Should the BBBEE rating not be provided, Transnet reserves the right to award no points and/or declare the tender void. Transnet also reserves the right to carry out an independent audit of the tenderers scorecard components at any stage from the date of close of the tenders until completion of the contract. Tenderers with no accreditation will score zero points for preferencing.

F.1 General

F.1.1 Actions

- F.1.1.1 The employer and each tendered of bmitting a tender offer shall comply with these conditions of tender. In their dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in F.2 and F.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, nonestin, and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not energy in all ticompetitive practices.
- F.1.1.2 The employer and the tenderer and all their agents and employees involved in the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Tenderers shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict, and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.
- A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of roles which might provide an incentive for improper acts in some circumstances. A conflict of interest can create an appearance of impropriety that can undermine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result.
 - 2) Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the procurement process include direct, indirect or family interests in the tender or outcome of the procurement process and any personal bias, inclination, obligation, allegiance or loyalty which would in any way affect any decisions taken.
- **F.1.1.3** The employer shall not seek and a tenderer shall not submit a tender without having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.

F.1.2 Tender Documents

The documents issued by the employer for the purpose of a tender offer are listed in the tender data.

F.1.3 Interpretation

DESCRIPTION OF THE WORK: BELCON SLAB ROADMARKING

- **F.1.3.1** The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender
- **F.1.3.2** These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are only required for tender evaluation purposes, shall not form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender.
- **F.1.3.3** For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply:
 - a) conflict of interest means any situation in which:
 - i) someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfill his or her duties impartially;
 - ii) an individual or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal organization or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal organization.
 - iii) incompatibility or contradictory interests exist between an employee and the organisation which employs that employee.
 - b) **comparative offer** means the tenderer's Thank's offer after all tendered parameters that will affect the value of the hear sial offer have been taken into consideration in order to enable comparisons to be made between offers on a comparative basis
 - c) **corrupt practice** means the officing, giving, receiving or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of the employer or his staff or agents in the tender process; and
 - d) **fraudulent practice** means the misrepresentation of the facts in order to influence the tender process or the award of a contract arising from a tender offer to the detrim nt of the employer, including collusive practices intended to establish prices at a tific al levels
 - e) **organisation** means a company, firm, enterprise, association or other legal entity, whether incorporated or not, or a public body
 - f) quality (iunctionality) means the totality of features and characteristics of a productor service that bear on its ability to satisfy stated or implied needs

F.1.4 Communication and employer's agent

Each communication between the employer and a tenderer shall be to or from the employer's agent only, and it a form that can be readily read, copied and recorded. Communications shall be in the Enrich language. The employer shall not take any responsibility for non-receipt of communications from the by a tenderer. The name and contact details of the employer's agent are stated in the tender data.

F.1.5 The employer's right to accept or reject any tender offer

- F.1.5.1 The employer may accept or reject any variation, deviation, tender offer, or alternative tender offer, and may cancel the tender process and reject all tender offers at any time before the formation of a contract. The employer shall not accept or incur any liability to a tenderer for such cancellation and rejection, but will give written reasons for such action upon written request to do so.
- **F.1.5.2** The employer may not subsequent to the cancellation or abandonment of a tender process or the rejection of all responsive tender offers re-issue a tender covering substantially the same scope of work within a period of six months unless only one tender was received and such tender was returned unopened to the tenderer.

F.1.6 Procurement procedures

F.1.6.1 General

Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, a contract will, subject to F.3.13, be concluded with the tenderer who in terms of F.3.11 is the highest ranked or the tenderer scoring the highest number of tender evaluation points, as relevant, based on the tender submissions that are received at the closing time for tenders.

F.1.6.2 Competitive negotiation procedure

- **F.1.6.2.1** Where the tender data require that the competitive negotiation procedure is to be followed, tenderers shall submit tender offers in response to the proposed contract in the first round of submissions. Notwithstanding the requirements of F.3.4, the employer shall announce only the names of the tenderers who make a submission. The requirements of F.3.8 relating to the material deviations or qualifications which affect the competitive position of tendered shall not apply.
- F.1.6.2.2 All responsive tenderers, or not less than three responsive tenderers that are highest ranked in terms of the evaluation method and call ation criteria stated in the tender data, shall be invited in each round to enter into competitive negotiations, based on the principle of equal treatment and keeping confidential the proposed solutions and associated information. Notwithstanding the provisions of F.2.17, the employer may request that tenders be clarified, specified and fine-tuned in order to improve a tenderer's competitive position provided that such clarification, specification, fine-tuning or additional information does not alter any fundamental aspects of the offers or impose substantial new requirements which restrict or distort appreciation or have a discriminatory effect.
- F.1.6.2.3 At the conclusion of each round of negotiations, tenderers shall be invited by the employer to make a fresh tender offer, based on the same evaluation criteria, with or without adjusted weightings. Tenderers shall be advised when they are to submit their best and final offer.
- **F.1.6.2.4** The contract shall be awar led in accordance with the provisions of F.3.11 and F.3.13 after tenderers have been requested to submit their best and final offer.
- F.1.6.3 Proposal procedure using the two stage-system

F.1.6.3.1 Option

Tendere shall in the first stage submit technical proposals and, if required, cost parameters around which a contract may be negotiated. The employer shall evaluate each responsive submission in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data, and in the second stage negotiate a contract with the tenderer scoring the highest number of evaluation points and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.

Fri 6 2.2 Option 2

- Tenderers shall submit in the first stage only technical proposals. The employer shall invite all responsive tenderers to submit tender offers in the second stage, following the issuing of procurement documents.
- **F.1.6.3.2.2** The employer shall evaluate tenders received during the second stage in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data, and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.

F.2 Tenderer's obligations

F.2.1 Eligibility

- **F.2.1.1** Submit a tender offer only if the tenderer satisfies the criteria stated in the tender data and the tenderer or any of his principals, is not under any restriction to do business with employer.
- **F.2.1.2** Notify the employer of any proposed material change in the capabilities or formation of the tendering entity (or both) or any other criteria which formed part of the qualifying requirements used by the employer as the basis in a prior

process to invite the tenderer to submit a tender offer and obtain the employer's written approval to do so prior to the closing time for tenders.

F.2.2 Cost of tendering

Accept that, unless otherwise stated in the tender data, the employer will not compensate the tenderer for any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of a tender offer, including the costs of any testing necessary to demonstrate that aspects of the offer complies with requirements.

F.2.3 Check documents

Check the tender documents on receipt for completeness and notify the employer of any discrepancy or omission.

F.2.4 Confidentiality and copyright of documents

Treat as confidential all matters arising in connection with the tender Use and copy the documents issued by the employer only for the purpose of preparing and submitting of inder offer in response to the invitation.

F.2.5 Reference documents

Obtain, as necessary for submitting a tender offer, copie the latest versions of standards, specifications, conditions of contract and other publications, which are not attached but which are incorporated into the tender documents by reference.

F.2.6 Acknowledge addenda

Acknowledge receipt of addenda to the tender documents, which the employer may issue, and if necessary apply for an extension to the closing time stated in the tender data, in order to take the addenda into account.

F.2.7 Clarification meeting

Attend, where requires, a carincation meeting at which tenderers may familiarise themselves with aspects of the propose, work, services or supply and raise questions. Details of the meeting(s) are stated in the tender data.

F.2.8 Seek clarification

Request clarification of the tender documents, if necessary, by notifying the employer at least five working days before the closing time stated in the tender data.

F.2.9 Instra

Be aware that the extent of insurance to be provided by the employer (if any) might not be for the full cover required in terms of the conditions of contract identified in the contract data. The tenderer is advised to seek qualified advice regarding insurance.

F.2.10 Pricing the tender offer

- F.2.10.1 Include in the rates, prices, and the tendered total of the prices (if any) all duties, taxes (except Value Added Tax (VAT), and other levies payable by the successful tenderer, such duties, taxes and levies being those applicable 14 days before the closing time stated in the tender data.
- **F.2.10.2** Show VAT payable by the employer separately as an addition to the tendered total of the prices.
- **F.2.10.3** Provide rates and prices that are fixed for the duration of the contract and not subject to adjustment except as provided for in the conditions of contract identified in the contract data.
- **F.2.10.4** State the rates and prices in Rand unless instructed otherwise in the tender data. The conditions of contract identified in the contract data may provide for part payment in other currencies.

F.2.11 Alterations to documents

Do not make any alterations or additions to the tender documents, except to comply with Instructions issued by the employer, or necessary to correct errors made by the tenderer. All signatories to the tender offer shall Initial all such alterations. Erasures and the use of masking fluid are prohibited.

F.2.12 Alternative tender offers

- F.2.12.1 Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, submit alternative tender offers only if a main tender offer, strictly in accordance with all the requirements of the tender documents, is also submitted as well as a schedule that compares the requirements of the tender documents with the alternative requirements that are proposed.
- **F.2.12.2** Accept that an alternative tender offer may be based only in the criteria stated in the tender data or criteria otherwise acceptable to the employer.

F.2.13 Submitting a tender offer

- **F.2.13.1** Submit one tender offer only, either as a single tendering entity or as a member in a joint venture to provide the whole of the works, services or supply identified in the contract data and described in the scope of works, unless stated otherwise in the tender data.
- F.2.13.2 Return all returnable documents of the employer after completing them in their entirety, either electronically (f they were issued in electronic format) or by writing legibly in non-eraspole link.
- F.2.13.3 Submit the parts of the tender offer communicated on paper as an original plus the number of copies stated in the tender data, with an English translation of any documentation in a language other than English, and the parts communicated electronically in the same format as they were issued by the employer.
- F.2.13.4 Sign the original and all copies of the tender offer where required in terms of the tender data. The employer will hold all authorized signatories liable on behalf of the tenderer. Signatories for tenderers proposing to contract as joint ventures shall tate which of the signatories is the lead partner whom the employer shall hold liable for the purpose of the tender offer.
- F.2.13.5 See the original and each copy of the tender offer as separate packages marking the packages as "ORIGINAL" and "COPY". Each package shall state on the outside the employer's address and identification details stated in the tender data, as well as the tenderer's name and contact address.
- Where a two-envelope system is required in terms of the tender data, place and seal the returnable documents listed in the tender data in an envelope marked "financial proposal" and place the remaining returnable documents in an envelope marked "technical proposal". Each envelope shall state on the outside the employer's address and identification details stated in the tender data, as well as the tenderer's name and contact address.
- **F.2.13.7** Seal the original tender offer and copy packages together in an outer package that states on the outside only the employer's address and identification details as stated in the tender data.
- **F.2.13.8** Accept that the employer will not assume any responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the tender offer if the outer package is not sealed and marked as stated.
- **F.2.13.9** Accept that tender offers submitted by facsimile or e-mail will be rejected by the employer, unless stated otherwise in the tender data.

F.2.14 Information and data to be completed in all respects

Accept that tender offers, which do not provide all the data or information requested completely and in the form required, may be regarded by the employer as non-responsive.

F.2.15 Closing time

- **F.2.15.1** Ensure that the employer receives the tender offer at the address specified in the tender data not later than the closing time stated in the tender data. Accept that proof of posting shall not be accepted as proof of delivery.
- **F.2.15.2** Accept that, if the employer extends the closing time stated in the tender data for any reason, the requirements of these conditions of tender apply equally to the extended deadline.

F.2.16 Tender offer validity

- F.2.16.1 Hold the tender offer(s) valid for acceptance by the employer at any time during the validity period stated in the tender data after the closing time stated in the tender data.
- **F.2.16.2** If requested by the employer, consider extending the validity period stated in the tender data for an agreed additional period with or without any conditions attached to such extension.
- **F.2.16.3** Accept that a tender submission that has been submitted to the employer may only be withdrawn or substituted before the closing time for tender that a tender is to be withdrawn or substituted.
- **F.2.16.4** Where a tender submission is to be substituted, submit a substitute tender in accordance with the equirements of F.2.13 with the packages clearly marked as "SUBSTITUTE".

F.2.17 Clarification of tender offer after submission

Provide clarification of a tender offer in response to a request to do so from the employer during the evaluation of tender offers. This may include providing a breakdown of rates or prices and correction of arithmetical errors by the adjustment of certain rates or item prices (or both). F.2.18 Provide other material

- Provide, on request by the employer, any other material that has a bearing on the tender offer, the tenderer's commercial position (including notarized joint venture agreements), preferencing arrangements, or samples of materials, considered necessary by the employer for the purpose of a full and fair risk assessment. Should the tenderer not provide the material, or a satisfactory reason as to why it cannot be provided, by the time for submission stated in the employer's request, the employer may regard the tender offer as non-responsive.
- **F.2.18.2** Dispose of samples of materials provided for evaluation by the employer, where required.

F.2.19 Inspections, tests and analysis

Provide access during working hours to premises for inspections, tests and analysis as provided for in the tender data.

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F.2.20 Submit securities, bonds, policies, etc.

If requested, submit for the employer's acceptance before formation of the contract, all securities, bonds, guarantees, policies and certificates of insurance required in terms of the conditions of contract identified in the contract data.

F.2.21 Check final draft

Check the final draft of the contract provided by the employer within the time available for the employer to issue the contract.

F.2.22 Return of other tender documents

If so instructed by the employer, return all retained tender documents within 28 days after the expiry of the validity period stated in the tender data.

F.2.23 Certificates

Include in the tender submission or provide the employer with any sertificates as stated in the tender data.

F.3 The employer's undertakings

F.3.1 Respond to requests from the tenderer

- F.3.1.1 Unless otherwise stated in the tender pata, respond to a request for clarification received up to five working cays before the tender closing time stated in the Tender Data and notify all tender is who drew procurement documents.
- **F.3.1.2** Consider any request to make a material change in the capabilities or formation of the tendering entity (or such) or any other criteria which formed part of the qualifying requirements used to prequalify a tenderer to submit a tender offer in terms of a previous procurement process and deny any such request if as a consequence
 - a) an include a firm, or a joint venture as a whole, or any individual member of the joint venture fails to meet any of the collective or individual qualifying requirements;
 - b) he new partners to a joint venture were not prequalified in the first instance, either as individual firms or as another joint venture; or
 - c) in the opinion of the Employer, acceptance of the material change would compromise the outcome of the prequalification process.

F.3.2 Assi e Addenda

If tecessary, issue addenda that may amend or amplify the tender documents to each tenderer during the period from the date that tender documents are available until three days before the tender closing time stated in the Tender Data. If, as a result a tenderer applies for an extension to the closing time stated in the Tender Data, the Employer may grant such extension and, shall then notify all tenderers who drew documents.

F.3.3 Return late tender offers

Return tender offers received after the closing time stated in the Tender Data, unopened, (unless it is necessary to open a tender submission to obtain a forwarding address), to the tenderer concerned.

F.3.4 Opening of tender submissions

F.3.4.1 Unless the two-envelope system is to be followed, open valid tender submissions in the presence of tenderers' agents who choose to attend at the time and place

stated in the tender data. Tender submissions for which acceptable reasons for withdrawal have been submitted will not be opened.

- F.3.4.2 Announce at the meeting held immediately after the opening of tender submissions, at a venue indicated in the tender data, the name of each tenderer whose tender offer is opened and, where applicable, the total of his prices, preferences claimed and time for completion for the main tender offer only.
- **F.3.4.3** Make available the record outlined in F.3.4.2 to all interested persons upon request.

F.3.5 Two-envelope system

- F.3.5.1 Where stated in the tender data that a two-envelope system is to be followed, open only the technical proposal of valid tenders in the presence of tenderers' agents who choose to attend at the time and place stated in the tender data and announce the name of each tenderer whose technical proposal is opened.
- F.3.5.2 Evaluate the quality of the technical proposals offered by tenderers, then advise tenderers who remain in contention for the away of the contract of the time and place when the financial proposals will be pened. Open only the financial proposals of tenderers, who score in the quality evaluation more than the minimum number of points for quality stated in the tender data, and announce the score obtained for the technical proposals and the total price and any preferences claimed. Return unabened financial proposals to tenderers whose technical proposals failed to a pieve the minimum number of points for quality.

F.3.6 Non-disclosure

Not disclose to tenderers, or to an other person not officially concerned with such processes, information relating to the evaluation and comparison of tender offers, the final evaluation price and recommendations for the sward of a contract, until after the award of the contract to the successful tenderer.

F.3.7 Grounds for rejection and disqualification

Determine whether there has been any effort by a tenderer to influence the processing of tender offers and instantly disqualify a tenderer (and his tender offer) if it is established that he engaged in correct of fraudulent practices.

F.3.8 Test for responsiveness

- F.3 Determine, after opening and before detailed evaluation, whether each tender offer properly received:
 - a) complies with the requirements of these Conditions of Tender,
 - b) has been properly and fully completed and signed, and
 - c) is responsive to the other requirements of the tender documents.
- **F.3.8.2** A responsive tender is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the tender documents without material deviation or qualification. A material deviation or qualification is one which, in the Employer's opinion, would:
 - a) detrimentally affect the scope, quality, or performance of the works, services or supply identified in the Scope of Work,
 - b) significantly change the Employer's or the tenderer's risks and responsibilities under the contract, or
 - c) affect the competitive position of other tenderers presenting responsive tenders, if it were to be rectified.

F.3.8.3 Reject a non-responsive tender offer, and not allow it to be subsequently made responsive by correction or withdrawal of the non-conforming deviation or reservation.

F.3.9 Arithmetical errors, omissions and discrepancies

- **F.3.9.1** Check responsive tenders for discrepancies between amounts in words and amounts in figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the amounts in figures and the amount in words, the amount in words shall govern.
- F.3.9.2 Check the highest ranked tender or tenderer with the highest number of tender evaluation points after the evaluation of tender offers in accordance with F.3.11 for:
 - a) the gross misplacement of the decimal point in any unit rate;
 - b) omissions made in completing the pricing schedule or bits of quantities; or
 - c) arithmetic errors in:
 - i) line item totals resulting from the product of a unit rate and a quantity in bills of quantities or schedules of prices of
 - ii) the summation of the prices.
- **F.3.9.3** Notify the tenderer of all errors or omissions that are identified in the tender offer and either confirm the tender offer at tendered or accept the corrected total of prices.



C3.1 EMPLOYER'S WORKS INFORMATION

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SECTION 1

1 Description of the works

1.1 Executive overview

The Works to be carried out by the Contractor shall include, but not be limited to the following items of work as summarized below:

- · Set out and pre remark area
- · Lettering and symbols
- · Paint road marking lines and symbols

1.2 Employer's objectives

2 Construction

2.1 Temporary works Site services & construction constraints

2.1.1 Employer's Site entry and security control, permits, and Site regulations

The site of the Be on Blab is located within the Belcon Depot, Robert Sobukwe Road, Bellville. Security clearance must be obtained by the Contractor. Access to adjacent areas shall be maintained at all times

The Contractor shall ensure the safe passage of traffic to and around the site at all times.

Access permits shall be made by the *Contractor* to a standard acceptable to the *Employers Representative*, be allowed for within the *Contractor's* access control provision and shall include at least the following information:

- Company name and logo.
- Employees name and ID number.
- Date of issue and period of validity.
- Company details

 - Fax number

2.1.2 People restrictions on Site; hours of work, conduct and records:

The working hours shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Labour or with the agreement of the relevant trade unions. This information relating to working hours shall be supplied to the *Employers Representative* prior to commencement of the proposed working hours.

The Contractor keeps daily records of his people engaged on the Site and Working Areas (including Subcontractors) with access to such daily records available for inspection by the Exployers Representative at all reasonable times.

2.1.3 Site services and procedures

The *Contractor* shall make his own arrangements for the supply of se vices such as electricity, potable water, ablutions, fire protection, lighting and all other services required for undertaking the *works*. The *Contractor* shall provide, maintain and finally remove proper portable latrings of sufficient number at his cost. Latrines shall be properly constructed and placed in suitable positions and maintained in a clean and sanitary working condition.

Where any of the above services can be made available by the *Employer*, the cost of meters, connections, reticulation and all other usage costs associated with the provision of services shall be to the *Contractor's* account.

2.1.4 Facilities provided by the Employer

A Suitable construction site vill be made available free of charge to the *Contractor* for the duration of the contract.

The site shall be clearly sign posted as being a construction site and shall be compliant with the relevant prevailing safety equations and restrictions that might be in place until the *Contractor* has de-established from site and has been approved by the *Employers Representative* or his duly appointed representative.

The layout of any construction site, if required, shall be submitted to the *Employers Representative* for his approval before the *Contractor* starts erecting his camp.

2.1.5 Facilities provided by the Contractor

The Contractor shall make his own arrangements for the accommodation of all labour and comply with the requirements of the respective authorities.

No accommodation for the *Contractor's* and/or sub-contractor's employees will be available on site. No employee, with the exception of security watchmen, may, without written approval from the *Employers Representative*, be accommodated on site.

The *Contractor* shall, at his own expense, provide for security and access to his construction sites as he may require. Control of access for construction plant onto public roads shall be in accordance with the requirements of the relevant roads authority and *Employer's Representative*.

No liability will be accepted by Transnet for the safekeeping of the *Contractor's* materials/equipment/plant. The *Contractor* will not be required to provide any facilities for the use of the *Employers Representative*.

2.1.6 Existing premises, inspection of adjoining properties and checking work of others

The site must be ceared and cleared of all facilities and released material within 72 hours after completion of all the work that vill form part of the final handing over.

2.2 Concoletion, testing, commissioning and correction of Defects

2.2.1 The work to be done by the Completion Date

On or before the Completion Date the *Contractor* shall have done everything required to Provide the Works' The *Employers Representative* cannot certify Completion until all the work has been done and is also free of Defects, which would have, in his opinion, prevented the *Employer* from using the *works* and Others from doing their work.

2.2.2 Access given by the Employer for correction of Defects

The *Contractor* shall submit all documentation conclying with the *Employer's* standards and requirements. The *Employer* will issue all relevant documentation and drawings, including revisions, to the *Contractor*, but control, maintenance and handling of these documents will be the *Contractor's* sole responsibility and at its expense, and managed with a suitable document control system.

4.3 Health and Safety equil ments

4.3.1 General

The Contractor's attention is directed to the Health and Safety Specification TFR-ISM-RN-R&C-FM009, and in particular to his Health & Safety Program, which must be submitted with his tender, as well as the requirements of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) as amended and Regulations issued in terms of the former Act no. 6 of 1983, in their entirety.

Without derogating from the Act or any un-repealed regulations issued in terms of legislation, or without purporting to limit the Contractor's responsibilities, the following are brought to the Contractor's attention:

- (a) For the purpose of the Act the site/s, to be demarcated as agreed to between the *Contractor* and the *Employers Representative* before the works start, will be transferred to the control of the *Contractor* for the duration of the contract.
- (b) The *Contractor* shall appoint a health and safety coordinator to liaise at least fortnightly with the *Employers Representative* on matters pertaining to occupational health and safety.
- (c) The *Contractor* is an 'employer' in his own right as defined in Section 1 of the Act 85 of 1993 and he shall fulfil all his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act.

- (d) The Contractor shall furnish the Employers Representative with full particulars of any Sub-Contractor which he may involve in the contract and the Sub-Contractor shall be made aware of all the clauses in this contract pertaining to health and safety.
- (e) The *Contractor* shall advise the *Employers Representative* of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situation, which may arise from, work being performed either by the *Contractor* or Sub-Contractor.
- (f) A letter of good standing in terms of Section 80 (*Employer* to register with the Compensation Commissioner) of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Bernases Act 1993 (Act 130 of 1993), must also be furnished.
- (g) The Contractor shall comply with the current Transnet Specific tion. FR-ISM-RN-R&C-FM009, Safety Arrangements and Procedural Compliance with the Occur ational Realth and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 and Regulations, and shall, before commencement with the execution of the Contract, which shall include site establishment and delivery of construction plant, equipment or materials, submit to the Employers Representative:
 - documentary proof of his procedural completes with the Act, and
 - particulars of the Health and Safety-Plogram to be implemented on the site in accordance with the Transnet Specification TFR-ISM-FN-R&C-FM009.

The Contractor's Health and Safety Program will be subject to agreement by the Employers Representative, who may order suplementary and/or additional safety arrangements and/or different safe working methods to ensure ull compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms of the Act.

(i) All clauses in this contract pertaining to health and safety form an integral part of this contract and if not concline with may be construed as breach of contract entitling the *Employer* to the appropriate remarks.

NB: The *Co tractor* and his employees shall have valid safety inductions and medical certificates when accessing of working on site. Copies of which shall be submitted to the *Employers Representative*. This will be at a time and location Transnet will arrange.

4.3.2 Hazard identification and risk assessment

The Contractor's appointed Site Representative and the Employers Representative shall finalize a site-specific HIRA (Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment) document, on the day of site handover to the Contractor. This site-specific HIRA document, based on a continuous HIRA, must cover site-specific hazards and the safe management of these hazards. The HIRA document must be signed by the abovementioned representatives as well as the Depot Safety Manager, and be approved by the Employers Representative, before any construction work can commence.

4.3.3 Substance abuse

The OHSA (Act 85 of 1993) clearly states in the Safety Regulations no. 2A "INTOXICATION" An employer or user, as the case may be, shall not permit any person who appears to be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, to enter or remain at a workplace". Transnet Capital Projects enforces this legislation by means of its Substance Abuse Policy, and therefore reserves the right to do substance abuse testing on anyone who enters their premises.

4.3.4 Safety meetings

The *Contractor* shall ensure that a safety representative is appointed and regular safety meetings are held. Written minutes of these safety meetings shall be forwarded to the *Employers Representative*. All costs related to the safety aspects required under this contract will be carried by the *Contractor's* and therefore be covered under the rates tendered.

NB: The tendered amount shall include for all costs to confirm to the Health and Safety requirements.

4.4 Environmental constraints and many ment

The Contractor shall provide a Contractor's Environmental Management Plan addressing all the potential impacts of his activities. The Employers representative has the right to request additional specific work method statements should in his opinion this be required.

Progressive and systematic mishing and tidying-up will form an essential part of this contract. Under no circumstances shall spoil tubile, materials, equipment or unfinished operations be allowed to accumulate unnecessarily.

No material shall be sumped on the *Employer's* property and no suitable material shall be disposed of if it is required elsewhere for the proper completion of the contract.

All discarded spokled/hazardous material shall be disposed of at an approved registered dumpsite and the Contractor shall furnish the Employers Representative with receipts and official disposal certificates from the dumpsite.

The *Contractor* shall make good all damages to the environment to the satisfaction of the *Employers* Representative Waste Management Objective.

Noise Pollution

Equipment used on the site shall be properly muffled and maintained so as to reduce noise generation to the minimum. Working procedures shall be structured so as to avoid the unnecessary generation of noise.

Dust Control

Dust has been identified as having a serious environmental impact. The Contractor is required to prevent the creation of dust.

The *Contractor* shall ensure that no dust is generated during the mixing process of construction materials used during any stage of the construction process.

The Contractor shall, at all times, comply with the statutes that prohibit pollution of any kind. These statutes are enacted in the following legislation:

- The National Environmental Management Act, 107/1998
- The Environmental Conservation Act, 73/1989; and
- The National Water Act, 36/1998

The Contractor shall appoint a responsible person to ensure that no insident shall occur on site that could cause pollution. Where the Contractor was negligent and caused any form of pollution the damage shall be rectified at the Contractors cost.

NB: The tendered amount shall include for all costs to conform to the Environmental constraints and management requirements.

4.5 Quality assurance requirements

The onus rests on the *Contracter* to produce work which will conform in quality and accuracy of detail to the requirements of the Specifications and Drawings, and the *Contractor* must, at his own expense, institute a quality control system and provide experienced technical staff together with all transport, instruments and equipment to ensure adequate supervision and positive control of the works at all times.

The Contractor skall submit his proposed Quality Control Procedures (QCP) to the Employers Representative for approval. Six Access will not be permitted until the QCP is to the Employers Representatives satisfaction Transnet will have the right to inspect the work at any time during the progress of the contract.

4.6 Programming constraints

A program is to be submitted with the tender. This program shall comply with the requirements as indicated in the T2.2-2 Returnable Schedule.

The Contractor submits programme report information to the *Project Manager* at a bi-weekly interval. The Programme needs to show planned progress versus actual, deviations from the Accepted Programme and any remedial actions proposed by the Contractor.

The *Contractor's* programme shows duration of operations in working days for normal hours of a working day and 5 days is a working week.

4.7 Contractor's management, supervision and key people

The Contractor shall provide an organogram showing his key people and their lines of authority and communication.

4.8 Insurance provided by the Employer

Procedures for making insurance claims can be obtained from the Employers Perresentative.

4.9 Contract change management

The standard reporting forms that shall be used will be provided the contractor.

4.10 Subcontracting

4.10.1 Preferred subcontractors

The *Contractor* shall not appoint or bring sub-confractors onto site without the prior approval of the *Employers Representative*, and all subcontractors will be required to conform to the requirements as set out herein as if they were employees of the *Contractor*.

The Contractor shall not decide from the approved sub contractor's list without prior approval of the Employers Representative.

4.10.2 Subcontract documentation, and assessment of subcontract tenders

The Contractor shall appoint his sub-contractors under the NEC3 Engineering Contract Sub Contract unless approve of the Nec Sub Contrac

4.11 Marking Plant and Materials outside the Working Areas

4.11.1 The *Contractor* prepares and marks items of Plant and Materials outside the Working Areas with Contractor's logo.
