2. No email or facsimile responses will be considered, unless otherwise stated herein.
3. The responses to this RFQ will be opened as soon as practicable after the expiry of the time advertised for receiving them.
4. Transnet shall not, at the opening of responses, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Proposals / information received, i.e. pricing, delivery, etc. The names and locations of the Respondents will be divulged to other Respondents upon request.
5. Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RFQ other than that shown on the envelope.

2 Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE]

Transnet fully endorses and supports the Government's Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Programme and it would therefore prefer to do business with local business enterprises who share these same values. Transnet will accordingly allow a "preference" to companies who provide a valid B-BBEE Verification Certificate. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

2.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Respondents are to note that the following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R1 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- Bidders are to note that if the 80/20 preference point system is stipulated in this RFQ and all Bids received exceed R1 000 000.00, the RFQ must be cancelled. Similarly, if the 90/10 preference point system is stipulated in this RFQ and all Bids received are equal to or below R1 000 000.00, the RFQ must be cancelled.

The value of this bid is estimated to be below R1 000 000.00 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable. When Transnet invites prospective suppliers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Respondents to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

The Department of Trade and Industry recently revised the Codes of Good Practice on 11 October 2013 [Government Gazette No. 36928]. The Revised Codes will replace the Black Economic Empowerment Codes of Good Practice issued on 9 February 2007. The Revised Codes provide for a one year transitional period starting 11 October 2013. During the transitional period, companies may elect to be measured in terms of the Revised Codes or the 2007 version of the Codes. After the first year of the implementation of the Revised Codes, B-BBEE compliance will be measured in terms of the Revised Codes without any discretion. Companies which are governed by Sector-specific Codes will be measured in terms of those Sector Codes.

As such, Transnet will accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes. Transnet will also continue to accept B-BBEE certificates issued in terms of the 2007 version of the Codes provided it was issued before 10 October 2014. Thereafter, Transnet will only accept B-BBEE certificates issued based on the Revised Codes.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date for this RFQ will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

Section 3**STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF GOODS OR SERVICES TO TRANSNET**

A Supplier/Service Provider shall be obliged to adhere to the Standard Terms and Conditions for the Supply of Goods and Services to Transnet as expressed hereunder. Should the Respondent find any condition(s) unacceptable, it should indicate which condition(s) is/are unacceptable and offer an alternative(s). A Quotation submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

1 SOLE AGREEMENT

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, these terms [Terms and each Term] and Transnet's purchase order(s) [Order or Orders] represent the only conditions upon which Transnet SOC Ltd [Transnet] procures goods [the Goods] or services [the Services] specified in the Order from the person to whom the Order is addressed [the Supplier/Service Provider]. Transnet does not accept any other conditions which the Supplier/Service Provider may specify, unless otherwise agreed to by Transnet in writing. In the event of any inconsistency between these Terms and any Order, these Terms shall take precedence.

2 CONFORMITY WITH ORDER

Goods/Services shall conform strictly with the Order. The Supplier/Service Provider shall not vary the quantities specified and/or the specification of any, stipulated in the Order, without the prior written consent of Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider warrants that the Goods/Services shall be fit for their purpose and of satisfactory quality.

3 DELIVERY AND TITLE

- 3.1 The delivery dates and addresses are those in the Order. Time shall be of the essence in respect of the Supplier's/Service Provider's obligations under the Order.
- 3.2 The Supplier/Service Provider will not be excused for delay in delivery or performance except due to circumstances outside its control and then only subject to the Supplier/Service Provider having notified Transnet in writing on becoming aware of such circumstances. Transnet may terminate an Order, in whole or in part, without incurring any liability to the Supplier/Service Provider if such a delay becomes, in Transnet's absolute opinion, significant.
- 3.3 Risk of loss or damage to Goods shall pass to Transnet on delivery, and title shall pass to Transnet when payment to the Supplier for the Goods has been effected.
- 3.4 If on delivery, the Goods/Services do not conform to the Order, Transnet may reject the Goods/Services and the Supplier/Service Provider shall promptly rectify any defects or in Transnet's opinion, supply appropriate replacement Goods/Services at the Supplier's/Service Provider's expense within the specified delivery times, without any liability due by Transnet. Goods shall be subject to such testing and/or inspection as Transnet may consider necessary.

4 PRICE AND PAYMENT

- 4.1 Prices specified in an Order cannot be increased. Payment for the Goods/Services shall be made by Transnet against an original undisputed invoice(s) [a Tax Invoice], supporting documentation and month-end statement from the Supplier/Service Provider. Tax Invoices plus supporting documentation shall be posted to the address shown in the Order.
- 4.2 Payment of the Supplier's/Service Provider's valid Tax Invoice(s) will be made by Transnet in the South African currency and on the terms stated in the Order, the standard payment terms being 30 [thirty] days from date of receipt by Transnet of a month-end statement, unless otherwise agreed to in writing. Transnet shall arrange for payment of such Tax Invoices and any pre-authorised additional expenses incurred, provided that the authorised expenses are supported by acceptable documentary proof of expenditure incurred [where this is available]. Any amounts due in terms of these Terms shall be paid to the Supplier/Service Provider, taking into account any deduction or set-off and bank charges.

5 PROPRIETARY RIGHTS LIABILITY

If any allegations should be made or any claim asserted against Transnet that ownership of, or any act or omission by Transnet in relation to Goods/Services or any written material provided to Transnet relating to any Goods/Services or pursuant to an Order being a violation or infringement of any third party's contractual, industrial, commercial or intellectual property rights including but not limited to any patent, registered design, design right, trade mark, copyright or service mark on any application thereof, the Supplier/Service Provider hereby indemnifies Transnet against and hold it harmless from any and all losses, liabilities, costs, claims, damages and expenses [including any legal fees] arising directly or indirectly from such allegation or claim provided that this indemnity shall not apply where the allegation or claim arises solely as a result of the Supplier/Service Provider following a design or process originated and furnished by Transnet. The Supplier/Service Provider shall either

- a) procure for Transnet the right to continue using the infringing Goods; or
 - b) modify or replace the Goods/Services so that they become non-infringing,
- provided that in both cases the Goods/Services shall continue to meet Transnet's requirements and any specifications stipulated in the Order. Should neither option be possible, the Supplier/Service Provider may remove, with Transnet's prior written consent, such Goods/Services and will pay to Transnet a sum equivalent to the purchase price. If Transnet refuses to give such consent, the Supplier/Service Provider shall have no liability in respect of any continued use of the infringing Goods/Services after Supplier's/Service Provider's prior written request to remove the same.

6 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

All information which Transnet has divulged or may divulge to the Supplier/Service Provider and any information relating to Transnet's business which may have come into the Supplier's/Service Provider's possession whilst carrying out an Order, and the existence of the Order, shall be treated by the Supplier/Service Provider as confidential information and shall not, without Transnet's prior written consent, be disclosed to any third party, or be used or copied for any purposes other than to perform the Order. This clause does not apply to information which is public knowledge or available from other sources other than by breach of this Term. Upon request by Transnet, the Supplier/Service Provider shall return all

materials issued pursuant to the Order and, pending this, shall protect Transnet's rights in any such materials. Such confidential information shall at all material times be the property of Transnet.

7 DEVELOPMENT WORK IN THE PRODUCTION OF GOODS

If the production or provision of any Goods involves research and/or development which are wholly or partly funded by Transnet, then all intellectual property or other rights as a result thereof shall be the property of Transnet on creation.

8 PUBLICITY

The Supplier/Service Provider shall not name Transnet or use its trademarks, service marks [whether registered or not] or Goods in connection with any publicity without Transnet's prior written consent.

9 AFTER SALES SERVICE

The Supplier shall provide replacement parts necessary to ensure the uninterrupted operation of the Goods supplied for the duration of the warranty period, from delivery of any particular item of the Goods and if requested by Transnet shall make these parts available to a third party maintainer of Transnet's choice at the same price as if the parts had been supplied to Transnet. The Supplier undertakes to provide a maintenance service for Goods should Transnet so request, on terms to be agreed. If the Order so indicates, the Supplier will provide a warranty service for the Goods at a level to be agreed with Transnet.

10 TERMINATION OF ORDER

10.1 Transnet may cancel an Order in whole or in part at any time upon at least 7 [seven] days' written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider, or when there is a change in control of the Supplier/Service Provider or the Supplier/Service Provider commits any serious breach or any repeated or continued material breach of its obligations under these Terms and/or Order or shall have been guilty of conduct tending to bring itself into disrepute, on written notice to the Supplier/Service Provider when such work on the Order shall stop.

10.2 Transnet shall pay the Supplier/Service Provider a fair and reasonable price for justified work in progress, where such price reflects only those costs not otherwise recoverable by the Supplier/Service Provider, at the time of termination, and the Supplier/Service Provider shall give Transnet full assistance to check the extent of such work in progress. Payment of such price shall be in full and final satisfaction of any claims arising out of such termination and upon such payment the Supplier/Service Provider shall deliver to Transnet all work, including any materials, completed or in progress. The sum payable to the Supplier/Service Provider under this clause will not in any event exceed the total amount that would have been payable to the Supplier/Service Provider had the Order not been terminated.

10.3 In the event of termination the Supplier/Service Provider must submit all claims within 2 [two] months of termination after which time claims will only be met in what Transnet considers exceptional circumstances.

10.4 If the Goods or Services are not provided in accordance with an Order, the Order shall be deemed terminated and the Supplier/Service Provider shall compensate Transnet for any costs incurred in obtaining substitute Goods or any damage caused due to the failure or delay in the delivery.

12 WARRANTY

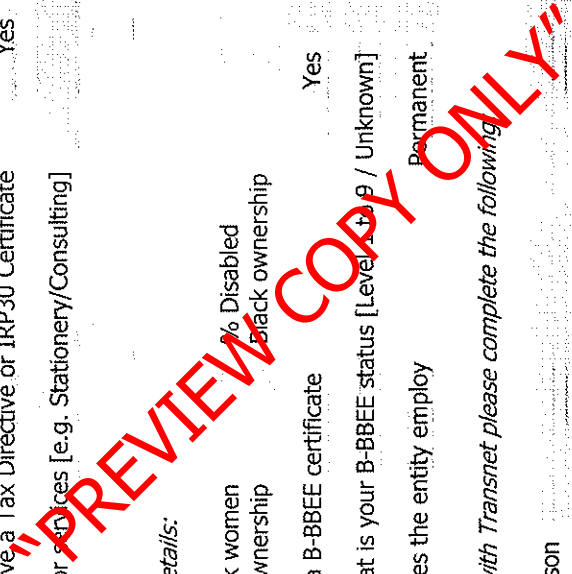

This preference form contains general information and serves as a claim for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment [B-BBEE] Status Level of Contribution.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A total of **20** preference points shall be awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution.
- 1.2 Failure on the part of a Bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System [**SANAS**] or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors [**IRBA**] or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act [**CCA**] together with the bid will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution are not claimed.
- 1.3 Transnet reserves the right to require of a Bidder, either before a Bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by Transnet.

2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 "**all applicable taxes**" include value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies.
- 2.2 "**B-BBEE**" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

- 2.7 "**consortium or joint venture**" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "**contract**" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by Transnet;
- 2.9 **EME** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 [five] million or less as per the

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2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R10 [ten] million or less as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928;

2.10 **"firm price"** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs and excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;

2.11 **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;

2.12 **"non-firm prices"** means all prices other than "firm" prices;

2.13 **"person"** includes reference to a juristic person;

2.14 **"QSE"** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue between R5 [five] million and R35 [thirty five] million as per the 2007 version of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of between R10 [ten] million and R50 [fifty] million as per the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928

2.15 **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;

2.16 **"subcontract"** means the primary contractor's assigning or leasing or making out work to, or employing another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;

2.17 **"total revenue"** bears the same meaning assigned to the expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;

Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EME's with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 4.4 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928 are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R10 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership.
- 4.5 In terms of the 2007 version of the Codes of Good Practice, bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 4.6 In terms of the Revised Codes of Good Practice issued on 11 October 2013 in terms of Government Gazette No. 36928, Bidders who qualify as QSEs are only required to obtain a sworn affidavit on an annual basis confirming that the entity has an Annual Total Revenue of R50 million or less and the entity's Level of Black ownership. Large enterprises must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.

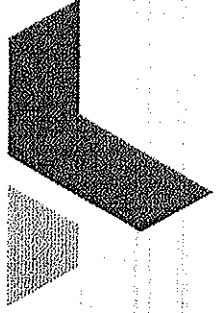

4. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS:

4.1. General

Switchgear shall be designed to minimise any risk of short circuits and to ensure personnel and operational safety during all operating conditions, inspections and maintenance.

Switchgear shall be of the metal-clad, withdrawable type, manufactured to match the existing Reyrolle switchboard as far as possible.

The lay-out of the operational front and the location of the components of the assembly shall be arranged to match the existing Oil Tanker Substation 11kV Switchboard panels as far as possible. No operational equipment or metering apparatus shall be located at levels below 200 mm and above 2 000 mm.

4.2. Circuit Breaker Units

Stored energy operating mechanisms shall be used.

Anti-pumping devices shall be included to prevent 'pumping actions' of the mechanism.

4.3. Earthing

Earthing facilities shall be provided at both ends of the main earth bar.

An integrally mounted three phase earthing switch, capable of making and carrying the prospective short circuit current and suitable for local, manual operation, shall be provided on the cable side of all MV switching devices.

The operation of the earthing switch shall be interlocked, allowing closure of the earthing switch only when the MV switching device is not in the service position.

Earthing devices shall be equipped with a mechanically operated position indicator which shall be clearly visible without removal or opening of panel doors or covers.

Padlocking facilities shall be provided for locking the earthing device in the open and closed position.

When an earthing device has been fitted in a compartment, it shall not be possible to insert a withdrawable switching device into the service position of the compartment concerned.

4.4. Auxiliary contacts

Auxiliary devices shall be directly operated by the switching device. The contacts shall be wired up to the terminal blocks in the LV control compartment.

4.5. Secondary wiring and terminals

Secondary wiring shall not be mounted direct to metal. To accommodate and support the wiring, covered plastic channels, insulated tubes or plastic strips shall be used. The filling factor for channels and tubes shall not exceed 70%.

Internal wiring between panels shall be adequately protected against mechanical damage by e.g. rubber grommets. Wiring passing through MV compartments shall be installed in conduit or trunking to facilitate the replacement of the wiring without the need to de-energise the MV compartment.

For bus wiring and outgoing control circuits, individual terminals shall be provided for each external conductor.

Wiring and terminals shall be identified in accordance with the related wiring diagrams.

4.6. Closing, Opening and Tripping

Closing, opening and tripping functions shall be electrically activated using the existing switchboard DC supply.

4.7. Name Plates and Labeling

Name, identification, instruction and warning plates and their fixing materials shall be of durable, corrosion resistant material. They shall be provided with indelible inscriptions in the

language as specified on the requisition. Plates mounted on the outside of the equipment shall be fixed by means of durable self-threading screws or pop rivets.

The following information shall be given on the nameplate installed outside the assembly:

- a) Manufacturer's name;
 - b) Customer's switchboard title and tag number;
 - c) rated voltage;
 - d) rated frequency;
 - e) rated current of busbar system;
 - f) rated peak and short time withstand current and withstand time;
- Each circuit of the assembly shall be provided with a circuit identification label.
- In locations where dangerous situations may inadvertently be created, warning plate(s) or caution notice(s) shall be installed, identifying the danger point(s).

4.8. Enclosures

Enclosures shall be free standing and self supporting.

The floor of the switchhouse shall not be considered to be part of the enclosure.

The top of the switchgear shall be sealed to such an extent that the ingress of dripping water is prevented.

All structures, sheeting and other metal parts shall be adequately protected against corrosion. Frame and partitions may be of galvanised steel without further paint coating. Those parts/covers requiring painting shall be properly pre-treated before the final coat(s) of oil resistant finishing paint is applied. Manufacturer's standard colour is acceptable.

4.9. Shutters

Shutters shall be closed and opened automatically by the mechanical drive of the removable part of the switching device when the latter is being racked out of or into the service position.

Each set of shutters, both for the busbar and the cable side, shall be fitted with individual padlock facilities in its closed position. Shutters shall be marked 'BUSBAR' and 'CIRCUIT'.

To facilitate testing, a manually operated device shall be installed to permit opening and fixing in the open position, but not padlocking, of each set of shutters individually. The device shall be overridden by the moving part of the switching unit, restoring the automatic features of the shutters.

4.10. Busbar Systems

Busbar systems shall be located in separate air filled compartments.

Busbars shall be made of copper.

Busbars and connections shall be fully rated, braced and supported to withstand the dynamic, thermal, and dielectric stresses over the full length of the switchgear.

All bolted connections shall be made with high tensile strength bolts effectively secured against loosening.

4.11. Current Transformers

Current transformers shall be in accordance with IEC-60185. The rated output shall match the requirements of the equipment connected. The secondary current rating shall be 1 A.

Secondary terminals of current transformers shall be wired up to a terminal block with short circuiting links, located at an accessible place. At this terminal block one side of each transformer shall be connected to earth.

The instrument security factor (FS) shall be 5 or less in order to prevent damage of instruments at maximum fault current.

Current transformers shall have an appropriate VA rating and a saturation factor that will ensure the proper working of the protection devices for all short-circuit currents up to the rated value of the switchgear.

4.12. Measuring Instruments

Measuring instruments shall have an accuracy class 2.5. They should be of the square pattern type 96 x 96 mm, and mounted at a suitable height for easy reading from the front. Scales shall be in actual values.

4.13. Protection Relays

Protection relays shall be microprocessor based devices.

Protection relays shall be flush mounted, withdrawable type. Current carrying terminals shall be automatically short circuited when the relays are withdrawn.

Relays shall be capable of withstanding the output current of the associated current transformers corresponding to a primary current equal to the specified short circuit withstand current and withstand time of the assembly.

Contact rating and performance shall be in accordance with IEC 60255.

Protection relays shall derive their power supply from the tripping supply bus-wiring. The relays shall not initiate a trip of the circuit in case of a loss of power supply.

Protection relays shall have clear operating indications.

Protection relays shall have manual reset facilities.

Overcurrent relays shall allow selection of inverse definite minimum time (normal, very and extremely) and definite time characteristics, and high set instantaneous elements which can be set on infinity if not required.

Earthfault relays shall allow selection of inverse definite minimum time (normal, very and extremely) and definite time characteristics, and high set instantaneous elements which can be set on infinity if not required.

4.14. Cable Terminations

Cable compartments shall be of adequate size for splitting, sealing and terminating multi-core cables including the utilisation of stress cones.

Separate termination compartments for MV and LV connections shall be provided.

Inside the compartments, adequate provisions shall be fitted for earthing the screen and/or armouring of each cable independently.

5. INSPECTION AND TESTING SPECIFICATIONS

a) The Manufacturer shall perform routine tests in accordance with SANS IEC 60694 Clause 7 and SANS IEC 62271-200 Clause 7 on the total assembly. The results shall be recorded on a Routine Test Certificate.

b) Inspection and tests shall be carried out on the complete assembled switchgear. Transportable units can be wired together instead of completing busbar joints.

c) The Principal or his Nominee shall witness the final routine testing after all work and factory testing by the Contractor has been completed.

d) Switchgear shall be visually inspected for conformity with the latest issue of the approved drawings and with the order. The following shall be verified:

- the degree of protection of the enclosure;
- the effectiveness and reliability of operating mechanisms, (pad)locks and interlock systems;
- the proper mounting of components;
- the internal wiring and cabling system;
- the correct wiring of main and auxiliary circuits;
- the suitability of clamping, earthing and terminating arrangements;
- the correct labelling of functional units;
- the completeness of the data on the nameplate;
- the availability of the earthing system throughout the switchgear;

- e) Insulation resistance testing shall be carried out by applying a Megger between each phase and earth, with the two remaining phases connected to earth. This test shall be carried out with all manually operated and latched type switching devices closed in the service position.
- f) Dielectric tests shall be carried out as follows:
 - 11kV circuits: 28kV, 50Hz for 1 minute
 - Control and auxiliary circuits: 2 times rated insulation voltage plus 1000V with a minimum of 2000V, 50Hz for 1 minute
- g) Full function testing of the mechanical and electrical operation of all functional units shall be conducted. Electrical tests shall include primary injection testing to prove measuring and protection circuits

6. ENGINEERING NOTES NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE

- a) If there are any documents listed in Section 3 which have not been included in the package received by the Supplier, advise Engineer so that copies of the missing documents can be forwarded to you.
- b) The Supplier is responsible for ensuring that the design and construction are in accordance with the specifications and codes referred to in the requisition and/or drawings. Any deviations to specification and codes shall be clearly identified in a separate schedule returned with the tender.
- c) The Supplier shall bring to the Engineer's attention any conflicts and/or discrepancies found in the documentation for clarification. Any unauthorized deviations or changes implemented by the Supplier may result in the tender components or equipment being rejected by the Engineer.
- d) The Supplier shall provide the Engineer with a minimum of one (1) weeks notification for the witnessing of inspections and factory testing. Prior to inspection and factory testing the Supplier shall provide the Engineer with adequate proof that the Supplier's QA / QC activities have been completed. Supplier shall supply all necessary tools and testing equipment required.
- e) Acceptance of inspections and factory testing does not constitute a waiver of requirements to meet field test under specified operating conditions, nor does it relieve the Supplier of his responsibilities in any way whatsoever, including the acceptance of deviations to specification.

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7. SUPPLIER'S DATA AND DOCUMENTATION

a) Supplier is advised that the documentation requirements as detailed in this section are a critical requirement of this requisition. Overall project performance will be affected without the timely receipt of this data and could result in unnecessary delays and payment retention.

d) General Arrangement drawing shall indicate the main dimensions, panel layout, floor plan, cable entry, anchor bolt locations, earthing connections, equipment masses and allowable bolt torque settings and minimum clearances around the assemblies for ventilation and safety during operation and maintenance.

e) Documents marked (*) shall be issued "As-built" upon completion of Site Acceptance.

f) Drawings and data supplied shall be rejected if not in accordance with the requirements as laid down in this specification.
