout, industrial dispute, government action, laws or regulations, riots, terrorism or considisturbance, defaults, delays or discontinuance on the part of independent contractors, suppliers, or other circumstances or factors beyond the reasonable control of either Party, and to the extent that the performance of obligations of either Party hereunder is delayed by virtue of the aforegoing, any period stipulated for any such performance shall be reasonably extended.
- 21.2 Each Party will take all leasonable steps by whatever lawful means that are available, to resume full performance as long as practicable and will seek agreement to modification of the relevant provisions of the Agreement in order to accommodate the new circumstances caused by the act of force majeure at a Party fails to agree to such modifications proposed by the other Party within 90 [nilety, days at the act of force majeure first occurring, either Party may thereafter terminate the Agreement with immediate notice.

22 FOUR TY AND DIVERSITY

- The Service Provider will not victimise, harass or discriminate against any employee of either Party to the Agreement or any applicant for employment with either Party to the Agreement due to their gender, race, disability, age, religious belief, sexual orientation or part-time status. This provision applies, but is not limited to employment, upgrading, work environment, demotion, transfer, recruitment, recruitment advertising, termination of employment, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training.
- 22.2 Both Parties to the Agreement undertake that they will not, and shall procure that its employees, agents and Subcontractors will not breach any applicable discrimination legislation and any amendments and re-enactments thereof.

- 25.3 Such dispute shall be finally resolved in accordance with the rules of AFSA by an arbitrator or arbitrators appointed by AFSA.
- 25.4 This clause constitutes an irreveal te consent by the Parties to any proceedings in terms hereof, and neither of the Parties shall be entitled to withdraw from the provisions of this clause or claim at any such proceedings that it is not bound by this clause 25.
- 25.5 This clause 25 is severable from the rest of the Agreement and shall remain in effect even if the Agreement is fermiously don't any reason.
- 25.6 This clause 2 shall not preclude either Party from seeking urgent relief in a court of appropriate jurisdiction, when grounds for urgency exist.

26 ADDITESSES IN NOTICES

- 1.2 **Respondent(s)** shall mean a respondent/bidder to a Transnet Bid;
- 1.3 RFP shall mean Request for Proposal;
- 1.4 RFQ shall mean Request for Quotation;
- 1.5 **RFX** shall mean RFP and/or RFQ, as the case may be;
- 1.6 Services shall mean the services required by Transnet as specified in its Bid Decument;
- 1.7 Service Provider shall mean the successful Respondent;
- 1.8 **Tax Invoice** shall mean the document as required by Section 20 on the Value Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time;
- 1.9 Transnet shall mean Transnet SOC Ltd, a State Owned Company, and
- 1.10 **VAT** shall mean Value-Added Tax chargeable in terms of the Value-Added Tax Act, 89 of 1991, as may be amended from time to time.

2 GENERAL

All Bid Documents and subsequent contracts and orders shall be subject to the following procedures as laid down by Transnet and are to be strictly adhered to by any person or enterprise or company responding to this RFX.

3 LODGING OF BID DOCUMENTS

- 23.4 Before a visit is using taken, such as envisage in this clause 23, Transnet and the Respondent will agree in writing on the number of employees of Transnet that should undertake the visit and the number of man-day, involved in the visit.

24 BIDS BY OR CALBUHALF OF FOREIGN RESPONDENTS

- 24.1 Bit submitted by foreign principals may be forwarded direct by the principals to the Secretary of the Acquision Council or to a designated official of Transnet according to whichever officer is specified in the Bid Documents, or may be so forwarded on the principal's behalf by its South African representative or agent provided that written proof is submitted that such representative or agent has been duly authorised to act in that capacity by the principal. Failure to submit such authorisation by the representative or agent shall disqualify the Bid.
- 24.2 When legally authorised to prepare and submit Bids on behalf of their principals not domiciled in the Republic of South Africa, representatives or agents must compile the Bids in the names of such principals and sign them on behalf of the latter.
- 24.3 South African representatives or agents of a successful foreign Respondent must when so required enter into a formal contract in the name of their principals and must sign such contract on behalf of

the latter. In every such case a legal Power of Attorney from their principals must be furnished to Transnet by the South African representative or agents authorising them to enter into and sign such contract.

- a) Such Power of Attorney must comply with Government Notice No. 1160 of 27 June 1930 [and any amendments thereto] "Rules of the Supreme Court of South Africa for the authentication of documents executed outside the Republic for use within the Republic."
- b) The Power of Attorney must be signed by the principal under the same title as used in the Bid Documents.
- c) On arrival within the Republic of South Africa this Power of Attorney is to be completed in terms of Section 8(2) of the Stamp Duties Act No. 77 of 1968, or any amendment thereof.
- d) If a Power of Attorney held by the South African representative or a set includes matters of a general nature besides provision for the entering into and signific of a contract with Transnet, a certified copy thereof should be furnished.
- e) The Power of Attorney must authorise the South African representative or agent to choose the domicilium citandi et executandi as provided for in clause 26 [Addresses for Notices] of the Standard Conditions of Contract, Form ST&C Services
- 24.4 If payment is to be made in South Africa, the foreign Supplier [i.e. the principal, or its South African agent or representative], must notify Trans et it writing whether, for payment by electronic funds transfer [EFT]:
 - a) funds are to be transferred to be credit of the foreign Supplier's account at a bank in South Africa, in which case the name and branch of such bank shall be furnished; or
 - b) funds are to be transferred to the credit of its South African agent or representative, in which case the name at Neralch of such bank shall be furnished.
- 24.5 The attention of the Respondent is directed to clause 15 above [Securities] regarding the provision of security for the followers of contracts and orders and the manner and form in which such security is
